Referring to communication of 14th September written you by Capt. Ballance on "Refusal of Traders to accept B.M.A. Currency", and communication to you of 17th Sept. written by Major Hefford on "B.M.A. Currency".

We have put into effect the remedial measures suggested by:

- (a) issuing 10,000 copies of reprint of Proclamation No. 5. with a supply to each Provincial S.C.A.O. (1,000 to Palermo Province) that these be distributed to all banks and commercial establishments to be posted where visible by customers;
- (b) issuing through the P.R.O. to "Sicilia Liberata" a release which appeared in today's issue; same to other Italian papers in Sicily ;
- (c) issuing through the P.R.O. a release for "Stars & Stripes"
(Copies of both attached)
- (d) addressing to Capt. Graham AMGOT, H.Q., a request that the British and American Army and Navy Commands be requested to issue orders to their personnel to familiarize themselves with the contents of Proclamation No. 5. and report promptly all violations to their Commanding Officers for transmissal to AMGOT.

Warning Concerning Rates of Exchange & Currencies.

Various incidents which have occurred have convinced the Allied Military Government of the necessity of bringing again to the attention of Allied Military and Naval Personnel the necessity of familiarizing themselves with the terms of Proclamation No. 3, which stipulates what currencies are legal tender in Sicily and fixes the rates of exchange which apply to the interchange of the various currencies.

Banks and business concerns are required to display copies of the Proclamation, which contains a table of the equivalents of yellow seal dollar notes, British Military Authority Notes and lire notes, and the respective coins. On the newly printed copies of the Proclamation there will be added a footnote giving in Italian certain distinguishing characteristics of the various denominations of Allied Military Lire and British Military notes, calling attention to an easy means of identification of Allied Military Lire currency by the colors of the borders on the faces of the notes. The small notes have borders on their faces colored as follows: Lire notes - blue; 2 lire - purple; 5 lire - green; 10 lire - black. The large notes have distinguishing borders on their faces as follows: 50 lire - blue; 100 lire - purple; 500 lire - green; 1,000 lire - black.

On the faces of the various British Military Authority notes the denominations appear both in numerals and in words; for example, 1/-, One Pound; 2/6, Two Shilling Six Pence; 1/-, One Shilling. One Pound is the equivalent of four dollars or four hundred lire; One Shilling is the equivalent of twenty U.S. Cents or twenty lire; Six Pence is the equivalent of 10 cents or 10 lire. These and other equivalents are shown in the table included in Proclamation No. 3.

The legal tender provisions in Proclamation No. 3 make it obligatory on banks to exchange lire for the various currencies mentioned and the Proclamation further orders that no transaction of any nature shall be entered into by anyone on the basis of rates of exchange other than those fixed by the Proclamation. Military and Naval personnel should report promptly to their commanding officers any cases of violations of any provision of the Proclamation.



Si deve notare che i biglietti delle Lire Militari Alleate possono essere facilmente riconosciuti (oltre che per i numeri) dai colori distintivi delle margini, i quali colori sono: (Biglietti piccoli 1 Lira - azzurro; 2 lire - violetto; 5 lire - verde; 10 lire - nero; (biglietti grandi) 50 lire - azzurro; 100 lire - violetto; 500 lire - verde; 1,000 lire - nero).

I biglietti "British Military Authority" mostrano la loro denominazione in numeri ed in parole; esempi: £1, One Pound (Una Lira Sterlina); 2/6 Two Shilling Six Pence (due scellini e sei "pence", ossia due scellini e mezzo); 1/-, One Shilling (uno Scellino). Proclamation No. 3

Currency and Exchange

Harold R. L. G. Alexander, G.C.B., C.S.I., D.S.O., M.C., General, General Officer Commanding the Allied Forces in

and Military Governor of the occupied territory, hereby proclaim as follows:

Article I - CURRENCY

All United States coin and all United States currency bearing a yellow seal on the right side of the face of the bill and known as United States Yellow Seal Currency, and all notes bearing the inscription «British Military Authority» issued by the British Government, as well as all coins of Great Britain, are hereby made legal tender in the occupied territory, and no person shall refuse to accept such legal tender for the payment of any amount.

Article II - EXCHANGE

Section 1. Rates of Exchange. The rates of exchange between the currencies and coin mentioned in Article I and the Italian Lira shall be as Specified in the Schedule hereto.

