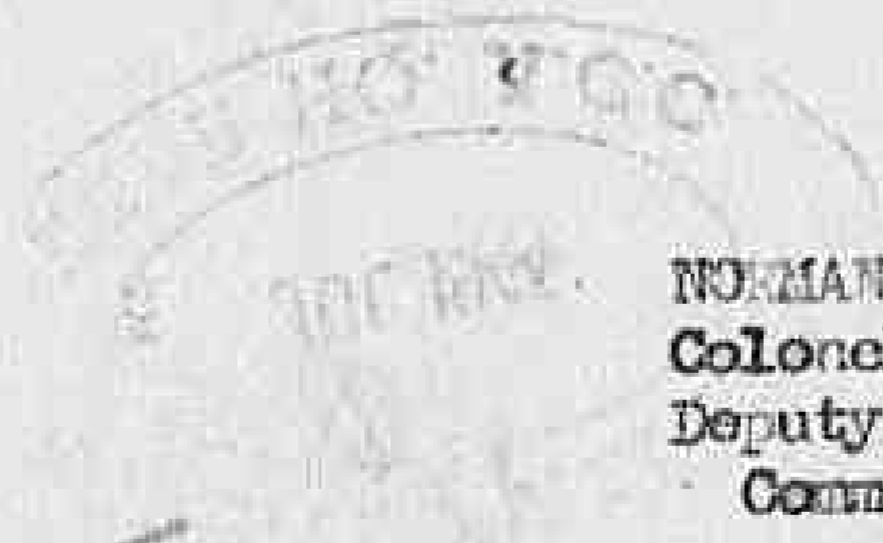

Please refer to attached undated draft directive setting up Internees and Displaced Persons Sub-Commission, which commission has jurisdiction over the Allied Nationals Camp at Palermo - a copy of a Summarized monthly report of the Camp is also attached - The Commandant of the Camp is Lt. Charles P. Clark, C.M.P. (A).

Lt. Plamenac (Yugoslav) status has never been clarified. He has represented himself as being a member of the Yugoslav Military Mission which mission represented the Royal Yugoslav Government (King Peter) and was attached to the Internees and Displaced Persons Sub-Commission to look after Yugoslav Nationals. As to the other Yugoslav Reynold Macun (it is believed he is now in Naples with some Yugoslav Committee) he states he was and still is an attache of the Yugoslav Foreign Office. He was confined to prison by Italian Authorities as a Political Internee for a period of 2 years - having been released by Allied Authorities in August 1943 at the time of the invasion of Sicily. He has never enjoyed any official position in connection with the administration of the Camp, since the writer took over in November 1943. He was more or less recognized as a colleague and aid of Plamenac.

At the time these moneys were obtained - August and December 1943 - said moneys were advanced by AMG on a loan basis to the Italian Government by and through the Prefect of Palermo, which Government assumed financial responsibility for the operation of the Camp.

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There is no Yugoslav Military Court or Court Martial available in Sicily.

It is suggested Lt. Col. Wilmer confer with Major Driffield White (B) A.C.C. Headquarters Naples - who is familiar with the activities of the Camp. It is also suggested that the representative of the Internees and Displaced Persons Sub-Commission who is located in A.C.C. Headquarters Naples be consulted, also representatives of the Yugoslav Military Mission located at Bari.

DRAFT DIRECTIVE
Governing the Function of
SUBCOMMISSION

50

1. COMMAND.

The Subcommission will be under the command of the Chief of the Political Section of the Allied Commission in conformity with such further directives as may be included concerning the functions of the Subcommission.

2. MISSION.

To care for and to dispose of in accordance with instructions of AFHQ persons not being American or British Empire nationals who are interned or have been displaced.

3. MAJOR FUNCTIONS.

The Subcommission will perform the following functions:

18

- (a) Obtain all information possible regarding internees and displaced persons in Italy, enemy or enemy occupied territories and forward it to the Political Vice President for submission to Allied Intelligence Staff at AFHQ when necessary.
- (b) Arrange with appropriate authorities when possible for the provision of employment for such persons subject to instructions of AFHQ.
- (c) Assist accredited representatives of foreign government in respect of their nationals, subject to instructions of AFHQ.
- (d) Arrange with appropriate authorities for the provision of accommodation, food, clothing and welfare and health services for such persons.
- (e) Arrange for such movements of internees and displaced persons as may be ordered or become necessary, subject to the policy of AFHQ.:-

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- (a) Obtain all information possible regarding internees and displaced persons in Italy, enemy or enemy occupied territories and forward it to the Political Vice President for submission to Allied Intelligence Staff at AFHQ when necessary.
- (b) Arrange with appropriate authorities when possible for the provision of employment for such persons subject to instructions of AFHQ.
- (c) Assist accredited representatives of foreign government in respect of their nationals, subject to instructions of AFHQ.
- (d) Arrange with appropriate authorities for the provision of accommodation, food, clothing and welfare and health services for such persons.
- (e) Arrange for such movements of internees and displaced persons as may be ordered or become necessary, subject to the policy of AFHQ.:-

The Subcommittee will directly:-

- (a) Supervise the work of the Italian Government and of approved agencies dealing with foreign internees and displaced persons; these agencies include the American and British Red Cross.
- (b) Assist Prisoner of War Organizations in respect of displaced persons subsequently found to be prisoners of war, particularly with technical instructions and information.

