AUG ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION NO.1.

Administration of areas under

AMG H.Q. 15 Army Group.

1. Under the original arrangements AMG 15 Army Group (Forward HQ) was to have consisted of only the two AFICOM detachments within Fifth and Eighth Armies and the headquarters detachment at H.Q. 15 Army Group. The area to be administered by AMG 15 Army Group was to have consisted of the occupied territories in the two army areas. The southern boundaries of the two army areas were then the same as the northern boundary of No. 2 Military District, namely, the northern boundaries of the Italian provinces of Salerno, Potenza and Basilicata.

2. Recently the AMG 15 Army Group has been called forward and has in fact taken over the administration of Reggio province under the command of S.C. A. C. Eighth Army. On the west side Provinces AMG personnel and civilian staff called forward and has been divided into AMG 15 Army and Region III. Moreover, the southern boundary of Eighth Army area has been moved north of Naples and the Region III has installed and is operating in the provinces of Campania (Molfetta) Benevento and Avellino.

3. It is anticipated that in the near future the southern boundary of Eighth Army will be moved north. When this occurs Naples province will be excluded from the jurisdiction of S.C. A. Eighth Army and it may in addition to this provision to Region IV.

4. In view of the decision to hand over AMG portions I and II to the Italian government and the other portions to the Commission, the question arises whether the captured areas which are neither in Eighth Army nor in the Region III are to be passed over to the Italian authorities. It would be No. 36. of that it is not the intention to hand over any more territory than that which is south of the line described (line 1), the southern boundaries of the provinces of Salerno, Potenza and Basilicata to the Commission.

5. After discussion with HQ, General J. McNaughton, A.C.S., A.T.H.Q. and O.G.A. of AMG 15 Army, it is agreed that the consequence of COO-in-C 15 Army handing over the areas will take charge of all occupied territories south of the line - Salerno Line, whether these territories are Italian or British, French and Belgian Army zones. In effect therefore COO 15 Army Group will have control under the Military Government of S.C. A. C. A. C. Eighth Army and the AFICOMs have full jurisdictional powers by S.C. A. C. A. C. Eighth Army and the AFICOMs in the two Army areas. On Regions III and IV.

Fifth and Eighth Armies and the headquarters detachments of the 12 Army Group. The area to be administered by HQ CO 15 Army Group was to have consisted of the occupied territories in the two army areas. The southern boundaries of the two army areas were then the same as the northern boundary of No. 2 Military District, namely, the northern boundaries of the Italian provinces of Salerno, Potenza and Bari.

2. Recently I ordered to provide for the occupation of further territory personnel. HQ Region IV has been called forward and has in fact taken over the administration of Foggia province under the command of S.C.A.O. Eighth Army. On the west side Ninth Army HQ personnel with their local staff called forward has been divided into HQ Fifth Army and Region III. Moreover, the southern boundary of Ninth Army area has been moved north of Naples and HQ Region III is installed and operating in the provinces of Campidie (Apulia) Benevento and Avellino.

3. It is anticipated that in the near future the southern boundary of Eighth Army will be moved north. When this occurs Dossena province will be excluded from the jurisdiction of S.C.A.O. Eighth Army and it is my intention to call this province to all the provinces of Salerno, Potenza, and Bari.

4. In view of the decision to hand over HQ Regions I and III to the Italian Government the Army HQs for the 12 Command, the question arises as to what will happen to the occupied areas which are neither in Fifth and Eighth Army areas nor in the area to be handed over to the Italian authorities. It may however be stated that it is not the intention to hand over any more territory than that which is south of the line described (namely, western boundary of the provinces of Salerno, Potenza, and Bari) for the time to come.

5. After discussion with General J. Holmes (U.S.) A.P.H.Q.) and C.G.S. HQ CO 15 Army Group in the consequence of COC-in-C 15 Army Group being given full control of all occupied territories in the area west of Salerno line, whether these territories are within or behind Fifth and Eighth Army areas. In effect therefore COO 15 Army Group will have control under the Military Governor of S.C.A.Os Fifth and Eighth Armies (subject to the existing arrangement whereby S.C.A.Os Fifth and Eighth Armies have full jurisdictional control of C.A. personnel and carry out affairs in the two army areas) on the S.C.A.Os Regions III and IV.

6. The two S.C.A.Os and the two I.C.A.Os will deal with personnel and administrative matters affecting their detachments as follows:

S.C.A.Os VIII and IXth Armies will send their casualty returns etc. direct to HQ 15 Army Group where they will be consolidated and submitted as a whole to the Army and the authorities together with returns for HQ 15 Army Group civilian and other American and British administrative matters. The details of the civilian and other American and British administrative matters will then be submitted to C.H.Q. (L.S.) or to C.H.Q. 2nd Section as appropriate direct. Th transmission will be forwarded to HQ H.Q. Palermo until such time as the HQ can be sent to HQ 15 Army Group direct.

