Subject: Mobile Police Service and Motorized Mobile Squad.

In order to oppose with all means further increase of common criminality, which during the recent period has grown also in this Province in an alarming proportion, it has been decided in full agreement with the Regional Allied Command of Police, to organize special motorized services for immediate intervention of police-officers in those places, where such intervention is being requested.

To put such service into practice, the following is herewith ordered:

Zones

Greater Genoa has been divided into 4 Zones as follows:

- a) First Zone: - Nervi: it includes the territory of Greater Genoa within the following lines: towards East boundary of Greater Genoa including the Comune of Bogliasco on the sea-shore; towards North the boundaries of Greater Genoa; towards West the bridge of Sturla-Borghetti - S. Desiderio di Bavari-Cavassolo.
- b) Second Zone: (Questura Centrale) it includes the following territory: towards East, the Western boundary of the first zone; towards North the boundary of Greater Genoa; towards West a line which starts at the Lanterna and runs along the road leading to the Camionale as far as Granarolo.
- c) Third Zone: (Sampierdarena) it includes the territory within the following line: towards East the Western boundary of the second zone; towards North the boundaries of Greater Genoa; towards West: the Bridge of Cornigliano - Collina Coronata - Burio - the boundaries of Greater Genoa.
- d) Fourth Zone: (Sestri Ponente) it includes the territory within the following line: towards East the Western boundary of the Third zone; towards North the boundaries of Greater Genoa; towards West the boundaries of Greater Genoa.

Direction of Operations.

The operations of these special services will be directed from the Questura Centrale from a room on the ground-floor where a telephone has been installed with number 55555 through which the population can ask intervention of the police, as has already been published in the papers, each time when a crime is committed or when there is reason to believe that a crime is going to be committed; there is also a direct telephonic connection with the Police Station of the first (Nervi), third (Sampierdarena), and fourth (Sestri Ponente) zones.

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To put such service into practice, the following is herewith ordered:

Z.O.N.E.

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- b) Second Zone: (Questura Centrale) it includes the following territory: towards East the Western boundary of the first zone; towards North the boundary of Greater Genoa; towards West a line which starts at the Bontema and runs along the road leading to the Cemionale as far as Granarolo.
- c) Third Zone: (Sampierdarena) it includes the territory within the following line: towards East the Western boundary of the second zone; towards North the boundaries of Greater Genoa; towards West: the Bridge of Cornigliano - Collina Coronata - Burio - the boundaries of Greater Genoa.
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As soon as a call for intervention is received, the director of the operating police will immediately send the police stationed within the territory in question.

The following functionaries will in turn direct the operations:

- 1) METTI Giulio
- 2) CIPOLLA Antonio
- 3) DI LORENZO Giuseppe e Mitta Vero
- 4) BELLA Giovanni

Police Stations

The Police Stations in the 4 zones will be the following:

- a) First Zone (Nervi): a room at the ground-floor of the local Commissariat of P.S. -
- b) Second zone (Questura Centrale): a room at the 1st ground-floor of the Questura close to the office of the room occupied by the director of operations;
- c) Third zone (Sampierdarena): a room next to the CC.RR. station of that place;
- d) Fourth zone (Cestri Ponente): Garage "Cestri" in Via Ciro Manotti, 193.

As mentioned already above these stations are connected with the Director of operations by a direct telephonic line, who will give them his orders to rush with the greatest speed to the indicated place.

The first, third and fourth Police Station are on duty daily between 19.00 hours and 7.00 hours of the next morning.

Each station will be fitted out as follows: 1) two motor-vehicles; - 2) two drivers (one for each vehicle); - 3) two P.S. NC-officers, of whom the one higher in rank will have to act as commander of the station; - 4) one telephone-operator; - 5) 4 carabinieri (two for each vehicle).

Personnel and vehicles remain on continuous duty during the 12 hours during which the station functions.

In case of a call both vehicles and the whole personnel must rush to the place considering the capacity of the vehicles; only the telephone operator remains at his post.

The Station of the second zone however (Questura Centrale) will be working without interruption day and night, and it's personnel will be on duty in turns of 8 hours: 1-st turn from 12.30 to 20.30; 2-nd turn from 20.30 to 4.30; 3-rd turn from 4.30 to 12.30.

The Director of operations will avail himself of the station of the second zone also for interventions in the other 3 zones in case of calls during daytime.

The following functionaries are attached to this station:

- 1) V. Commissario Agg. to Mascetti Aldo
- 2) V. Commissario Agg. to Massa Antonio
- 3) V. Commissario Agg. to Greco Umberto
- 4) V. Commissario Agg. to Chilaroni Giulio

They will carry out their duties according to the abovementioned turns of service.

Besides the abovementioned functionaries the following personnel is attached to this station: a) 4 motor-vehicles; b) 4 drivers (one for each vehicle); c) 3 NC officers of P.S.; d) 8 Carabinieri.

