1. The type of pass now in use is attached at ^{9A} HA. (The type at HB is no longer used). Each application is dealt with on its merits.
2. The Italian Government has not been formally advised of the procedure pertaining to the issue of passes; it is assumed the procedure is already known to all the Ministries.
3. The Deputy Secretary General has lately asked HQ ACMP for guidance with regard to the issue of passes to Italian Governmental officials, and until a reply is received, he suggests further action be deferred.
4. The lifting of all travel restrictions except in the Army area and the Province of Reggio has been matter considerably.
5. Public Safety Sub-Commission will be kept advised of all developments.
6. Italian Province Public Safety Officer has been verbally informed as above. W.C. Ballance Capt.

1. Enclosed is copy report by GIP of 200 Prov Coy, which was forwarded by IC Perugia (under y/c this HQ) with the comment that cars had arrived in the province in similar circumstances on other occasions.
2. It will be seen that the case in point occurred eight days after Executive Memorandum No. 77 had been issued.
3. It is appreciated that the car was not of the S.N.S. but no doubt a prosecution will not follow in this case as the GIP corporal concerned assumed the journey or use of the car to be Vatican sponsored.
4. The issue of passes for Vatican officials is of course covered by para 23(a) of Executive Memorandum No. 77, and therefore it must be accepted by the Vatican authorities that any case coming to notice of Vatican state or Vatican State sponsored journeys into Army Area being undertaken without the proper authorization will inevitably lead to prosecution.

Sir,

I have to report that at Perugia on Friday 6th September 1944, at about 10.33 hrs, I was on duty at P.O. "B" A.C. point, when I accepted civilian car Fiat No. Roma 59516 driven by Sanguigni Silvio of No. 5 via Bonaria, Roma.

The only permit he carried for the journey, and the vehicle, was a card placed on the windscreen giving the number, and type of vehicle and the Italian Vatican commission for the assistance of Refugees.

Superimposed ^{over} the area of the Vatican. A flag bearing the same area was mounted on the radiator of the vehicle.

The driver stated that his destination was the Italian Police Hq. Perugia and that he had made this journey before.

I satisfied myself that the man was genuine, and allowed him to proceed, but could this matter be carried further as there is nothing to stop other ⁵³⁹⁰ placing a similar card and circulating outside their legitimate area, without the necessary yellow permit, issued by the A.M.C. authorities.

SUBJECT: Passes for Italian Government Officials.

TO : Distribution as below.

1. Reference is made to 316/76/CA of 26 April 1944 (a copy of which is attached for easy reference).

2. Para. 4 (f) of 316/76/CA is hereby amended to read as follows:

" (i) Government Officials of the Central Italian Government.

The method of issuing passes to Government Officials of the Central Italian Government will be as follows: the official will apply to the corresponding ACC Section, Sub-Commission or Branch for a pass. If approved, Sub-Commissions or Branches of the Admin, Economic and R.C. & M.C. Sections will forward the passes in duplicate through their Sections to the Secretary-General for signature. In the case of the Political Section, Independent Sub-Commissions and Public Relations Branch, passes approved by them will be forwarded direct to the Secretary-General for signature. All passes in duplicate will be on the standard A.C.C. yellow and blue forms and will bear the following endorsement, before they reach the Secretary-General:-

'The facts set forth in this pass have been verified and the provisions of letter Hq. ACC, file 316/76/CA 26 Apr 44 have been fully complied with.'

(ii) Special passes for Ministers of the Central Italian Govt.

Special passes will be available for Ministers of the Central Italian Government. Such passes will be issued by the Sub-Commissions concerned in duplicate and forwarded through their Section to the Secretary-General for signature. The passes will be on the ACC yellow and blue forms only and will be made out to cover move-

Signature. Sub-Commissions and Public Relations Branches dependent Sub-Commissions will be forwarded direct to the passes approved by them will be forwarded in duplicate Secretary-General for signature. All passes in duplicate will be on the standard A.C.C. yellow and blue forms and will bear the following endorsement, before they reach the Secretary-General:-

'The facts set forth in this pass have been verified and the provisions of letter HQ. ACC, file 516/76/CA 26 Apr 44 have been fully complied with.'

(ii) Special passes for Ministers of the Central Italian Govt.

