Whereas a total prohibition on the transfer of lease and buildings, and of interests therein has been imposed by order of the Allied Military Government, and,

Whereas it is now deemed advisable partially to surmount and modify the said prohibition,

Now, therefore, I, Maurice Kelly Lusk, C.B.M., D.C., Brigadier, Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer, hereby order as follows:

Article I

Partial Removal of Prohibition

Notwithstanding the prohibition of leaseholdings or interests therein to be effected under restrictions except as hereinafter provided.

Article II

Prohibitions

Section 1. No transfer of any lands or buildings or any interest therein, whether by sale, gift, mortgage, charge or otherwise, when the total consideration for the transfer including any consideration passing in related transactions of, in the case of a gift, the fair value thereof, in excess of 50,000 lire, shall hereafter be effected without the written consent of the Senior Civil Affairs Officer of the Province in which such lands or buildings are situated.

Section 2. Individual transfers of portions of the same parcel of land or of adjacent parcels owned by the same person, when such transfers have a net value of a series of transactions, shall be deemed one transaction for the purposes hereof.

Section 3. Any such transfer or contract therefor made hereafter without such written consent shall be void.

Article III

Leases

Nothing contained in this order shall be taken to suspend, terminate or modify the existing prohibition against lease of land, buildings or interests therein for a term longer than the year.

without such written consent shall be void.

terminate or nullify the existing prohibition against leases of lands,
buildings or interests therein for a term longer than one year.

With reference to your letter F/1002/1/5 of 22 December 1943, together with enclosed draft proclamation on above mentioned subject, this matter has been under deliberation by the Legal Sub-section with a view to the issue of a proclamation which will be uniform throughout all occupied Italian territory.

Enclosed is a draft of what will become General Order 18. This, when promulgated, will be sent to your P.C.A.O. through official channels with instructions as to its publication - until these official instructions are received, no publication will be made and the text is now forwarded only for your information and the guidance of your actions in the meantime.

Article III should be noted. The policy remains unchanged in the matter of leases longer than one year.

Subject: Real Estate Transfers.

To: All S.C.A.O's.

- Under Section 1 of Article III. of Proclamation No. 5, no transfer of any interest in lands or buildings may be effected without the written consent of the C.C.A.O. or an Officer empowered by him. The purpose of this provision is to prevent important Fascists from converting their real estate holdings into cash and to prevent an easy means of flight from cash which would tend to aggravate inflationary tendencies. Since these two objects can, generally speaking, be furthered only by voluntary transfers as distinguished from transfers taking place by operation of law or by order of a judicial tribunal, it is deemed that involuntary transfers are not within the prohibition and that judicial tribunals need not therefore seek written consent before making orders providing for transfers of real estate, as in the case of bankruptcy sales, foreclosures of mortgages, and transfer of real estate upon death.
- With respect to voluntary transfers, authority has been delegated to S.C.A.C. A.M.G. 5th. Army, by the D.C.C.A.O., of 15 Army Group, to give the necessary consent. Applications for consent to transfer should therefore be sent to A.M.G.; H.Q. 5th. Army. Applications in each instance should be accompanied by the unsigned original deed, so that the S.C.A.O.'s consent may be endorsed on the document to be recorded, and a certificate signed by the notary involved that the purchase price to be paid corresponds approximately with the value of the land. Applications so supported will be granted by the S.C.A.O. unless the purchase involves a very substantial sum, in which event additional information will be sought with respect to the identity of the transferor.

Subject: Real Estate Transfers.

To: All S.C.A.O's.

1. Under Section 1 of Article III. of Proclamation No. 5, no transfer of any interest in lands or buildings may be effected without the written consent of the S.C.A.O. or an Officer empowered by him. The purpose of this provision is to prevent important Fascists from converting their real estate holdings into cash and to prevent an easy means of flight from cash which would tend to aggravate inflationary tendencies. Since these two objects can, generally speaking, be furthered only by voluntary transfers as distinguished from transfers taking place by operation of law or by order of a judicial tribunal, it is deemed that involuntary transfers are not within the prohibition and that judicial tribunals need not therefore seek written consent before making orders providing for transfers of real estate, as in the case of bankruptcy sales, foreclosures of mortgages, and transfer of real estate upon death.

2. With respect to voluntary transfers, authority has been delegated to S.C.A.O. A.M.G. 5th. Army, by the D.C.C.A.O., of 15 Army Group, to give the necessary consent. Applications for consent to transfer should therefore be sent to A.M.G., H.Q. 5th. Army. Applications in each instance should be accompanied by the original signed deed, so that the S.C.A.O.'s consent may be endorsed on the document to be recorded, and a certificate signed by the notary involved that the purchase price to be paid corresponds approximately with the value of the land. Applications so supported will be granted by the S.C.A.O. unless the purchase involves a very substantial sum, in which event additional information will be sought with respect to the identity of the transferor.

Reference your enquiry as to sales of Real Estate by Region I, the following is a copy of a minute of a meeting of SCAC's and AMGOT Hq held at Palermo 20/21 August 1943 under Lord Rennell.

