SUBJECT: Promotions

TO : Regional Commissioner, Toscana Region

1. Reference is made to your letter of 25 January addressed to Brigadier M. S. Lush, C.B., C.B.E., M.C., Chief of Staff, Allied Commission, concerning the promotions of U.S. officers. The allegations which you make are of a very serious nature, reflecting on the integrity and/or administrative efficiency of senior American officers of the Commission who deal with promotions. I shall see to it that an exhaustive investigation is conducted and every conceivable effort made to ascertain the facts.

2. It appears that these allegations are six in number:

a. That promotions are manipulated in favor of officers or groups of officers who are in a good position to advocate their own promotions.

b. That practically every officer in the immediate headquarters of the 2675th Regiment has been promoted without regard for the comparative importance of his position.

c. That practically every officer in the Legal Subcommittee has been promoted.

d. That certain regions whose personnel have not been engaged in running a region have been promoted out of proportion to promotions in regions actually functioning as such.

e. That willfully, or through gross inefficiency, promotions are sidetracked because the promotion recommendations are lost at the Headquarters of the Commission.

f. That a promotion lobby exists at Headquarters Allied Commission which is operated to the disadvantage of Toscana Region, which does not have such a lobby.

(Promotions - Ref/11/Eat, 22 Feb. 45, Cont'd.)

3. It is my earnest desire that all of the facts bearing on the above allegations may be adduced. I should, therefore, be grateful to you if you would provide me with factual evidence on which the allegations are based and with all pertinent supplemental information in your possession which will aid in the investigation.

4. As you are no doubt aware, recommendations for promotions of U.S. officers are passed upon by a board of officers at Headquarters of the Commission, consisting of myself and the following: Colonel Parkin, Executive Officer, U.S. and Commanding Officer, 2675th Regiment; Colonel Chapman, Director, Public Safety Subcommittee and Senior U.S. Officer at Headquarters of the Civil Affairs Section; Colonel Densmore, Chief Staff Officer, Economic Section and sometimes Acting Vice President, Economic Section. In order to set some limit to the scope of the investigation, I propose that it be confined to the period of the last five months, which is to say, from 19 September 1944, on which date I was appointed Director, Establishment Branch, in addition to other duties, to the present.

5. The officers concerned are most desirous that the investigation be full and complete and that the facts, with respect to the six allegations, be established beyond any reasonable doubt. I trust, therefore, that you will be specific and detailed in the evidence you supply and the information you furnish.

Dear Brigadier,

1. The manner in which the promotions of American officers has been handled in HQ. AC has caused much dissatisfaction among American officers in the field. There appears to be ample reason to believe that promotions are manipulated in favor of certain officers or groups of officers who are in a good position to advocate their own promotion. First, practically every officer in the immediate headquarters of the 2675th Regiment has been promoted, regardless of the comparative importance of his position. Then, too, practically every officer in the Legal Sub-Commission has been promoted. Also certain Regions whose personnel have not been engaged in running a Region, have been promoted out of proportion to the promotions in Regions actually functioning as such.
2. As an example of an unaccountable promotion, Major (now Lt. Col.) Curry CARTER has, with the exception of a very short time, been doing duty in my Region either as an assigned or attached officer for more than six months. I have not recommended him for promotion. His work while quite satisfactory does not compare either in importance or in quality with that of at least three Heads of Divisions, and one Provincial Commissioner, in TOSCANA Region who have been recommended but not promoted. Moreover, he has not had as long a time in grade as either of the three Majors (two Heads of Divisions and one Provincial Commissioner) recommended by me for promotion.
3. One of the usual causes of sidetracking promotions is losing the recommendation in HQ. AC. This has happened several times. One must conclude that this is done either wilfully or through gross inefficiency.
4. The officers of this Region are fully occupied with their duties in the provinces and at Region Headquarters. This Region has not and cannot maintain a promotion lobby at HQ. AC. It must depend upon HQ. AC to look after its interests. This appears not to have been done.

