The Secretariat of State of His Holiness takes the liberty to recommend for the benevolent consideration of the competent authorities the request of Maria Troia, Piazzale della Stazione N.4, Siracusa, for the liberation of her husband, Luigi Troia, presently detained in the Carceri in Siracusa on the charge of complicity in a robbery of Allied merchandise.

Maria Troia states that her husband, in good faith, gave the key to an air raid shelter to a number of soldiers who said that they wished to avail themselves of it in case of an attack. They however, made use of it to store stolen goods therein. She furthermore states that her husband, during the questioning by the Allied Tribunal, was, at first, absolved of any complicity by the soldiers, who, however, later accused him of cooperation with them in the theft.

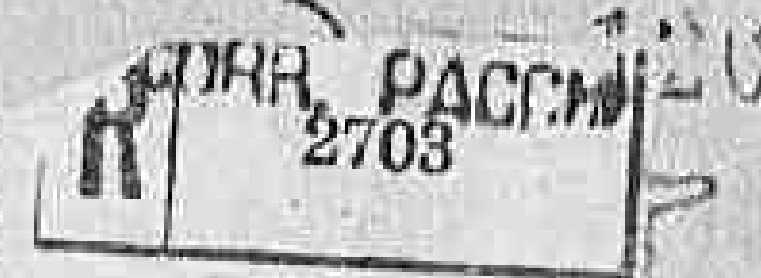

I, the undersigned, Nicola LEONARDI, son of Pompeo, on 13 December 1943 was apprehended by the American Military Police at Camigliano (Caserta Province) on grounds of having been a member of the Special Tribunal. I was first sent to the Concentration-camp of Garinara and later to Padula where I was held until 18 February 1945.

On that date I was turned over to the Italian Authorities in order to be tried. Recently I have been amnestied and I would have been already released were I not included in the list of the persons who are "at the disposal of the Allied Authorities".

As I cannot be charged with any crime inasmuch as I have always behaved well I beg your Command to be returned to my family who is living in very dire conditions, to my old father, who is blind and 90-year-old, as well as to allow me to know my last daughter who is 5-year-old.

Encouraged by your fine feelings of humanity and justice I am applying to your Command in the hope that you will take into consideration my request and urge my release.

I am 52-year-old, and I am in very critical health conditions because of nervous break down, bronchial catarrh. In addition I am toothless. I thank you in advance.

Dear Sir,

I acknowledge receipt of your letter dated 17th August 1946 relating to your son AMATO Giuseppe.

As I understand you are not aware that your son, having served half the penalty imposed upon him by an Allied Court, is now entitled to lodge an application for conditional liberty as established under art. 176 of the Italian Penal Code modified by art. 1 of Law 27 June 1942 N° 827; Art. 176 reads: "A person sentenced to detentive punishment for a term exceeding 5 years, who has served half of the punishment, or at least three fourth of the punishment if he is a relapsed individual, and has given constant evidence of good conduct, may be granted conditional release if the remainder of the punishment does not exceed 5 years. The grant of conditional release is subordinated to the fulfilments of the civil obligations arising from the offence, unless the convicted person proves that he finds it impossible to fulfil them"

Art. 1 of Law N° 827 reads: "During the present state of war and up to six months after its cessation, conditional liberty as established under Art. 176 of the Penal Code may be granted... also to persons sentenced to a detentive punishment less than 5 years."

Such application together with all necessary documents (viz.: penal record, statement of the Prison Director proving good behaviour of your son, written opinion of the "Giudice di Sorveglianza") should be forwarded to the Ministero di Grazia e Giustizia - Ufficio di Colleamento con l'A.C. Rome - through the "Giudice di Sorveglianza" of the prison where your son is now being detained. Such application will be dealt with in a very short period of time.

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I suggest therefore that you comply with the above instructions and I hope that the punishment imposed upon your son will be a good lesson for him and will keep him away from bad company in the future.