Special passes will be available for Ministers of the Central Italian Government. Such passes will be issued by the Sub-Commissions concerned in duplicate and forwarded through their Section to the Secretary-General for signature. The passes will be on the ACC yellow and blue forms only and will be made out to cover movement anywhere south of the Army Control Line. They will be for a period of three months and will bear the following endorsements:

'S....., (designation of office) is hereby authorised to proceed to any part of Italy south of the Army Control Line. He should be given every facility and courtesy.'

After signature by the Secretary-General the passes will be forwarded by him to HQ. AAI G.S.I. (b) for counter-signature.

SUBJECT: Control of Civilian Movement,

TO : Regional Commissioners Regions I, II, III, V, and VI.
S.C.A.O.'S Fifth & Eighth Armies.

1. Introduction.

It is evident that the enemy intends to continue his efforts to introduce espionage and sabotage agents into Southern Italy on a considerable scale. In order to meet this threat and to neutralize as far as possible the activities of such agents, it has been decided that a wider and more effective system of control of civilian movement will be introduced.

Allied Control Commission Officers are therefore requested to assist the Military Security Services every possible assistance, and to see that the restrictions referred to herein are properly and strictly imposed.

2. Restrictions.

(a) Army and Corps Areas.

In the Army (and Corps) Areas the existing regulations will continue to apply whereby civilians are forbidden to travel more than 10 km. from their own homes without an AIC pass.

These civilians who wish to proceed into such areas will require to obtain a special pass which will normally be issued by the AIC authority of the area into which they intend to travel.

(b) Territory under AIC.

In Territory under Allied Military Government in any of the Army (and Corps) Areas, restrictions on inter-provincial movement are to be reimposed forthwith, i.e., civilians in this area will be forbidden to travel from one province to another without an AIC pass.

(c) Italian Administered Territory.

There will be no restriction on movement within that part of Southern

Allied Control Commission Officers are therefore requested to accord the Military Security Services every possible assistance, and to see that the restrictions referred to herein are properly and strictly imposed.

2.

Restrictions.

(a) Land and Corps Areas.

In the Army (and Corps) areas the existing regulations will continue to apply whereby civilian, etc. are forbidden to travel more than 10 km. from their own homes without an A.C.C. pass.

Where civilians wish to proceed into such areas will require to obtain a special pass which will normally be issued by the A.C.C. authority of the area into which they intend to travel.

(b) Territory under A.C.C.

In Territory under Allied Military Government in rear of the Army (and Corps) areas, restrictions on inter-provincial movement is to be re-imposed forthwith, i.e., civilians in this area will be forbidden to travel from one province to another without an A.C.C. pass.

(c) Italian Administered Territory.

There will be no restriction on movement within that part of Southern Italy which is administered by the Italian Government, nor within Sicily and Sardinia. In Allied controlled Southern Italy, Sicily, and Sardinia, however, be required for movement between Southern Italy, Sicily, and Sardinia, and also for all movement from any territory into Italy and vice versa.

Check Posts.

(a) In Restricted Areas.

In Army (and Corps) areas and in territory administered by Allied Military Government every effort will be made to enforce the above restrictions by means of a widespread system of 'Army' check posts, which will be established for a few hours daily at irregular times and at varying points. The responsibility of arranging such checks will rest with U.S.S. or C.I.C., Units.

The object of these check posts will be: (i) to turn back those seeking to move outside the prescribed limits without a pass, (ii) to take action against those who have committed serious and flagrant breaches of the regulations, (iii) to question or detain for investigation persons whose conduct or "story" is suspicious.

(b) In Unrestricted Areas.

In territory administered by the Italian Government a similar system of "enclaves" check posts will be established. In this instance, however, the objects will be limited to (i) briefly questioning those passing the point with a view to discovering suspicious individuals who should be subject to further interrogation, and investigation, and (2) instilling a sense of security in the minds of agents or other undesirable individuals so that they may hesitate to move about or even abandon their mission.

(c) Organization and Composition.

This system of check posts will be organized by Army, Corps, District and Base Section Headquarters and MOC by AMG/ACC, both AMG and ACC territories.

These check posts will normally be manned by appropriate combinations, according to circumstances of N.S.P./C.I.C., S.I.A. (C.S.), CC.RR and Guardia di Finanza.

Every effort will be made by Allied Control Commission officers to ensure the fullest co-operation of the Italian Police in connection with these duties.

4. Passes.

(a) Army Areas and Poggia.