Moreover, it is especially requested that the recommendations made for the promotion of Heads of Divisions and Provincial Commissioners be given prompt and favorable consideration.

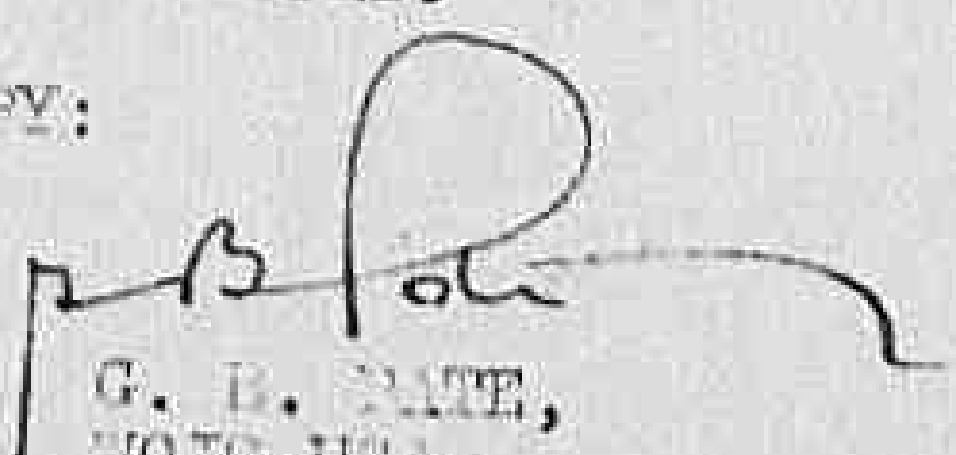

Dear Colonel:

As I stated to you the other day the American Promotion Board has not passed any recommendations from the grade of captain to major since your original talk with me prior to your trip home. It is true that a number of promotions have been made but these all had been pending at AFHQ for a considerable length of time. With respect to Captain Neufeld, recommendation for his promotion should be before our Board at the next meeting.

There are two or three items with respect to the Captain which I think you should know. There are approximately 109 other American captains in the AC/AMG organization who are senior to Neufeld in point of length of service as captain. Neufeld was promoted to grade of captain on 30 September 43. He, therefore, has less than 17 months in grade and with 109 captains having more time in grade, I suspect the Board will insist on having a good reason why this officer should be preferred to the senior captains.

Another point is that AFHQ recently returned a number of recommendations on the ground that the position which the officer occupied did not justify the grade for which he was recommended. A recent compilation of officers assigned to Lombard Region carries Captain Neufeld as Personal Assistant to the Regional Commissioner. While I have no idea what his position is as shown on the recommendation, I am of the opinion that WFOUSA will never agree to the promotion to the grade of major on position of Personal Assistant to a Regional Commission.

I understand that the captain's recommendation will be before the Board at its next meeting, at which time we will be informed as to how many recommendations for the grade of major can be sent forward. I am sure that the Board will give Neufeld proper consideration along with some 30 to 40 other captains who have been recommended all of whom are senior to Neufeld. You can rest assured that I will not permit his recommendation to be overlooked.

