Memorandum for Col. William C. Murrell.

On Sunday evening August 2, 1943 Col. Murrell came to me and asked me to prepare General Order No. 3 to stabilize prices for agricultural products and livestock. It was necessary to have such an order prepared because in August the C.I.O. had raised high prices for grain, which caused a disturbance in surrounding territory. I prepared the order and trust it was satisfactory.

On Monday morning on August 3 I left for Colchester to arrive here at six in the evening. I stopped at Colchester but Major Benton Jones was not in, but found the situation quite normal.

Arriving here I contacted Lt. Col. Irish, and he arranged quarters for me. So far there has not been any military court trials. He is desirous of having all the Italian courts opened at once, and I am to confer with the judges today. He stated that it would do us good to see the prosecution against some of the men they could not do so of many cases, and he wanted the matter in the jail reduced which is overcrowded. Col. Bradford has been here and knows the situation. There have not been any bombings for some time, and all men were kept in the barracks for Italian officials to maintain a situation as fully as possible as possible.

Before leaving Algiers Col. Murrell asked me to transmit to the Military Government section through you any communications which might be helpful in future operations.

So far the greatest problem I have seen is lack of by civilians. While these could be prosecuted under martial law as plundering, I feel that in future operations we should be able to get some of the men who are guilty of these things and put them in the barracks. Before leaving Algiers Col. Hargen asked me to transmit to the Military Government Section through you any observations which might be helpful in future operations.

So far the greatest problem I have seen is looting by civilians. While these could be prosecuted under regulations 2 and 3, I feel that in future prosecutions we should not be an offender not carrying the death penalty and trials even after the completion. In these days with hardships resulting in unloosened and abandoned premises a real problem is presented.

Likewise directives for opening all courts should be prepared in advance so that we would not face the inevitable situation that has existed or would have existed if the directives for trials in Italian courts had been carried out.

The directives I refer to are those dated July 24 and July 27.

Lt. Hargenberger prepared a mimeographed form of charge (Form No. 4) in Italian and English which I have taken with me and am passing out for use in summary courts. It follows your ideas on the matter.

I had a long talk with the G.A.O. officers here last night. Lt. Col. Irish, Major Kennedy, Capt. Perara and DeBourbon, Lts. Becker and Hahn, Capt. Maud is the only British officer here. All of them stated Major (Dr.) Johnwick had done any outstanding work at Cattegani which is quite hard here. He originally was at Gela and gave me full details of the landing.

It is the attitude of the American officials that more and more of the operations should be imposed on Italian functionaries and in this I feel they are acting wisely. The administration seems to have been one based on common sense rather than attempting to follow a stereotyped plan.

Col. Irish told me he had two problems -- one arising over the grain situation, which he felt would be corrected by the issuance of General Order No 3 drafted by Col. Salts for the purpose of securing that he is going to Palermo.

The other is in reference to courts and prisoners in the jail. Lieutenant Smith, who is now in charge of the police feels we can get two things cleared up within a few days, after which I shall return to Syracuse.

It would seem desirable that the court forms should be circulated. I left the charge sheet form used in Syracuse here, and it will be used in this province.

Second Lieut. Krile has a case ever at Mussomeli involving looting where the Sicilian had a gun. I told him to have a brief Summary Court session, and commit the case to the Superior Court for trial as I felt Superior Courts would soon be established.

It seems to me to be advisable to send Major Hannaford out to talk to the judges. I know he could do much to help the situation in reference to opening Italian Courts. Major Wright is no longer with us being retained at A.F.H.A. to work on the Sicilian Gazette.

This morning a loan of 15 million lire was made from the Bank of Italy to be repaid from taxes. The money is to be needed for payment of officials and relief. As I said before Col. Irish and the boys are doing a fine job here.

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If I hear nothing further I expect to be able to return to Syracuse Friday. Awaiting any orders at your command.
