Subject : Reformatory of Palermo.--

At present, in the Reformatory of Palermo there are 112 minors. Many of these are awaiting trial. The personnel who serve in it, as follows:

Functionaries employed with Directing Staff.....	M, 5
Prison guards.....	M, 45
Hired personnel.....	M, 12
Teachers of art.....	M, 4

Seven prison guards have their duties in the judiciary offices, ten have various duties (kitchen, stores, infirmary). The remaining personnel serve in surveillance on the minors. If the seven guards were not at Judiciary Offices, some agents would be available, but due to the present needs I think that the number of guards should not be changed.

I beg to inform you that in the above place there is a scarcity of water as the water pressure, light and does not draw the necessary amount of water. However I do not believe this matter can be straightened out at present, as it probably is due to broken mains.

The Scillato Society has been informed, but so far they have not been able to do anything about it.

The minors are in need of shoes. 300 wooden-shoes are needed. This prison will be able to make these, when the necessary material can be had.

The Director of Reformatory asks for some means of transport.

The Medical Officer of ARCOI made an inspection of the Central Prison on 16 Sept. 1945 and from his report the following matters require attention.

1. Containers for rubbish, food, paper etc. in form of baskets to be kept in each place of confinement where there are several prisoners.

2. The latrine accommodation is insufficient and bucket latrines outside living places to be introduced - there should be 5 bucket latrines to every 100 prisoners in addition to the one squat type in rooms.

3. The Cook-House, Bakery and stores to be lime washed.

4. Bins for soil to be brought into use and kept on concrete slabs in vicinity of Cook House but sufficiently far away so as not to cause any fouling. These bins to be made of tin and kept covered. They should be emptied daily.

5. It is hoped that you may be able to obtain greater force of water for the laundry. At all places where dirty water runs away a grease trap is required. This will be required at the Bath House, Laundry and Cook-house.

6. The report brings to notice the improvement which has been made and the above points are directions on which the medical authorities desire to see further action taken.

The Superintendent hopes you will be able to have them attended to and put into force during the next week or 10 days.

Notes on the inspection of the Prison, Via Vicini, Palermo by Major W.D.R. Thomson P.S. Division on 10th September 1943.

The inspection staff included Captain Brown, Civil Prisons Section, the Governor and one of the Prison Medical Officers.

Improvements have been made since the inspection of August 17th through the energies of all concerned. This is reflected in the attitude and demeanour of both prisoners and staff. The present situation is summarised as follows:-

1. Accommodation:- The prison will remain fairly full owing to the influx of men from other prisons. However there is no obvious overcrowding. The two "social blocks" have been thoroughly cleaned and lime-washed ready for re-housing the inmates. The corridors and passages have been lime-washed and scrubbed down with cresol. Beds lying in yards etc. is being cleaned. The main water supply has been installed and is functioning satisfactorily for the past few days. Lavatory accommodation is inadequate, nearly fifty men using one squat. Rubbish baskets should be provided and any food in the living rooms be placed in fly proof containers and obviate the fly nuisance. Some inmates were without beds.

2. Sanitation:- This shows an all round improvement. The main water supply has been installed and is functioning satisfactorily for the past few days. Lavatory

3. Disinfectants:- All blankets have been disinfected. ~~and~~ ^{and} where slippers, boots, showers, ring vessels are installed ~~are~~ ^{are} traps appear to

At the time of inspection the place was tidy and clean. No gross traps appear to be provided.

5. Laundry. Main water supply is laid on but the amount of water passing into the washing tanks is inadequate. Soap is scarce but hot water is provided by a copper fired by wood.

6. Cookhouse. Judged by army standards there is room for considerable improvement. The staff consists of six cooks. The fabric requires lime-washing and more attention paid to cleanliness. Still bins consist of baskets set within the cookhouse. The bakery was functioning well and in ~~fact~~ ^{fact} reported in the flour store.

7. Food. 400 grammes of bread are issued with pasta stew, meat is provided two or three times a week. The ration is augmented by the sale of grapes wine and milk each day. 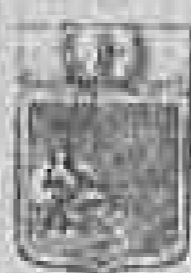

But now that things are becoming normally I will retake action upon it, in order to get the necessary amounts for the starting of works.

Therefore, I beg you to release me from the obligation of performing the ~~masonry~~ ^{MASONRY} works which the prison is now in need, as this work would be useless for the coming construction of a new building, in the meantime I promise you to increase the cleanliness and disinfection of the place so as to make it hygienic as much as possible.

The cleaning, the hygiene and the prophylactic services in prison are quite improved with the supplying of water.

The alimentation is not yet arranged for the missing of some foods. The increasing of bread and macaroni is very necessary.

The sanitary conditions of prisoners for this month are satisfying. Among those arrived from prisons of Favignana we have verified many cases of run down with vedimas at the limbs for alimentary insufficiency (avitaminosi). It is necessary to improve the alimentation for the sick prisoners with meat and eggs that are lacking. In the last few days we have been furnished every day of 150 litres milk for all the sick prisoners and those with stomach diseases.

In comparing to the letter above indicated I communicate:

1. As much bed sheets are concerning we notify you that the sheets are insufficient because with the moving of the detainees from here to other prisons, they were sent to the direction where the detainees were set out. We have left only very few sheets at our disposal, a few hundred are in mediocre state that can be used.