EXCERPT FROM RETIRING DIRECTOR'S FINAL REPORT

IN RE MAJOR CARLETON W. WASHBURN

"On way indeed in which this outcome [progressive democratization of Italian education] may begin to be implemented is at hand. The progressive demilitarization of our educational work in Italy, now a logical and a prudent step, will not of itself be enough. Fortunately this Subcommittee has at hand an officer -- Major Carleton W. Washburne, now happily made Acting Director -- who has unusual qualification for subserving these positive ends. He should be left as Civilian Adviser on Education if and when the military phase is completely liquidated, and should be left as long as possible to counsel the Italian Government, now educationally to travel the road, the long road, toward democracy. Washburne is a persona grata to the Ministry of Public Instruction. He has had the widest experience in Italy: from Sicily to Rome; from Headquarters as Deputy Director and now Acting Director to every Region so far occupied. He has mastered the language. He has initiated the revision of textbooks and has overseen the transfer from all angles to the ministry of the massive printing program of texts. He has helped form all the important commissions and is serving as adviser to all alike, whether they be Ministerial or Subcommissional. He has stimulated and initiated a strategic program for translating into Italian a few of the best of the educational books, British, American, and Russian. He brings to all these enterprises not only the practical experience of a long superintendence of a forward-looking school system in America (Winnetka) but also first-hand knowledge of the schools in many lands (England, France, Germany, Russia, China, Japan, and five of the South American republics). He is free to undertake this work; he is highly acceptable for this work; he is superbly equipped for this work. "This work" -- let no one ever doubt -- is the task which our peoples in both our democratic homelands expected us, and do expect us, to do in order to stop the recurrence of war, at least from this fascist source-land. This is a task, however -- and let there be no false claims about it -- on which we have been able to do little as an arm of the military is the stern business of helping to win the war."

Those courts tried all the espionage and sabotage cases which originated in 5th & 8th Army areas during that period.

On 22 May I reported to Col. Thornhill, P.C. Province Provins, and served as P.D.O. until 1 August. On that date I was ordered to Rome, where I served both Province v. Vittoria Province as P.D.O., until 15 August, while serving on a General Court.

From 1 Aug. to 1 Oct. I served as President of two Region IV Army General Courts at Rome. One court was composed of

President or member. Copies of the orders appointing those courts (about 14 in number) are in my 201 file. Those courts tried all the espionage and sabotage cases which originated in 5th & 8th Army areas during that period.

On 22 May I reported to Col. Thornhill, P.C. Frosione Province, and served as P.D.O. until 1 August. On that date I was ordered to Rome, where I served both Province & Littoria Provinces as P.D.O., until 15 August, while serving on a General Court.

From 1 Aug. to 1 Oct. I served as President of two Region IV Army General Courts at Rome. One court was composed of Major Elder, Capt. Cox and myself, and Capt. Levy and more served as members of ²⁴⁸⁴ other. During that same period I also served as President of a General Court which tried two espionage ^{at} Perrugia. That was also a Region IV court consisting of Major Andrew Way (13) and Capt. L.D. Cox (A) and myself.

3

On 1 Oct I was transferred from Region IV to Region XI and detailed as Deputy, R.L.O., and Legal Officer of both the City and Province of Milan.

On 12 Oct, I was attached to 5 Army, A.M.G. for temporary duty, and appointed President of a General Court which has tried a number of espionage cases at Florence. (Copy of order attached)

On 20 November I was placed in charge of all the A.M.G. Courts in the City and Province of Florence, and have organized a Central Prosecutor's office here.

At the moment I have Summary Courts functioning at Florence, Prato and Borgo San Lorenzo, Superior Courts at Prato and Florence, and a General Court at Florence.

Commencing next week we will have 2 General Courts in operation here, and will start the trials of a series of 45 espionage and sabotage cases. I will serve as President of one of them.

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During the past three weeks I have made a physical inventory of the prisons and have brought all prosecutions up to date

The Legal Sub-Commission has classified me as being qualified to serve as President of General Courts, and to preside alone as a Superior Court. In the latter capacity I have heard many cases from time to time.

I am certain that I have ~~participated~~ ^{participated} as a member of the court in a much larger number of espionage cases than any other officer in Italy, and no case in which I have taken part has ever been reversed, although the penalties imposed were reduced in some instances.

The Legal Sub-Commission (Col. Wellmer and Lt. Col. Campbell, in particular) are well acquainted with my capacity and the quality and character of the services which I have rendered.

SUBJECT : Services of Major Washburne

1. Major Carleton W. Washburne, C-518332, has been assigned to Co. D, 2675th Regiment, as Education Officer since the original organization of Region 4. He has, however, actually been working as Deputy Director of Education for HQ. A.M.G., and the Education Subcommittee A.C.C., since 9 October 1943. This arrangement, at first an informal one while Region 4 was gathering in Italy, was confirmed by personal conference between the C.C.A.O. and the R.C.A.O. Nothing of this, however, appears in Major Washburne's service record.