In case of a call the following personnel must get on each vehicle: the functionary in the first vehicle and one NC officer in each of the other 3 vehicles and 2 carabinieri in each vehicle.

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The station of the second zone however (Questura Centrale) will be working without interruption day and night, and its personnel will be on duty in turns of 8 hours: 1-st turn from 16.30 to 20.30; 2-nd turn from 20.30 to 4.30; 3-rd turn from 4.30 to 12.30.

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In case of a call the following persons must get on each vehicle: the functionary in the first vehicle and one NC officer in each of the other 3 vehicles and 2 carabinieri in each vehicle.

The NC officers, the drivers and the carabinieri will be on duty in the same turns as the functionaries and they will be relieved by the Command of the Division of Police -Officers and by the competent command of C.C.R.R.

In consideration of the seating capacity of the vehicles assigned to the station in question (3 seats besides the driver's seat) the Director of operations will at each call send two of the cars at disposal and will keep the other two in readiness to start in case of another call or in case of reinforcements required by the first two cars.

It is strictly forbidden to the personnel of the Police Stations (functionaries, NC officers, carabinieri, drivers and operators) to leave under whatever conditions, also not for a short time, so as to avoid

any possibility of loss of time between the call arriving and the departure of the cars with their personnel.

The telephones-operator of each station must inform the Director of Operations as soon as the cars have left and must give him the names of their crews. When the cars return to the stations, the functionary or the NC-officer must immediately report about the result of the operation carried out.

Independently of the above telephonic report made to the Director of Operations the departing of the vehicles and their return will be noted in a special register which will be given to each of the 4 stations.

The register must contain the following informations:

- a) the time when the call was received;
- b) the time when the cars have left;
- c) the address to which the cars were sent;
- d) the names of the persons of which the crews of the cars consisted.

These items will be put down in the register by the telephones-operator. Besides the above the following data must be put down :

- a) the nature of the operations;
- b) the result of the operations;
- c) eventual arrests made;
- d) whether arms were used or not;
- e) behaviour of the men;

These items will be put down in the register by the functionary or NC officer who has directed the operation.

The reports will, with eventual legal papers attached, be sent to the Chief of Cabinet.

UNIFORM and outfit.

Of the men attached to the four stations the drivers, the NC officers of P.S. and the Carabinieri must wear uniforms. The commanding NC officers and the carabinieri must be armed with automatic weapons, whereas the drivers will be armed with revolvers and Italian hand-grenades.

Orders in connection with travelling on the streets.

In consideration of the necessity for the cars to transport the officers of Public Force as quickly as possible to the place to which they have been called, the drivers must work the clackson giving prolonged hootings until it will have been possible to provide the cars with special sirens.

The Command of the City Police has been requested to give absolute precedence to such cars over any other vehicle (cars or tram-cars), and to avoid for them stoppings at block-posts, semaphores, street-crossing etc. considering that the cars in questions will, besides being duly labelled with the normal label (P.A.P. Forze Armate Polizia with the progressive number);

be provided for and aff with a well visible label carrying the words "Polizia

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EXTRACUR and outfit.

Of the men attached to the four stations the drivers, the NC officers of P.S. and the Carabinieri must wear uniforms. The commanding NC officers and the carabinieri must be armed with automatic weapons, whereas the drivers will be armed with revolvers and Italian hand-grenades.

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The Command of the City Police has been requested to give absolute precedence to such cars over any other vehicle (cars or tram-cars), and to avoid for them stoppings at block-posts, semaphores, street-crossing etc. considering that the cars in questions will, besides being duly labelled with the normal label (P.A.F. Forza Armata Polizia with the progressive number); be provided for and aft with a well visible label carrying the words "Polizia Mobile" in red letters on white ground.

The competent Command of CC.RR. is requested to give the respective orders to the block-posts.

Starting of the Service.

The central directing office for the operation at the Questura as well as the 4 fixed stations must start their complete activity on 15th inst.

The chief of cabinet of the Questura and the Command of the Police-Division as well as the competent Command of CC.RR. will in the meantime arrange that:

1) The functionary who will be the Director of Operations in the Questura and the functionary who will take over the command of the Police Station in the Second Zone, as well as the NC officers, the Carabinieri, the telephone-operators and the car-drivers with their vehicles will be ready in the Questura building, and that

2) the NC officers of P.S., the Carabinieri, the telephone-operators and the drivers with their cars will be concentrated in the Questura at 18.30 hours and that they will arrive at the fixed station of the first, third and fourth zone by 19.00 hours.

As already mentioned above the service at the second zone is of a permanent character and continuous so that all its personnel will be relieved at the station in the Questura.

Service in zones one, three and four is carried out only between 19 and 7 hours, for which reason the Police Forces and the cars will meet at the Questura every evening at 18.30 as will be done when the services have been started.

