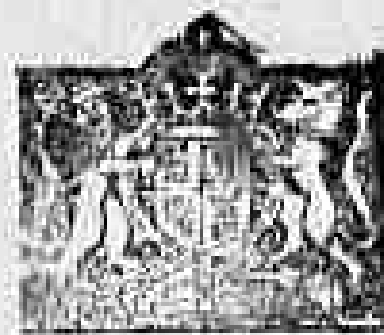

Article 4 is therefore modified as follows: «The number of shareholders

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is unlimited. Apart from those who took part when the Deed of Constitution was drawn, any person may become a shareholder of the Company:

(a) All those who, when they apply, carry out the business and have a shop at Suk Rbaa el Ghedim;

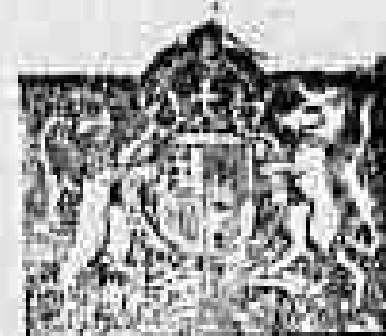

PROCLAMATION No. 85

I, TRAVERS ROBERT BLACKLEY, Brigadier, *Hereby Proclaim:*—

ARTICLE 1.

Standing Military Court. — There shall be established a Standing Military Court consisting of not less than five officers to be appointed by the Chief Administrator.

ARTICLE 2.

Extent of Jurisdiction over Territory. — The jurisdiction of each officer of the Court shall extend over the whole of the occupied territory.

ARTICLE 3.

Extent of Jurisdiction over Persons. — (a) The jurisdiction of the Court shall extend over all persons found in the territory except those who are members of the Armed Forces of the Belligerents and those who if captured would be entitled to be treated as prisoners of war under the Geneva Convention of the 27th July, 1929.

(b) Any civilian who is subject to British Military Law by reason of the fact that he is employed by or in the service of or a follower of or accompanying any of His Britannic Majesty's troops except British Inspectors and Assistant British Inspectors of the British Military Administration Police Forces shall be liable to be tried by the Standing Military Court for any offence under any Proclamation.

ARTICLE 4.

Summary and General Courts. — Any single officer of the Court shall constitute a Summary Court and any three officers of the Court when convened by the Legal Adviser shall constitute a General Court but the Legal Adviser may, for good reason entered on the record, recommend and the Chief Administrator may upon such recommendation constitute a General Court consisting of two officers, or one. If a Court consists of two officers and their opinions differ, that of the senior shall prevail, and if of three the majority opinion shall prevail.

ARTICLE 5.

Competence and Powers of General Courts. — A General Court may try any one charged with any offence under any Proclamation, Order or Regulation, and may impose any punishment thereby authorized.

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ARTICLE 6.

Competence and Powers of Summary Courts. — A Summary Court may try any one charged with any offence under any Proclamation, Order or Regulation, but may not impose any punishment greater than imprisonment not exceeding five years and fine not exceeding ninety-six thousand M.A.L.; provided that when appointing any officer to the Standing Military Court, the Chief Administrator may further limit the maximum punishment which he may impose when sitting as a Summary Court.

ARTICLE 7.

Assessors. — Every Civil Affairs Officer in charge of a District shall appoint a panel of assessors for his District. Every Military Court sitting in that District may if it thinks fit select two or more assessors from the panel to sit with the Court. The duty of the assessors shall be to hear the evidence and express their opinions at the end of the trial. The opinion of each assessor shall be recorded, but in arriving at its decision the Court shall not be bound thereby.

ARTICLE 8.

Advocates. — Any person authorized by the Legal Adviser to practise as an advocate shall have the right of audience in any Military Court. The Legal Adviser may revoke any such authority for reasons communicated in writing to the Advocate. Any Military Court may authorize any person to assist the accused in his defence.

ARTICLE 9.

