So far as past court cases were concerned I understood that the Legal Subcommittee would have completed its reviews and would have finished with the records of all past cases by August this year at the latest.

The work proposed in this file covers only Southern Region. What is the situation as regards other regions?

There is a possibility that the A.C., including the Legal Subcommittee, may be abolished in the near future and its functions taken over by G-5, in which case records must be passed to Archives.

Is it necessary to have such a detailed and elaborate card index? To fill in all these particulars in respect of all regions is a very large task.

I approve this scheme in principle provided it does not entail taking on additional staff and before giving approval of the expenditure applied for I should like to have an estimate of the number of cases which have got to be card indexed in this way.
