1. Lt. Col. The Hon. P. Rodd of this Headquarters reports that at about 1100 hrs, Monday, 10 Jan 14., on the Haplas-Foggia road, slightly east of AVELLINO, he saw two U.S. Army tracks and a Flat car each carrying a number of civilians. The vehicles were proceeding in an easterly direction.

- 2. In view of the possibility of typhus being spread by this means and of the standing orders prohibiting the cerrying of civilians in military vehicles the matter is reported for such action as you may consider necessary.
- 3. Details of the markings of each vehicle and of the number of civilians carried are given below.