Appeal and Review. — Any person convicted by a Military Court may appeal against the conviction or the sentence or both or against any order made by the Court by lodging at the Court within fifteen days of his conviction, a petition addressed to the Chief Administrator. And the Chief Administrator or the Legal Adviser may at any time call for the record of any case for the purpose of review.

ARTICLE 10.

Procedure on Appeal or Review. — On any such appeal or review and in every case which results in a sentence of death the record shall forthwith be transmitted to the Chief Administrator who may:—

- (a) confirm the finding and sentence, or
- (b) quash the conviction if it appears to be wrong, or
- (c) reduce or vary the sentence if it appears to be excessive, or

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- (d) order the retrial of any convicted person if it appears that there was any excess of jurisdiction or other irregularity in the proceedings of the Court, or
- (e) substitute for the finding of the Court any other finding at which the Court could have arrived on the evidence and confirm or reduce the sentence;

and may in any event annul or vary any order given by the Court trying the case but not so as to increase the total penalties.

ARTICLE 11.

Confirmation of Death Sentence. — A sentence of death even if confirmed by the Chief Administrator shall not be carried out unless further confirmed by the Chief Civil Affairs Officer.

ARTICLE 12.

Suspension of Sentence. — On the lodging of an appeal the officer of the Court receiving it may order the suspension of the sentence pending the decision of the Chief Administrator and if the sentence is a term of imprisonment, he may also order the appellant to be released on bail.

ARTICLE 13.

Binding Over. — When a person is convicted of any offence not punishable with death the Court may instead of passing sentence discharge the offender upon his entering into his own recognisance with or without sureties in such sum as the Court may think fit, on condition that he shall appear and receive judgment at some future sitting of the Court or when called upon.

ARTICLE 14.

Fines. — Whenever a Military Court imposes a fine it may give such directions as appear to be just with respect to payment and in default of payment, may order the accused to be committed to prison for a period not exceeding one year or may order the seizure and sale of such of his property as is necessary to secure the payment of the fine.

ARTICLE 15.

Proceedings to be Public. — The proceedings of every Military Court shall be public unless the Court orders otherwise for reasons of military necessity which shall be entered on the record and any particular person may be excluded by the Court from any proceedings for reasons which shall be similarly entered.

ARTICLE 16.

Publication of Proclamations. — In the principal Courthouse of every District there shall be available for inspection by the public:

- (a) all Proclamations from time to time in force,
- (b) all Regulations made under any Proclamation and applying in the District,
- (c) the Rules of Procedure prescribed for Military Courts,
- (d) the names of the officers of the Court, and their powers of punishment when sitting as a Summary Court,
- (e) the names of the Assessors for the District,
- (f) the names of all persons authorized to practise as advocates.

ARTICLE 17.

Procedure on Questions of Jurisdiction over Persons. — Where at any stage of the proceedings it appears that any person accused before the Court might be exempt from its jurisdiction, the Court shall forthwith suspend the trial and shall determine as a preliminary issue whether the accused is or is not to be exempt. The finding on the preliminary issue together with the record of the case shall forthwith be sent to the Chief Administrator for his decision.

ARTICLE 18.

Rules of Procedure. — The rules of procedure shall be those prescribed by the Chief Civil Affairs Officer for use in occupied territory in the Middle East but the Chief Administrator may make such additional rules not inconsistent therewith as he considers necessary.

ARTICLE 19.

Forfeiture. — (a) Upon a conviction the Court may order the forfeiture of any movable property used or intended to be used in the commission of the offence or of any products or profits resulting therefrom, except where such property belongs to a person not privy to the offence and lawfully entitled to retain the same; and may further order that any article forfeited hereunder be sold in any manner consistent with obtaining a fair price and that the proceeds of such sale be disposed of in such manner, including payment or part payment of any fine imposed upon the offender, as to the Court may seem just.

(b) Before making any order of forfeiture under (a) the Court shall ascertain and record the value of the property affected and shall take into account the gravity of the offence and any penalty imposed.

