1. Forwarded herewith is a copy of 15 MG/1401/10/G(1b) of 4 Jan 44 altering the Army Control Line so that it runs through La Junta, altering the Army Control Line so that it runs through the centre of CORDOBA Province, the town of CORDOBA being south of the line.

2. The memorandum was not received at this H.Q. until after the date on which it came into effect, but representations were immediately made to G (1b) on behalf of those people north of the old Control line who would suddenly find themselves compelled to procure a pass. G (1b) has issued verbal instructions to cover this question.

3. It is not proposed to issue any amendment to the Notice of 27 Nov 43 at present. S.C.A.O.s should arrange to notify the people forward of the old line.

3. It is asked, therefore, if you will kindly arrange to stop all Northbound trains in future at the railway bridge to allow sufficient time for C.R.R. to clear the train of all unauthorised passengers and refugees.

Subject: Control of Civilians.

To: See distribution.

1. The Provost Marshal, Fifth Army, will establish control posts in the Fifth Army area from the mouth of the Volturno River, east along this river to its junction with the Calore River, thence along the Calore River to Ponte (N5790), thence to Fragneto (N6394). No civilians will be permitted to go north of this line unless they hold a pass issued by Allied Military Government specifically granting authority to do so. In this connection Allied Military Government will assist in establishing and maintaining such control by disseminating necessary information to the civilian population. Carabinieri personnel are authorized to assist in this control.

2. The Carabinieri selected for use in the program will be organized and instructed by Allied Military Government before assuming their duties.

3. It will be the responsibility of Unit Commanders within their areas to see that no refugee civilians or other unauthorized persons are permitted to pass through Allied lines into enemy occupied territory. Any such persons attempting to do so will be apprehended and turned over to the nearest Prisoner of War Collecting Point or Enclosure. Refugee civilians or other personnel passing through Allied lines from enemy territory will be taken into custody and likewise turned over to the nearest Prisoner of War Enclosure or Collecting Point. It is not desired to prevent refugee civilians, ex-Prisoners of War, or other individuals who may be able to impart valuable information to the Allies from passing through Allied lines from enemy territory, but their apprehension is desired for security purposes and to expedite the opportunity of questioning them. They will be picked up by the Army at the Division Prisoner of War Collecting Points and screened at the Army Prisoner of War Enclosure.

When British Army boundary moves westward to the TORONTO RIVER, the section of the provostion of personnel for check points on this River should be necessary be corrected & by British Army with M.G. Divisional HQ and to cross this control line from the South-West.
4. As the Canadian military personnel, in Indian territory personnel on duty in those provinces indicated below in accordance with the instructions given in this R.G. letter of 15 Nov 42 L/T(b) dated 7 Nov 42 will be required to cross this control line from the South-West.
5. According to letter of 15 Nov 42, issued by M.G. As the matter is one of extreme urgency, would you please forward your comments or agreement at the earliest possible date, preferably by signal, if short. G.S.I.(b) 15 Army Group have agreed to the draft.

With reference to paragraph 6 of the draft, regarding the setting up of a second controlled line, please see letter from 15 Army Group to Fifth and Eighth Armies, No. 15AG/1401/10/GI(b) of 19th November 43, a copy of which is attached for easy reference.

With reference to my AMO/66/40 of 9th November 43, it is considered necessary that the movement of civilians north-westward into the forward Army areas should be subject to strict control.

1. No civilian, therefore, will be allowed to move into the portion of Italy north of a line formed by the Northern boundaries of the provinces of Parma, Piacenza and Reggio, without a permit in writing authorizing him to do so. Permits will only be issued on the authority of the Civil Affairs Officer at the destination to whom the civilian wishes to travel. All applications will be made through the A.M.G. or A.C.C. Officer at the civilian's starting point and passed by this officer, with any observations he may have, direct to the C.A.O. at the civilian's place of destination.