In the case of persons wishing to move North-Westwards across the "Control Line" (which follows the general line of the River Biferno and Volturno) or to enter Foggia Province, the existing procedure will normally be followed whereby they must first obtain (through their local AMG/ACC representative) a pass issued by the appropriate AMG authority in the area of their destination.

(b) AMG Provinces.

For other journeys involving movement into, or between, Provinces within the restricted area (e.g. from Bari to Avellino or from Foggia to Naples) a pass will be issued by the local AMG/ACC authority at the point of destination.

Every effort will be made by Allied Control Commission officers to ensure the fullest co-operation of the Italian Police in connection with these duties.

4. Passes.

(a) Army Areas and Morgia.

In the case of persons wishing to move North-Westward across the "Control Line" (which follows the general line of the Rivers Difuro and Valtorno) or to enter Poggia Province, the existing procedure will normally be followed whereby they must first obtain (through their local AMG/ACC representative) a pass issued by the appropriate AMG authority in the area of their destination.

(b) AMG Provinces.

For other journeys involving movement into, or between, Provinces within the restricted area (e.g. from Bari to Avellino or from Poggia to Naples) a pass will be issued by the local AMG/ACC representative at the point of departure.

(c) Discretion of Provincial Commissioner.

The procedure described in para (b) above may be employed in cases described in (a) above when, for urgent administrative, economic or other reasons, the procedure described in (a) would be impracticable owing to the time factor. In such cases the passes will be issued by the Provincial Commissioner or by a member of his staff on his behalf who will immediately forward details of the issue of such passes to the SCAG or PC of the area of destination.

- 3 -

(d) Reasons for Travel.

It is essential that the issue of passes to cross the "Control Line" or to enter Foggia Province be strictly limited to those cases where the journey will benefit the Allied cause, or where there are important administrative or economic reasons, or in exceptional cases, where there are urgent compassionate grounds. The issue of other passes will be limited to persons who show good and genuine reason why they wish to travel, whether on official matters, business or family grounds.

(e) Issue of Travel Tickets.

Allied Control Commission officers will ensure that transport tickets will not be issued by the railway authorities or other travel agencies to places within restricted areas unless the persons applying for tickets are in possession of a proper pass to their intended destination.

(f) Italian Government Officials.

Passes for Italian Government officials will be issued by the Headquarters and signed by the Secretary General or by the Deputy Secretary General, Allied Control Commission, and will be issued after application has been received from the Government Department concerned or from Italian Liaison Section, Allied Control Commission, and considered by the appropriate Sub-Commission who will be responsible for examining the application as to actual necessity for the proposed journey. Such passes will be prepared for signature by the Sub-Commission concerned.

(g) Italian Military Personnel.

The movement of members of the Italian Military Forces is unrestricted providing they are on duty and in possession of proper credentials. The Italian Military Forces when not on duty, C.A. when on leave, are subject to the same restrictions as civilians.

(h) Issuing Officers.

It will be within the discretion of the Provincial Commissioner to authorize specified and approved officers of the Quotone or C.A. to issue passes for inter provincial travel. It is emphasized, however, that passes permitting persons to enter the Army areas or Foggia Province must be issued by AAG/AGC officers.

(i) Semi-Permanent Passes.

In the case of persons living near a Provincial boundary and whose place of employment is in, or partly in, and adjoining Province or Provinces, a semi-permanent pass may be issued and such passes shall expire on 31 March, 30 June, 30 September and 31 December annually, and then become renewable upon further

Control Commission, and will be issued to the Government Department concerned or from Italian Liaison Section, Allied Control Commission, and considered by the appropriate Sub-Commission who will be responsible for examining the application as to actual necessity for the proposed journey. Such passes will be prepared for signature by the Sub-Commission concerned.

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(E) Italian Military Personnel.

The movements of members of the Italian Military Forces is unrestricted providing they are on duty and in possession of proper credentials. The Italian Military Forces when not on duty, e.g. when on leave, are subject to the same restrictions as civilians.

(F) Issuing Officers.

It will be within the discretion of the Provincial Commissioner to authorise specified and approved officers of the Quarters or HQ to issue passes for inter provincial travel. It is emphasised, however, that passes permitting persons to enter the Army areas or Foggia Province must be issued by HQ/ASC officers.

(G) Some-Permanent Passes.

