There is no permanent government revenue at the moment as nothing has been decided upon and recently removed except one account regarding revenues and expenses of the Italian Red Cross.

There is no Trade Taxation taxes existent in Central Italy other than sub division of 100 million.

Italians are very poor and Government expects to have post offices now operating for all services except mail and some postal and telegraph services. Letter will be handled directly between towns. Other of country roads remain unaffected. In view of this, annual expenditure probably amounts to heavy owing demands which include oil transportation to remote provincial towns. Situation generally good.

POST AND TELEGRAPH

Post offices have been suspended temporarily. Increasing revenue and Government expected to have post offices now operating for all services except mail and some postal and telegraph services. Letter will be handled directly between towns. Other of country roads remain unaffected. In view of this, annual expenditure probably amounts to heavy owing demands which include oil transportation to remote provincial towns. Situation generally good.

TELEGRAPH
Important local still in various short supply. Local telegraph important information to central areas from parts of country now existing.

TELEPHONE
Telephone lines are being established.

TELETYPE
System of telegraph machine contains no permanent localistic problems. Average 4-7 times a day being reported. Localistic being attained along lines of Salerno & Genoa. Localistic facilities and destination machines being suspended.

Activities of the Central Economic Committee will be
included in the report to be forwarded by A.C.C.
The AMFA report will be submitted as an annex to the
A.C.C. report.

The first situation report is required at A.F.H.Q. by 8 Jan.

2. Situation reports will be completed by G.S.O.1 from brief
telegraphic sentences to be forwarded by Heads of Divisions to G.S.O.1
on the evenings of the 6th, 13th, 20th and last day minus two of each
month. Nil reports are required. It is suggested that each
Division open a special file for these reports. Registry will arrange
to bring these up on the morning of the day on which reports are
required.
