1 Your para 1. Instructions issued by this HQ only apply within the district under its comd, which includes the province of FOGGLA.

2 Your para 2. This HQ Routine Order No 3 dated 6 Nov 43 reads:-

"3. Discipline"

1 Cases have been reported of soldiers interfering with Italian railway personnel in possession of a State Railway pass and preventing them carrying out their work or journeys.

2 These workers are engaged on work for the Allies and such interference is causing serious delay to movement of troops and stores by railway for the Allied Armed Forces.

3 Such conduct is a serious military offence and offenders detected will be tried by Court Martial."

① The matter is one of military security, and therefore NOT one for decision by joint consultation with the civil authorities. You will appreciate the harm which could be caused to the maintenance of the Allied Armed Forces by delay to railway traffic caused by unlawful interference with the work of the Italian State Railway employees engaged upon their lawful duties. ISR employees on duty, working for the Directorate of Transportation, definitely do NOT count as civilians for whom a special pass is necessary to enter the province of FOGGLA. Inevitably Eighth Army maintenance trains are crossing the Army control line daily and their crews on duty must NOT be interfered with in any way. These passes were therefore brought to the attention of all concerned under comd of this HQ so that such employees could be identified readily.

② 3 Your para 3. The pass under reference is issued by the Italian Ministry of Communication of which the official designation is TESSERA DI RICORSIMENTO, the nearest description of which is a pass. It includes a photograph.

③ Consultation with HQ ACMF was suggested.

④ Discreet the point.

As instructions only apply in HQ's district no need for further action

1. The opinion of this branch is that there is no security objection to the control of civilian movement being carried out on an inter-provincial basis behind the rear Army boundary, as proposed in the above letter.

2. It is however pointed out that this headquarters is not at the moment responsible for security in the area concerned and that the matter should therefore be referred to No.2 District and P.B.S. for a decision on the security aspect involved.

3. It is strongly recommended that movement control should be made uniform for both Regions II and III on the basis of either the 10 km restriction or inter-provincial control.

- a. Naples Province - No passes required south of the rear Corps. boundary of the Army (when the rear boundaries moves forward to the provincial line, no passes to be required in the province.)

- c. Avellino Province - No passes required in the Province.

2. On this basis passes will only be required for inter-provincial travel.



2. As you are aware, special powers are necessary to enter the province of PUGLIA and to cross the Army Control Line, and it is not desirable to make any exception in the case of Italian State Railway Employees, without prior consultation with your HQ.


Dear General ERICKSON,







On 4 December 43, thirteen persons were charged and appeared before an A.M.G. Summary Court at Campobasso for travelling together from S. Marco in Province of Benevento to Campobasso without passes authorising them. All were heavily fined.

Two vehicles were used by the defendants, a lorry BN 2352 and a small private car BN 1461: the former vehicle had attached permit affixed authorising its use solely for transport of food products; this vehicle however was moving furniture belonging to some of the defendants. The other vehicle had affixed a Naples City Pass No. 1734 attached, issued 28 Oct 43 expiring 31 Dec 43, bearing a stamped signature. The driver of this car Costantino Diodoro, was also in possession of a pass issued on 26 Oct 43 from Benevento to Naples. It was stated in evidence by Diodoro that neither of these passes were obtained by him but through an Italian friend.

The following instructions are issued regarding the movement of civilians in No 2 District.

MOVEMENT

1. There is no restriction on movement of civilians in the "visited" via the Province of LARI, PRIMIDI, TALAMO and LECCO.
2. Movement of civilians in AMG areas is limited to a distance of 10 km from their place of residence.
3. Movement of civilians in or out of the Province of BOLOGNA is controlled by special permission from the SCAC HQ. It must be obtained before entry or exit is allowed. (Ref letter this HQ 2022/12/G dated 5 Dec 43)
4. Civilians wishing to travel from the "visiting" to AMG areas must first, through the nearest AMG representative in the "visiting", obtain a permit from the SCAC of the district which they wish to visit.
5. It will be noted that the term "AMG" is not in No 2 District and 495 special permission from SCAC NAMES is necessary for civilians to visit it.

PASSES

1. Passes are not required for travel in the "visiting" either by Italian civilians in possession of Identity Cards, or foreigner in possession of valid passports.
2. "Territory Identity Document" for displaced non-Italian persons are issued by 315 Field Security Section in LARI and bearing the section's stamp.
In AMG areas civilians, Italian or foreigners, wishing to travel more than 10 kms beyond their places of ordinary residence, must first obtain a permit from the head of the area in which they wish to visit.