Mobile Patrols.

Where the services at the fixed stations have an exclusively repressive character, special services of preventive vigilance have been created in addition carried out by motorised Police Forces which will be called Mobile Patrols.

Consistence of the Mobile Patrols.

There will be 4 mobile patrols which will be active between 18 hours and 7 hours in the morning, one of them in each zone into which Greater Genoa has been subdivided.

Each patrol will consist of a functionary of P.S. and two Carabinieri who will use a motor-vehicle placed at their disposal with a driver.

The functionaries in charge of this work will be :

Thus the first four functionaries mentioned will be on duty the first night and the other the night following.

Service will last 8 hours for each patrol and the chief of cabinet will daily indicate the hour when service will have to be started and he will also give the names of the functionaries destined for each zone.

During the 8 hours of service a rest of 2 hour is granted, to be taken between the third and fourth hour.

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Service will last 8 hours for each patrol and the chief of cabinet will daily indicate the hour when service will have to be started and he will also give the names of the functionaries destined for each zone.

During the 8 hours of service a rest of 6 hour is granted, to be taken between the third and fourth hour.

The rest must be taken at the fixed station in the respective zone.

The functionary commanding the Mobile Patrol will, within its own zone be active in that part of it where according to his judgement preventive vigilance appears to be most needed, may be because the locality in question is of ill fame because frequented by people with penal records or suspected people or because the locality is suitable for laying in ambush and for the committing of crimes against persons and property.

During his activity the functionary in question will set up desultory "block-posts" in the localities considered best fit for it, where all passing cars will be stopped, their and their traveller's papers checked submitting them if needs be to perquisitions and searching the interior of

the vehicles.

Such operations must be carried out with firmness but with the greatest of tact and with politeness so as to avoid panics or demonstrations.

With the same tact must be proceeded against pedestrians and in case of suspicion, they must be duly controlled and the measures taken needed by the case.

Each commander of Mobile Patrol will further see to it to ring up about every hour the Operative Director at the Questura from the locality where he finds himself and will report about the operations carried out up to that moment and will pass eventual news worth being mentioned.

The Director of Operations will put down a summary of these informations in a special book, mentioning the number of the patrol who has communicated the respective information (first, second, third or fourth), the hours of communication and the extract of the information.

For such informations the commanders of the Mobile Patrols will use the telephones in localities open to the public, in hotels, P.S. offices, carabinieri stations, Commands of R.Guardia di Finanza and other military bodies and they will ring up one of the following numbers of the Questura: 55997 - 51354 - 51637 - 51108 - 55727. Only in cases of extreme necessity and of special urgency may they call directly the Director of Operations under the No. 55555.

All mobile patrols will start their service when leaving the Questura and their service will end when returning to the Questura.

The Chief of Cabinet will inform the functionaries of the various services, the Command of Division of Police (as far as regards drivers and cars) and the Command of the CC.RR. Company daily of the hour when service has to start and the hour in which the functionaries, drivers and cars and carabinieri must be present at the Command of the Operative Police of the Questura.

The functionaries, drivers and Carabinieri carrying out this service will have to wear their uniform. The functionaries and the carabinieri will have automatic arms, whereas the drivers will be armed with revolver and Italian hand-grenades.

The 4 cars used for this service will, besides being labelled in the normal way (P.A.P. with the progressive number), be provided with large labels for and act with the words "Polizia Mobile" in red on white ground.

When service is over the commanding functionaries will write out a report about the operations carried out, which will be passed along with eventually made out legal papers for the Polizia Giudiziaria, to the Commander of the Operative Police in the Questura to be then as soon as possible passed to the Chief of Cabinet.

The service of the Mobile Patrols must start in the evening of

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The service of the Mobile Patrols must start in the evening of 15th inst. and so the Chief of Cabinet will from the morning of that day arrange for the hour in which the functionaries, the carabinieri, the drivers and their cars will have to be concentrated in the Questura to go to the zones where they will have to be active.

I count on the spirit of initiative, abnegation and attachment to duty of the functionaries called to command these patrols.

Subject : Cinema-workers' strike.

A strike was decided by the cinema-workers' on 16th November 45.

As however 46 cinemas decided to stay open, the strikers set-up "pickets" carried by hired trucks.

Questura posted 4 agents and 4 CC.RR.s to each of the 46 open cinemas and kept the Reparto Celere ready to intervene.

As a matter of fact pickets proceeded to following cinemas urging the closing of the premises with threatening attitude: Quattro Fontane, Brancaccio, Splendore, Reale, Capranica, Principe, Palestrina, Savoia, Manzoni.

The timely intervention of the Reparto Celere avoid crimes and violences.

Two cinema managers were fined because employing operators without licence.

22 most riotyous persons have been arrested and soon after released.