2.

R.C.A.Os Regions III and IV will compile and consolidate their own personnel and administrative returns as separate units and forward them to HQ AIC 15 Army Group for onward transmission as has been laid down in the preceding paragraph.

7. Officers of administrative policy relating to the territories under administration S.C.A.Os Fifth and Eighth Armies will receive general directions from C.O.A.O. 15 Army Group but remain as heretofore directly under C.O.A.O. with no Eighth Armies. R.C.A.Os Regions III and IV will report directly to and come under C.O.A.O. 15 Army Group for all purposes until their territories, or parts of their territories, have been handed over to the Italian authorities under the direction of the Allied Control Commission.

8. All accounts in the areas under HQ 15th Army Group will be maintained in the name of the appropriate region; and will be submitted monthly through normal channels to the C.P.O. 15 Army Group. The accounts will be examined and forwarded to the Chief Accountant of the Region concerned. Care must be taken to ensure that Finance Officers of 5th and 8th Armies operating in forward areas maintain a different set of books for each region.

9. A further order will be issued defining the boundaries.

1. Instructions for rendering Confidential Reports on British Army officers and Recommendation for Change of Employment are contained in H.C.I. 515/43 and L.T.H.Q., C.E.O. 510/43. A summary of these instructions with the procedure to be adopted for officers of AMG, 15 Army Group is set out below. Copies of the H.C.I. will be forwarded when they are available.

TYPES OF REPORT.

2. The types of report now in use are given below. In order that all the relevant facts in connection with each case may be readily at the disposal of the Army Council, the following forms will be used:

- (a) A.P.B. 1943 - Recommendation for advancement or promotion.
- (b) A.P.B. 1943 - Service Report.
- (c) A.P.B. 1943 - Recommendation for change of employment (not confidential).
- (d) A.P.B. 1943 - For use to render a periodic report or other report on an officer called for by higher authority for which A.P.B. 1943, D, E, or F, is inappropriate.
- (e) Reports on unsuitability on account of incapacity due to age will be submitted in letter form.

- 3. The initiating officer for each report will be a British Army officer not below the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel under whom the officer reported on is immediately serving. The initiating officer will sign the report in the space "Signature of Reporting Officer".
- 4. Where the officer reported on is serving with AMG 5th or 8th Army the report will be forwarded in quadruplicate to this H.Q. with a covering letter signed personally by the S.C.A.O. or his deputy stating who the officer substantiates the report from his own personal knowledge, and adding any further remarks he wishes to make. The space on the report for "Remarks

GENERAL

1. Instructions for rendering Confidential Reports on British Army Officers and recommending for Change of Employment are contained in A.O.I. 545/43 and A.P.D. 1., G.R.C. 510/43. A summary of these instructions with the procedure to be adopted for officers of Air, 15 Army Group is set out below. Copies of the A.O.I. will be forwarded when they are available.

TYPES OF REPORT

2. The types of report now in use are given below. In order that all the relevant facts in connection with each case may be readily at the disposal of the Army Comptroller, the following forms will be used:-

- (a) A.P.D. 19/C - Recommendation for advancement or promotion.
- (b) A.P.D. 19/E - Service Report.
- (c) A.P.D. 19/F - Recommendation for change of employment (not confidential).
- (d) A.P.D. 19/G - To use to render a periodic report or other report on an officer called for by higher authority for which A.P.D. 19/D, E, or F, is inappropriate.
- (e) Reports on unsuitability on account of incapacity due to age will be submitted in letter form.
3. The initiating officer for each report will be a British Army officer not below the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel under whom the officer reported on is immediately serving. The initiating officer will sign the report in the space "Signature of Reporting Officer".
4. Where the officer reported on is serving with 42 5th or 8th Army the report will be forwarded in quadruplicate to this H.Q. with a covering letter signed personally by the S.C.A.O. or his Deputy stating whether he substantiates the report from his own personal knowledge, and adding any further remarks he wishes to make. The space on the report for "Remarks of Superior Reporting Officer" are for completion by the O.C.A.O.
5. All officers responsible for the submission of these reports must realise that, with the exception of reports on A.F.B. 194/P, they are strictly Confidential. Extraordinary care must be taken that they are treated as Confidential documents.
6. In compiling reports the following points will be strictly observed:
  - (a) It is essential that reports should be precise and that the use of vague terms or expressions be avoided.

