

1. Reference your AC/4082/13/L letter dated the 17th July 1945.

- 2. This Headquarters is in entire agreement with the proposed procedure for epuration of the magistracy under the provisions of DLL 159 by a commission of high ranking judges appointed by decree.
- 3. It is suggested, es a comment, that the commission should, when appointed, sit in the Capitals of the various Regions when dealing with personnel within that Region rather than permanent session in say Milan. This, it is thought, would have the following edvantages:-
 - (a) Facilitate the ettendance of witness
 - (b) Enable the commission to understand the past social and political situation under which the magistrate in question was compelled to function and thus insure a more uniform and comprehensive decision
 - (c) The Commission would more readily have the confidence of the persons affected and the public which is more directly concerned.

2. For information the following is extracted from letter of this HQ. to all P.C.'s Piemonte Region, dated 27 May 1945:

- " 9. We next come to the question of epuration of Piemonte judiclary under General Order 35. It will be seen from a study of G.O. 35, and 35a, that it was conceived as a summary measure to accomplish the result that has now been achieved through the note hereinbefore described.
- 10. Should epuration now be attempted on Provincial levels of the Flemonte judiciary it is apparent that confusion and emb. assment would result.
- 11. In exercise of the powers recognized in such order it is hereby directed that the heads of the administration of the Judiciary branch in Piemonte Region need not post any copies of the Order nor give any notice as provided therein. Persons of the Judicial branch who otherwise would be required to sign and lodge with the head of his administration a scheda personale are horsby relieved from such duty until further order.
- 12. As a result of the fore oing directives it is contemplated that epuration of the Judiciary will take place under D.L.L. Nº 159 of 29 July 1944 and further implementing decrees for such purpose, thus giving to the persons suspended I'm moffice a forum appropriate for a full hearing and the rights of appeal therein granted."

At the meeting of Mirst Presidents and Procumtori Generali which took place in Milan on 30 Jume all judicial officials present

took strong exception, as far as the magistracy was concerned, to the procedure of epuration under General Order No. 35.

2. It was compassized that, under the order, high "magistrati" are operated through commissions where no judges sit, or if some do, they hold a much lower grade than that of the judicial officials whose future career they have to decide upon.

- 3. High judicial officials therefore claim to be "epurated" either centrally through the Ministry of Justice or by a countesion composed of high ranking judges sitting in the North.
- 4. As INL 199 is now operative in ANG territory, the Minister of Justice could appoint such Commission by Ministerial decree, which could be immediately implemented in AN regions in order to avoid further loss of time.
- 5. Considering the fact that ACC will hand over in about six weeks time, both Legal Sub-Coundation Legal Officers attending the conference and the Minister of Justice are in favour of this solution.
- 6. Fill you please inform se whether you are in agreement with the proposed procedure or alternatively let me bear any comment you may wish to make thereon.

You will recollect from reading the minutes of the meting of pre and for in Milen that strong exception was taken by all the magistrati present, as far as the magistracy and concerned, to the procedure of opurstion under G.O. 35. . They claim, rightly I believe, that high officials are epurated through commissions where no judges sit at all or if they do, they are judges of a each loser grade than the officials who appear before them. They sak to be spursted centrally by the Ministry of Justice or by a commission sitting in the North composed of judicial officials holding the some or higher grade as held by these officials whose future career they have to decide upon. II. There appear to exist two solutions to the problem. a. As DLL 159 is implemented, to request the Ministry to appoint such commission for the North, as a section of the Central Commission sitting at the Ministry of Justice. This the Minister is perfectly willing to do immediately and considering that AMD will cease in wix works time way be the essiest and more practical solution. b. For AMS to appoint a Commission of high judicial officials under G.C. 35 to proceed with the epuration of the Morthern Magistracy. This solution presents the following difficulties: A. As ALG will cease in about six weeks it is likely that such Commission will have done no work whatscever by Il August and will be automatically replaced by the Ministerial Commission under DIL 159. 2. In the north it will be extremely difficult to find and appoint suitable officials holding the required grade without depleting even further the sorely reduced staff of the Morthern Courts. 3. The Northern Commission will be losth to apply stricter standards of political morality to their colleagues of the North than those

applied by the Ministerial Commission to their collemgues of the South.

(Therefore the prectical result of their activity will in all probability be mil.

III. Solution (a) is consequently strongly recommended by this cubcommission, bearing in sind that the establishment of a section of the Ministerial Commission in the North will not require the presence of delegates, to whom, it is understood, strong exception has been taken by RC. Lombardy for administrative and other reasons.
