1. Signora MARRA, VIA MARISA 6, MILAN, was responsible for assisting myself and about 400 other British Officers and CMs to escape to SWITZERLAND during the autumn of 1945.

I visited her at MILAN the other day to see if there was any way in which we could repay the help she gave to them.

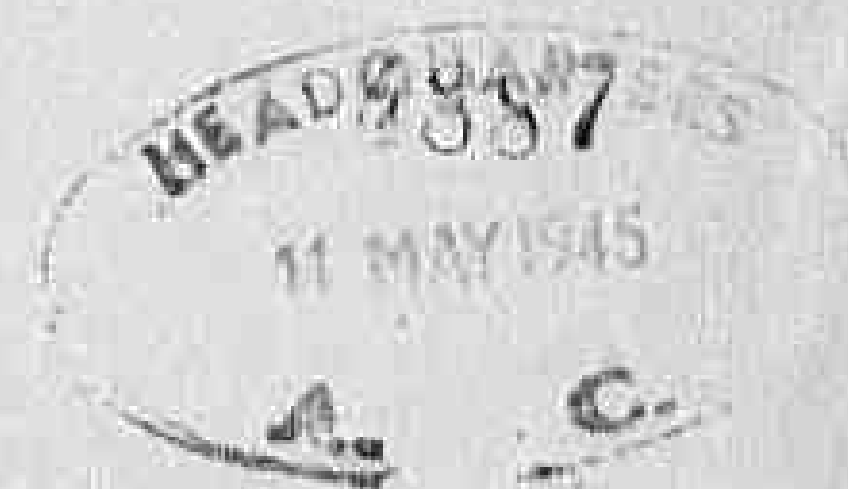

The Mayor of Bracciano signals the trouble and the concern as well as the great excitement of the farmers in his commune in relation to the fact that the owners of the land located within the area of the restricted zone of the former airfield of Vigna di Valle are not allowed to enter their fields in order to accomplish the most urgent work.

On account of this same situation last year also the aforesaid farmers - over 200 people are involved - have lost their crops thereby causing big losses for the owners and depriving the local economy of a considerable amount of essential agricultural products.

I have therefore been contacted in view of calling your kind attention to the difficult situation in which more than 200 families find themselves and consequently try to have the question of access to the above mentioned area re-examined.

Hence I would be particularly grateful if you would do me the favor of asking the proper military authorities to examine this matter again with the greatest possible kindness. I point out again that the release of permits to enter in this restricted zone would be advisable in order to take care of the season's works that are urgently needed and further so that the harvesting operation could be completed.

I will appreciate your kind news in regard to the action that will be taken.

In recent weeks there has been a serious increase of civilians attempting to enter the Army Zone without proper authority and it is found that this to a large extent is due to civilians being granted Civilian Movement Passes by Questure Officials to enable them to proceed to towns on or near the Rear Army Security Control Line.

2. The town of Fano, for instance, is on the Control line but is considered to be in the Restricted zone and a number of people have arrived there with passes issued by the Questure Officials of Rome. The ultimate destinations of many of these people are within the Army Zone and they either endeavour to secure extension of the passes at Fano or attempt to proceed by evading the controls.

3. This matter has previously been brought to your attention and it would appear that Questure officials are not thoroughly investigating applications for travel to points on or near the Rear Army Security Control Line.

4. I shall be glad to receive your cooperation in this extremely important question and to receive your assurance that Questure officials will show the utmost discrimination when considering applications for passes to places on or near the Control line.

