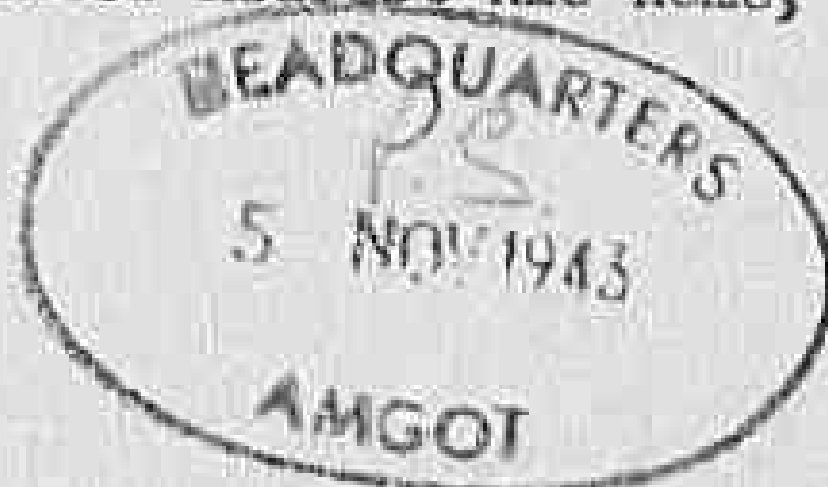

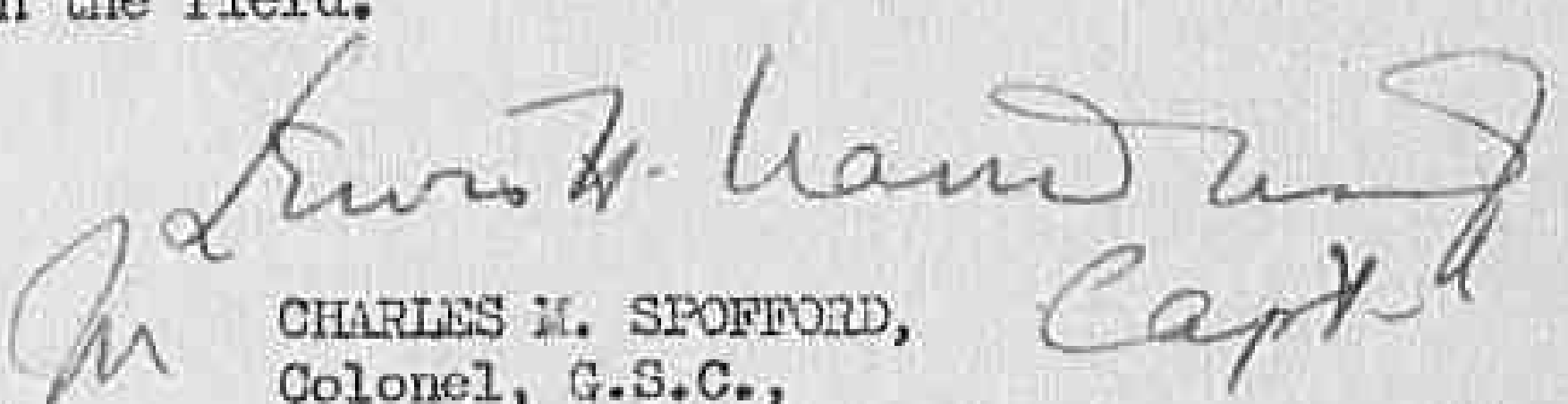

His full name is NASINI Filippo fu Adolfo e di Justini Barbara born in Rome 22.8.1917 and residing in Sicily for the last 6 years. He himself admits to have left the working party of No.1 Det.368 POW Camp on the 9.10.1943. He insists, that he does not know where his brother went to, who was escaping with him.

Nasini Filippo was sent today to the nearest POW Camp 222, Siracusa and a copy of this letter accompanied the guard bringing him there for the information of the Camp commander.