2. It is therefore the purpose of this communication to state briefly the facts of the case and the nature and quality of Major Washburne's service, for the record and for his 201 file.

3. Major Washburne, on reaching Sicily 8 October, 1943, was ordered to acquaint himself with the work in Sicily. Lt. Col. G.R. Gayre (B) was at that time Education Adviser for HQ. A.M.G. and the only education officer on the island. After becoming briefly acquainted with Col. Gayre's work, Major Washburne volunteered to assist him until ordered to do otherwise by his R.C.A.O., Brigadier Carr.

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4. Col. Gayre, on learning of Major Washburne's extensive acquaintance with elementary and secondary education in most major countries of the world, and his experience in school administration and in the preparation and publication of text books, delegated to him. (a) The planning and supervision of

the opening of elementary and secondary schools, (b) the supervision of the preparation of non-fascist courses of study and programs, (c) the examination and difascistization of text-books, and later, (d) the preparation and publication of a new series of elementary school text-books to replace the fascist series.

5. While Major Washburne was proceeding with these activities, Region 4 prepared to move up to the mainland. The C.C.A.O., General Mc Sherry, thereupon entered into an oral agreement with the R.C.A.O., Region 4. Brigadier Carr, that permitted Major Washburne to continue to act as Col. Gayre's deputy and carry forward the work to which he had been assigned by Col. Gayre, until his active services should be needed by Region 4.

6. When Sicily was organized as a region, about 3 November 1943, the R.C.A.O. for Region 1 requested that Major Washburne be assigned to him as Regional Director of Education until a more permanent Director could be brought forward and broken in. On V.O.C.O. of General Mc Sherry this was arranged, Major Washburne, however, still continuing to carry forward his general text-book program, etc. He was Director of Education for Region 1 until 6 December, 1943, when he was replaced by Major G.R. Koopman and reverted to full time with the Education Sub-commission.

7. In the early part of November, while still Director of Education for Region 1, Major Washburne was sent by General Mc Sherry to (a) Brindisi, to attempt coordination with the Italian Government; (b) Bari, to coordinate the opening of schools in 15th Army Group territory; (c) Matera, to arrange for the opening of schools in Region 2, and (d) Naples, to arrange for the opening of schools in Region 3.

8. On 2 January, 1944, Major Washburne reported in Naples to the R.C.A.O. Region 4. He began active work in Region 4, opening the schools in Foggia and preparing materials for other provinces. He has been active in the Region 4 organization ever since.

Naples it was 24/3

9. However, on Major Washburne's arrival in

informally and orally agreed by Brigadier Carr for Region 4 and Col. Spofford for A.C.C. - A.M.C. that until Region 4 required all his time, Major Washburne should continue to act as Deputy Director of the Education Subcommittee. Accordingly, he opened the Naples Hq. of the Education Subcommittee and took charge of it until Lt. Col. Gayre's subsequent arrival.

10. In Naples he continued the functions he had been performing, in general charge of elementary and secondary education for the Subcommittee. He arranged for the printing of the new elementary school text-books in Naples for all southern Italy except Calabria, and in Palermo for Sicily and Calabria.

11. When Lt. Col. F.V. Smith replaced Lt. Col. G.R. Gayre as Director of the Education Subcommittee, he confirmed informally, first with Brigadier Carr and then with Brigadier Dunlop, successive R.C.'s of Region 4, the existing arrangement, continuing Major Washburne as his deputy, and assigning him general responsibility for elementary and secondary education. This arrangement is still in effect at the time of filing report.

12. Such are the bare facts. One word of evaluation should be added. If ever an officer's services could be truly said to have been both invaluable and indispensable, Major Washburne is that officer in relation to the Educational rehabilitation in Italy. With the widest and deepest experience, with energy apparently inexhaustible he has turned his head to any and every job in sight. Far beyond the demands of duty, he has served the cause in a spirit cooperative and in a manner efficient.
