

This situation is mounting in growing concern not only in Livorno but elsewhere. While limited perhaps to Toscana Region at the moment, it will no doubt arise elsewhere in occupied territory. ## " Prisoners of war:

The large number of Italian Prisoners of War in this area present a grave problem and has created a situation which requires serious attention. In Livorno hundreds of prisoners of war are roaming the streets, dressed in American Uniform and they cannot be distinguished from any other American soldier as the only difference is a little insignia of metal, detachable, in the shape of the map of Italy on their sleeve. When they remove this and commit crimes the American soldiers are blamed for the same. There is little enforcement of their curfew regulations. Reports have reached us that a considerable number of them threatened civilian girls to cut their hair if they are seen with Allied soldiers. They are insulting to the Carabinieri because they know they will not be arrested. They are boasting that they are pro-fascist, they circulate often drunk, singing fascist songs. They enjoy unlimited freedom, they are not concerned about discipline as this generally amounts only to Company punishment which is only a temporary detention in a open camp. The Italian Police are afraid to interfere because they are told that they come under the protection of the Allies. Many of them possess arms. Some of them have resorted to looting and molestation of private property. Their activities have increased black market operations as a number of them are employed as drivers by Allied Forces. It is recognised that under the Hague Convention they are to be treated in accordance with international law. It is suggested that a special Court through A.M.G. may be established for the purpose of controlling this situation keeping in mind the principles laid down in the rules of land warfare."