In the case of persons living near a Provincial boundary and whose place of employment is in, or partly in, and adjoining Province or Provinces, a usual permanent pass may be issued and such passes shall expire on 31 March, 30 June, 30 September and 31 December annually, and then become renewable upon further application. Such passes may also be issued to all persons who have sufficient reason for frequent travel between Provinces.

(1) It is suggested that when an application for travel in or an Army area or into Foggia Province is received in HQ/ASC territory that the officer concerned completes the pass on behalf of the applicant (provided he is satisfied with the sufficiency of reasons for such travel) and forwards it to the SCAG/FC or the destination for approval: signature and return.

2. It will be seen that in future, Provincial Commissioners will be authorised under certain circumstances to issue passes for entry into Army areas or Foggia Province without prior permission from the point of destination (vide 4 (c) and further that the movement of members of Italian Military Forces is unrestricted, (vide 4 (e)).

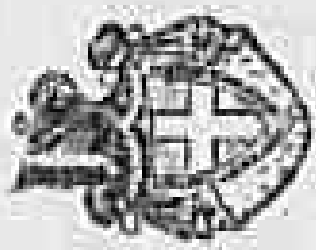

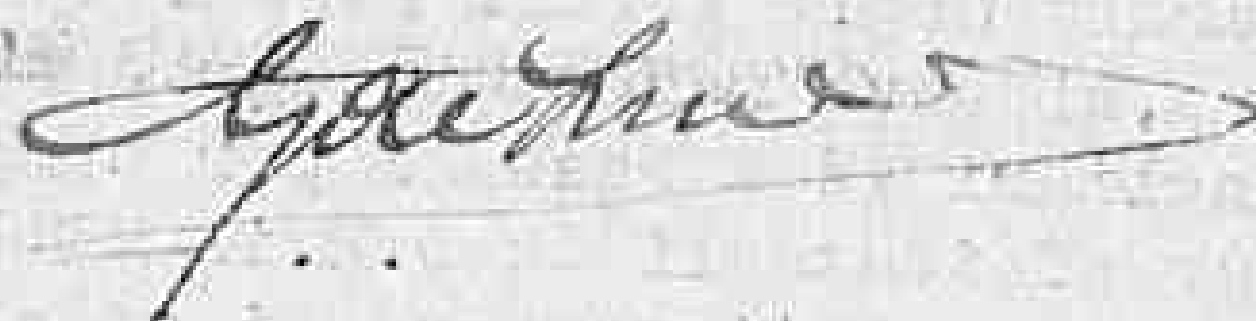

1. Paragraph 4f, letter HQ ACC, R.C. & M.C. Section, Ref/316/76/Ca, dated 26 April 1944, charges the Secretary General and the Deputy Secretary General with the issuance of all passes for travel by Italian government officials.

2. In accordance with instructions outlined in the letter referred to above, the following procedure will govern the preparation and submission for signature of all travel permits for Italian government officials requested from either Main or Rear Headquarters of Allied Control Commission.

a. Requests for travel permits originating within the Italian Government or in the Italian Liaison Section, Allied Control Commission, will be directed to the appropriate sub-commission for investigation, and verification of the circumstances warranting the proposed journey.

b. The sub-commission concerned will ascertain that the applicant meets all requirements of letter referred to above. A pass will be filled out and forwarded in duplicate to the Secretary General or to the Deputy Secretary General for signature. The following certificate, to be signed by the responsible officer of the sub-commission requesting the pass, will appear on the reverse of both original and duplicate:

1. As agreed at the Regional Commissioners' meeting held on 4th March, 1944, restriction on the movement of civilians in AMG territory should be lifted with the exception of Army and Corps Areas and the Province of FOGGIA (Region V).

2. This conforms with the freedom of movement already applicable in unoccupied Italy.

3. The movement of motor vehicles between Regions will continue to be regulated by arrangements to be made by the Regional Commissioners concerned. Where passes are deemed necessary these should be made valid for journeys to specific destinations where they should be collected by the authority concerned and a new pass for the return journey issued. This should act as a check on attempted black market operations and all loaded trucks and other vehicles should be subjected to a rigorous police examination.