4. OTHER ACTION REQUIRED.

The Subcommittee will bear in mind the importance of security. For this purpose staff will be provided for intelligence duties including interrogation and use will be made of accredited officers provided by the respective governments of the United Nations. Full investigation into the credentials of personnel will be carried out while they are in internment camps. Personnel will not be released prematurely. Internees and displaced persons will be classified early.

- (a) to indicate nationality, and whether
- (b) political prisoners, or
- (c) prisoners of war, or
- (d) deserters from an enemy army, and their
- (e) respective political outlook.

Information regarding the number in categories (b), (c), and (d) above should be forwarded urgently, through Allied Intelligence Staff to AFHQ, for onward transmission to combine Chiefs of Staffs. Reliable information as to negligence or maladministration on the part of Italian authorities of individuals concerned with the supervision, direction, or management of internment camps causing hardship and/or suffering will be collected and forwarded to AFHQ for onward transmission.

5. METHOD.

(a) All foreign displaced persons will be retained originally in the camps in which they are found. American and British Empire nationals are the only persons originally to be excluded from the category of "displaced persons". Displaced persons, other than those of Italian nationality, who can support themselves by private means, may not be required to live in camps but they will be subject to full investigations and classification. Displaced persons of Italian nationality, including refugees and exauees, are the responsibility of the Italian government, operating through a Committee of its own appointment, which will be supervised by a branch of the Subcommittee.

(b)(i) Displaced persons will be cared for in the initial emergency stage by AMG assisted by the Subcommittee (including Red Cross Personnel) and also, it is expected, by the P.O.W. Subcommittee and by the Chief Surgeon.

(ii) As soon as possible they will be transferred to the control of the Subcommittee, under which Red Cross personnel have agreed to serve.

(iii) An initial emergency stage will always exist when an internment camp is first taken over, which will be handled as in (b) (i) above, even after Allied Control Commission is functioning.

(c) All displaced persons other than enemy nationals will be

lire advance to one Reynold Macun (Yugoslav).
TO : Regional Commissioner.

1. In connection with the High Commissioner's
memo, the following statement on the subject is repro-
duced from my monthly Report of 5 February 1944 which
was forwarded to the I. and D.P. Sub Commission with
supporting data with a copy to A.C.C. Hqts.-

"" With respect to the 45,000 lire obtained by
Lt. Macun (Yugoslav,) the following facts are submitted:

On 6 December 1943, Lt. Macun presented a voucher
for 45,000 lire to the writer for signature. When asked
what this 45,000 lire was to be used for, he replied :
"It is for Camp expenses" and further added " You are the
first officer to question such a request; Major Witte and
other officers connected with the Camp never questioned
such a request." At any rate, the voucher was signed.

On 8 January, Macun was asked to furnish a state-
ment as to the disposition of this 45,000 lire. After
repeated requests, Macun on 15 January submitted the
attached accounting marked " Exhibit D ". When queried
as to who authorized him to make these disbursements, his

reply was: " No one, but Lt. Plamenac (Yugoslav,) approved them. "

On 24 January, Lt. Plamenac submitted a statement dated 23 January and attached to " Exhibit D " offering to make restitution for a portion of the 45,000 lire.

Two facts are submitted in connection with this 45,000 lire incident : a) There was a very definite understanding among Lieutenants Plamenac, Macun and myself that no salaries or disbursements other than for food were to be made under any circumstances without my approval. b) This 45,000 lire item does not appear in the Camp Cash Book. "

2. In addition, the following extract is reproduced from a Report dated 23 January 1944 from Lieutenant S.M. Mc Graw to the Chief Accountant Sicily Region Hqs.. This Report was the result of a request by the writer for an audit of the Books of the Allied Nationals Camp.

