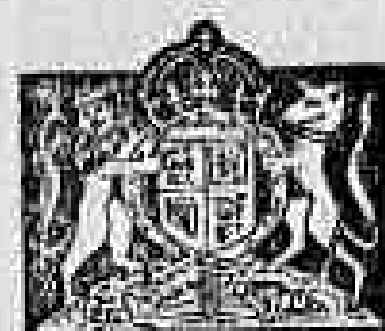

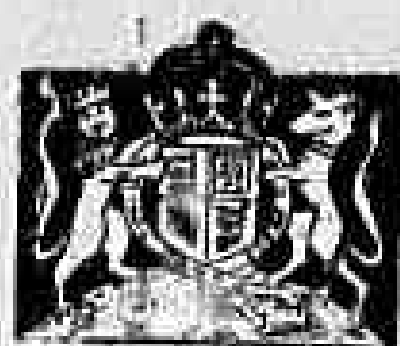

Police Force Discipline

REGULATION No. 1

This Regulation is made under Article 22 of Tripolitania Police Force Proclamation No. 4 as amended by Tripolitania Police Force (Amendments) Proclamation No. 74.

1. APPLICATION.

This Regulation applies to all members of the Police Force except Officers. It does not apply to any member of the Armed Forces of His Britannic Majesty or His Allies employed by the Force or to the Carabinieri Reali or any other person entitled to be treated as a prisoner of war under the Geneva Convention of 27th July 1929.

2. INTERPRETATION.

In this Regulation

- (a) «Inspector» includes Chief Inspector and Sub-Inspector but does not include British Inspector or Assistant British Inspector.
- (b) «Sergeant» includes First Sergeant and Second Sergeant.
- (c) «British Inspector» includes Assistant British Inspector.

3. OFFENCES AGAINST POLICE FORCE DISCIPLINE

Any member of the Police Force of or below the rank of British Inspector who

- (a) fails in any of the duties imposed upon him as a member of the Force;
- (b) wrongfully exceeds or abuses any of the powers conferred on him as a member of the Force;
- (c) strikes or offers violence to anyone who is his superior in the Force;
- (d) deserts or assists any other member of the Force to desert;
- (e) displays cowardice in the execution of his duty;
- (f) fails to deliver up in good order any arms, clothing, equipment or other articles in his charge when lawfully called upon to do so by any superior;
- (g) wrongfully destroys, damages or otherwise disposes of any articles the property of the Force or damages or loses the same by culpable negligence;
- (h) absents himself from duty;
- (i) disobeys or fails to observe any of the Standing Orders of the Commissioner of Police which it is his duty to observe, or any lawful order given to him by his superiors;
- (j) is guilty of any conduct which is prejudicial to good order and the discipline of the Force;

shall be guilty of an offence hereunder.

4. ATTEMPTS.

Any attempt to do any of the acts made an offence by Paragraph 3 of this Regulation shall itself be an offence and may be punished as if the act had been completed.

5. ARREST.

Any officer, British Inspector, Inspector or non-Commissioned Officer of the Police Force may arrest any member of the Police Force of either equal or junior rank whom he reasonably suspects to have committed an offence under Paragraph 3 of this Regulation save that only an officer or British Inspector may arrest a British Inspector.

6. INVESTIGATION OF CHARGE

- (a) Any person arrested under Paragraph 3 of this Regulation shall be brought before an officer of the Police Force without delay and in any case within forty-eight hours of arrest. If for any reason it is impracticable to bring an arrested person before an officer within forty-eight hours of arrest, this fact and the reason thereof shall be reported in writing to the Commissioner.
- (b) Every officer before whom is brought a person charged with an offence under these Regulations shall inquire into the charge without delay.

7. SUSPENSION FROM DUTY.

The Commissioner may order suspension from duty of any member of the Force.

