11 38 personal for Jones. SCAO has informally consulted Sullivan and me on Alcoms amendment to second paras of draft order on additional sanctions against crimes of a fascist nature. He understands from Legal Officer that amendment reading "In conformity with the policy by the Italian Government " should be inserted at Behest 2 Embassies. SCAO is advised insertion would have no legal effect but is concerned at possible political repercussions of including overt acknowledgement of application Italian law here, contrary to practice since ANG took over. I am inclined to share this apprehension but said AM unaware your reasons for waiting insertion, which on its face appears to give pro Jugoslavs additional propaganda point of exception to new law which they probably wont like anyhow. Other hand new law by applying Italian procedure appears meet local Italian objections to present 1 even without the amendment. Since SCAO anxious publish final order soonest, grateful for your early comment which I may use in further personal and informal discussion with him.

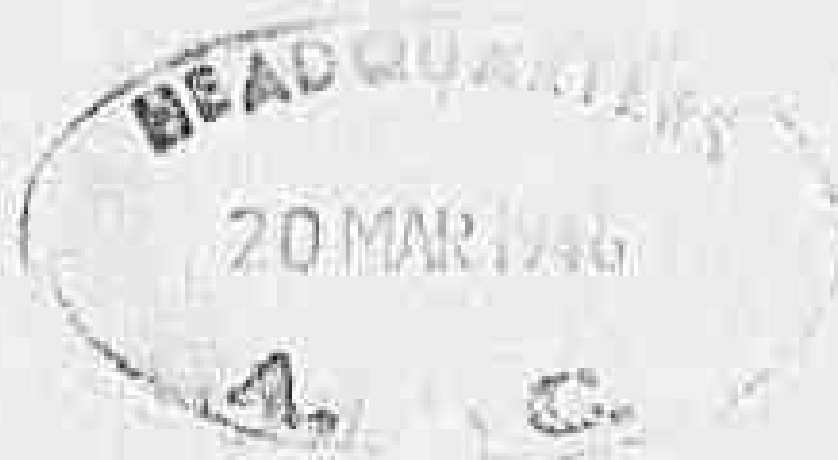

Subject is arrest of Yugoslav citizen spirac.

1. UNRRA BELGRADE were informed on 7 March through Jugo-slav quarters that IVO SPIRAC representing "ZAVOD ZA VANREDNE NABVKE" who has just replaced BOZEVIC in this post had been arrested by Allied authorities in TRIESTE.
2. They had previously been inform that SPIRAC was not obtaining same facilities in connection with visits port etc. As BOZEVIC and it appears his arrest was due to non-possession or requisite permit.
3. UNRRA co-operated SPIRAC as Official representative "ZZVN which is organisation through which UNRRA deal with Jugo-slav govt. R. They urgently request if arrest was in fact due to reasons stated above SPIRAC be given his freedom whilst matter is being rectified.
5. Fo your information story has received some prominence in today BELGRADE newspaper POLITIKA. A full statement of the facts would therefore be helpful.

Newly elected national assembly first met on 19 December and heard renners account of activities provisional Government. Federal council met same day on 20 December meeting of both houses elected renner Federal President and formed Government previously approved by Allied council new Governments also constituted STYRIA and CARINTHIA. In order to secure financial control authorities instructed to submit to SMGOS earliest budget estimates for 1946. Preliminary 1946 budget for VIENNA shows large deficits which requires investigation. Distribution household coal in Vienna now in full swing and gas supplies so much improved that whole city is now getting gas regularly for restricted periods. No change in food rationing though possible shortages later are envisaged.

Road transport U S and British element now lifting 97 per cent tonnage daily. Supplies of captured enemy vehicles being handed over to Austrians now almost exhausted. Spare parts being supplied to Austrian Government. Being obtained for distribution on agreed plan and further parts being obtained by cannibalization of non repairable vehicles. Soviet request for assistance and snow clearance has been met.