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(c) The forfeiture of any article produced before the Court may be ordered even when no conviction has been pronounced if its possession, use or manufacture constitutes an offence or requires a permit or authority which is not forthcoming.

(d) Where a Military Court convicts a person of having committed an offence punishable under the laws of the Occupied Territory in force at the date of the Occupation it shall have power to exercise such powers of forfeiture in connection with the offence as could have been exercised by the Courts of the Territory under such Laws.

(e) The powers of forfeiture hereby conferred will be exercised only if and in so far as the justice of the case permits.

ARTICLE 20.

Revocation. — Proclamations Nos. 3 and 76 are hereby revoked without any prejudice to the previous effect thereof.

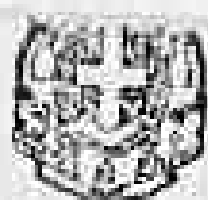

Tripoli Harbour Passes**PROCLAMATION No. 42.**

I WILLIAM JAMES MILLER, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Brigadier, HEREBY PROCLAIM:—

Article 1. — Definitions: In this Proclamation, «Harbour Area» means those parts of the City of Tripoli adjoining the harbour, moles, docks, quays and waterfront and bounded on the landward side by a wire fence.

«Pass» means any card or document issued by the competent authority entitling the person whose name it bears to enter the Harbour Area.

Article 2. — Unlawful possession of passes: (i) No person other than the person to whom it has been properly issued by the competent authority shall be in possession or control of a pass or of any card or document purporting to be a pass.

(ii) No person to whom a pass has been issued shall retain it or be in possession thereof after the expiry of the period of validity endorsed thereon.

Article 3. — Return of passes: (i) Every person to whom a pass has been issued shall return it to the issuing authority on the expiry of the period of validity endorsed thereon.

(ii) Any person to whom a pass has been issued for the purpose of employment in the harbour area and who ceases or is unable for more than 48 hours to continue to be so employed shall immediately deliver up his pass to the issuing authority notwithstanding that the period of its validity may not then have expired.

Article 4. — Unlawful disposal or acquisition of passes: (i) No person to whom a pass has been issued shall sell, barter, give, lend or otherwise dispose of or part with the possession of such pass to any other person (except for the return thereof to the issuing authority) or wilfully destroy, lose or abandon the same.

(ii) No person shall purchase, borrow, receive or otherwise acquire a pass (except for the receipt thereof from the issuing authority).

(iii) No person shall mutilate, alter, falsify or make any addition to or erasure from a pass.

(iv) No person shall forge or manufacture any card or document purporting to be a pass.

Article 5. — Unlawful use of passes: No person to whom a pass has been issued for the purpose of employment in the harbour area shall.

(i) enter or be in any part of the harbour area which he is not required to enter or be in for the purpose of his employment, or

(ii) enter or be in any part of the harbour area at any time when he is not required to be there for the purpose of his employment.

Article 6. — Penalty Clause: Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Proclamation shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction by a Military Court to imprisonment for a term not exceeding Ten Years or to a fine not exceeding Five Hundred Pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine.