Section 2. Exchange Obligatory. Within the occupied territory every person in the business of banking or the exchange of money, on demand of any holder of currency or coins described in Article I hereof, shall exchange such currency or coins for lire in his possession at the rates specified in the schedule, without charging any commission or fee for making such exchange.

Section 3. Prohibition of other Rates. No transaction of any nature shall be entered into on the basis of rates of Exchange other than those outlined by or under this Proclamation.

Article III - EXPORTS and IMPORTS of MONEY PROHIBITED

No currency and no coin of any country may be exported from or imported into the occupied territory except as authorised by the Allied Military Government.

Article IV - PENALTIES

Any person violating the provisions of this proclamation shall on conviction by an Allied Military Court be liable to imprisonment or fine, or both, as the Court may determine.

Article V - EFFECTIVE DATE

This Proclamation will become operative in each province or part thereof within the occupied territory on the date of its first publication therein.

There is no information in this Section that cases in which B.M.A. currency is refused, frequently occur, but if such is the case no doubt the C.F.C. will wish to adopt the suggestion put forward by Capt. BALLANCE to familiarise the public generally with this form of currency.

In the meantime, the attention of the various police organizations has been drawn to the matter in order that they may, when necessary, advise the public that such currency is legal tender.

It has been asked that details of any cases of refusal to accept such currency should be at once reported to this Section

AMGOT HQ SICILY

SUBJECT : Refusal of traders to accept BMA Currency.

TO : Col. Lemuel Bolles, Commissioner of Public Safety.

1. It has come to notice that instances have arisen in Palermo in which traders have refused to accept BMA currency in exchange for goods.

2. Positive action was not possible in any of the cases referred to because the information which reached this office concerning them was both scanty and late.

3. In this part of the Island the inhabitants are not as familiar with BMA currency as they are with lire notes and dollar bills, and some traders may not appreciate that BMA currency is legal tender. On the other hand it is possible that similar cases have arisen with regard to dollar bills in those parts of the Island where BMA currency is in general circulation.

4. It seems that an attempt should be made for:-

- (a) Familiarise the inhabitants to a greater extent with the new forms of currency.
- (b) Inform the troops (who are usually the persons refused) of the prompt action that must be taken in all cases in which legal currency is refused.

5. With regard to (a), it is suggested that:

- (i) the proclamations fixing the ~~wrong~~ rates of exchange should be reprinted, and in particular a copy of the proclamation should be displayed wherever banking business is conducted.
- (ii) BMA currency and dollar bills, and information with regard to their equivalent value in lire should be displayed in bank windows as well as inside bank premises.
- (iii) Suitable propaganda should be inserted in the press.

6. With regard to (b), troops should be informed through their various daily orders of:

(i) the importance of refusing to negotiate in

for goods.

2. Positive action was not possible in any of the cases referred to because the information which reached this office concerning them was both scanty and late.

3. In this part of the Island the inhabitants are not as familiar with BMA currency as they are with lire notes and dollar bills, and some traders may not appreciate that BMA currency is legal tender. On the other hand it is possible that similar cases have arisen with regard to dollar bills in those parts of the Island where BMA currency is in general circulation.

4. It seems that an attempt should be made for:-
- (a) Familiarise the inhabitants to a greater extent with the new forms of currency.
 - (b) Inform the troops (who are usually the persons refused) of the prompt action that must be taken in all cases in which legal currency is refused.
5. With regard to (a), it is suggested that:
- (i) the proclamations fixing the exchange rates of exchange should be re-posted, and in particular a copy of the proclamation should be displayed wherever banking of exchange business is conducted.
 - (ii) BMA currency and dollar bills, and information with regard to their equivalent value in lire should be displayed in bank windows as well as inside bank premises.
 - (iii) Suitable propaganda should be inserted in the press.
6. With regard to (b), troops should be informed through their various daily orders of:
- (i) the importance of bringing to notice all cases in which currency of legal tender is refused.
 - (ii) that local police should be called at once to deal with matters of this nature; and
 - (iii) that full details should be reported for transmission to AMGOT.
7. I suggest that a copy of this report, after being referred to Supt Civil Police for his observations, be forwarded to Finance Division for any action which they consider necessary.
