SUBJECT : Price Fixing Orders.

TO : DCMO.

1. Enclosed are proposed orders which we have drafted for the purpose of carrying into effect in Region II the decisions of the Central Economic Committee as to the prices of olive oil, hemp, wheat and petroleum products as set forth in their letters to you of 14th January 1944. Their letters did not contain all of the basic information required to prepare these orders and it was, therefore, necessary for us to obtain additional facts from other sub-commissions and from the Committee.

2. No order has been prepared relating to coal as we have been advised by Mr. Henry Grady that he does not wish to have an order on that subject issued at this time.

3. The enclosed orders have been approved by Mr. Grady.

4. If the orders have your approval they should be forwarded to the DCMO of Region II with instructions to issue them immediately. We enclose for your convenience a draft of an appropriate letter.

SUBJECT : Price Fixing Orders.

TO : HQAO, Region II.

1. The Central Economic Committee of the Advance Administrative Echelon of AFHQ fixed uniform prices for certain commodities and has requested that we make these prices effective in Region II.

2. Enclosed are proposed regional orders which have been prepared for this purpose. These relate to:

- (a) Olive Oil and its By-Products;
- (b) Heap of the 1942 and 1943 harvest;
- (c) Wheat;
- (d) Petroleum Products.

These orders should be issued immediately.

3. You will note that the order relating to wheat is made retroactive to 1 January 1944, and provides for claims as to past sales to be filed with the Office of the Accertamenti Agricoli Comunalì. A similar provision is contained in Ordinance No. 16 issued on 23 December 1943 by the Italian Government as to the four provinces under its control. If this organization is not functioning in all of the provinces in Region II, you should check the order to provide that claims be filed with some other appropriate

These orders should be issued, immediately.

3. You will note that the order relating to wheat is made retroactive to 1 January 1944, and provides for claims as to past sales to be filed with the Office of the Accertamenti Agricoli Comunalì. A similar provision is contained in Ordinance No. 16 issued on 28 December 1943 by the Italian Government as to the four provinces under its control. If this organization is not functioning in all of the provinces in Region II, you should change the order to provide that claims be filed with some other appropriate Italian organization. It may also be necessary for you to issue instructions as to the handling of such claims and to provide through ASFA the funds necessary to pay them by an advance on behalf of the Italian Government to the bank through which the farmers are paid for their wheat. It has not been possible to verify here the proper method of handling such claims.

4. According to previous arrangements, it is understood that you will arrange for printing, publication and distribution in Region III.

5. Please forward to this Headquarters 10 copies of each of the orders as issued.

- (d) Petroleum Products.

No order has been prepared as to the price of coal as we understand from Mr. Tirana's memorandum of 19th January 1944, that the Committee does not wish any order on that subject issued at this time.

4. If the orders are satisfactory to you and to the Committee, please advise us and we will submit them to the D.C.C.A.O. who in turn will forward them to the R.C.A.O. of Region II with instructions that the orders be issued immediately.

1-This is a follow-up to your request to provide an answer to the questions raised by Col. Wilmer and Capt. Dawson regarding the decisions of the C.T.C. and their embodiment in an order to be drafted by the Legal Section.

2-Date of effectiveness of the measures and decisions to be contained in the order: Except where specifically stated to the contrary, in the decisions of the C.E.C., the date of effectiveness would be the date of the promulgation of the order in the province or provinces.

3-Types of wheat. There is a hard and a soft wheat in Italy and there is a differential in the price paid for the two types. This differential has ranged between 20 and 30 lire per quintal in regions I and II during the last harvest. According to the information available in the Agricultural Section, producers' prices for wheat during the 1943 harvest have been as follows (in lire per quintal):

Region II	300	280
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4-Tax differential on petroleum. There is such a differential according to users. Petroleum used for agricultural and fishing purposes ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ is subject to much lower, in fact just nominal, taxes. According to the information available in the Finance Sub-Commission the two types of taxes on petroleum products payable to the Italian Government are as follows (in lire per liter):

5-Coal: Two questions arose under this heading. The first relates to the necessity or appropriateness of including in the present order the decisions regarding coal in view of the fact that coal distribution is at present very restricted and involves mainly official channels which can be much better reached through a directive rather than the public which would be the goal of the present order. Lt. Col. Oxeley, assistant to Brigadier Norman Smith, considered the present inappropriate for making public the decisions regarding coal prices, and suggested waiting until the organization of the distribution of coal by A.M.C. and the civilian bodies. 1. The Central Economic Committee of Advance Administrative Echelon of AFHQ is about to fix uniform prices to be paid in Italy for wheat, olive oil and petroleum products. It is proposed that these prices be made effective in Region II by Regional Orders to be issued by you, in the 15th Army area by orders of the DCOAO there or the RCOAO of the particular region in such area and in the four provinces under the jurisdiction of the Italian Government by decrees or ordinances.

