1. Reference is made to War Department letter, file AG 510 (23 Oct 44) OF-S-E-N, subject as above, dated 23 November 1944; AR 55-120, 26 April 1943; and Allied Force Headquarters letter, file AG 371.2/015 GEG-C, dated 7 November 1944, subject: "Military Travel Authorization".

2. The Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section, is hereby delegated authority to issue orders authorizing surface transportation to the United States for dependents of United States military and civilian personnel in and under the military establishment on duty in this theater, provided:

- Evidence is submitted that the American Consul has examined the dependent and will issue a visa upon receipt of travel orders from Peninsular Base Section.
- Military Travel Authorization for the dependent has been received from G-2 (OI), Allied Force Headquarters.
- Dependent's passport and other necessary papers are in order.
- Accommodations are available on Army, Navy, or USA ships without displacing military personnel or cargo.

3. Commanders of major commands are authorized to communicate directly with Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section on matters concerning return of dependents.

4. The Assistant Chiefs of Staff, G-2, this headquarters, and Headquarters Peninsular Base Section, are authorized to communicate directly, through technical channels, on matters of security clearance pertaining to travel of dependents to the United States. See paragraphs 5, 7, and 8 below.

5. Personnel desiring to send alien dependents to the United States will:

- Obtain from the nearest American Consulate a Department of Justice Form 633 (Petition for Issuance of Immigration Visa), and, after completing the form, forward it to the Department of Justice, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. If the petition is approved by the Department of Justice, it will be forwarded to the American Consulate nearest the dependent's foreign address, and the Consulate will then inform the dependent of the procedure to be followed and documents to be presented for a visa.

b. Apply for travel for dependent to Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section, through the American Consulate General of the district of the Consulate where the dependent is making application for a visa, on the form attached as Inclosure Number 1. Evidence of dependency must accompany the application.

5. The dependent will apply for a Military Travel authorization at the Office of the Civil Affairs Officer, Allied Commission, nearest the American Consulate where application for visa is to be made.

6. Upon receipt of the application for inspection by the American Consul, he will invite the alien dependent to his office for examination. If the dependent is found to be admissible to the United States, the Consul will forward the application to the Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section, with a copy to the Civil Affairs Officer nearest the Consulate, stating that a visa will be issued upon receipt of travel orders at the Consulate.

7. Upon receipt of the statement by the Consul that a visa will be issued, the Civil Affairs Officer will transmit the Military Travel Authorization application and statement of the Consul through Headquarters, Allied Commission to G-2 (CI), Allied Force Headquarters. If the dependent is eligible for a Military Travel Authorization, such authorization will be transmitted by G-2 (CI) Allied Force Headquarters to the Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section.

8. When travel orders are issued, the Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section, will transmit the copies for the dependent and the Military Travel Authorization to the American Consulate through which the application for travel was made, and will dispatch a letter (through the applicant, if necessary) informing the dependent that the orders, Military Travel Authorization, and visa may be obtained at the Consulate. After receiving the orders, the dependent will make final arrangements for transportation with the Transportation Officer, Peninsular Base Section.

1. Reference is made to War Department letter, file AG 510 (23 Oct 44) CB-S-E-M, subject as above, dated 23 November 1944; AR 55-120, 26 April 1943; and Allied Force Headquarters letter, file AG 371.2/015 GEG-C, dated 7 November 1944, subject: "Military Travel Authorization".

2. The Commanding General, Peninsular Bases Section, is hereby delegated authority to issue orders authorizing surface transportation to the United States for dependents of United States military and civilian personnel in and under the military establishment on duty in this theatre, provided:

- a. Evidence is submitted that the American Consul has examined the dependent and will issue a visa upon receipt of travel orders from Peninsular Base Section.

5. Personnel desiring to send alien dependents to the United States will:

a. Obtain from the nearest American Consulate a Department of Justice Form 633 (Petition for Issuance of Immigration Visa) and, after completing the form, forward it to the Department of Justice, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. If the petition is approved by the Department of Justice, it will be forwarded to the American Consulate nearest the dependent's foreign address, and the Consulate will then inform the dependent of the procedure to be followed and documents to be presented for a visa.

b. Apply for travel for dependent to Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section, through the American Consulate General of the District of the Consulate where the dependent is making application for a visa, on the form attached as Inclosure Number 1. Evidence of dependency must accompany the application.

5. The dependent will apply for a Military Travel Authorisation at the Office of the Civil Affairs Officer, Allied Commission, nearest the American Consulate where application for visa is to be made.

6. Upon receipt of the application for inspection by the American Consul, he will invite the alien dependent to his office for examination. If the dependent is found to be admissible to the United States, the Consul will forward the application to the Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section, with a copy to the Civil Affairs Officer nearest the Consulate, stating that a visa will be issued upon receipt of travel orders at the Consulate.

7. Upon receipt of the statement by the Consul that a visa will be issued the Civil Affairs Officer will transmit the Military Travel Authorisation application and statement of the Consul through Headquarters, Allied Commission to G-2 (CI), Allied Force Headquarters. If the dependent is eligible for a Military Travel Authorisation, such authorisation will be transmitted by G-2 (CI) Allied Force Headquarters to the Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section.

8. When travel orders are issued, the Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section, will transmit the copies for the dependent and the Military Travel Authorisation to the American Consulate through which the application for travel was made, and will dispatch a letter (through the applicant, if necessary) informing the dependent that the orders, Military Travel Authorisation, and visa may be obtained at the Consulate. After receiving the orders, the dependent will make final arrangements for transportation with the Transportation Officer, Peninsular Base Section.
