1. HERE FOLLOWS AGWAR CABLE WX 88818: (SIGNED COMMANDING GENERAL MTOUSA CITE NAGAP) "PROMOTION OF OFFICERS BELOW GRADE OF COLONEL AND EXCLUDING REGULAR ARMY OFFICERS IS AUTHORIZED ON REFERTING TO INACTIVE STATUS UNDER FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

a. OFFICERS HAVING HELD GRADE AS SECOND OR FIRST LIEUTENANT 18 MONTHS OR MORE, AS CAPTAIN OR MAJOR 24 MONTHS OR MORE, AND AS LIEUTENANT COLONEL 30 MONTHS OR MORE, WITH EFFICIENCY IN EX OF 40 OR HIGHER, WILL BE PROMOTED ONE GRADE ON FIRST DATE OF TERMINAL LEAVE. COMPUTATION OF TIME IN GRADE IS BASED ON 50 PERCENT INCREASE FOR OVERSEAS SERVICE.

b. OFFICERS HERETOFORE REVERTED TO INACTIVE STATUS AND ELIGIBLE UNDER FOREGOING PROVISIONS WILL BE PROMOTED IN RESERVE OR IN AUS, NGUS OFFICERS WILL BE GIVEN OPTION OF COMMISSION IN ORC OR COMMISSION IN AUS AND WILL BE INFORMED HIS SELECTION OF COMMISSION IN ORC WILL PROVIDE FOR AUTOMATIC TERMINATION HIS STATUS IN NGUS, FURTHER THAT SHOULD BE ELECT COMMISSION IN AUS SUCH COMMISSION IS TEMPORARY AND TERMINATES AUTOMATICALLY AT END OF EMERGENCY PLUS SIX MONTHS WITHOUT AFFECTING NGUS.

c. OFFICERS CURRENTLY ON TERMINAL LEAVE AND ELIGIBLE UNDER FOREGOING WILL BE PROMOTED PRIOR TO REVERTING TO INACTIVE STATUS. CANDIDATES FOR PROMOTION UNDER THIS POLICY MAY DECLINE TO ACCEPT PROMOTION AND CAPTAINS ELIGIBLE WHO DECLINE IN ORDER TO COLLECT MUSTERING OUT PAY WILL BE REPORTED TO TAG FOR PROMOTION ON DAY AFTER REVERTING TO INACTIVE STATUS.

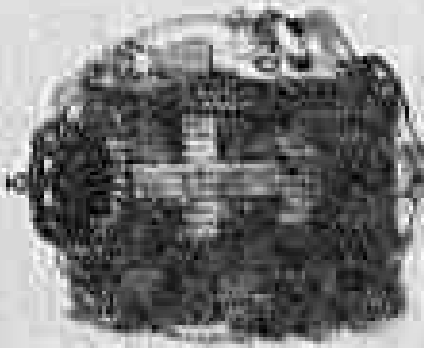

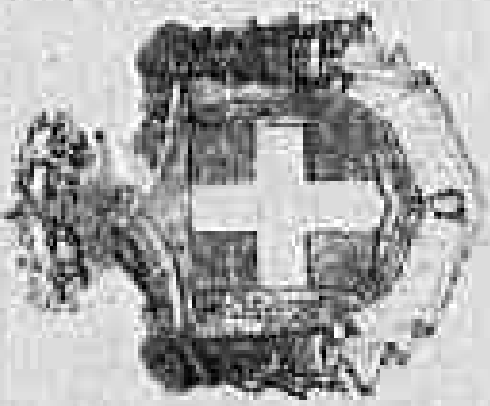
As a sign of our appreciation we propose to confer upon Major Brannigan an Italian honour.

1. According to MTOUSA Letter, AG 210.2/186-P, dated 27 September 1945, the promotion of 1st Lt JOSEPH J. GUARINI, CAC, 01049184, was not favorably considered because he was supposed to have sufficient points for release and informal information received at MTOUSA Headquarters did not indicate that he was a volunteer.

2. The recommendation in question was dated 7 September 1945 and met all the requirements currently needed. It was subsequently indorsed by Headquarters, Headquarters Command, 10 September 1945, and received at the AG Section of AFHQ, 19 September 1945.

3. Lt Guarini's AGRS as of 7 September 1945 was 77 so that contrary to what was stated in MTOUSA Letter, AG 210.2/186-P, he did not have sufficient points for release at the time his recommendation was not favorably considered.

4. Furthermore, pursuant to MTOUSA Circular #115, dated 24 September 1945, representing presumably the latest instructions for promotion up to and including 27 September 1945, sub-division II, paragraph 4, states that officers with scores equal to or above the announced critical score for relief from active duty were supposed to sign one of the two volunteer certificates. In view of Lt Guarini's 77 points, it appears he did not have to volunteer but rather could have filled the requirements of paragraph 5 of the promotion form as an officer recommended who "has not volunteered to remain on active duty but has AGRS less than that currently required for relief from active duty".

5. Lt Guarini is in civilian life a member of the Federal penitentiary system. He was purposely sent overseas twenty-four (24) months ago to do prison work and throughout this period has achieved an enviable record as a Regional Prison Officer for the Allied Commission. At present he is the only Lieutenant in the Public Safety Sub-Commission which has a staff of slightly over one hundred (100) Allied Officers. 2435

6. Lt Guarini was first recommended for promotion early in February of this year. Unfortunately, either because of a lack of vacancies or a

freeze on promotions, no favorable action could be taken in his case. His work, however, did not suffer because of these disappointments but rather as is evidenced by the recommendation for a Legion of Merit submitted by Colonel THOMAS H. PAGE, Deputy Regional Commissioner of Venezia Region, he continued to show exceptional results and his efforts deserved some recognition.

7. This latest recommendation for promotion which was not favorably considered was probably his last chance to get a promotion for the outstanding work he has done during his two (2) years overseas. On 1 October 1945 the score for officers was reduced to 75 and, consequently, he has become eligible for release.

8. In view of Lt Guarini's excellent record, the fact that he was first recommended in February of this year, and that the reasons why his last recommendation was not favorably considered, are not in keeping with the facts of the case, it is requested that a reconsideration of his recommendation for promotion as of 27 September 1945, be made so as to render justice in the matter of his promotion.

TO : All Concerned.

1. The War Department has advised that the following change has been made in AR 805-12, dated 17 August 1944, in order to permit promotion of deserving 2d Lieutenants who have been denied promotion due to lack of vacancies in the higher grade:

"Paragraph 4d (4). Any 2d Lieutenant (including Army Nurses, Dietitians, and Physical Therapists) who has completed 18 months of service in that grade, may be promoted to the grade of 1st Lieutenant without regard to Table of Organization or Allotment vacancies in the grade of 1st Lieutenant provided he is qualified for and worthy of promotion.

In determining time in grade for this purpose, service outside the continental limits of the United States or in Alaska will be counted as time and a half.

This authorization will NOT be used for the automatic promotion of all 2d Lieutenants who have served 18 months in that grade, but will be reserved for those denied merited advancement solely because they are NOT assigned to positions established for higher grades."