8. POWERS OF OFFICERS TO TRY SERGEANTS AND BELOW.

Any officer of the Force may inquire into any charge under Paragraph 3 of this Regulation against a member of the Force below the rank of Inspector, and shall keep a record of such inquiry and if the accused is below the rank of sergeant and is found guilty, may impose on him one of the following punishments:—

- (a) reprimand;
- (b) severe reprimand;
- (c) fine not exceeding 7 days' pay;
- (d) confinement to barracks up to 7 days with or without punishment drill;
- (e) up to 12 punishment drills.

But if the accused holds the rank of sergeant and the officer conducting the inquiry does not dismiss the charge against him or if the accused is below the rank of sergeant and such officer is of the opinion that the offence deserves a more severe punishment than he may impose he shall refer the case and immediately forward the record to the Commissioner.

9. POWERS OF COMMISSIONER TO TRY SERGEANTS AND BELOW.

The Commissioner may inquire into any case referred to him under Paragraph 8 of this Regulation and shall keep a record of such inquiry and if he finds the accused guilty may impose on him one of the following punishments:—

- (a) reprimand;
- (b) severe reprimand;
- (c) fine not exceeding 14 days' pay with or without reduction in rank;
- (d) confinement to barracks for a term not exceeding 14 days with or without punishment drill or reduction in rank or both;
- (e) up to 12 punishment drills;
- (f) reduction in rank;
- (g) deprivation of proficiency or trade pay with or without any of the above;
- (h) dismissal.

But if the Commissioner is of the opinion that the offence deserves a more severe punishment he shall cause the accused to be charged before a General Military Court.

10. POWERS OF COMMISSIONER TO TRY BRITISH INSPECTORS AND INSPECTORS.

The Commissioner may inquire into any charge under Paragraph 3 of this Regulation against a British Inspector or Inspector and shall keep a record of such inquiry and if he finds the accused guilty he may recommend to the Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer his dismissal from the Force or may impose on him one of the following punishments:—

- (a) reprimand;
- (b) severe reprimand;
- (c) fine not exceeding 14 days' pay with or without forfeiture of seniority or reduction in grade or rank;
- (d) forfeiture of seniority;
- (e) reduction in grade or rank.

But if the Commissioner is of the opinion that the offence deserves a more severe punishment he shall refer the matter to the Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer.

11. POWER OF DEPUTY CHIEF CIVIL AFFAIRS OFFICER TO DISMISS BRITISH INSPECTORS AND INSPECTORS.

The Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer may dismiss from the Force any British Inspector or Inspector whose dismissal is recommended by the Commissioner under Paragraph 10 of this Regulation.

12. **POWER OF MILITARY COURT TO PUNISH OFFENDERS UNDER THIS REGULATION.**

With the exception of officers and British Inspectors any member of the Force who commits an offence under this Regulation shall on conviction by a General Military Court be liable to imprisonment up to five years or a fine up to 96,000 M.A.L. or both.

13. **REPLACEMENT OF LOSS.**

Any member of the Force of or below the rank of British Inspector convicted of an offence under Paragraph 3(f) or (g) of this Regulation may in addition to any other punishment be ordered by the Commissioner to make good out of his pay or otherwise the whole or any part of the cost of repairing or replacing any article damaged, destroyed or lost as a result of the offence.

14. **DEPRIVATION OF PAY.**

Any member of the Force of or below the rank of British Inspector shall forfeit his pay in respect of every day during which he is undergoing any sentence of imprisonment and if convicted of the offence of being absent from duty under Paragraph 3(h) of this Regulation he shall forfeit his pay in respect of every day during which he is found to have been so absent. The Commissioner may order that any such member convicted of any offence shall forfeit up to one half of his pay in respect of any day during which he was suspended from duty or under arrest on account of such offence.

15. **DISCHARGE AND REDUCTION IN RANK.**

Any member of the Force of or below the rank of British Inspector who is inefficient in the performance of his duties or unfit to carry out his duties may be discharged or reduced in rank or grade, in the case of a British Inspector or Inspector, by Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer and, in the case of anyone of less rank, by the Commissioner.
