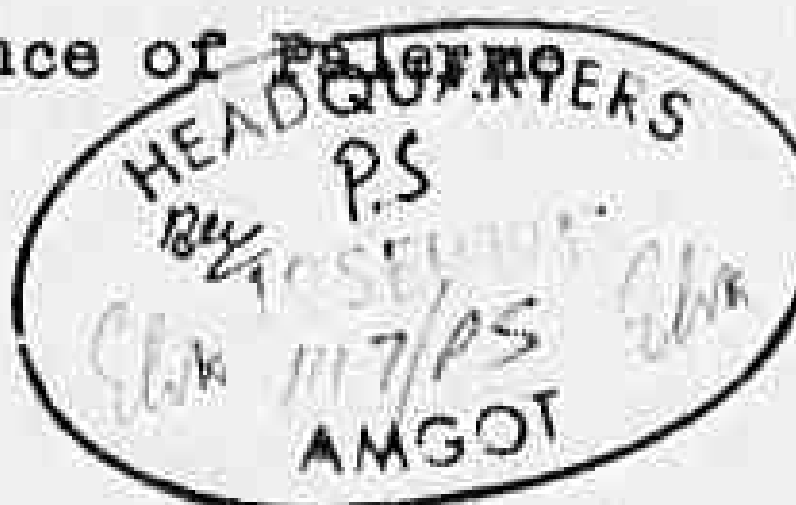

Attached is a copy of the Denuncia Apparecchi Radio, Fotografici, Binocoli, etc., issued August 21, 1943, effecting Article II of Proclamation No. 11.

In the September 17, 1943 issue of Sicilia Liberata will be found an order concerning development of films by local photographers. This order, requested by G2 officials reads:

"Art. 1 Da oggi tutti gli studi fotografici ed i negozi che comunque si occupano di articoli e lavori fotografici non potranno piu' accettare da parte di civili e militari rollini, filmpach, lastre, pellicole tec. per lo sviluppo e la stampa.

Art. 2. I seguenti studi fotografici sono stati scelti per lo sviluppo e la stampa di rollini filmpach etc., esclusivamente per il personale militare:

Russo, Via Cavour 54.
 Palazzolo, Corso Vittorio Emanuele 370.
 Santangelo, Via Maqueda 202.
 Foto Ottica, Via Roma 135.
 Vito Lo Verso, corso Camillo Finocchiaro Aprile 9.

Art. 3. Gli studi fotografici potranno solo eseguire ritratti a civili e militari.

Art. 4. I contravventori saranno puniti secondo legge."