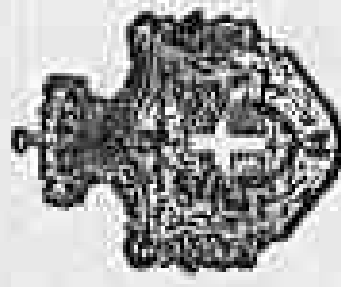

NOTICE

1. A control of the movement of all persons has been established on the following line:

From the mouth of the River Fortore in the Province of FOGGIA along the line of the River to Basilice, thence along the road running from Basilice to S. Marco and thence through FRAGNELLO to PONTE, thence along the line of the river CALORE to its junction with the River VOLTURNO and thence along the line of the River VOLTURNO to its mouth.

2. No person will be allowed to proceed northwards across the above line without being in possession of a pass issued by the Allied Military Government.

3. Passes will only be granted where in the opinion of the Allied Military Government the journey is likely to assist the war effort or is necessary for the maintenance of supplies or where the journey is necessary to allow the applicant to carry on an essential business, or where it is required to be made in exceptional cases of urgency.

4. Persons, such as Doctors, carriers of supplies, workmen and the like who require to pass and re-pass regularly over the above line will be issued with passes valid for a fixed period on application to the Civil Affairs Officer of the place where they reside.

5. Persons not in the above categories who desire to cross northwards over the above line must apply by letter to the Civil ~~Affairs~~ Officer of the place they desire to reach. The application must state the name of the applicant, his address and occupation, his identity card number and the full reasons for his proposed journey. The application must be delivered to the Civil Affairs Officer stationed nearest the place where the applicant is residing or if such place is not in occupied territory to an Officer of the Allied Control Commission.

6. Every pass issued to a person mentioned in paragraph 5 will be signed by the Civil Affairs Officer of the place that person desires to reach, to whom the officer receiving the application will forward it. Applications for passes should therefore be made considerably in advance of the date of the proposed journey.

7. The possession of a pass to cross the above line does NOT exempt the applicant, if resident in occupied territory, from the necessity of obtaining a permit under PROCLAMATION NO. 2 to travel more than 16 Kms. from his place of residence.

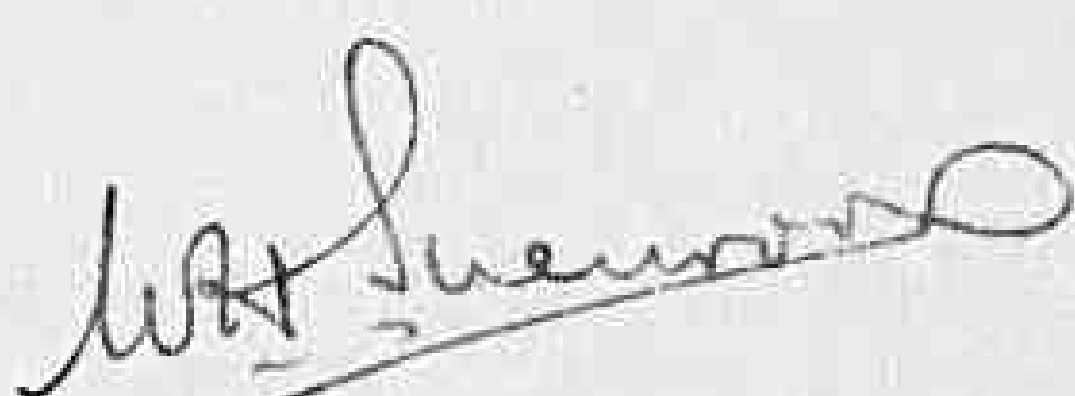

TO : Adm. Dir.

This office has tried without success to obtain the original papers, from which this entire question or matter arose. In the absence of the papers themselves I rely upon my recollection, which is as follows:

A communication addressed to or from AMHQ, and passing through HQ.AMG as a channel, made reference to passes for Italian officials (presumably those at BARI or BRINDISI). Col. Spofford made a note to you indicating that Public Safety might be of help in devising such a pass if AMHQ wanted one. We thereupon drafted the attached and submitted it on Dec 5 to you. That was and is our only interest; namely the suggestion of a type of pass which could be used.

I repeat, the question of necessity or desirability was not referred to us, nor as I recall it, to Col. Spofford or to you, but was reserved by the originator of the correspondence. The pass suggested is available for adoption by those who raised the question initially. In the absence of the original papers, I do not propose to interpose my views on the question of necessity, or to suggest that the matter be dropped when higher authority has an apparent interest in it.
