1. With the deepest regret I have to report the death on
20 May 1944, of Lt. Col. S. M. Fairman, Other Constable of Bedfordshire.

2. I caused Major Hessey (formerly Detective Inspector, Metropolitan Police) to obtain details regarding the illness and death of Col. Fairman, and the following are some extracts from his report to me, which would be of interest to Col. Fairman's relatives.

3. On 3rd April, 1944, Col. Fairman mentioned to Captain Egan, an American officer in the same brigade, that he did not feel well, but said he did not wish to see the medical officer. Two days later however, Captain Egan noticed that Col. Fairman appeared ill and complained of high temperature. He thereupon arranged for Col. Fairman to be sent immediately to the 30 M.R. Hospital at Fogia, Italy whence he was later transferred to 71st General Hospital, Taranto, suffering from pneumonia.

4. On 6th May 1944, he was operated on to drain fluid from the left lung, and made steady progress until 17th May, when a second operation was necessary. His condition deteriorated, and in spite of two blood transfusions, he died at 1045 hours on 20th May 1944. Subsequent to this he made a special request and I am informed that he received every possible care and atten-

Levin, an American officer in the same billets, that he did not feel well, but said he did not wish to see the medical officer. Two days later however, Captain Degen noticed that Col. Fairman appeared ill and complained of high temperature. He therefore arranged for Col. Fairman to be sent immediately to the 30 M.Y. Hospital at Fogia, from whence he was later transferred to 71st General Hospital, Venetie, suffering from pneumonia.

4. On 6th May 1944, he was operated on to drain fluid from the left lung, and made steady progress until 17th May, when a second operation was necessary. His condition deteriorated, and in spite of two blood transfusions, he died at 1045 hours on 20th May 1944. Throughout his illness he made no special requests and I am satisfied that he received every possible care and attention.

5. The post mortem examination revealed the causes of death as:-

- (a) Pleuro-pneumonia
(b) Endocardial embolism,
(c) Gangrene of Lung.

6. Col. Fairman is interred at Grave No. 1.7, Military Plot, Civil Cemetery, Barletta, which is situated on the main Veggie Road, about one mile outside Barletta, overlooking the Adriatic Sea. The local authorities will erect a cross in the near future. Major Harvey placed two small bunches of flowers on the grave as tokens from the family and from former colleagues, and also had a photograph taken, which will be sent to Mrs. Fairman in due course.

7. Col. Fairman had been engaged in the most important task of organizing the hospital and care of refugees. His ability contributed much to the success of this work and his personal efforts /

efforts were untiring to alleviate the hardships of these unfortunate people.

8. His loss is keenly felt by his colleagues, who esteemed him very highly, his charming disposition endeared him to his numerous friends. The officers with whom he was associated desire me to express their deep sympathy with Mrs. Palmer and relatives, and all police officers here also wish me to include their condolences at the loss of a former colleague and friend.

9. I would be pleased if a copy of this official report could be passed on to Col. Palmer's relatives for their information.