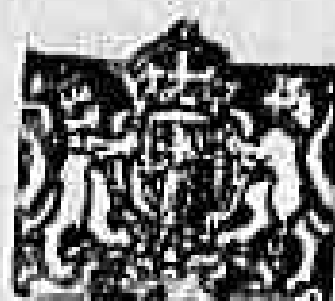

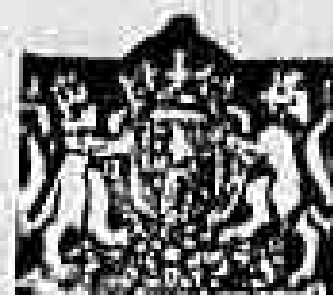

1. The public are warned that, notwithstanding the occupation of Tripolitania by the Armed Forces of His Britannic Majesty and of His Allies, the Laws relating to the Tobacco Monopoly remain in full force.
2. Proceedings under the monopoly laws will not be taken, however, against persons who have cultivated tobacco or have had tobacco cultivated on their behalf during the year 1943 without the authority of the Administration of Monopolies provided such persons declare all tobacco so cultivated to me or to the nearest Civil Affairs Officer not later than the 31st day of July 1943 in the case of persons residing within the Municipal Area of the City of Tripoli and not later than the 10th day of August 1943 in the case of persons residing elsewhere within the Territory.
3. Provided that the tobacco is duly declared as aforesaid the cultivators will be paid a fair price in accordance with the quality and condition of the tobacco.
4. Proceedings will be taken against any person found to have cultivated tobacco during the year 1943 which is not duly declared as aforesaid.
5. Declarations must be in writing and must state:—
 - (i) Measurements of area cultivated and precise location.
 - (ii) Type of tobacco cultivated.
 - (iii) State of cultivation at the time of declaration and whether the tobacco is still growing or harvested.
 - (iv) If harvested, the location of the tobacco.
 - (v) Surname, name, paternity and address of person on whose behalf the tobacco was cultivated.
 - (vi) Surname, name and paternity and address of declarant.

I, WILLIAM JAMES MILLER, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Brigadier, HEREBY PROCLAIM as follows:—

Article 1. — Every person who, whether solely or jointly with any other person or persons, is in possession or control of any establishment or machinery for the manufacture of wine shall declare the same by delivering particulars thereof in writing to the Director of Agriculture at the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries, Via Frascadi, Tripoli, before the 21st day of July 1943 or outside Tripoli to the nearest Civil Affairs Officer before a date to be fixed by him and duly published.

Article 2. — No person shall manufacture wine without a licence obtained as hereinafter mentioned.

Article 3. — Licences for the manufacture of wine for the period 1st July, 1943 to 31st December, 1943 may be obtained on application made to the Director of Agriculture before the 21st day of July 1943 or outside Tripoli to the nearest Civil Affairs Officer before a date to be fixed by him and duly published.

WHEREAS the British Military Administration has imported certain quantities of tea, sugar and cotton piece goods for sale to certain persons as prescribed herein;

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to regulate the sale and distribution of such goods;

NOW THEREFORE, I, WILLIAM JAMES MILLER, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Brigadier, HEREBY PROCLAIM:—

Article 1. — Such goods will be sold only to persons who sell their grain to the British Military Administration in accordance with the Control of Sale and Movement of Grain Order No. 21 and Agricultural Notice No. 1 and whose names have been registered by the Civil Affairs Officer for the District in which they reside in a register to be prepared and signed by him in respect of each village in the District and to be known as the Village Register, copies of which may be inspected at the office of the Civil Affairs Officer or on demand made to the Sheikh of the Village or to the appropriate merchant appointed as hereinafter mentioned.

Article 2. — Such goods will be sold on behalf of the British Military Administration by merchants to be appointed by the Civil Affairs Officer by notice under his hand duly published.

Article 3. — Every merchant shall sell such goods to any person duly registered in the appropriate register prescribed by this Proclamation up to the quantity shown opposite the name of such person in the register.

Article 4. — The prices to be paid for such goods shall be as follows:—

Article 5. — No merchant shall charge more than the price fixed by this Proclamation.

Article 6. — No merchant shall sell, supply, give or otherwise dispose of such goods to any person except one who is registered in the Village Register for the village or villages in respect of which the merchant is appointed and no person except one so registered shall acquire such goods from a merchant.

Article 7. — (i) Every merchant to whom goods have been delivered for distribution in accordance with this Proclamation shall account for the same to the Civil Affairs Officer from whom he receives them.

(ii) The Civil Affairs Officer may at any time require a merchant to whom he has delivered such goods to return any quantity then remaining undistributed and the merchant shall thereupon forthwith return the same to the Civil Affairs Officer.

Article 8. — Every Sheikh or merchant holding a copy of a Village Register shall produce the same for inspection to any person on demand.

