Dear Sir:

We have been unable to secure any information concerning the proper place to address this inquiry and shall greatly appreciate your courtesy in referring it to the office or official responsible for prisoners sentenced by the Allied Military Government in Italy.

We have been requested by Joseph Amato, 4758 Labadie Avenue, St. Louis, Missouri, to secure some information concerning the possibility of a parole for his cousin, Giacchino Amato, who was sentenced by the Allied Military Government on January 26, 1945, to a term of three years for passing counterfeit money in Italy. He is now serving his sentence at Livorno, Fiarubino, Italy. Giacchino Amato is the only relative of Joseph Amato (an American citizen who was recently discharged from services in the United States Army) left in Italy and he was given Power of Attorney by Joseph Amato in order to look after property which the latter still owns in Italy. Although Joseph Amato realizes the seriousness of the offense, he would like to know whether or not there is a possibility of his cousin being released on parole as his own affairs are very much complicated since Giacchino Amato has been unable to serve as administrator for him.

We shall greatly appreciate your cooperation.

I wrote to you on 25th January, 1946 about two Italian civilians, SACCOLINI Attilio and VENERI Guglielmo, who had been sentenced by the Allied Military Court at Verona on 5th October, 1945, to one year's imprisonment. You replied to me by letter of 29th January, 1946 (Reference: D.O. 1/26/H/CA). You said that you would arrange for Legal Sub-Commission to examine the records.

I have been given to understand that the two men are still held in Carceri Giudiziarie at Verona and I have been asked whether there is any action in the way of appeal or representations that should be made by the relatives and friends of the two men.

I venture therefore to bring the case again to your notice in the hope you might be able to give me a lead as to the position so that I can deal appropriately with the enquiries I am receiving.

Dear Brigadier Carr,

This note relates to two Italian civilians, SACCOMANI Attilio and VENTURI Guglielmo, who are at present undergoing a sentence of one year's imprisonment in Verona prison, for illegal acquisition of Allied petrol. They were sentenced by an Allied Military Court at Verona on 5th October, 1945, having been in custody for some time before their trial, and have therefore been about five months in prison.

The former Prime Minister, Bonomi, and Avv. Mutinelli, both vouch for the previous good character of these men, and ask for a revision of the sentence with a view to early release. The men in question operate a building construction firm, which is suffering owing to their absence, and this at a time when building construction is naturally of importance in the revival of Italian life. At the instance of Signor Mutinelli, who is known to me as a serious and reputable person, I am venturing to bring the case to your notice for consideration of revision of sentence, if possible.

REASONS FOR JUDGMENT

The defence raised in this case that the whole blame for the receipt of the petrol lies with the accused Veneri Guglielmo is not accepted by the Court. The accused Veneri and Saccomani Attilio wish the court to believe that after having arranged for the receipt of the petrol the accused Saccomani Attilio decided not to buy it and that the petrol was received and paid for by Veneri Guglielmo contrary to Saccomani Attilio's instructions. The only evidence in support of this allegation is the sworn testimony of Veneri Guglielmo and Saccomani Attilio. It is in the interest of these two accused to persuade the Court to believe this story as if accepted it would in the opinion of the Court virtually exonerate Saccomani Attilio from blame for the actual receipt of the petrol; and his early release from prison would assist the work of the firm in which he and the accused Veneri are jointly interested. The Court does not accept it for the following reasons. Saccomani Attilio showed no hesitation in making the original arrangement to purchase the petrol. Saccomani Attilio stated that he told his son in law not to buy the petrol and then went to Trento and after that to Padova. He was however in Verona on the morning of the seventeenth of August (see evidence of Cassadore Evelino). ## REMARKS BY ATTORNEY