Leaving out of misdemeanours-amnesty to damage the Allied-Forces, brought Italian people a very deep sadness. Everybody was thinking these misdemeanours were remitted and contained in a mercifulness-action, deeming impossible that the Representatives of the greatest and mightiest Army in the world, had not pardoned those whom were conquered. Such an action, rather incomplete, was benevolently interpreted by Col. Weber. He judged by his feeling and interpreting the magnificent sentiments of the Allied-Forces, he has conferred the amnesty and some benefits on the condemned men that caused damage to the Allied-Forces.

Italian people are very obliged to Col. Weber for this beautiful act; but, Col. Weber has forgotten to confer amnesty on those whom must be still judged by Italian court of Law. Perhaps he has forgotten all that, for in his country, there is only the conditional-discharge, and not the amnesty; but, in according to Italian Law, it is a very different condition. In other countries some misdemeanours are quite redeemed by amnesty, so that they do not involve disadvantages to the party, for everything is placed in the archives, and nothing is mentioned in the certificates of conviction or in any other paper required to the offenders.

He whom is granted an amnesty, if he is engaged, he may continue his work and may have a part in any competitions. He whom is judged and convicted of theft and then gets the conditional discharge, as the proposal you have a case- he lose his job during a period of five years, and he shall not be permitted to get public positions.

As stated above, Italian people apply to Col. Weber in order that he gets conferred amnesty also on the offenders that committed some misdemeanours damaging the Allied-Forces, and must be still judged by Italian court of Law, especially if the offenders were held liable about little misdemeanours as: taking-in stolen goods; issue of counterfeited certificates in order to make use of the Allied-Forces' tires; possession or counterfeiting of the Allied-Forces' seals in order to make use them as stated above.

These misdemeanours should be especially pardoned being the most numerous, and for the reason, too, the Allied-Forces have ceded now their tires to the Italian Government; everywhere they are and by everybody they are possessed.

One should ally amnesty to the law on the misdemeanours to judge is as much as, in according to the antimocratic Italian laws, made by the Fascismo, the punishment remission is often the least benefit that one may have, especially the intellectual classes and the staff working in the public managements, if they were adjudged and then condemned for one day only in prison, they lose their job and are dismissed, so that it means misery and to be hungry as long as they live. All that does not happen in the most civilized countries as America, England. There, a small misdemeanour is cancelled by payment of adequate little money. So that, in according to above mentioned reason, those who caused damage to the Allied-Forces, being still obliged to be judged by Italian court of Law, and wishing to keep their own civil-law, they apply to Col. Weber in order to get judged them by the Allied-court of Law. They are sure the Allied-court of Law will be more forgiving than Italian-one. They beg also Col. Weber to get applied for them the amnesty given by Italian government on the 22 June 1945

They are waiting very anxiously for this magnificent action from you. Think, Col. Weber, many Italians by thousands and thousands hope to be admitted again in the civil society by your decision. And think, also, of the children of these unhappy men that lose their bread, if your goodness does not intervene benefiting them. Believe, they are more unlucky than culprit. They did not act in account of misery and hunger and ill-luck. Italian people are sure you will intervene, and remember: everywhere in Italy and everywhere is waiting anxiously for your decision.

To your Country, to the Allied Forces, and to You, the best expression of gratitude from the weeping Italy.

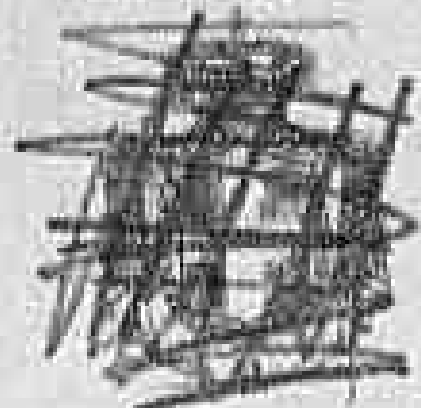