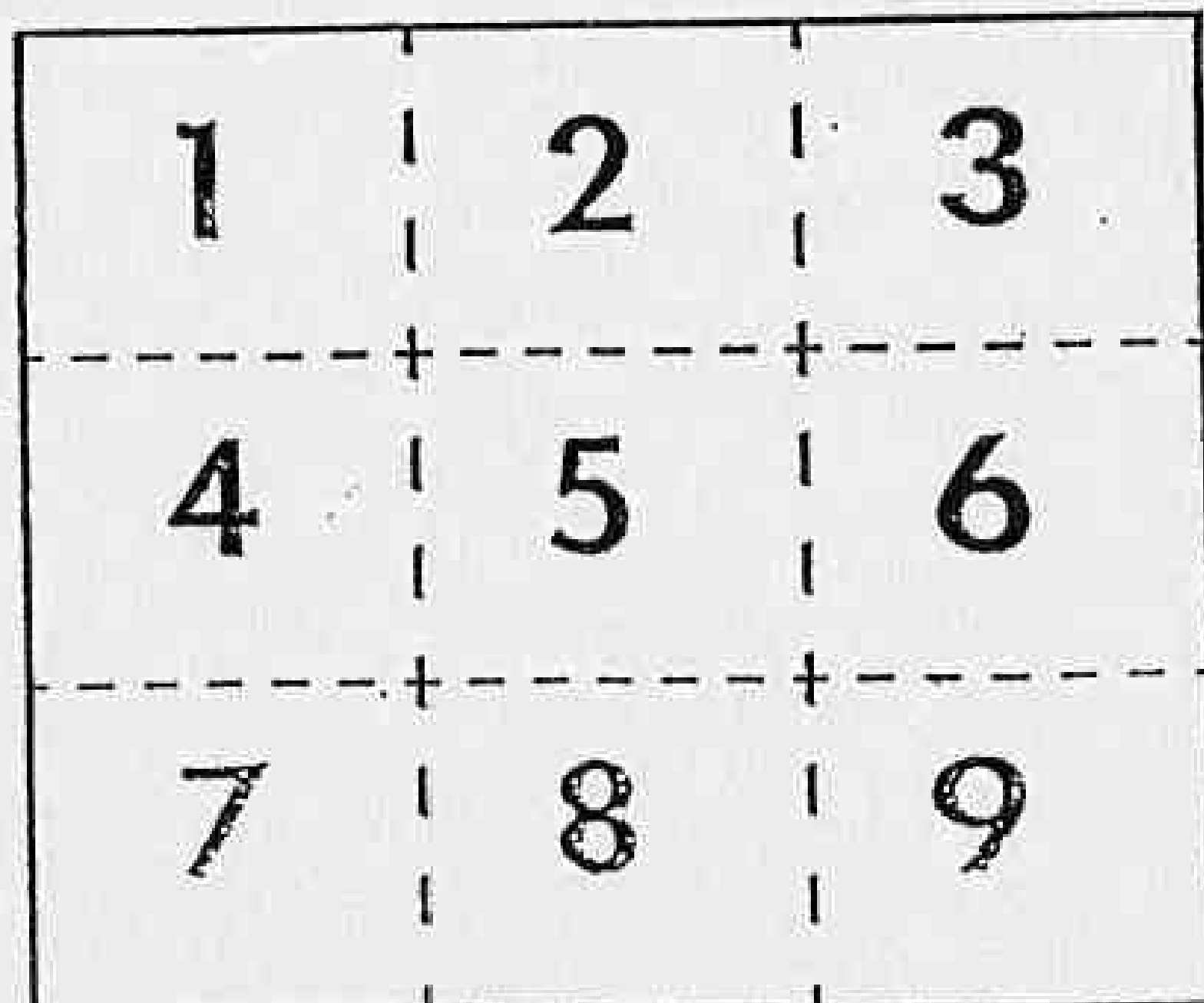
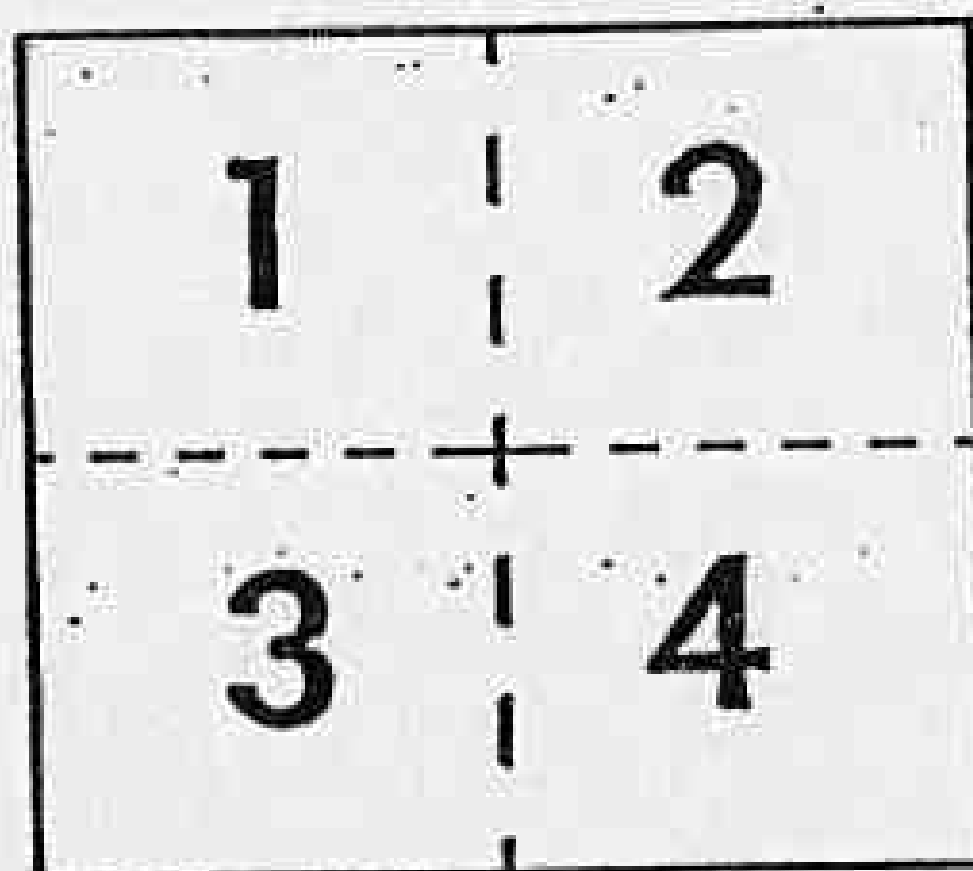

TRANSLATION: R. B.

"Art. 1. From to-day all the photographic concerns, shops etc. which in any way deal with photographic articles of any description, will not accept from this date any more film rolls, film packs, plates films etc., neither civilian nor military ones, neither for the development, nor for copies to be reproduced.

"Art. 2. The following photographers have been designated for developing and printing, and reproduction of films etc., exclusively for military persons.

"Art. 3. The photographic offices may only execute portraits of civilian and members of the armed forces.

"Art. 4. The transgressors will be punished according to the law.

SUBJECT: PROCLAMATION NO. 11, ARTICLE II

TO : S.C.A.P.O. Province of Palermo (through S.C.A.O.)

Please report what steps have been taken in the Province of Palermo for the enforcement of Article II of Proclamation No. 11, "Prohibition of Photography and declaration of Photographic Equipment".

If, as may be the case, the S.C.A.O. has issued a written permit under section 1(b) please forward a copy.

I am informed that members of the Allied Forces are having films developed by local photographers and that these frequently contain photographs of Military equipment which constitutes a breach of Military Security and I should be glad of an assurance that some attention is being paid to this aspect of photography.