2. The regional orders to be issued by you will be drafted here and sent to you for issuance and distribution. In preparing these orders we should like to know whether you have already issued any regional orders on this subject, and if so, we would like to have copies forwarded here immediately.

3. Also please advise the prices which have been paid since 1 January 1944 and also in 1943 since the occupation, for wheat delivered to the Anasai in Region II.

4. The matter and method of distribution, posting and printing the orders above referred to and subsequent ones of similar import that may be made in the future, are being left to you, but if you do not have printing facilities immediately available, we can arrange for printing here if you will advise us of the number assigned to each order and the number of copies you will require and any other pertinent details. In case of any printing, it would be better, if possible, to have the printing done at some place near you, because of the great difficulty we are experiencing in the transmission of messages etc and particularly bulky articles.

5. Whenever possible we will send you the Italian translation of each order.

6. Please send for our files a copy of each regional order heretofore issued, and three copies of each orders hereafter issued by you, directed to the Legal Sub-Commission.

Dear Gerald: (For Thackrah, in your absence.)

1. I have been asked to work with C.R.C. (Central Economic Council) in connection with legal matters in addition to other duties.
2. The C.R.C. is going to want various price orders issued. Some will be issued in Region II. Some in the four provinces through the Italian Government and some in the 15th Army Group area or in two or all three of these areas.
3. When an order is to be issued in Region II (C.R.C. is not presently interested in Region I) a letter will be directed by C.R.C. to DCCAG AMG. When an order is to be issued in the Area under 15th Army Group a letter will be directed by C.R.C. to the DCCAG 15th Army Group. When a decree or ordinance is to be issued in the four provinces a letter will be directed by C.R.C. to the Deputy President of A.G.C. When more than one area is involved joint letters will be sent. I note from some documents that prices have been fixed by ordinance (see for instance No. 17 relative to olive oil which is to be amended.) in the four provinces.
4. When we get a letter affecting Region II alone or Region II and other areas, we will proceed here to get the order issued in Region II, and I understand 15th Army Group will do likewise as to its area. As these matters are somewhat pressing, it would be advisable for you to make early arrangements at HQ A.G.C. to get a request letter of C.R.C. as quickly as possible.
5. As to olive oil, it is going to be necessary for the Italian Government to issue either a new ordinance in its entirety in substitution for No. 17 or an ordinance amending the prices only. I will have to have immediately a copy of what the Italian Government does in this instance as it becomes the basis of what is done in Region II, likewise the 15th Army Group area must be accordingly advised.

ORDINANCE NO. 17

GENERAL FOOD COMMISSION

THE GENERAL FOOD COMMISSIONER

Having seen Ordinance No.2 of October 11, No.5 of November 10, No.9 of December 16, of this year, of this Commission; and considering the opportunity of increasing prices for olive oil and its by-products in relation to the cost of production; establishing the necessity of retaining the monthly ration of oil

ORDERS

Art.1- the price of olive oil and its by-products to correspond to the producers for the entire territory during 1943-44, are established as follows:

Art.2- For oil already reported and delivered to the Ammasso, either directly to the Ammasso agency or deposited in the storehouses of authorized dealers or industrialists, the General Food Commission will pay directly to the producers the difference between the prices fixed in art.10 of Ordinance No.2 and those indicated in the previous art.1.

The interested parties must make request to the General Food Commission and document same with the delivery receipt issued by the Ammasso agency.

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OVER

Art.3- The agricultural producers who at the date of publication of this Ordinance have sold oil olives from the territory, will advise this General Commission of the lots of olives sold and the sales' prices, so that this Commission can, on the basis of adjustment of the price of olives to the new price of oil, place the respective producers in condition to obtain the difference. The notification, as above, must be previously signed for confirmation by the buyer of the olive lots for which the price difference is demanded.

Art.4- To the effects of passage from the Amasso to the purchasing assignees, edible oils are distinguished in the following qualities and at the prices indicated:

Oil, superfine, Virgin, with acidity up to 1 degree	per quintal L.2.618
Pine Olive oil, with acidity up to 2.7 degrees	" " 2.543
olive oil with acidity up to 5 degrees	" " 2.458
Purified oil A	" " 2.543

Art.5- For transmission of oils from the purchasing assignee to local wholesaler and from local wholesaler to retailer, the increase quotas fixed in articles 9 and 10 of Ordinance No.5 remain unchanged.

Art.7- As for that which is not specified in the present Ordinance, the regulations set ^{established} in the previous No.2, No.5 and No.9 remain in force.

Art.8- Whoever be in possession of olive oil illegally held, in violation of amasso instructions, can deliver same within twenty days from the date of the present Ordinance without incurring any penalties.
