INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF
AND TO DISCHARGED PRISONERS IN SICILY.

AMGOT/1091/ES

21 Sett. 1943.

In order to assist prisoners on liberation the following ruling has been arrived at :

1. A prisoner who has served a sentence of not less than one year may receive a grant up to 200 lire, paid immediately on liberation.
 2. A discharged prisoner in residence in the locality of the prison would normally receive a railway ticket to his place of residence, but as this is impossible at the present time a sum of 100 lire will be paid to aid means of travel.
 3. A person who has been detained in prison awaiting trial by court only, on liberation, be granted aid for travelling up to 100 lire.
- This payment will be made by the Prism direct and charged against Prison account no aid to prisoners on liberation.

2. Un detenuto scarcerato vicino la località delle sue residenze, nonché riceverebbe un biglietto di ferrovia per il luogo di residenza, a seconda questo si sarà possibile gli sarà pagata una somma di lire 100 per i mezzi di viaggio.
3. Una persona che è stata detenuta in carcere per attendere il giudizio del tribunale, subito all'atto di liberazione riceverà aiuto per versare fino a lire 100.

2. Un detenuto se rientra vicino la località della sua residenza, non soltanto riceverebbe un biglietto di ferrovia per il luogo di residenza, ma siccome questo è oggi impossibile gli sarà pagata una somma di lire 100 per i mezzi di viaggio.
3. Una persona che è stata detenuta in carcere per etendere al risultato del tribunale, può, all'atto di liberazione ricevere aiuto per viaggiare sino a lire 100.

Questi pagamenti saranno fatti dal direttore del carcere o dagli altri uffici del carcere come aiuto ai prigionieri liberandosi.

1. With reference to your memorandum AMGOT/1091/PS of 14th September, I agree that some form of financial assistance should be made available to the persons described in your note.

2. In this connection the following points arise:

(a) Is it not possible to centralize the payments you suggest through the Prison management? Civil Affairs Officers are already grossly overworked, and the last sentence of para. 3 suggests that one such unhappy officer might find himself involved in a very intricate Means Test with 200 political prisoners.

(b) As long as the trains do not run, is there any real value in basing the relief given to prisoners on the cost of a ticket from the prison area to his place of residence? The person concerned will either have to walk or hitch-hike. I would prefer to see a flat lire 300 in your para 2 (a) and lire 100 in your para 2 (b).

3. Although prisons are managed and superintended on an island-wide basis, I imagine that they are still financed by the Provincial F.O. and booked against State expenditure. If this is the case, I suggest that the funds necessary for your purpose should be drawn in a similar manner.

1. It is recommended that all prisoners at the end of their period of detention should be given some cash in order to help them to return to their homes, if this is not in the town in which the Prison is located. When train services operate aid can well be a ticket bought by the Prison, but till such time a cash payment will help. Any cash due to a prisoner on account of earnings in Prison will not be taken into account.

2. (a) A prisoner who has served a minimum sentence of 1 year to receive a grant of 200 Lire and ticket to commune from which convicted or to his place of work as may be approved of by Prison Director.

(b) prisoner who has served a sentence of less than 1 year to receive ticket for transportation or a sum of cash in lieu if there is no means of public transportation.

3. The case of a person who has been held in Prison and later dismissed or discharged by a Court is not one usually handled by the Prisons Department. I think however, this might be so. The circumstances in which we find many persons and A.M.G.O.T. responsibility towards the Citizen make it a necessary problem for welfare. I would suggest a grant be made authorised by A.M.G.O.T. to Local C.A.O.s to pay cash to needful cases. This may run into large sums of money for example some 200 Political Prisoners might be released all within one week.

It is recommended that all prisoners at the end of their period of detention should be given some cash in order to help them to return to their homes, if this is not in the town in which the prison is located. When train services operate ~~the~~ aid can well be a ticket bought by the prison, but till such time a cash payment will help. ~~The maximum cash payment might be 250 Lire dependent upon place to which the discharged prisoner is proceeding.~~ Any cash due to a prisoner on account of earnings in prison will not be taken into account.

The case of a person who has been held in prison and later dismissed or discharged by a court is not one usually handled by the Prisons Department. I think however, this might be so. The circumstances in which we find many persons and AMGOT responsibility towards the Citizen make it necessary problem for welfare.