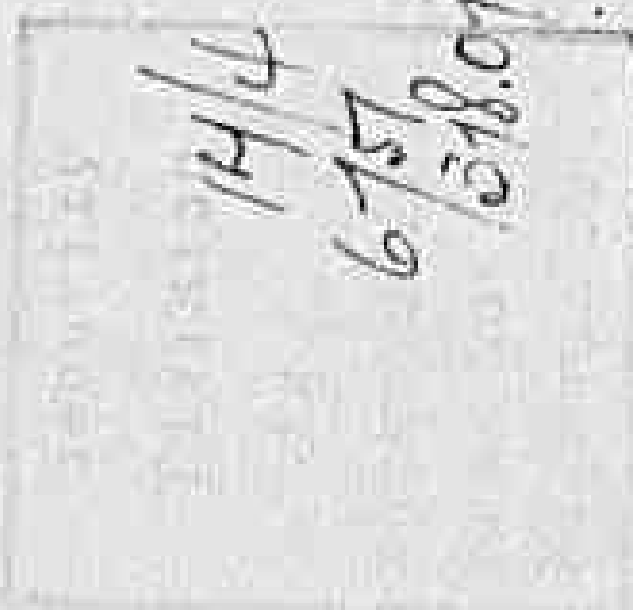

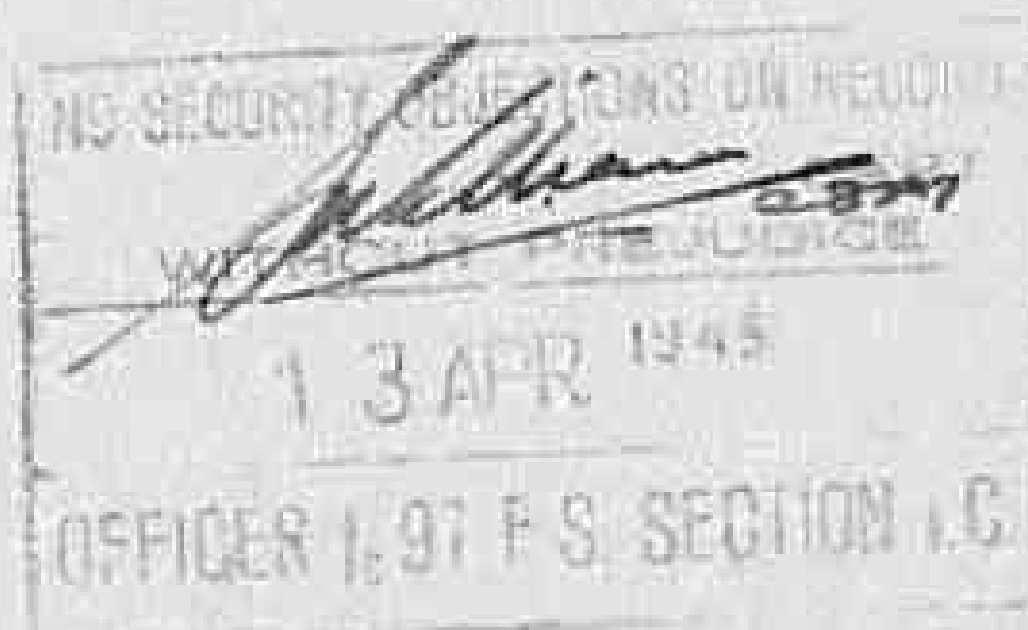

1. It has been arranged that the physical work of the rehabilitation of the oil installations in Northern Italy will be carried out by the Italian civilian petroleum organisation working under the direction of Allied military engineers.
2. It is desired to take into use as soon as possible after the capture of the Po Valley the major methane gas installations in that area, which in 1944 had a potential production equivalent to some 5,000 tons of gasoline per month.
3. It is considered that in order to achieve these objects it will be essential to send into Northern Italy, as early as possible after liberation, certain selected officials of the Comitato Italiano Petroli, which is the organisation set up by this HQ to supervise the exploitation of local petroleum resources, to render such assistance as is possible in the distribution of petroleum to the Allied Forces, and to arrange the distribution of petroleum products to the Italian civilian economy.
4. The problem has been discussed with the Chief Administrative Officer of 15 Army Group, and it has been agreed that facilities will be given for the early entry into the liberated territory of certain selected officials who are considered satisfactory from the point of view of security.
5. It is therefore requested that the credentials of the officials listed in Appendix 'A' of this letter may be examined now with a view to their being given special passes for admission into the liberated territory as soon as the military situation permits.
6. As Appendix 'B' to this letter is attached a list of 6 fitters who have been specially trained by the Royal Engineers for the purpose of rehabilitating the oil installations at Genoa. It is necessary that they should be transported into Genoa as soon as possible, and it is requested that passes may be issued with this object.

2. The Restricted Zone is the area south of the Near Army Control line and north of the northern boundaries of the Provinces of Viterbo,ieti and Teramo.

No Civilian Movement Pass can be issued to enter the Army Zone without the prior approval of either AMG Fifth Army, AMG Eighth Army or Regional Commissioner concerned.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ALLIED COMMISSION

SUBJECT: Captain Stanko MILIC

With reference to Minister Prunas' letter to Mr. Schott n. 15/211/18 of January 8th concerning Captain Stanko MILIC and to Mr. Halford's verbal request for additional informations on the subject, the Ministry for Foreign Affairs beg to acquaint the Allied Commission with the further developments of the aforesaid officer's journey.

1. Captain MILIC arrived at Cagliari (Sardinia) accompanied by another Yugoslav officer - CALICH Alois - towards the end of December; he stated that they came from Brindisi and belonged to the Royal Yugoslav Mission of that city, a claim substantiated by their papers, and that object of his journey was that of tracing his brother, Sladko MILIC, a soldier in the 40th Regiment of artillery at Sassari.

2. The two officers were invited, on arrival, to present themselves to the Command of the "Calabria" Division, but ignoring this request they made direct inquiries with the soldiers of the 40th Regiment. They did not fail, on all possible occasions, to carry out anti-Italian propaganda amongst the Italians of Slav origin.

3. The Italian Military Command of Sardinia informed of the Yugoslav officer's activities Col. Simons, of the M.M.I.A., and the latter had them return to Cagliari in order to control their papers and remark on their failure to present themselves to the Mission.

4. Probably perceiving that he was kept under close observation and having unsuccessfully tried to cross into Corsica, Captain MILIC left Sardinia.

The Italian Military Command in Sardinia have stated that the collaboration of the Allied Authorities in this question has been very useful and particularly appreciated.

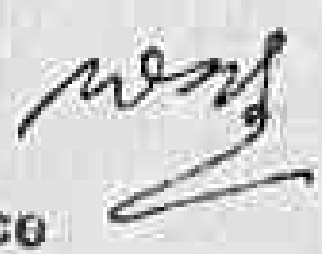
