Subject: Posting of Proclamations on Re-occupation  
of Italian Government Territory.

To : Regional Legal Officer (thru RG) Region 6.

1. Reference your HQ/2101 dated 30 Jun 44.
2. In the first place the proclamations in loose-leaf and booklet form sent to you under letter ACC/1022/10/1 of 23 Jun 44 were for informatory purposes only with no intention of their being posted in that small form at any time.
3. In the event of the situation arising as set out in our letter ACC/4438/L of 8 May 44, that certain portions of the territory now controlled by the Italian Government come under Allied Military Government, Proclamations 1 - 4 and Notices 1 and 2 (New Series), which are separate and printed on large size paper both in Italian and English, will be posted in the normal manner. For this purpose 1000 copies of each of the above proclamations in poster form were forwarded to you by R C & M G Section on the 5th Jun 44. Confirmation of this is contained in letter from R C & M G Sec Ref/270/32/CA dated 26 Jun 44, copy of which was sent to you. Publication of proclamations in newspapers would not be regarded as sufficient public notice. The actual posting of the proclamations has always been deemed essential.
4. Possibly some confusion exists in your mind about proclamations being compressed. Proclamations 1 - 4 (New Series) consist of some fifteen of the old series of proclamations which were revised in the light of experience and compressed into four proclamations of the new series.

1. Your ACC/4002/10/L dated 23rd June 1944 together with enclosures (quantity correct) are acknowledged.

2. I am not entirely clear as to the method of posting or publishing these in the event of territory being brought under A.M.G. It was understood that Proclamations 1 to 4 were to be compressed onto one sheet of small type. The proclamations in pamphlet form are of course obviously unsuitable for posting. Is it intended that the Proclamations should be published in the press and copies of the pamphlets deposited with the Italian Authorities at Capitals of Provinces and other important centres without any attempt being made to "post" copies?

3. It would appear essential even if there is to be no "posting" but merely reproduction in newspapers that translations of the Proclamations should be made available. Is it intended that publications should be made in both languages?

4. May above matters be clarified, please?

SUBJECT : Reoccupation of Italian Controlled Territory.

TO : Regional Commissioners, Region I, II and VI.

1. It is the ever present possibility that AMG may have to be reimposed in certain areas of territory which has been turned over to the Italian Government. To the end that this may be done rapidly and effectively in an emergency, it is desired that Regional Commissioners make detailed plans in their respective regions to handle such situations as might reasonably be expected to arise. Plans should include personnel, transportation, supply and communications and officers concerned should be thoroughly advised in advance what their responsibilities would be in such an emergency.

2. The restoration of Military Government is a corollary to the use of Allied troops to control civil disorder. Orders for the imposition of Military Government, when the occasion arises, will be issued by this Headquarters. Regional Commissioners may at any time move the necessary personnel and transport to an effected area prior to receipt of orders, in order that it may be prepared to deal promptly with the situation.

3. When detailed plans have been prepared, please forward copies to these Headquarters.
