Two queries arise on the proofs attached hereto:-

(a) The date of General Order No. 4.

It will be recollected that the original of G.O.4 is dated 5 Sept. 1943.

This Order was first published at about that time but the prints then made contained serious errors and it was ultimately decided to make a fresh set of prints for re-posting. According to all the proofs I have of this new copy of G.O.4, the date is given as 5 Sept. 1943, but on looking at the final print of G.O.4, the date is given as 10 October. As I myself had no knowledge of this alteration, I saw Sgt. Soresi of the Printing Dept. who stated that you had instructed him to put in this date when you gave him the final proof before printing. At any rate 5,000 copies have been printed with the date 10 October inserted.

As this Order was first published in early September and as the new print is simply a correct copy of the original Order as signed, should not the original date have been retained and should not the September date appear in the Gazette? Your instructions are requested.

(b) The form of General Order No. 11.

General Order No. 11 appears in the proof for the Gazette as it was originally drawn and as it has been signed by Lord Rennell. It is understood that this Order is being redrawn on the instructions of the Agriculture Division. In these circumstances will it not be best to go to print on the Gazette and omit G.O.No. 11 altogether? Alternatively can the correct form of G.O.11 be obtained soon? Your instructions are sought as there is no point in the printers'

The first proof of the above Manual has now been checked and is attached hereto for your consideration.

The revised forms for use in Allied Military Courts have been included for printing in the Manual.

Major German has suggested that all the Legal Division Directives relating to Allied Military Courts should be included also. I have accordingly prepared the relevant directives for inclusion, but should be glad if you will peruse them and consider their form. As they stand they will be printed as they were sent out, i.e. in letter form. It is wondered whether it would not be better to remove the headings, file references and signatures and simply incorporate the substance of the directives. The numbering of the Directives follows the numbering given in the Folder of Directives recently prepared.

If these Directives are included, it is also wondered whether paras. 4, 5, and 6 of the Final Directive (No. 19), referring to Procs. 6, 8 and 9 should not be omitted. Procs. 6 and 9 have not yet been published in Italy at all and, it seems, may not be published there in their present (i.e. Sicily) form.

A further question to be considered is the composition of a Preface for the Manual.

May these various points have your consideration, please?
