thereas a total prohibition on the transfer of lands and buildings, and of interests therein has been imposed by order of the Allied Military Government, and,

thereas it is now deemed advisable partially to amend and modify the said prohibition,

now, therefore, I, Marion Stanley Smith, U.S.A., Major, Brigadier, Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer, hereby order as follows:

Article Two.

Partial suspension of restrictions.

Section One. Transfers of lands or buildings, or any interest therein, in the occupied territory, whether by sale, mortgage, charge or otherwise, may, except as provided in Section 2 of this article, be freely effected, subject to applicable provisions of Italian law, when the consideration paid for the transfer is not in excess of L. 50,000,000. Gifts of cash, lands, buildings or interests therein may be similarly effected when the fair value of the land, building, or interest does not exceed L. 50,000,000.

Section Two. The provisions of Section One of this article shall not be applicable to individual transfers of portions of the same parcel of land, or of different parcels owned by the same person, when such transfers form part of a series of transactions in which the total consideration received by the grantor for all transactions in the series or the total fair value of all of the properties transferred exceeds

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and modify the said prohibition.

Now, therefore, I, Milton Stanley Lamb, U.S.S., M.C., Brigadier, Deputy Chief of Staff, hereby order as follows:

Article VIII.

Article VIII. Prohibition of Transfer.

Section One. Transfers of lands or buildings, or any interest therein, in the occupied territory, whether by sale, mortgage, charge or otherwise, may, except as provided in Section 2 of this article, be freely effected, subject to applicable provisions of Italian law, when the consideration paid for the transfer is not in excess of L. 30,000. Gifts of such lands, buildings or interests therein may be similarly effected when the fair value of the land, building, or interest does not exceed L. 30,000.

Section Two. The provisions of Section One of this article shall not be applicable to individual transfers of portions of the same parcel of land, or of different parcels owned by the same person, when such transfers form part of a series of transactions in which the total consideration received by the grantor for all transactions in the series or the total fair value of all of the properties transferred exceeds L. 30,000. Such transfer in such a series of transactions, except the first transfer, may be effected only in accordance with the provisions of Article Two hereof.

Article IX.

Article IX. Special Licenses.

Section One. Transfers of lands or buildings, or of any interest therein, in the occupied territory, whether by sale, mortgage, charge or otherwise, when the total consideration to be paid for such transfer

is in excess of \$5,000, and gifts of such lands or interests when the fair value of the land, building or interest is in excess of \$5,000, and any such transfer of such lands, buildings or interests as is described in Section Two, Article One hereof may only be effected with the written consent of the Senior Civil Affairs Officer of the province in which the land is situated.

Section Two: The Senior Civil Affairs Officer shall give his consent to such transfers only when he is satisfied that the proposed transaction or series of transactions is bona fide and that the consideration for which the transfer is made is fair and equitable.

Article Three.

Leases.

Nothing contained in this Order shall be taken to amend, terminate or modify the existent prohibition against leases of land, buildings or interests therein for a term longer than one year.

Article Four.

Enactment.

Any person violating the provisions of this Order shall, on conviction by an Allied Military Court be liable to imprisonment or fine, or both, as the Court may determine. All transfers made to be made in violation of the provisions of this Order shall be void and of no effect.

Article Five.

Effective Date.

This Order will become operative in each province or part thereof within the occupied territory on the date of its first publication

therein.

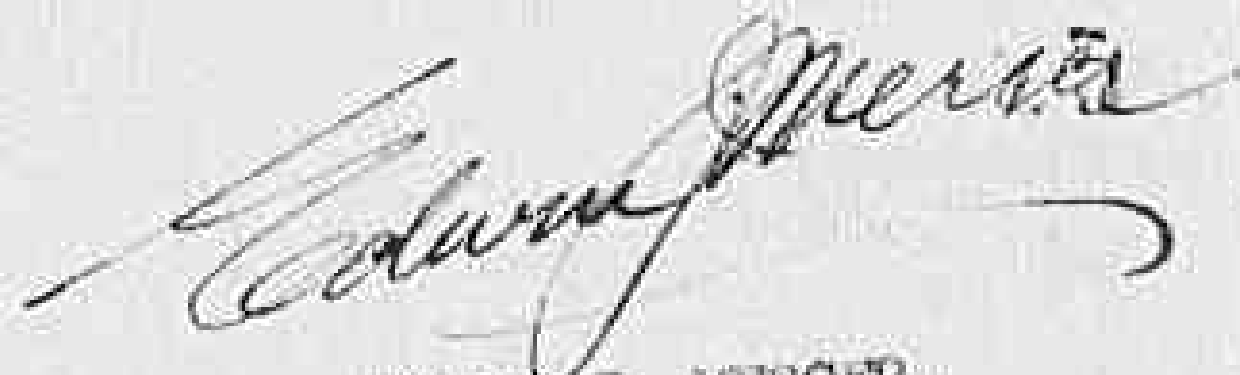

LABOR RELATIONS

Whereas in Sicily by General Order No. 8 and in Calabria, Lucania and the Province of Salerno by Regional Order No. 5, the Fascist Corporative Syndicate System was dissolved and a method provided for reestablishing and assuring freedom of labor organization;