2. The section of control will be set out in para 5(b) para (c) of the above letter.
3. Armies will be responsible for organizing the check points and patrols. When Eighth Army rear boundary moves forward to the SOTCAZ River, the question of the provocation of personnel for check points on this River should if necessary be coordinated by Eighth Army with No. 2 District.
4. Apart from All sea military personnel, and certain military personnel on duty, only those persons having passes issued in accordance with the principles laid down in this H.Q. letter 15 A/10/432/4/SD(b) dated 17 Nov 43 will be allowed to cross this control line from the South-east.
5. As regards the issue of passes to civilians by A.M.G. officers, A.M.G. to arrange for the following procedure to be adopted for such passes.
Any civilian wishing to cross the Control Line from S.E. to N.W. must apply to the nearest Civil Affairs Officer or United Control Commission representative. If the latter approves the application, he will forward it to the C.A.O. of the town or locality to which the civilian wishes to proceed; the latter C.A.O. will then issue the pass, if so required. In this way services (through their S.U.C.O.) can centralize the number of passes required to enter this country and thus obviate the number of difficulties to be applied in the granting of passes.
6. As regards news publicity to be given to the C.I.D. population as to the existence of these check points, and to the above pass procedure.

1. Complaints are frequently received that passes are issued by A.M.C. officers on pieces of paper and not on the approved form, copy attached, marked "A". It is proposed to have a further copy of those forms printed but before doing so there may be some alterations which you would like to have made. One suggestion is that the passes be made up into books of 100 and numbered and that a counterfoil be left available for records.

2. A special pass may now be required for agricultural workers to allow them access to their fields beyond any shot line.

3. There are also circulation permits for motor vehicles, marked "B" and permits authorising a vehicle to travel, marked "C". A further suggestion has been made that copy of permit marked "D" is necessary; this permit might be used for removal of property.

4. Permits have also been suggested for issue to servants for trading. Standardisation of all passes and permits would seem to be necessary.

Your remarks and suggestions are asked for and also some idea of number of the various forms you consider suitable to have on hand for immediate use.

1. Considerable difficulty and confusion is being caused in this theatre of operations by the numerous and varied passes, many of them in most unsatisfactory form, which are issued by various authorities to civilians and others.

Many such passes are mere "scams" of paper which can be easily transferred or forged, and cannot be easily recognised as genuine.

2. Some of the more common weaknesses of such makeshift passes are:

(a) They are frequently not properly identified with the person to whom they are issued; eg the following wording is common: "Please allow bearer to... and this Italian is working for us and is authorised to" etc.

(b) The issuing authority is not clearly shown: eg illegible signature, issuing officer's appointment not given, no office stamp etc.

(c) The period of validity is seldom included.

3. Passes of this nature are a danger to security, they are of little value to the bearer, and they cause considerable trouble and delay to our security/counter-intelligence organisations and to the military police, particularly as regards road checks and their other duties in connection with the Security control of movement.

(ii) The standard "Brom Security Passes," printed in English and Italian, headed "MILITARY PERMIT. FERRESCO MILITARE," and bearing an embossed stamp showing an eagle, and a lion on a crown. These are for special and strictly limited issue by intelligence staffs.

- (e) Those two types of pass should cover most normal requirements.
There are occasions, however, when certain military authorities require to issue other special passes or permits for various purposes.

In such cases, these passes should:

- (i) State precisely what the holder may do or where he may go.
- (ii) Be properly identified with the person to whom issued! The latter's name, identity card number and signature should appear on the pass.
- (iii) Bear the tangible signature and appointment of the issuing officer.
- (iv) Be typed and stamped with an office stamp.
- (v) Show the period of validity.

5. It is stressed that, in view of the number of the authorities and the extent of the areas involved, the co-operation of all concerned is essential, if the issue and use of passes in ITALY is to be an asset rather than a liability to our security, and it is requested that all possible steps be taken to improve the present position on the lines indicated in para 4 above.

1. Since the beginning of our operations in SICILY and ITALY, frequent reports have been received by this Branch concerning unsatisfactory types of circulation passes issued by AMG officers to civilians.

2. Following are some of the features subject to criticism in such passes:

(a) Permission is sometimes given to enter enemy occupied territory.

(b) The pass is frequently NOT properly identified with the person to whom it is issued; i.e. it is not linked with the person's identity document. E.g. wording such as "Please allow bearer to...." and "This Italian official is authorised to...." etc. is common.

(c) The issuing authority is often not clearly shown; e.g. illegible signature, issuing officer's appointment not given, no office stamp etc.

(d) Period of validity is seldom included.

3. The large-scale issue to civilians of "scraps of paper" of this nature, which can easily be forged and cannot easily be recognised as genuine, make the security work of the allied Security/counter-intelligence organisations and of the Italian police, much more difficult, particularly as regards road checks and other duties connected with the security control of civilian movement, which is an important element in the general security scheme. 459

4. It is considered most desirable that there should be one or two standard printed AMG passes for issue to civilians.

This was agreed to before HUSKY and was incorporated in the "AMGOT Plan", and was referred to in this HQ letter 141F/142/4/G(1b) dated 2 Jun 43.

Such passes existed in SICILY, though apparently not in adequate quantities, or inadequately distributed.

It appears that they are not now being used to any extent, if at all, in ITALY, and it is strongly urged that they be introduced as soon as possible.

5. In the meantime, it is requested that all AMG officers be instructed that "home-made" passes should:-

- (a) Always be made out with care
- (b) Never authorise the person to enter enemy-occupied territory or our forward battle area.
