SUBJECT : Travellers Stranded at Foggia Station.

TO : Regional Commissioner, Abruzzi-Marche Region.

1. The Regional Commissioner, Southern Region, has made representations to this Headquarters concerning the difficult situations which arise at Foggia Railway Station as a result of passengers finding themselves stranded at that station.

2. The majority of the stranded passengers are said to have travelled from Abruzzi-Marche Region, in particular, Chieti Province, and it is suggested that journeys are authorized by AMG officials and Sindici as a matter of course. Many of the stranded passengers are found to be improperly transporting olive oil and salt.

3. It is requested that steps be taken to ensure that civilian movement passes are issued only in accordance with the instructions contained in Executive Memorandum No. 77 to persons who show good and sufficient reason why they wish to travel.

1. Your letters 1456/357/4.5 1 (b), dated 13 and 15 October 1944, refer.
2. The Polish Consul General who directs the Polish War Relief Organisation has indicated that the pass used by the subjects of your letters was not issued by him or under his direction.
3. The Consul General is aware of the regulations in force with regard to the Control of Civilian Movement, and he has given his assurance that all Polish organisations under his control comply with them on all occasions.
4. With regard to the irregular form of pass issued to the persons named in your letters, enquiries are being made with a view to determining by whom the pass was issued and counter-signed in order that appropriate action may be taken with regard to this matter.

3. As the phrasing of the letter is not strictly accurate and is likely to mislead will you please advise whether you consider a request should be made for the withdrawal of the letter in question and all similar letters issued to persons of Sig. DI FULVIO's standing.
4. Signor DI FULVIO produced the letter when he was interrogated by MG officers in Chieti in connection with failing to produce a regular civilian movement pass.
5. The return of the letter is requested, please.

1. Reference conversation today, Consul General, Republic of Poland, this Headquarters, it is confirmed that three zones and two boundary lines affect civilian travel in Italy:-

- (a) The Army Zone (north of the Rear Army Control Line)
- (b) The Rear Army Control Line
- (c) The Restricted Zone (between the Rear Army Control Line and the Restricted Line)
- (d) The Restricted Line
- (e) The free Zone (South of the Restricted Line, Province of Foggia excepted).

2. Details concerning the boundary lines are as follows:-

(a) Rear Army Control Line.

"Fiumesino S4951 Iesi Fabriano S1217 Fossato R9912
Perugia Maggione W5396 thence north of Lake Trasimeno to
Sinalunga R1605 Siena, Volterra, Cecina"

(b) Restricted Line.

"Northern boundaries of Provinces of Teramo, Rieti and
Rome. In addition all Foggia Province is a Restricted Zone."

civilians are forbidden to cross either of the lines without a pass.

3. The restrictions imposed within the zones are as follows:-

(a) Army Zone

No civilian may travel more than 10 km. or enter or leave the zone without a pass approved by AMG within the Zone. 557

Requests for passes will not be considered unless the journey is in the direct interest of the war effort.

(b) Restricted Zone

No civilian may travel from one province to another without a pass issued at the point of departure. It will be noted that Foggia is regarded as a Restricted Zone. Applicants for passes must show good and sufficient reason why they wish to travel.

(c) Free Zone

Movement is unrestricted except between the Islands of Elba, Sardinia, Sicily and the mainland. Passes will be issued at the point of departure.

It is believed that the form was countersigned by an officer of A.M.G. After examination by C.I.C. agents, the persons were allowed to return to Rome.

2. The Polish Consul General was directed the Polish War Relief organization was informed that the pass used by the persons named was not issued by him or under his directions.

3. Irene J. Di Maria is said to reside at Piazza Giunone No. 2, Rome.

4. Full information is requested with regard to the issue of the pass. The name of the A.M.G. Officer who countersigned the pass should be obtained.

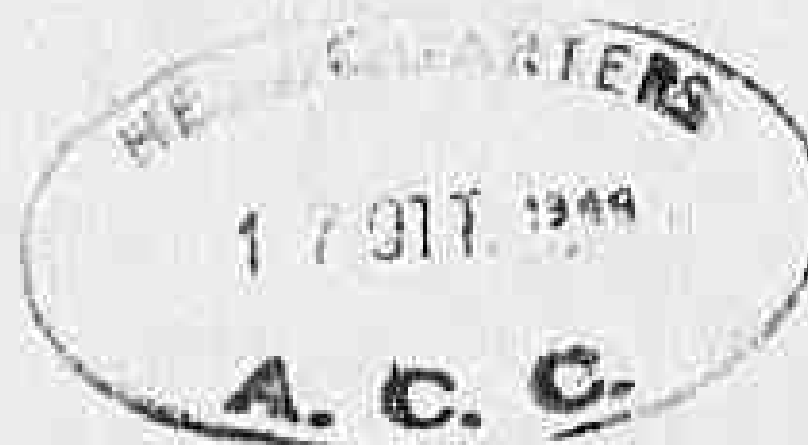

1. Interrogation of two captured enemy agents has revealed the fact that, before their capture, they were in contact with two persons ZAGARI Claudio and JAPLOWSKA Irene (his wife) in SIENA on 25 Sep 44.
2. It is understood that these two persons were in SIENA while on their way from ROME to FLORENCE where they were to buy souvenirs etc for sale in Polish Military Welfare Shops in ROME.
3. Subsequent investigation revealed that ZAGARI and JAPLOWSKA were NOT in any way implicated in espionage activities. Nevertheless they were examined by CIC agents with a view to confirming their bona fides.
4. CIC report that ZAGARI and JAPLOWSKA were in possession of a permit issued by the Polish War Relief typewritten on an irregular form. It is believed that the form was countersigned by an officer of AMG. They were allowed to return to ROME.
5. This matter is brought to your attention as it is a notable case of persons being irregularly authorised to enter the Army area. Any comments or information which you may be able to supply would be appreciated.