Article 9. — Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Proclamation shall be guilty of an offence and liable upon conviction by a Military Court to imprisonment for a term not exceeding Twelve Months or to a fine not exceeding Two Hundred Pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine and the Court may order the confiscation of any such goods proved to have been the subject matter of the offence.

PROCLAMATION No. 41.

WHEREAS by reason of the Occupation of Tripolitania by the Armed Forces of His Britannic Majesty and those of His Allies it is expedient to make provision for the exercise by an Officer of the British Military Administration of the powers formerly exercisable by the Italian Director of Customs and the Director of Monopolies;

NOW THEREFORE I, WILLIAM JAMES MILLER, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Brigadier, HEREBY PROCLAIM:—

Article 1. — All the powers formerly vested under Italian law in the Italian Officials entitled «Il Direttore della Circonscrizione Doganale della Tripolitania» and «Il Direttore dei Monopoli della Tripolitania» shall vest in and be exercised by the Officer for the time being holding the appointment of Controller of Customs and Excise in the British Military Administration of Tripolitania.

Article 2. — The Controller of Customs and Excise is hereby empowered to exercise in addition the following powers formerly vested in the Governor of Libya:—

- (i) The power to issue and withdraw licences to retail Monopoly commodities under Article 18 of Ministerial Decree of 11th December 1914.
- (ii) The power to give administrative decisions in Excise contravention cases where such decisions are admissible under Article 12 of Royal Decree of 15th May 1924, No. 857.
- (iii) The power to give administrative decisions in Customs cases where the amount of the fine exceeds 5000 lire under Royal Decree of 14th March 1932, No. 381, Head 10, Chapter 3, Article 90.
- (iv) The power to grant licences for the distillation, rectification and transference of spirits under Governorial Decree of 24th February, 1938.XVI, No. 3197 (Head 1, Article 1).

1. From the date of this Order, no person shall whether as principal, agent, or assistant, engage in the business of hawker, pedlar, or other itinerant street trading in any public place within the Municipal area of Tripoli otherwise than in the places specified in the Schedule hereto.
2. The said Schedule may be added to, altered or varied from time to time by notice under my hand, and all the provisions of this Order shall be deemed to apply to such additions alterations or variations.
3. Any person who contravenes the provisions of this Order shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction by a British Military Court to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding one year, or to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

Upon such conviction the Court may in its discretion order the confiscation of the goods, wares or stock-in-trade proved to have been the subject matter of the offence.

Where any premises are closed or put out of bounds to members of His Britannic Majesty's Forces or of His Allies and any such member is thereafter found in or upon such premises the owner, licensee, and person having the apparent management of such premises shall each be guilty of an offence, and all or any of them may be charged with and convicted of such offence.
3. The expression "Military Authorities" shall be interpreted as including an Area or Sub-Area Commander or other Officer authorised by him to grant the permission referred to in Article 1.
4. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Order shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction by a British Military Court to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding five years or to a fine not exceeding Two Hundred Pounds or to both such fine and imprisonment. Upon such conviction the Court may, in its discretion, order the confiscation of the drugs or intoxicating liquor proved to have been the subject matter of the offence.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by Article 4 (1) of Proclamation No. 16 of 1943 and with the approval of the Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer, I, THOMAS ROCHFORD, Major, Trade Commissioner Tripolitania, hereby declare:—

1. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in Essential Supplies Notice No. 1, any person having in his possession or under his control any Essential Supplies as specified in the schedule to such notice shall be required to make a return of such Essential Supplies ONLY where the quantity or value exceeds that specified in the Schedule hereto.
2. Control of Movement and Sale of Grain

ORDER No. 21.

I, MAURICE STANLEY LUSH, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, upon whom his Majesty has been pleased to confer the decoration of the Military Cross, Brigadier, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Article 1 (e) and (f) of Proclamation No. 6 HEREBY ORDER as follows:—

1. No person shall remove or carry away from any farm, settlement or other place where it has been grown any wheat or barley grain or flour made from such wheat or barley grain unless such person has first obtained from

the nearest Civil Affairs Officer or Agricultural Officer a written permit (the burden of proving which shall rest upon such person) so to do.