Quadrupartite Committee investigating Austrian Glider Club and Aero Club activities. Also Air Office set up by Ministry of Transport in newly formed Government.

Comprehensive scheme for registration of all Austrian male and female now approved and will be put into operation when 520 law approved in draft is promulgated.

1. Ref as to my 444949, your 73306 (netter to Cabinet Offices) and draft military and civil affairs agreement received from War Dept airmail by Siry Gen RAMBLEN.

2. I agree generally with proposed UNITED STATES agreement as drafted with the following major exceptions:

A. Para 2A mentions certain airfield by name as being the ones required exclusively for American use. These are not however the ones that it is planned here to use. Suggest para should be redrafted to avoid specific mention of particular airfield.

B. Para 6D does not appear to be clear. The first sentence states no payment to be made for "facilities". The second one provides for credit to be given for "public service facilities".

C. Para 11A and B. The provisions of this para are dependent on governmental policy of which I have no information. However it is believed undesirable to include in the agreement any reference to the term "net troop pay procedure".

D. Para 17. In view of redeployment I am unable to continue the processing of all such claims mentioned in this para and consider it should be redrafted to place the onus of investigating such claims on the Italian Govt.

E. My detailed comments follow by air.

3. In addition to the American draft a copy of the British agreement has been received in this Hq and Field Marshall ALEXANDER made a copy available for my information.

4. There are 2 major differences between the 2:

A. The British agreement is to run initially for 5 years with an option for a further unstated period after consultation between parties: The duration of the American agreement is unspecified.

B. The British agreement provides for free fire supplies and services, including costs for carting for displaced persons: the American agreement provides that no payment will be made for facilities (undefined) but that agreed rental value for fixed installations and the cost of public service facilities used by the US Forces shall be credited to the Indian Govt against its obligations to the Govt of the U S (SD). Furthermore a separate agreement, whose terms are not indicated, is envisaged for the supply of fire and in the mean time the troop pay procedure will obtain which means dollar credit (para 17). These divergent financial policies appear irreconcilable. In addition there are several other variations in the drafting of clauses common to both agreements and certain additional points included in the American draft which are not in the British one.

5. I am including a copy of the British agreement with Gen MORGAN's comments thereon in my letter forwarding my detailed comments on the UNITED STATES one and have included also a note of the main variations and omissions.

6. In view of the fundamental differences in financial policy, a joint Anglo American agreement seems impracticable.

I understand from TROOPERS signal 740750A (B) from the Director of Civil Affairs that my views on the draft Military and Civil Affairs agreement with ITALY contained in TROOPERS signal 740750A(B) would be appreciated.

1. I am generally in agreement with proposed British agreement as drafted with the following major exceptions:

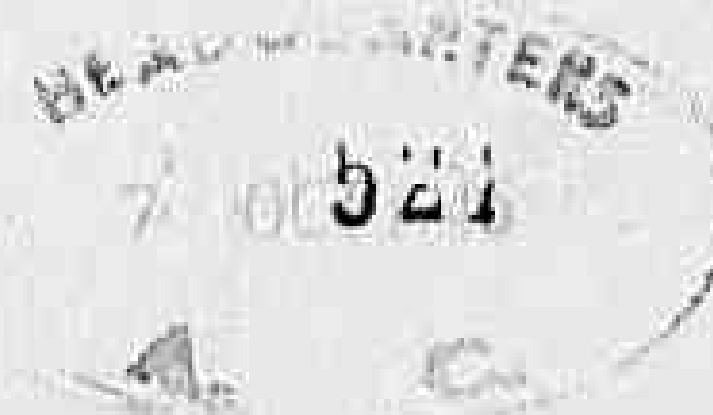
A) In view of possible difficulties over transport of supplies to AUSTRIA from ITALY the right to take complete control of any section or sections of the railways should be reserved. A similar right in the case of ports and airfields is already reserved in Sect 3 Roman numeral (III), paras 2 and 3.

