During the time of their domination, the Germans, looted, burned, and damaged or destroyed completely, public building and private homes; they stole, linen, cars, trucks, typewriters, and money.

The total amount of damage is estimated at 12,162,243 Lire. In addition, the damage done to factories and construction works has not as yet been estimated.

111 people lost their lives at the hands of the Germans.

The following is an account of the atrocities committed:

At approximately 15:30 September 29, 1943
MARTELLOTTI ECISA, daughter of the late PASQUALE, born
in Naples September 11, 1874 residing on the third floor
of No. 10 VIA ARANELLA, was killed by the Germans while
closing her window.

DE MARTINO ASSUNTA, daughter of GIOVANNI, 11 years old, was killed at 1500 on September 29, while crossing Piazza Arenella.

The Germans threw a number of hand grenades at the farm called "PEZZALONGO" located at No. 88 Via Funtelate, forcing the people who were concealed there to come out in the open. The brutes thereupon slaughtered them. The following were the victims:

(1) VARRIALE VINCENZO - age 34

(2) CEMBROLA VARRIACE, 24 years old.

VARRIALE GENNARO, age 31 - was
seriously wounded.

(3) ESPOSITO TERESA daughter of the late ALFONSO was killed while her niece TINA SICA, age 11, and her nephew SALVATORE SICA, age 14, were seriously wounded. MORRA FERGIMANDO son of late LIUGI, age 76, a farmer, was also killed.

(4) RUSSO GIOVANNI son of VITALE, and an unidentified Sicilian sailor were killed.