2. No person shall except under the authority of the British Military Administration of the Territory dispose, whether by sale or barter, gift, loan or in any other manner whatsoever of any wheat or barley grain or flour made from such wheat or barley grain, otherwise than to the British Military Administration aforesaid at prices to be fixed by it and duly published.

3. (i) Producers of wheat or barley grain shall hold such grain at the disposal of the Director of Agriculture.

(ii) For the purpose of dealing with and generally handling such wheat or barley grain the Director of Agriculture may:—

(a) decide what quantity of wheat or barley grain should be left in the possession of any producer or group of producers thereof;

(b) arrange for and give orders in connection with the purchase by the British Military Administration and removal to any one or more of the Centres mentioned in the Schedule hereto, of all wheat and barley grain over and above the quantities mentioned in (a) hereof;

(c) determine the method date and place of payment for such wheat and barley grain;

(d) make additions to or deletions from the Schedule;

(e) generally do all such things as are necessary to give effect to the provisions of this Order.

(iii) The Director of Agriculture may delegate the powers hereby conferred upon him to any Civil Affairs Officer or Agricultural Officer.

(iv) For the purpose of exercising any of the powers mentioned in subparagraph (ii) hereof the Director of Agriculture or any Civil Affairs Officer or Agricultural Officer to whom he may delegate such powers, may issue orders to persons mentioned therein either verbally or in writing and general orders in writing under his hand. Any general order shall be published in the manner provided by Article 7 of Proclamation No. 1, and in such other manner as is customary in the area concerned.

4. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Order or who wilfully disobeys any order issued under the provisions of Article 3 (iv)

hereof shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction by a British Military Court to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years or to a fine not exceeding L. 250 or to both such fine and imprisonment. Upon such conviction the Court may in its discretion order the confiscation of any grain or flour proved to have been the subject matter of the offence.

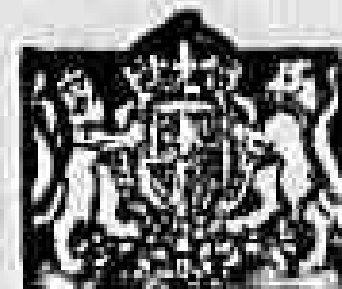

Trade Commissioner - Change of Title

PROCLAMATION No. 24.

I, MAURICE STANLEY LUSH, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, upon whom His Majesty has been pleased to confer the Decoration of the Military Cross, Brigadier, by virtue of an instrument dated the 13th day of April, 1943, under the hand of the General Officer Commanding Tripolitania Base Lines of Communication, Eight Army, HEREBY PROCLAIM:—

Article 1.

Change of title of Trade Commissioner to Controller of Civil Supplies.

Where in any Proclamation, Regulation, Rule, Order, Contract or other Instrument whatsoever issued or made before the coming into force of this Proclamation reference is made to the Officer holding the title of Trade Commissioner such reference shall be construed after the said date as a reference to the title of Controller of Civil Supplies.

Article 2.

Date of coming into force.

This Proclamation shall come into force and take effect from the date of signature hereof.

Contempt of Court

PROCLAMATION No. 25.

WHEREAS certain Military Courts have been established within the Territory for the Trial of Offenders against Proclamations, Orders and Regulations.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that such Courts should have the power

to protect their dignity and position and to ensure the orderly conduct of their proceedings

NOW THEREFORE, I, BRIAN HUBERT ROBERTSON, Baronet, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, upon whom His Majesty has been pleased to confer the Decoration of the Military Cross. HEREBY PROCLAIM:—

Article 1.

Short Title

This Proclamation may be cited as the Contempt of Court Proclamation No. 25.

Article 2.

