Livio Mosca in the functioning of A.R.P. in PALERMO, the same system is to be worked out in TRAPANI.

In view of the report from a visiting officer from this Section, copy attached, it is felt that the following action should be taken.

The Commandante of the Fire Brigade should be instructed to work out a scheme on the same lines as is operating in PALERMO. For this purpose the Commandante should visit the Commandante of the PALERMO Brigade and study his plans.

The engineer of the Comune should be responsible for the clearing of debris and the pulling down of dangerous buildings which have been bombed.

The Comune should be urged to provide earth closets as required at each shelter, if water closets are not practicable, and arrangements be made for the daily emptying of the earth closets.

The people living in the shelters should be housed, if possible, in deserted houses or disused large buildings.

The Fire Brigade should be responsible for rescue

Report of Civil Defense
Commune of Trapani

The civilian defense of Trapani was organized as was the whole of Sicily, similar to that of the United States and England. However, as is true with most Fascist organizations, it only looked good on paper. The U.N.P.A. was charged with the duties of Air Raid Wardens, Rescue Squads, Demolition and etc. However, as far as the Commune of Trapani is concerned they only devoted their time to looting and during the Air Raids took to the hills or shelters.

The civilian defense of Trapani was organized under the supervision of Dott Stabile. Dott Stabile's whereabouts at the present time is unknown.

At the present time the job of clearing debris and rubbish from the city streets is being carried out under the supervision of the C.A. of Trapani.

Air Raid shelters are plentiful and well constructed of stone and sand. The average depth of overhead protection being 4 to 5 meters.

Sanitary facilities are nil. People are living in same, some have lived in the shelters for the past year.

It is recommended that crews be hired to pull down walls of bombed buildings throughout the city since they present a very serious hazard.

It is recommended that the Commune of Trapani organize a Civil Defense similar to the one recommended for the Commune of Palermo and that Commandante Monaco be made responsible for its organization and maintenance.

At the present time there are available two auto-ambulances and one civilian hospital of 146 beds.
