Now that the Province of Naples has been restored to Italian Administration it may be convenient, in as far as the military situation will permit, to explore the possibility of placing as much as may be desirable of the purely civil administration of the Comune of Naples itself under the Italian services. I refer to such matters as the field of education, asylums, charitable institutions, municipal bus services and so forth.

As it would be necessary to define what public services and institutions might be properly included in such an arrangement, perhaps you would kindly give us the benefit of your views hereon.