Contempt in Presence of Court

Any person who during the course of any proceedings before any Military Court by word, gesture, demeanour or by any other means wilfully shows or expresses towards the Court or towards any member thereof hostility or disrespect or who wilfully interrupts or obstructs the proceedings of the Court or other wise misbehaves himself in the place where such Court is held shall be guilty of an offence and the Court may forthwith summarily order such person to pay a fine not exceeding £50 or in default of payment of such fine to be imprisoned for a period not exceeding six months: provided that at any time before the termination of the proceedings in the course of which such order was made the Court may cancel the same if the person concerned openly expresses contrition and the Court is satisfied that such expression of contrition is genuine and provided further that any order made under this Article and not subsequently cancelled as set forth in the first proviso shall be immediately submitted to the Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer for review together with a brief statement of the facts upon which it is based set forth on the record of the proceedings in the course of which it was made.

Article 3.

Contempt not in course of Judicial Proceedings

Any person who at any other time by word gesture, writing or other means expresses towards the Court or any member thereof in the exercise of its or his Judicial functions, hostility or disrespect shall be guilty of an offence, and on conviction by a Military Court be liable to pay a fine of £50 or in default of payment of such fine to be imprisoned for a period of not more than six months.

Article 4.*Powers in Respect of Defaulting Witnesses etc.*

Any person duly summoned to appear before a Military Court who without reasonable cause:—

- (1) fails to appear in answer to such summons or
- (2) being in attendance as a witness
 - (a) refuses to take an oath or make a declaration required for the purpose of his evidence or
 - (b) refuses to produce any document or thing in his power or control which the Court may require him to produce or
 - (c) leaves before the conclusion of the proceedings without leave of the Court

shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to imprisonment for a period of not more than six months or a fine of L50.

Article 5.*Removal of Advocates from Court*

A Military Court may order the removal from Court of any person appearing before it under the provisions of Article 8 of Proclamation No. 3, whose conduct is liable to censure and such order and the reasons therefor shall be included in the record of the proceedings without prejudice to any powers of a Military Court under Article 2 of this Proclamation.

The terms of the last proviso to Article 2 shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to any such order.

Article 1.**Short Title.**

Article 2.**Repeal of Proclamation No. 15**

British Military Time (Amendment No. 1) Proclamation No. 15 is hereby repealed.

Article 3.**Amendment of Proclamation No. 12.**

Article 2 of Proclamation No. 12 is hereby amended and British Military Time shall as from 0200 hours (by existing British Military Time) on the 24th day of May 1943 be two hours in advance of Greenwich Mean Time or one hour in advance of Central European Time.

Registration of Italian Citizens - Western Province

ORDER No. 24.

I, MAURICE STANLEY LUSH, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, upon whom His Majesty has been pleased to confer the Decoration of the Military Cross, Brigadier, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Article 3 (i) of Proclamation No. 17, HERBY order as follows:—

1. Every Italian Metropolitan Citizen male or female of the age of 17 years and over now residing in the Western Province of the Occupied Territory of Tripolitania, shall make application for an identity card in accordance with the instructions set out in the Schedule hereto.
2. As from the date of issue of his or her identity card every such person shall carry such card at all times and produce the same on demand to any duly authorised person.
3. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Order shall be guilty of an offence and liable, upon conviction by a Military Court, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years or to a fine not exceeding Two hundred pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine.

Schedule

1. All persons required to register shall apply for and complete a form of application for an identity card between 8 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. or between 2 p.m. and 6 p.m. on the appropriate date and at the appropriate place as shown below.

2. Persons required by this Order to register who are now residing outside any of the above-mentioned places shall report to whichever place of application may be most convenient to them but between the times mentioned above and on one of the appropriate dates shown against such place of application.
3. Every applicant shall bring with him the following documents:—
 - (a) Foglio di congedo illimitato, foglio matricolare or certificato di riforma;
 - (b) and passport, identity card or any other military or civil documents disclosing their identity.
4. Clerks will be available to assist applicant in the completion of the forms.
5. Every applicant shall bring with him two photographs of the applicant 5cm by 5cm. Applicants not in possession of such photographs will be photographed at the place of application, for which a charge of 1/- for the two photographs will be made.
