SUBJECT: Illegal use of Ration Cards.

TO : Regional Commissioners, Regions I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII.

Reference para. 5 of AOO/43-1/Food dated 10 Apr. 44.

1. It is realized that during the process of occupation a close check could not be kept on this issue of Ration Cards. As a result many cards are in the hands of unauthorized persons and owing to the acute food supply position it is necessary for these to be eliminated without delay.

2. A detailed plan for examining Ration Cards at bakers' premises is attached. This plan is now being applied in Naples with convincing results.

3. The scheme as being worked now is reasonably simple and does not require a large number of personnel to operate it successfully, but the maximum number of inspectors should be employed to enable the check to be completed at the earliest possible date.

4. Regional Commissioners will put similar schemes into operation forthwith. The adjusted totals of Ration Card Holders by provinces, should be notified to this Headquarters immediately on completion of the scheme.

ILLEGAL USE OF RATION CARDSOPERATION OF THE EXAMINATIONSTAFF

An equal number of Alimentation Inspectors and Guardia Finanza are employed. One inspector and one Guardia Finanza for each shop.

SHOPS

Shops, for one operation, are selected at widely separated points. As many shops are covered, as the number of available personnel will allow. The inspectors are in the shop during service hours for two consecutive days. A third day is utilized by the inspectors for writing up their reports and initiating, further enquiries, when necessary, by the Questura.

The Alimentation Inspector and the Guardia Finanza are changed daily so that they only work together for one day, and that neither should be in the same shop on the second day, as on the first.

INSPECTION OF RATION CARDS

The Inspectors examine the ration cards of all persons entering the shop, and allow no-one to leave after their documents have been examined or a reasonable explanation given. Ration cards are compared with identity cards. Cards which are suspect, after enquiries of the person presenting them, are impounded, and a receipt given. Enquiries are made for checking purposes, for deaths, removals, illegal or un-authorized ownership, counterfeits etc. Cards which are not complete with holders name and address, or where coupons detached from the name space are presented, are suspected.

Only coupons for the day on which the inspection takes place are included in that days totals. Customers may obtain bread against the previous days' coupons, but the coupons are kept separately. Bread is not allowed to be supplied against any coupon dated more than one day before the inspection. These coupons are declared null and void. Bread may be sold against and advance coupon. At the end of the day, the coupons are counted and the number put on a slip of paper. The slip is signed by both inspectors and countersigned by the shop-keeper, or a responsible employee. The coupons are left with the bakers.

The number of ration coupons are compared with the retailers' production. The highest daily total is taken as legitimate.

SUBJECT: Ration Cards

TO : Regional Commissioners, Regions I, II, III, IV, V, VI

1. As a result of a recent survey of the Rationing System in Naples Province the following points have emerged and action should be taken as indicated in the following paragraphs.

2. There are many cases where deaths of civilians have not been reported to the authorities. To cite one aspect of this delinquency, ration cards are being issued in the names of deceased persons and are finding their way into the hands of unauthorized holders instead of being returned to the issuing office for cancellation.

3. Publicity should be given that it is necessary to notify deaths to the authorities and that failure to do so constitutes an offense which in future could be subject to a severe penalty. In preparing the publicity people should be given an opportunity of notifying the deaths where such has not been done.

4. Further instructions should be issued that persons in possession of Ration Cards belonging to deceased persons, people who are not now residing in the Province and unauthorized holders of Ration Cards should, within 3 days of the date of the order, hand them in to Administrative authorities under pain of severe penalty if they fail to do so.

5. Enforcement action is being instituted against offenders in respect of ration cards, and anyone found using a Ration Card without due authority, will be severely punished. Further information and instructions are being prepared and will be forwarded to Regional Commissioners in the near future.