- (b) The officer's exact rank, e.g. "Lieut (7/S Capt Major)", must be stated together with his Person No., type of Commission, e.g. "R.A. 3.0.", Regiment or Corps, age, medical category and whether P.S.C., S.O., etc.
- (c) Under the heading of "present employment" will be included the grade of his Staff appointment, e.g., "M.S. 15 Artillery Group, C.M.O. (G.S.C.III)."

A.P.B. 194D - Recommendation for Promotion

7. These reports may be made at any time and S.C. in Os 5th and 8th Armies will from time to time review the qualifications of all British Officers under their command with a view to initiating A.P.B. 194D for those officers considered suitable for promotion. British officers cannot be promoted until A.P.B. 194D has been submitted to A.R.H.Q. through the usual channels.

8. On no account will the officer reported on be informed that A.P.B. 194D has been initiated.

9. If a superior reporting authority disagrees with a recommendation put forward on A.P.B. 194D and is not prepared to forward it to higher authority he will inform the initiating officer accordingly and thus give guidance as to the standard required.

10. If for any reason an officer is no longer considered fit for promotion after the submission of a report this H.Q. will be notified immediately by the S.C. concerned.

A.P.B. 194E - Adverse Report

11. An officer who is unsatisfactory should be told of his shortcomings before a report is rendered. A report in which it is stated that an officer has not been warned previously loses much of its force.

12. A.P.B. 194E will not be used in the following cases:

- (a) Where the report is that the officer is inefficient only on account of lack of training.
- (b) If the case is a disciplinary nature it will be dealt with by disciplinary procedure.

13. The initiating officer will personally show his report to the officer concerned and point out to him why the report will be forwarded to the Army Council. The officer responsible on will initial the report and may make marks of it but he will not be given a copy. The initiating officer does not need to initial the report with it but only that he is aware of its contents. An officer cannot refuse to initial a report.

14. If a superior reporting authority does not concur in the report

7. These recommendations will be made at any time and S.C. On 5th and 8th Armies will from time to time review the qualifications of all British Officers under their command with a view to initiating A.F.B. 194D for those officers considered suitable for promotion. British officers cannot be promoted until A.F.B. 194D has been submitted to A.T.I.Q. through the usual channels.

8. On no account will the officer reported on be informed that A.F.B. 194D has been initiated.

9. If a superior reporting authority disagrees with a recommendation put forward on A.F.B. 194D and is not prepared to forward it to Higher authority he will inform the initiating officer accordingly and thus give guidance as to the standard required.

10. If for any reason an officer is no longer considered fit for promotion after the submission of a report this H.Q. will be notified immediately by the S.C. concerned.

A.F.B. 194E - Adverse Report.

11. An officer who is unsatisfactory should be told of his shortcomings before a report is rendered. A report in which it is stated that an officer has not been warned previously loses much of its force.

12. A.F.B. 194E will not be used in the following cases:

- (a) Where the report is that the officer is inefficient only on account of lack of training.
- (b) If the case has a disciplinary aspect it will be dealt with by disciplinary procedure.

13. The initiating officer will personally show his report to the officer concerned and point out to him that if it is signed on it will rest with the Army Council. The officer concerned on will initial the report and may make notes of it but he will not be given a copy. The initialling of a report does not mean that the officer agrees with it but only that he is aware of its contents. An officer cannot refuse to initial a report.

14. If a superior reporting authority does not concur in the report on A.F.B. 194E and is not prepared to do so to higher authority the officer reported on will be so informed. On the other hand whenever the remarks and recommendations of a superior reporting officer are more adverse than the original report they must be shown to and initialled by the officer reported on.

15. In cases where a initiating officer recommends that an officer be called on to resign. Commission he will inform the officer, if he is of military age (i.e. at present under 51 years of age), that the effect of the recommendation if accepted by the Army Council will be that he will be liable for service under the provisions of the National Service (Armed Forces) Act. If punishment or commission is recommended an interview

will be granted to the officer reported on by the British Commissioner next superior to the initiating officer. An officer has no right to claim an interview with any other superior officer except as stated in sub para 16(c) below.

16. The rights of an officer who disagrees with the report made on him on A.P.B. 1943 are given in detail in sub para 4(l), (n) and (o) of A.C.I. 545/43. They may be summarised as follows:
- He may submit an appeal under Sec 42 of the Army Act or he may, even if he feels he is not suffering injustice, make a representation not amounting to an appeal under Sec 42 of the Army Act. The appeal or representation will be submitted to the initiating officer who will forward it via the report. Both the initiating officer and the British member next superior to him will at the same time forward their comments on it. The comments will not be seen by the officer reported on.
  - He may appeal under Sec 42 of the Army Act against a decision of the Army Council.
  - If called on to submit an application to retire or resign his commission he may apply for an interview with a member, or a deputy of a military number, of the Army Council under King's Regulations 1940 para 236.