2. Permits will only be issued by the C.A.O. at the place of destination and then only in special cases and no civilian will be allowed to start on his journey northward until he is in possession of such permit duly signed by the C.A.O. or the place of destination. All areas north of the line referred to above will be declared restricted areas, and any person found crossing into these areas without a permit will be prosecuted, care being taken to inflict a severe penalty upon all branches of this regulation.

3. It would greatly assist if A.M.G. Region 2 and A.C.C. would arrange for necessary orders or proclamations to be issued, taking the above regulations quite clear to the Italian civil population in the regions under their respective control.

The widest publicity should be given to these orders or proclamations.

4. It is contemplated that in the near future a second controlled line running approximately along the River Tormoto - Celone, and Volturno will be brought into effect, beyond which no civilians will be allowed to proceed except for the most urgent possible reason. Permission to cross this former line will be granted in accordance with the procedure laid down in para 3 above, and must be restricted to cases of most extreme urgency.

The widest publicity should be given to these orders or proclamations.

5. A.M.G. will arrange for Cordinieri check posts to be established at points where roads cross this line and for Cordinieri patrols between such points.
6. It is contemplated that in the near future a second controlled line running approximately along the Rivers Poetto - Celore and Volutorno will be brought into effect, beyond which no civilians will be allowed to proceed except for the most urgent possible reason. Permission to cross this forward line will be granted in accordance with the procedure laid down in para 3 above, and must be registered to cases of most extreme urgency.
7. A separate coloured pass for daily labourers desirous of crossing either of the two above mentioned lines for the purpose of carrying on their business will be introduced and issued by the C.A.O.

1. The security problem and danger presented by the movement of refugees etc. South-Westwards through our forward positions has led to the preparation and issue of a comprehensive scheme for the proper security control of such persons. (Ref. AFHQ Intelligence Instruction No. 35 dated 13th November 43).

2. It is considered desirable that movement North-Westwards into the object of preventing (a) the infiltration of unauthorised persons from Allied into German-occupied ITALY, and (b) the circulation of such persons in the forward areas, where vital military moves and dispositions may be observed either willfully or carelessly, with consequent danger of leakage of information.

3. A.M.C. would be requested to instruct all Civil Affairs Officers to limit to really essential cases the issue to civilians of passes authorising movement North-Westwards across this control line.

Considerable difficulty and confusion is being caused in this theatre of operations by the numerous and varied passes, many of them in most unsatisfactory form, which are issued by various authorities to civilians and others.

Many such passes are mere "scraps of paper" which can be easily transferred or forged, and cannot be easily recognised as genuine.

Some of the more common weaknesses of such makeshift passes are:

(a) They are frequently not properly identified with the person to whom they are issued; e.g. the following wording is common: "Please allow bearer to" and "This Italian is working for us and is authorised to..." etc.

(b) The issuing authority is not clearly shown: e.g., illegible signature, issuing officers appointment not given, no office stamp etc.

(c) The period of validity is seldom included.

Passes of this nature are a danger to security, they are of little value to the bearer, and they cause considerable trouble and delay to our security/counter intelligence organisations and to the military police, particularly as regards road checks and their other duties in connection with the Security control of movement.

It is requested that all concerned should take all possible steps to rectify this present unsatisfactory position regarding passes, and that the following principles should be followed in this connection.

(a) In general, the issue of passes should be kept to the minimum.

Circulation passes should only be issued to civilians after careful consideration as to the justification of their reasons for wishing or requiring to move or circulate.

Passes should normally be required by Allied military personnel in uniform; if challenged when circulating in the course of their duties, the production of their identity document and a brief explanation of their business should normally prove adequate to enable them to continue without hindrance.

(b) The two normal and standard types of passes in general use in this theatre of operations are:

(i) Passes or permits issued by AMG to civilians authorising certain movement or certain action prohibited to the population as a whole.

(ii) AMG HQ has been requested to supply all AMG officers with

form, which are issued by various authorities to civilians and others.