" One incident which has caused Lieut. Clark some uneasiness, and which calls for a full explanation from the officer concerned, is reported. In December Lieut. Reynold Macun approached Lieut. Clark and requested an advance of lire 45,000 stating that the cash was required for Camp administrative expenses. On this understanding the advance was authorized: Lieut. Macun obtained the money but failed to give an accounting of it until requested by the Camp Commandant to do so, and he has now submitted the following details:-

He paid himself a salary at the rate of lire 5,000 a month from 17th August to the end of November,	17,500
A locksmith's account,	1,030
Clothes for Dr. Radovanovic,	2,000
Official journey to Lipari,	4,500
Pay to Sgt. Jancic (cheuffer) Sept. Oct. Nov.,	7,500
Clothes for do,	2,877
Car repairs,	4,693
Rent for quarters (Macun's), and repairs,	4,900

None of this expenditure (which remarkably enough totals exactly lire 45,000) was, of course, authorized by the Camp Commandant, and Lieut. Macun had no right whatsoever to pay himself a salary dated back to August, nor to pay three months' salary to Sgt. Jancic. He has been asked to give details of his expenses on the " official journey to Lipari ", but he has so far failed to comply. It is suggested that Lieut. Macun be instructed to furnish forthwith a full explanation.

The transactions do not appear in the Cash Book.

Another instance of an application by Macun for an advance might be mentioned. On 30th September 1943 he addressed a letter to the Chief Finance Officer asking for authority for an advance of lire 62,371 to enable him to cash Postal Orders in the possession of certain Yugo-Slavs in the Camp. Macun stated in his application that the amount would be claimed from the "Yugo-Slav Fund". It is understood that no such fund exists, and that the only way in which repayment could be made was from the periodical advances made to the Camp by AMG. for administrative purposes. It might be considered that the C.F.O. was misled by the words "Yugo-Slav Fund" when authorizing the advance."

3. With respect to the 62,371 lire item, a facsimile of the original request is attached and marked Exhibit A.

4. As to the 62,371 lire advance, the writer takes no position since this advance was made prior to my assumption of duties.

5. As to the 45,000 lire, the writer takes the position that despite the fact he affixed his signature as Camp Commandant to the voucher which permitted them to secure the money, such signature was obtained fraudulently by Plamenac and Macun (Yugoslavs) in that they both represented these moneys were to be used for the purchase of necessities for the members of the Allied Nationals Camp.

The evidence clearly shows that not one cent of these moneys went towards the purchase of a single item of food or any other necessity in connection with the activity of the Camp.

It is obvious therefore that the writer when called upon by the Office of the Prefecture to approve the amounts in question could not conscionably justify or approve the 45,000 lire item. As to the 62,371 lire item, the writer, for reasons hereinbefore set out, does not assume responsibility.

Being mindful, that sometimes in the future, the writer may be called upon by competent authority to justify the approval of this 45,000 lire, it is respectfully requested that the means employed as well as the disposition of the moneys by Plamenac and Macun (Yugoslavs) be the subject of an investigation if for no other reason than to fix responsibility in the premises.

Chiesta per iscritto la produzione dei documenti giustificativi complementari con lettera 11 Febbraio u.s. di numero pari alla presente, diretta al Sig. Lt. Charles P. CLARK, via Bari 8, questi veniva a conferire col V. Prefetto Comm. Dr. Arturo LENTINI, e spiegava che i documenti giustificativi sono in suo possesso, ma che egli non può inoltrarli perchè ve n'è un gruppo di L.45.000, corrispondenti ad un'anticipazione di ugual somma in data 8 Dicembre 1943, con ordine di pagamento n.792 al Dr. Reynold Macun, perchè ritiene che i documenti stessi non costituiscono titolo valido e legale per il discarico della spesa.

Lo stesso Lt. CLARK pregava il V. Prefetto LENTINI di chiedere al Dr. Macun spiegazioni in proposito.

E' da notare che la richiesta fondi di L.45.000 che diede origine all'ordine di pagamento della Prefettura, dietro autorizzazione del Capo dell'Ufficio Finanziario di

allora Capt. BECKER, fu sottoscritta dallo stesso Lt. CLARK.

Il Dr. Reynold MASON chiamato in Prefettura spiegò al V. Prefetto LENTINI che la richiesta fondi fu a suo tempo concordata col prefato Lt. CLARK e col Ten. PLAMENAC ed era pacifico che essa non dovesse servire per operazioni strettamente attinenti al Campo Jugoslavo, ma, per competenza e spese, cui egli aveva diritto, suffragate poi da normali pezzi giustificativi consegnate al Lt. CLARK.

Stando così le cose, la Prefettura scrivente è in condizione di non potere conseguire le desiderate giustificazioni di spesa tanto per le lire 45.000 in questione quanto, per le altre somme anticipate, non avendo indubbiamente i poteri per derimere la controversia insorta tra i due ufficiali avanti citati.

Fertanto, prega cotesto Quartiere Generale di compiacersi intervenire, al fine di dare alla questione una definitiva e legale sistemazione, per il fatto anche, che la Prefettura deve dare giustificazione e rendiconti di tutti i pagamenti effettuati durante il periodo d'occupazione agli uffici finanziari superiori italiani.

This sum I suggest may be accounted for at this stage through the mentioned fund.