Further the Court can draw no reliance on the evidence of Sacerdoti Baldino and takes judicial notice of the fact that the Zona H.Q. of the Italian Air Force in Padova is in Corso Umberto, Padova, and is not in the neighbourhood of the Station. There is in fact no Air Force H.Q. near Padova Station. Sacerdoti Baldino gave his evidence in an unconvincing manner, and the Court disregards his evidence as being unreliable. Furthermore if Sacerdoti Attilio had given orders to Veneri Guglielmo not to buy the petrol he had the opportunity of informing the Carabinieri of this on Aug. 17th after returning from Padova. Instead he made no effort to communicate with the Carabinieri. Moreover in his statement made on 1st August

Veneri Guglielmo says nothing about buying petrol contrary to his father in laws instructions. Instead he speaks of an arrangement having been come to between himself and his father-in-law to buy petrol. The Court notes that according to the evidence of Saccomani Attilio he had seen Veneri Guglielmo at Isola della Scala after his arrest; and before Veneri made his statement. It is to be imagined that he would have requested Veneri to say that he had bought the petrol contrary to instructions. No suggestion was made on behalf of Saccomani Attilio that Veneris statement was not true. Furthermore in his statement taken on 29 September 1945 Saccomani Attilio did not say that he had given his son-in-law orders not to buy the petrol. In these circumstances the Court has come to the conclusion that such orders were never given, and that the evidence given by the accused given to mislead and Veneri Guglielmo that these orders had been given is misleading.

The Court considers that there is evidence to show that Saccomani Baldino was aware that he was helping to unload stolen petrol, but considers that there is no evidence to show he was more than a mere porter.

With regard to the plea in mitigation that the accused were engaged on work of a public nature, the Court points out that they were also working for their private profit and were getting an illegal advantage over their competitors. The Court takes into consideration the previous good character of the accused. They were however extremely willing purchasers of the petrol.

To the undersigned ~~MARZULLI~~ Cerro, 47 years, born at Naples and living in Livorno - No. 1 Via della Maddalena, apply to you for what follows :

I was sentenced by the Allied Military Court of Livorno on 17 December 1945 for wrongful possession of Allied property (tires) to serve one year imprisonment. As I think that my punishment is unfair and heavy for the reasons that I will explain in this petition, I ask that a revision of the grounds which determined my sentence be granted or the remainder of my sentence be remitted or suspended.

I have three little boys and I had no job as the factory where I was employed was destroyed by Germans. To live after having worked as assistant cook with a battery of American Field Artillery to the front-line (as shown by the inclosed document) facing all discomforts and dangers of the war passionately I returned to my family and I was obliged to front the problem for life. With my little savings I put myself in a condition to rent two bed-rooms of my house and with such a source of income and with my work I was able to feed my family and myself.

One of these bed-rooms was required one day by a Mr. Carrone, my present accomplice. This gentleman bought the tires confiscated and found at my house, because he needed some for a truck of his property.

He told me that he had bought some tires of the Italian mark Pirelli and asked me to grant him to bring said tires in his bed-room, as he did not know where put them till he could not forward same to his house.

And he did so giving me a remuneration for the trouble caused me.

I did not know absolutely the source of the tires and trusting Carrone who told once to be a student and officer of the Italian Army I allowed him to do so.

He insured me that during same day he would have thought to eliminate such a trouble.

In said day a search was made in my house and the tires were found to be American.

Afterwards I heard from Carrone that when he knew to have been defrauded as he had been assured the tires were Italian, he tried to trace they who had sold the tires to him to compel them to take their goods and get back his money.



I was in ignorance of this circumstance. I did not wish to aggravate during the trial the condition of Garrone charging him, and so he was released against payment of a heavy fine and I was sentenced to one year imprisonment.

I am suffering for a sharp gastritis for I have been hospitalized in very bad condition. My physical structure is much pined away also in consequence of the bad condition of my teeth caused by an accident happened to me working. Grieved by the situation in which are my wife and my sons who suffer innocently for the missing of their only support, I am serving a heavy sentence which is sorrowful for me and my innocent sons. I trust in that Hon. Commission and I hope that my case will be taken into good consideration.
