

1. Reference to extract from an H Q, 180th Infantry report sent your office on 11 September 1943 from Colonel Lemuel L Bolles, Commissioner of Public Safety, AMGOT H Q, Sicily:

 2. The report mentioned in paragraph 1 states, "The mayor of San Fratello (0525360) told one family that asked for grain, 'You might as well kill yourselves as the Americans will not feed you.' The mayor's name is Nancuso Benedetto. He was left in power by the authorities."

a. The name of the mayor of San Fratello is as stated. We have had this man under our observation since September 1; when Lt. Donald S. Root arrived in San Fratello. During that time the man has been consistently helpful, indeed, one of the most helpful of all the mayors in the sector. He was referred to us with a clean bill of health by Captain Criven who, presumably, had a similar reference from whatever officer originally retained him in office.

b. It is, of course, an exceedingly difficult thing to accumulate proof that any individual has made specific statements such as the one quoted. This man has had his full share of trouble with the population because of the food shortage and, to our knowledge, has been subjected to the activities of individuals representing themselves as special police. (See further report on this subject.)

c. We are convinced that the quoted utterance was not made by this mayor and recommend that any action on the matter be suspended.

3. The above-mentioned report also states, "An American born woman school teacher in St. Agate (sic) (C554415) is constantly working on the natives in that area making unfavorable comparisons of Allied troops and the Germans."

a. The only person in Sant' Agata di Militello (not St. Agate) who answers this description is a young woman, 25 years old, named Artino Maria di Antonio. She was born in Ohio and was brought back here as a baby and has been here ever since. For the last

two years she has been teaching, mostly private pupils. She has an excellent reputation in the town. She stated that in the early days of the Allied occupation here she spoke to several American soldiers and, possibly, some officers but is not sure. There was no conversation of any nature comparing the Germans and the Allies.

b. On the day this letter is written she stated that in the morning she met Virzi Benedetto, head of a private school and expressed herself to him as being fearful what might have happened if the Germans had stayed here. That she states is the only time she has made any comparison, direct or indirect, of the nature charged.

c. The above-mentioned Virzi Benedetto told us that he had seen the young woman this morning and that she had remarked to him substantially as reported in par 3b just above.

d. Might not this reference apply to some other town? We are convinced that the woman is blameless.





1. Routine patrols under supervision of our battalion S-2,^s picked up the following information during the past four days. As instances of this sort are not expected to create a favorable reaction toward Allied control we are passing these reports along for your information.

A. The mayor of Millitello Rosmarino (C595390) is reported by a large portion of the inhabitants to issue the city grain supply to fascists only. He has told several anti-fascists to "eat their ration books".

B. The mayor of San Fratello (C525360) told one family that asked for grain, "You might as well kill yourselves as the Americans will not feed you." The mayor's name is Mancuso Benedetto. He was left in power by our authorities.

C. An American born woman school teacher in St. Agate (C554415) is constantly working on the natives in that area making unfavorable comparisons of Allied troops and the Germans.

D. Our patrol was the first Allied unit in the town of Galati Mamerrino. Upon arrival they were met by a crowd of approximately one thousand people which nearly rioted. Later it was discovered that local fascists had caused this disturbance. These fascists (for names see attached roster) told the natives that city authorities were not making an equal distribution of food.







Reference your memorandum 1017/PS dated 16 Aug.

I am most anxious that your department should receive the fullest assistance and cooperation from the Military Security organisation, and in particular that any information concerning civilians possessed by the latter and required by you should be readily available to your department.

To this end Eighth Army (and Seventh Army also) has instructed by this H.Q. before the commencement of the operation to ensure that local M.G.O.R. representatives (normally C.A.P.O.'s) should be kept promptly informed by I(b) Staffs and/or Field Security Sections of all cases handled by them affecting civilians, and that there should be a full and free exchange of information concerning civilian individuals or organisations.

I believe that this instruction has been properly carried out in the Eighth Army area, and the information you require should therefore be already in the possession of your representatives in that area.