#### A.P.B. 1943 - Recommendation for Change of Employment.

17. A.P.B. 1943 will not be considered as a confidential report. On no account should it be used to enclose a report on an officer on A.P.B. 1943.

18. In completing reports the following points should be noted:
- The reporting officer must state positive reasons why an officer is recommended for a change of employment and not quote negative reasons why an officer should not remain where he is.
  - A.P.B. 1943 will be completed in close collaboration with the officer concerned so as to ensure the disclosure of any qualifications which will assist the reporting officer in making his recommendations for alternative employment.

19. A.P.B. 1943 will be initiated by the officer on whom the report is made. He may make an appeal under Sec 42 of the Army Act or submit a representation.

20. A list of employments outside A.W.C. for which officers may be recommended is given in the Appendix to A.C.I. 545/43.

  - (b) A.P.B. 1948 will be completed in close collaboration with the officer concerned so as to ensure the disclosure of any qualifications which will assist the reporting officer in making his recommendations for alternative employment.
  - 19. A.P.B. 1948 will be initialled by the officer on whom the report is made. He may make an appeal under Sec 42 of the Army Act or submit a representation.
  - 20. A list of employments outside A.M.G. for which officers may be recommended is given in the Appendix to A.C.I. 545/43.
- A.P.B. 1948 - Periodic Report.
- 21. Reports will be made on all officers relinquishing Staff appointments and on all officers serving in the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel, Colonel or Brigadier on completion of six months in their appointments. These reports will be made on A.P.B. 1948 unless the officer is recommended for retirement.
  - 22. A.P.B. 1948 will not be shown to the officer reported on.
  - 23. Separate instructions will be issued regarding the submission of this report.

A.P.L. • FINANCIAL RECORDS ORDER NO. 479, DATED 17TH SEPTEMBER 1943.

479. Transactions between British Army and Allied Military Government of  
occupied Territory (U.S.A.)

Permitting the issue of complete instructions on accounting for goods  
and services exchanged between the British Army and A.G.C., similar records will  
be maintained by all British depots, formations and units which may issue to,  
or receive from,盟友 countries, supplies and services. The records should not  
include goods and services provided by the British Army for the personnel of  
A.P.L., A.E. regiments, patrols, hospital treatment, billets, etc. It is agreed  
and service provided to A.G.C., which A.G.C. in turn issues to the local  
authorities and population, e.g., Army latrines provided for sale to the civilian  
population and works services for the civil population or local authorities  
conducted by the Army on behalf of A.G.C., which are to be recorded at this stage.

1. Receipts and issues of all such issues of stores, supplies and  
services to A.G.C. will be given to A.G.C. for all record  
and services received by the British Army from their organization.
2. The records will be prepared on the first day of each month to the  
Financial Advisor (Finance) U.S.A. The first record will be rendered on  
the 2nd October 1945 and will embody all relevant transactions up to that date.  
Wherever possible, voucher numbers will be quoted on the records, or an extra  
copy of the voucher will be forwarded therewith, but care must be taken  
that there is not retaining one copy of such vouchers.
3. The records will be prepared on the first day of each month to the  
Financial Advisor (Finance) U.S.A. The first record will be rendered on

47B. Transactions between British Army and United Nations Government of  
Cochinchina Territory (M.A.C.T.)

Permit the issue of complete instructions on accounting for goods and services exchanged between the British Army and M.A.C.T., simple records will be maintained by all British depots, hospitals and units which may issue to, or receive from, Army stores, supplies and services. The records should not include goods and services provided by the British Army for the personnel of M.A.C.T., e.g. rations, petrol, hospital treatment, billets, etc. It is understood that services provided to M.A.C.T., which will in turn be used to the local authorities and populations, e.g. Army Nations provided for sale to the civil population or local authorities contracted by the Army on behalf of M.A.C.T., which are to be recorded at full charges.

1. Permits the issue of complete instructions on accounting for goods and services exchanged between the British Army and M.A.C.T., simple records will be maintained by all British depots, hospitals and units which may issue to, or receive from that organization.
2. Records must be secured for all such issues of stores, supplies and services to M.A.C.T. Similarly, records will be given to M.A.C.T. for all supplies and services received by the British Army from that organization.
3. The records will be forwarded on the first day of each month to the Financial Master (British). The first record will be rendered on 1st October 1942 and will embrace all transactions up to that date. Whenever possible,oucher numbers will be noted on the records, or an exact record book of theoucher will be forwarded therewith, but care must be taken that such a record can only be used for such vouchers.
4. Depots and other accounting units will render all records when applicable.

5. M.A.C.T. will impose on their dependents either or not the goods and services are for the civilian population or local authorities.