B) The right to arrest and detain or call upon the Italian Govt to arrest and detain any one in ITALY who is deemed to be a danger to the security of British Forces should be reserved. I suggest a new para 3 be added to Section XI (II?) to cover this.

C) The ban on operating radio and radar stations in Sect IV B appears most undesirable and I consider the first part of the sentence should read "The right to construct, maintain and operate" etc.

2. In addition to the British draft a copy of the American agreement has been received in this Hq and Commanding General MTOUSA has made a copy available for my information.

3. There are two major differences between the 2:

A) The British agreement is to run initially for 5 years with an option for a further unstated period after consultation between both parties (para 2 of Memorandum attached to the agreement) the duration of the American agreement is unspecified.

B) The British agreement provides for free live supplies and services, including costs for caring for displaced persons (see Roman numerals one eight -XVIII): The American agreement provides that no payment will be made for facilities (unrefined) but that an agreed rental value for fixed installations and the cost of public service facilities used by the UNITED STATES Forces shall be credited to the Italian Govt against its obligations to the Govt of the UNITED STATES. Furthermore a separate agreement, whose terms are not indicated, is envisaged for the supply of live and in the meantime the troop pay procedure will obtain which means dollar credit. In addition there are several other variations in the drafting of clauses common to both agreements and certain additional points included in the American draft which are not in the British one.

4. Section Roman numerals one eight -XVIII- in the British agreement is fundamentally different from the UNITED STATES method of dealing with this problem. With the knowledge and advice available in ITALY I do not feel competent to comment upon this paragraph, except to state that any form of agreement requiring a balance to be struck between services rendered to the Italians by the British and

5. I do however feel that consideration should be given to the possibility of bringing British policy into line with current American policy as far as troop pay procedure is concerned. Under the existing American practice dollar credit is given to the Italian Govt equivalent to the amount of lire paid to civilians by American troops in ITALY out of their pay. It seems possible that a similar arrangement might be acceptable to HMG which would result in a sterling credit accruing to the Italian Govt which might be used for expenditure by that Govt within the sterling area. The necessary records are already maintained by MPIC CMF, so that no administrative difficulty would arise here.

6. I am including a copy of the American agreement with Commanding General MROUARD comments thereon in my letter forwarding my comments on the British one and have included in the letter a note of the main variations and omissions.

7. In view of the fundamental differences in financial policy, a joint ANGLO - AMERICAN agreement seems impracticable. I recommend that, insofar as is possible, all clauses common to both agreement should be drafted in the same form, and that the time element of both agreements should be the same.

Send first report on mass murders at prison SCHIO VICENZA PROVINCE. Approximately 15 armed men carrying automatics obtained admission to prison about midnight Friday Saturday by threats to gaoler. They segregated 73 political prisoners both men and women into 2 rooms and opened fire with automatics. 30 men and 13 women killed outright. 4 more died in hospital 26 wounded in hospital. Among killed women of 70 and girl of 17. Provincial Commissioner deputy Regional Commissioner and team experts with US Military Police have proceeded SCHIO and I await their full reports. In meantime have arranged publication local PWB papers of factual statement as above. For you confidential information some evidence as to identity criminals already hopeful. Will decide further action as to Allied Court of Inquiry at SCHIO or immediate trial of criminals if apprehended after receipt of report from Provincial Commissioner and in consultation with 5TH ARMY. Have ordered withdrawal political prisoners from small local jails even at risk of overcrowding.

I explained the present law by which communal elections cannot take place until mid November earliest and national elections 3 months later. Within overall allocation laid down in para 3 above, Third Army and First French Army will call forward to MUNICH and BREGENZ respectively Italians from Seventh, 15th Armies and 21 Army Group in sufficient numbers to ensure continual flow of 3,000 per day over each of the BRENNER and Swiss routes.
5. Use of Swiss route and full details will be discussed at conference to be held at BERNE end of month and Army Groups will be advised.