It would be necessary for us more than a thousand sheets.

2. The disinfection and the cleaning of the blankets is in course.
3. The existing lavatories are sufficient but they need to be provided of abundant water;—

This matter has been taken care of and they will do as much as possible to improve and complete the furnishing. With a separate letter it will be sent the sum required for the occurring water pipes.

4. The bathroom has good basins and is provided with shower baths. These are in course of repair and also the matter of furnishing this locality with sufficient water has been taken care of. At present time water is very scarce for the damage endured to the water mains during the bombardment.

5. The water situation in general line is already improved.

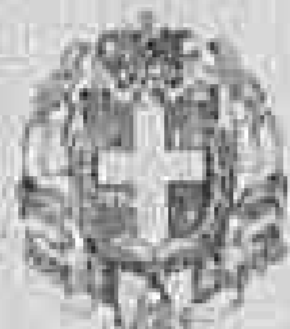



NOTES ON INSPECTION OF THE PRISON, VIA VICIARDONA, PALERMO,
BY Lt. COL. D. A. MCNEALD, P.H. Division on 11 Aug 42.

1. Accommodation.
The normal accommodation was 5000 but this has been reduced by bombing to 1500.
2. No. of Prisoners.
Approximately 800, two hundred of whom were brought in during the last two days.
3. Staff.
Resident staff of 185 including the Governor. This is 40 below the normal establishment. In addition there are two medical orderlies who live in.
4. Visiting Staff.
There are two non-resident doctors - Capt. Saso and Dott. Servino - one of whom visits the prison each day.
5. Sanitation.
Owing to the failure of the water supply, due to bombing, the prison has been in a deplorable condition. Very great improvement has been made during the last few days, but there is still a lot to be done. Water has been made available from today and the drains are being flushed out. For some months the latrines were emptied by hand. Laboratory accommodation is quite inadequate. There is only one aquator for each room, in which there are anything from 40 to 80 men. This would be alleviated by the provision of buckets. Cresol is available at the prison and this should be used freely.
6. Disinfection.
A mobile disinfectant, which has not been in operation for some months, has been brought in and the disinfection and disinfection of blankets, clothing etc are being carried out daily. Blankets are disinfectant at the rate of 150 per day. This is the maximum number as the machine can operate for only 4 hours per day.
7. Bathing Facilities.
There is one large bathhouse with 6 sprays and 8 slipper baths. Some of the inmates have not had a bath for two years as the bathhouse has not been in use for this period. Now that the water supplies have been reconnected each man will be able to have one bath per week and a clean change of clothing.
8. Laundry.
The laundry is working again fairly satisfactorily and temporary hoses/pipes have been supplied from the bathhouse to the laundry unit. Pipes are repaired. There is a shortage of soap.

There is one large bathhouse with 6 showers and 8 slipper baths. Some of the inmates have not had a bath for two years as the bathhouse has not been in use for this period. Now that the water supplies have been remedied each man will be able to have one bath per week and a clean change of clothing.

8. Laundry.
The laundry is working again fairly satisfactorily and temporary hoses/pipes have been supplied from the bathhouse to the laundry until the pipes are repaired. There is a shortage of soap.

9. Cookhouse.
The Cookhouse has been cleaned up and greatly improved, but a lot still requires to be done.

10. Food.
Only one meal a day is provided consisting of unseasoned a small amount of bread. This is not sufficient. The calory nature is probably below 500 per day and this is the cause of the emaciated condition of the inmates.

11. General Condition of Inmates.
(a) Political Prisoners.
These are housed separately in batches of 15 to 20. They look clean and well fed. Supplies of bread and fruit are sent in to them by relatives. They are allowed one bath per week the same as the other prisoners with changed under clothing. They asked permission to use the corridor, which is wide and airy, for the purpose of taking exercise. The Governor promised that this would be done.

(c) Ordinary prisoners.

The great majority of these are suffering from lack of food, many are extremely emaciated particularly those recently brought in from the island of Utahe. Their cells have been cleaned up during the last few days. Their mattresses and blankets are infested with lice, fleas, and bugs. Their blankets are being disinfectod, and their mattresses emptied and filled with clean hay after they have been washed. Four prisoners are obviously non compos mentis. The doctor has promised to have them removed to an asylum as soon as there is one functioning. Several prisoners were found to be ill and were removed into hospital.

12. Hospital.

This has accommodation for 300. At present 45 men are in hospital mainly suffering from gastrointestinal complaints. Quite half of them are from the island of Utahe and are suffering from extreme indigestion. No milk is provided for these patients, their principal diet being thin soup. There are two operating theaters, one of which is well equipped with surgical instruments, but there is a shortage of medical supplies, drugs, dressings etc. This will be remedied as far as possible.

13. General remarks.

There appears to be lack of supervision on the part of the Medical Officers. No routine inspection of cells, sanitary appliances, cookhouse etc have been made. One case of hemorrhoiditis was removed to a single cell.

14. Recommendations.

1. That the repairs to water supply be expedited.
2. That bucket latrines be brought into use to augment the sanitary accommodation.
3. That additional bread, cheese and milk be added to the dietary for at least one month.
4. That milk and if possible, eggs be provided for the patients in hospital.
5. That the visiting doctor be instructed to make routine inspections of the whole of the prison and keep a sanitary diary.
6. That the prisoners be given more facilities for taking exercise.