Page 10 of the minutes, para 6 (a) 4.

Matters brought up by Hq

"Allowing real estate sales up to L. 50,000. It was decided that it would be the responsibility of each SCAC to approve the sale if he considers each sale to be at an equitable price."

This minute has been acted on by the SCAC's of Region I, and no other order has been issued on the matter.

It appears that Region I has sought authority for the limit to be raised to L. 250,000 but no reply has been received. It is believed that Finance Section is opposed to this increased limit.

ARTICLE I

Transactions in lands and buildings

SECTION 1. No transfer of any lands or buildings or any interest therein located in Calabria, Lucania or in the Province of Salerno shall hereafter be effected without the written consent of the S.C.M.G. of the Province in which such lands or buildings are situated when

- (a) in the case of gift, the fair value of the property or interest therein transferred exceeds 1,50,000, or
- (b) in the case of sale, mortgage, charge or otherwise, the total consideration for the transfer, in whatever form or manner paid, is in excess of 1,50,000, or
- (c) in the case of lease, when the period thereof exceeds one year and the yearly rental or the value of the consideration received in lieu thereof is in excess of 1,5,000, or if there be no rental or other consideration, the fair yearly value of the tenancy is in excess of 1,5,000.

SECTION 2. Any such transfer or lease or contract therefor made hereafter without such written consent shall be void.

ARTICLE II

PENALTIES

Any person violating any of the provisions of this Order, shall, on conviction by an Allied Military Court be liable to imprisonment or fine, or both as the Court may determine.

REGIONAL ORDER No. 2.

RESTRICTIONS IN DEALINGS IN LAND AND BUILDINGS

I, G.M. McCaffrey, Lieutenant Colonel, Infantry, Regional Civil Affairs Officer of Calabria, Lucania, and the Province of Salerno, by virtue of the powers conferred upon me, HEREBY ORDER as follows :-

ARTICLE I

Restrictions in dealings exceeding L.50.000.

Section One. Any person company or corporation owning or having an interest of any kind in land or buildings in Calabria, Lucania or the Province of Salerno who wishes to sell, exchange, mortgage, charge, or otherwise dispose of the same or of any part or parts thereof for a total sum exceeding L.50.000 or for property or rights other than money of a value in excess of L.50.000. shall apply in writing to the Senior Civil Affairs Officer in which such land or buildings or the greater part thereof are located.

Section Two. The application, accompanied by a copy of the proposed contract, shall set out the following particulars:-

- (a) The names and addresses of all parties concerned in the proposed transaction
- (b) A full description of the subject matter of the proposed transaction.
- (c) A statement of the total amount of money or other consideration being given for the land or buildings.
- (d) The reasons for the transaction.

Section Three. If any dealing or transaction in land or buildings, though in itself involving a consideration whether monetary or otherwise less in value than L.50.000, forms part of a larger transaction or series of transactions of which the aggregate amount or value of the money or property passing exceeds L.50.000 then each such dealing or transaction shall require the consent of the Senior Civil Affairs Officer as provided by this Order.

Section Four. Any dealing or transaction for which consent is required under this Order shall be void and of no effect if completed without such consent.

ARTICLE II

Restrictions on Leasing.

Section One. No lease or letting of any land or buildings for any rent or consideration in excess of Lire 5.000 a year shall be entered into for a term exceeding one year without the written consent of the Senior Civil Affairs Officer of the Province in which such land or buildings are located.

Section Two. Any lease or letting for which consent is required under this Order shall be void and of no effect if such consent shall not have been obtained.

ARTICLE II

Restrictions on Leasing.

Section One. No lease or letting of any land or buildings for any rent or consideration in excess of Lire 5,000 a year shall be entered into for a term exceeding one year without the written consent of the Senior Civil Affairs Officer of the Province in which such land or buildings are located.

Section Two. Any lease or letting for which consent is required under this Order shall be void and of no effect if such consent shall not have been obtained.

ARTICLE III

Penalties

Any person contravening this order shall on conviction by an Allied Military Court be liable to imprisonment or fine or both as the Court may determine, and in addition the consideration (whether in money or in property other than land or buildings or interests therein) passing on any transaction completed without consent may be confiscated.

Major Van Dusen has requested an answer to your memorandum of January 7, 1944, regarding transfers of realty. Colonel Jordan, Regional Legal Officer, has informed me that he has no knowledge of a general, regional or special order which terminated restrictions on transfers of land in Region I where the consideration therefor was not in excess of L.50,000.

Col. Jordan states that the minutes of an S.C.A.O. meeting held by Lord Rennell on August 21 and 22, 1943, will indicate that the origin of the matter under discussion was based on a verbal agreement between the S.C.A.O.'s and Lord Rennell. From knowledge at this Headquarters, no general order would seem to have been issued, but Provincial orders were apparently issued on the basis of the verbal agreement.

AMGOT minutes are not available in Region I, but should be in Naples.