Many such passes are mere "scraps of paper" which can be easily transferred or forged, and cannot be easily recognised as genuine.

2. Some of the more common weaknesses of such makeshift passes are:

3. 4. It is requested that all concerned should take all possible steps to rectify this present unsatisfactory position regarding passes, and that the following principles should be followed in this connection.

(a) In general, the issue of passes should be kept to the minimum.

Circulation passes should only be issued to civilians after careful consideration as to the justification of their reasons for wishing or requiring to move or circulate.

Passes should normally be required by Allied military personnel in uniform; if challenged when circulating in the course of their duties, the production of their identity document and a brief explanation of their business should normally prove adequate to enable them to continue without hindrance.

(b) The two normal and standard types of passes in general use in this theatre of operations are:

(i) Passes or permits issued by AMG to civilians authorising certain movement or certain action prohibited to the population as a whole.

(ii) AMG HQ has been requested to supply all AMG officers with standard printed pass forms for this purpose.

(iii) The standard "Brown Security Passes" printed in English and Italian headed "MILITARY PERMIT, PERMESSO MILITARE" and bearing an embossed stamp showing an eagle and a lion on a crown. These are for special and strictly limited issue by intelligence staffs.

(c) These two types of pass should cover most normal requirements.

There are occasions, however, when certain military authorities require to issue other special passes or permits for various purposes.

In such cases, these passes should:

- (1) State precisely what the holder may do or where he may go.
- (II) Be properly identified with the person to whom issued; the latter's name, identity card number and signature should appear on the pass.
- (iii) Bear the legible signature and appointment of the issuing officer.
- (iv) Be typed and stamped with an office stamp.
- (v) Show the period of validity.

5. It is stressed that, in view of the number of the authorities and the extent of the areas involved, the cooperation of all concerned is essential, if the issue and use of passes in ITALY is to be an asset rather than a liability to our security, and it is requested that all possible steps be taken to improve the present position on the lines indicated in para 4 above.

1. Attached herewith a discussion on the above subject and possible plan as presented by Brigadier, Commanding 66 Area, and sent through G.S.I. 8th Army Main dated 15 Nov 43.
2. Reference para 4 (c) Lt.-Col. Briggs S.C.A.P.O. Foggia Province has been contacted and is planning to post 24 hour Carabinieri guards on Southern Boundary of Foggia Province as suggested. The rear boundary of 8 Army is the southern boundary of Foggia Province.
3. The guard plan as suggested in para 4 (c) will tend to control movement northward but will not stop the influx of persons before it starts.
4. It is suggested that if AMG. 15 Army Group posts an order or proclamation in the necessary areas south of the boundary covering the essentials of this plan that much of the movement will be stopped at the source. It is also suggested that the order or proclamation be so worded that punitive measures can be taken against any persons found north of this boundary without proper authority.
5. It is thought that in the above mentioned two ways AMG can implement the proposed plans as laid down. Any further suggestions would be welcome.

(d) Civilians should be allowed to move forward into the Army Area on the authority of the Civil Affairs Officer at the destination in the Army Area to which they wish to go. Civil Affairs Officers should obtain the agreement of the local Military Commander as to the policy in the scale on which civilians are to be permitted to return. Applications should be made through the AMGOT representative at the [redacted] point and passed by him, with any observation he may have, to the C.A.O. at the destination. In addition it would be necessary to provide for persons wishing to cross the Rear Boundary for the purpose of e.g. agricultural labour in the area adjacent to the Boundary day by day; this could be covered by a different pass issued on a certificate by a local Italian Official that the application was bona fide and that the bearer could be relied upon to return.

- (e) Orders prohibiting the carrying of civilians in TD transport should be rigidly enforced subject to an exception where civilians are in the employ of the unit transporting them.

5. It will be appreciated if an arrangement on these lines can be made, the difficulties are realised but it is felt that the position will never be satisfactory until effective control is instituted.
