1. Reference your 013.04/EKM of 29 Dec 44, I deny the petition in the Case of MONCADA Salvatore and return the file.

2. While the petition may suggest that the defence was not properly presented it is quite clear from W/Comdr DICKIE's synopsis that the trial court was fully aware that the accused claimed to have deposited debris at non-official dumps and to have prepared the false check-slips as a means of recovering payment for those deliveries. In view of the many suspicious circumstances surrounding the case it is not surprising that the court rejected this defence.

3. While it was entirely proper for you to forward the new petition, I am not prepared at this late stage to reopen the facts; still less will I order a new trial.

SUBJECT : Case of MORGAN Salvatore.

1. In reply to your C-5 OIA.5 of 20 Jan 1945 the facts of this case have been investigated.

2. MORGAN Salvatore was one of four partners in the firm of S.L.O.P. The firm was brought into existence soon after the occupation of Palermo in order to enter into and execute a contract with the city of Palermo for the clearance of debris in the city. MORGAN and another partner, PIANA Alfonso, were in charge of the actual work under the contract.

Payments under the contract were organized as follows: A number of dumps were established, at each of which an inspector was posted with the duty of inspecting and countersigning the check-slips brought by the carters, representing the loads brought to the dumps.

The firm was entitled to payment from the city for each countersigned check-slip presented.

Advance payments by way of working capital were made by the city to the firm without presentation of check-slips. These totaled 1,750,000. These advances were to be offset by subsequent check-slips. In fact for the period 31 July - 24 August 1943 120,000 check-slips were presented for this purpose.

Of these 120,000 check-slips 90,000 were proved to be false or irregular. The evidence was clear that they were prepared in the office of the firm, with the knowledge and consent of MORGAN and 2 other partners. In fact it was proved that many of the check-slips, which purported to have been issued for work done between 31 July and 7 August were not themselves printed until after 7 August.

On the 17 Sept the firm was dissolved and all documentary evidence disappeared. The partners MORGAN and PIANA fled.

The defence, which was disbelieved by the Court, was that debris was taken to dumps other than those authorized and that it was impossible to obtain duly countersigned check-slips for this work. It was alleged that there had been memoranda explaining the preparation of the check-slips but that these memoranda had disappeared with the other documentary evidence.

3. It is the opinion of the Legal Sub-Commission that on the above facts the accused was properly convicted and that the sentence, in all the circumstances, was not excessive. Several appeals have already been lodged against the conviction and sentence. It is however considered that the conviction and sentence should remain affirmed.

 2. The A/M was temporarily released from prison from 5.7.44 to 15.19.44 under somewhat mysterious circumstances and while at large committed further offences against the Amassi Laws. This aspect of the matter was fully reported to you in my long letter of 11.10.44 and reminder of 24.11.44 to which I have received no answer. It is suggested that the letter of 11.10.44 be referred to as it may afford you some considerable assistance.

3. As a result of the petitioner's further activities while at large he was convicted on 9.1.45 by Enna Tribunale for withholding from the Amassi and selling approximately 348 quintals of grain to the Black Market and was sentenced to 4 years 20 days reclusion and a fine of £8,973,333 plus £156,800 profits wrongfully made. There were 12 other accused involved of whom 7 were convicted and sentenced to imprisonment.

4. I am not at all sure that you will desire to take the above facts into consideration when considering the present petition, but as these facts do show that the conduct of the accused has not been good while serving his A.M.G. sentence I feel it right to draw your attention to these facts.

- c. Heavy sentence was imposed as a deterrent. This consideration does not apply now to the same extent.
- d. This case was omitted apparently by inadvertence from the list of wire-cutting cases re-reviewed by you in March 1944, when heavy sentences were substantially reduced. For your convenience a copy of this list is enclosed (may it please be returned).

2. I recommend that the prisoner be released immediately. This action will bring this case in conformity with the other similar cases above mentioned.