I feel therefore that it would be more appropriate if you could instruct the letter to forward to you the information which has been passed to them in this way, rather than that I should call on G.S.I.(b) Eighth Army to reproduce at this time the records of several hundred civil cases which their Military Security organisation has dealt with during the past five weeks.

I am anxious, if possible, to avoid making such a demand at this time when G.S.I.(b) Eighth Army is so fully occupied, not only with its immediate security problems in the important N.Z. sector of the island, but also with preparations for further operations.

If you are unable to get the information you require by the means I suggest, please let me know and I will take all possible steps to meet your request.

As regards your final paragraph in which you refer to personnel contact with a security staff officer in connection with civil cases dealt with by the Eighth Army, Major de FREITAS is the senior G.S.I.(b) Officer at H.Q. Eighth Army; I am sure that he would be very glad to be contacted either by yourself or by an officer of your department nominated by you, to discuss any outstanding points in connection with this subject. I could easily arrange such a meeting.

I have discussed the subject of your letter with Col. JOHNSTONE who is in full agreement with the course I have suggested above, not only as regards the Eighth Army area, but also that of the Seventh Army.

I am enclosing, if possible, to avoid mailing such a demand at this
time when G.S.I.(b) Eighth Army is so fully occupied, not only with its immediate
security problems in the important R.A. sector of the island, but also with
preparations for further operations.

If you are unable to get the information you require by the
means I suggest, please let me know and I will take all possible steps to meet
your request.

As regards your final paragraph in which you refer to personnel
contact with a security staff officer in connection with civil cases dealt with
by the Eighth Army, Major de FRETTES is the senior G.S.I.(b) Officer at H.Q.
Eighth Army; I am sure that he would be very glad to be contacted either by
yourself or by an officer of your department nominated by you, to discuss any
outstanding points in connection with this subject. I could easily arrange such
a meeting.

I have discussed the subject of your letter with Col. MORIN-THOMAS
who is in full agreement with the course I have suggested above, not only as regards
the Eighth Army area, but also that of the Seventh Army.

I shall write again in a few days time, and will call to
see you in case you wish to discuss the matter further.

With reference to point 8 of the minutes of the 14th Meeting of the Political and Economic Council on the 30th July the following is the reply from London to a request for information about any Italian anti-Fascists that there may be in the Lipari Islands.

2. No detailed information is available, but it is believed that many anti-Fascists originally in the Lipari Islands were removed for greater security either to the islands of Ponza and Ventotene near Naples or to prisons in the interior in Abruzzi and Calabria.

Three months ago the following were believed to be at Ponza:-

(a) RICCARDO BAUER and ERNESTO ROSSI, who were believed to be leaders of Giustizia e Libertà movement in Italy and who were sentenced in 1930. They are both Professors in Economics and are considered to be leaders of Liberal forces in Italy.

(b) ALTIERO SPINELLI, a prominent Communist, who later became a Social Democrat - imprisoned about ten years ago.

The following are believed to have been in the Lipari Islands; but their present whereabouts is not known.

(a) ALTIERO, a lawyer of Trieste, reported to have been exiled in November, 1942.

(b) TORRICIANO, a lawyer, Grand Master of Freemasons.

(c) CALPANILE, an University student.

(d) FERRUCIO PARTI, who had a distinguished record in the last war and worked on the staff of "Corriere della Sera", until it was taken over by the Fascists. Though not a Socialist, he was imprisoned for assisting the escape of FILIPPO TURATTI, the aged Socialist leader.

3. In the meantime it appears from Italian broadcasts that a decree has been issued providing for the liberation of political prisoners which is to be expedited by all possible means, and prominence has already been given in the Popolo di Roma to the release of 4,000 of such prisoners.

A brief summary of circumstances address and description should be included with each name.

4. Particulars of persons now employed by AMGOT and applicants for such employment are by direction of C.C.A.O. to be checked in this Division. A form, a specimen of which is attached, should therefore be forwarded in respect of all existing employees and applicants for employment to enable this to be done.

5. Any other inquiries should be forwarded to this Division.
