SUBJECT: Officers' Mail.

Dear Colonel,

1. Referring to our conversation last night, I think a legitimate complaint may be made as to surface mails addressed to WAF & ODF. I have been out here exactly 3 months and the Weekly Time has regularly been addressed to us since 25th of Aug. and no copy has ever arrived; they have been addressed to M.C.S. A.F.M.C.; Military Government School and Folding Centre A.P.H.Q.; A.H.C. and C.M.F. successively.

The same applies to a regular tobacco allowance.

Two parcels and two packages did arrive in the early days (about the middle of Sept.) but I have received no surface mail of any sort since, though I know that from time to time books and parcels have been sent out to me.

2. With regard to air mail I personally have no complaint and letters normally take 10-12 days here and 12-14 days out but a large number of other officers have not been so fortunate. This has been particularly noticeable since the large body moved from Fisi-Ourou rather over a month ago. Officers (for example Major Theckrah) who regularly received mail at Fisi-Ourou have received none since and I feel reasonably confident that some hold-up is occurring there.

3. With regard to airmail letters Col. Todd told us last night that his daughter writes to him absolutely regularly twice a week and in over 2 months he has received only two airmails numbered respectively 9 & 14 and the remainder have gone astray. I have never received an airmail letter myself but possibly this is because none have been sent.

4. Forgive me troubling you with the above but I think it is a mat-

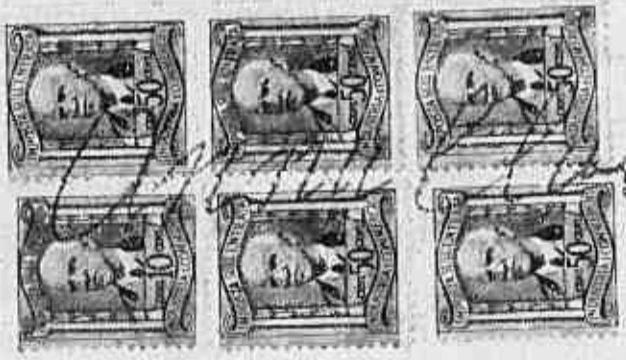