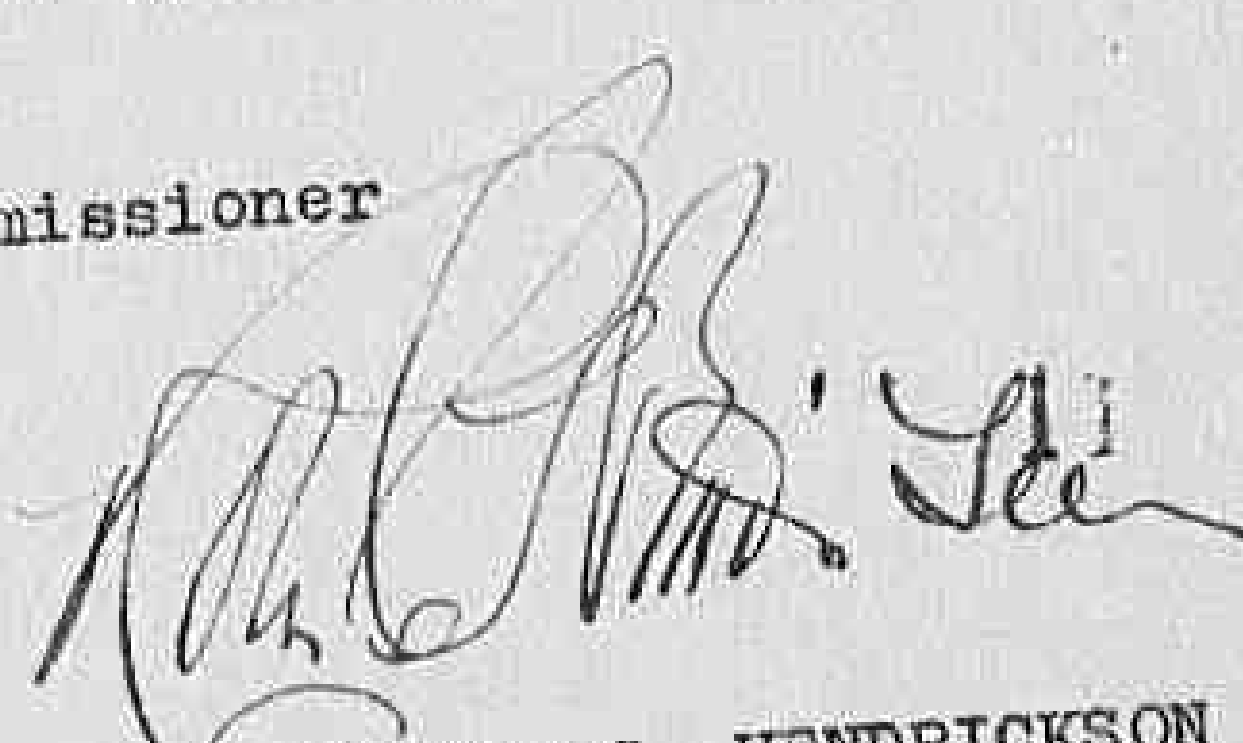

2. We have examined all of the court case files received from Salerno and the file in the case of the above subject is not listed among the cases in this office. Lt. Bannò has personally investigated this case and finds that subject was convicted of sodomy and possession of Allied property. He also feels that the sentence imposed was severe because of the crime of sodomy. The court probably exceeded its jurisdiction in sentencing the accused for the crime of sodomy unless it might be considered that sodomy comes within the provision of section 45 of Procl.2.

3. Lt. Bannò also states that Major Green, Public Safety Officer, Salerno, is also of the opinion that the conviction of the accused and the heavy sentence imposed, was brought about by the charge of sodomy rather than the possession of Allied property.

4. Under the circumstances perhaps the accused should be released.

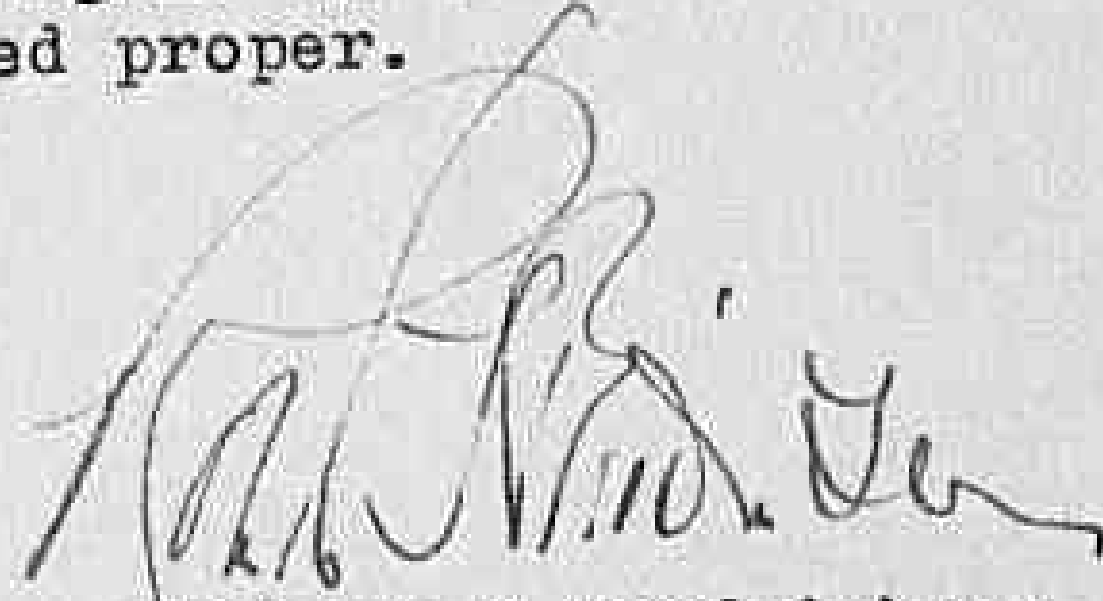

 - (ii) That H.E. the Procuratore Generale at Court of Appeal Catanzaro has stated that no person of the names of two men above referred to are confined in prison within his area (which covers CALABRIA).
4. In the circumstances it is regretted that it is NOT possible to obtain any further information with respect to this case.