Now, therefore, in furtherance of the objectives of said General and Regional Orders, I, CHARLES M. SPOFFORD, Colonel, G.S.C., Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer, hereby order as follows :

ARTICLE I

Right of Organization

Employees shall have the right to organize, hold meetings, and select representatives of their own choosing for the purpose of collective bargaining with respect to all matters pertaining to or connected with their employment, including such matters as concern hours, wages, working conditions, grievances, disputes and mutual social and economic assistance.

ARTICLE II

Effective Date

This Order shall become operative in Sicily, Calabria, Lucania and the Province of Salerno on the date hereof.

ALL INFORMATION CONTAINED HEREIN IS UNCLASSIFIED

The recent inquiry which was transmitted to us concerning the present status of insurance companies in California Province, and to which we have replied under cover date (10/21/44), indicates the urgent need for action to clarify the present position of all financial institutions in that Province.

4. It is our understanding that in certain portions of the Province, including the city of San Francisco, Resolution No. 5 was posted in the first days of occupation. Captain GILBERT, recently Vice Consul General of the Financial Division, stated that he had in fact been done. Although his subsequent removal of the resolution may have served to prevent its recognition in fact, it did not serve to destroy its legal effect. Any action must, therefore, be taken to terminate the navigation and reveal certain prohibitions created by that resolution.

5. In my course of the Province in which Resolution No. 5 was posted General Order No. 3 should forthwith be published. It will not be necessary to do this on an extensive scale, and if inquiries are made as to its meaning in a community in which the resolution was never enforced it will be sufficient to state that it is intended solely to strengthen out a record when in law is presently confirmed. At the fact of the General Order the 10-19 should direct a date which will state the order effective immediately upon posting.

6. In those countries in which Resolution No. 5 has never been posted, if there are such countries, no action need be taken. It is our understanding that if such places exist a special notice prohibiting land transactions has been published. As yet that prohibition, whether it results from the resolution or from the special notice, has not been carried out officially.

The recent inquiry which was transmitted to us concerning the present status of Indians comprises in 200/205/203, and to which we have replied under date (200/205/203), indicates the present need for action to clarify the present position of all concerned institutions in that Province.

2. It is our understanding that in certain portions of the Province, including the city of Chibougamau, Resolution No. 5 was posted in the first days of occupation. Captain GILBERT recently told the Chief of the Provincial Division that that had in fact been done. Although the subsequent removal of the Resolution may have served to remove its recognition in fact, it is not known to what extent its legal effect. Any action must, therefore, be taken to terminate the situation and to call certain prohibitions created by that Resolution.

3. In any corner of the Province in which Resolution No. 5 was posted General Order No. 5 should forthwith be published. It will not be necessary to do this on any extensive scale, and if inquiries are made as to its meaning in a community in which the Resolution was never enforced it will be sufficient to state that it is intended merely to strengthen out a report which in law is presently confirmed. As the fact of the General Order the 200 should direct a date which will give the order effective immediately upon posting.

4. In those corners in which Resolution No. 5 has never been posted, if there are such corners, no action need be taken. It is our understanding that if such places exist a special notice prohibiting land transactions has been published. As yet that prohibition, whether it results from the Resolution or from the special notice, has not been removed or modified.

One of the needs which becomes more and more pressing as time goes on is for law books. It occurred to me that you might possibly be able to tell us whether there is any chance of our getting hold of a few really essential volumes. We cannot, of course, afford to be particular about the authors; what we need most are a few basic texts on English and American criminal law and on those aspects of international law which deal with problems of citizenship and nationality. The only law books which were issued to us and which dealt at all with these subjects were Roscoe's Criminal Evidence and Hall's International Law (6th ed: 1924). You will realize fully why these are not adequate to serve our needs. The second volume of Oppenheim, useful as it is for many matters, is no help on any problem of citizenship, and Hall is so antiquated that it is no longer reliable.

If there is any help which you can give us in meeting this need it will be greatly appreciated.

I'm hoping you may turn up in these parts again and for a less hurried visit.

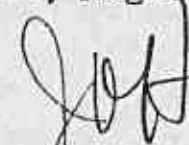