This AMG authorization was given by my former secretary the Italo-Canadian Peter Bonardelli and he also signed my name. A copy of my signature follows :



The trip ticket was initiated by the Azienda Servizi Annonari (part of the Rome Municipal Administration) to which service had been entrusted the emergency issuing of these trip tickets for the procurement of fresh food supplies for Rome. Strict orders had been given as to necessity of not issuing trip tickets for journeys beyond the Army Line but owing to the changes in the administration mainly due to political causes some lapses were inevitable. Bonardelli acted in good faith when he gave the AMG authorization during my absence however he has since left the service of Allied Military Government.

Merchants were constantly warned as to the danger of sequestration of their transport by proceeding beyond the Army Line and every publicity was given to the regulation.

Herewith report from FSO on the case of the men who were taken into custody at Abbadia, on which Capt Dawson discussed some points at the conference yesterday. You will note that 2 men of the "rescue party" are now also here. I have released the first 2 on recognisance & am holding both lorries, pending your instructions.

I must emphasise the danger of individuals in Rome attempting to make their own arrangements (usually at the expense of other institutes) in obtaining goods from anywhere that offers a chance. Comment is superfluous on the waste of transport. This is on a par with the T5 and Italian civilian who came here a few days ago from the Excelsion Hotel in Rome with a truck, to get wine. This apart from the question of crossing the army boundary & drawing supplies from a refugee area.

Irregular Journeys from Rome into the Army Area.

With ref to my remarks at yesterday's conference on the subject of irregular passes to Abbadia San Salvatore, I have to submit a case for orders.

Bizzarri Andrea and Rocca Giulio came up from Rome to Abbadia with the encl. paper (No. 8497, it is called folio di via by Capt Lester); I have marked it "A" in Red.

I noticed the truck in Abbadia on the evening of Thursday 27 July and ordered the CCRR to find it again. The 2 men were brought before me on the following evening & I ordered their arrest. The arrest report is herewith (B). I further ordered that they be sent to Montepulciano prison to await trial. They are now held there.

Their position is clear: they have between them violated not only Secs referred to above but also Proc. No. 1; Art 5 Sess 39, 41 & 42. And have further travelled a distance of 13 kms beyond Abbadia.

It will be noted that the purpose of the journey is said to be the purchase of fruit and vegetables. Now the fruit and vegetable country had been passed before coming into this province. The communes round Lago di Bolsena produce both in abundance, whereas the only interesting produce in Abbadia consists of mushrooms. These may or may not have a definite food value which I will not discuss. They are, however, generally regarded as a luxury article. The price in Abbadia is 20 to 25 Liri per kilo, and I am informed that the retail price in Rome is 150 Liri per kilo. In fact we appear to have a pretty piece of black market work in circumstances to which I will refer later.

The date of arrest was 28 July 44, 1900 hrs. and on 31 July evening 2 men came up with papers C and D. C speaks for itself. It is perfectly clear that 1 of the gang went from Abbadia to Rome with the news (means of transport??). I am sending orders to the CCRR to trace the man.

Paper D is a most interesting document. It will be noted that under the heading "Type of Goods" that the object of the journey is "soccorsio macchina" (rescue vehicle). It is pleasing to know that Rome is in a position to permit the expenditure of 5,500 litres of petrol on such an errand, while we can get none to thresh our

The remarks on the reverse of paper D are, to say the least, naive. Considering the omission of the names of the persons interested in Paper A, I certainly cannot ascertain that the Folio di Via is regular. The PS of the Local Resources Officers does not cover the omission of the names.

Quite apart from the Folio di Via (A & D) not only the 1st pair but the 2nd pair have been allowed to travel without passes. I can understand their being given passes to another AMG province but this has not been done. Even if passes had been granted it is contrary to regulations to grant them to places North of the Army Control Line without ref. to the AMG authorities of the province

concerned.

Not to put too fine a point on it, it is apparent that every possible breach of Proc. 1 and Gen Order No 24 and the Standing Orders re the Issued Passes, has been committed. As far the arrested men and their rescuers are concerned, I cannot help feeling that a portion at least of the blame for the breaches must lie on the Rome authorities. At the same time there is no doubt in my mind that they are trying to exploit the present situation by indulging in, if not black market, at least a little profiteering.

The whole transaction is, in my view, unsatisfactory. It looks too like the old game played in Naples. I feel that no purchase should be made by one prov. outside its own territory without the approval of the P.C. concerned.

I have decided to hold all 4 persons and the 2 trucks and to submit the papers for the instructions of the PC. There is no doubt that a conviction for travelling without passes would stand. The irregularities are, however, so gross that I feel that the matter will have to go very much further and that steps will have to be taken to see that regulations are strictly observed by Rome Area.

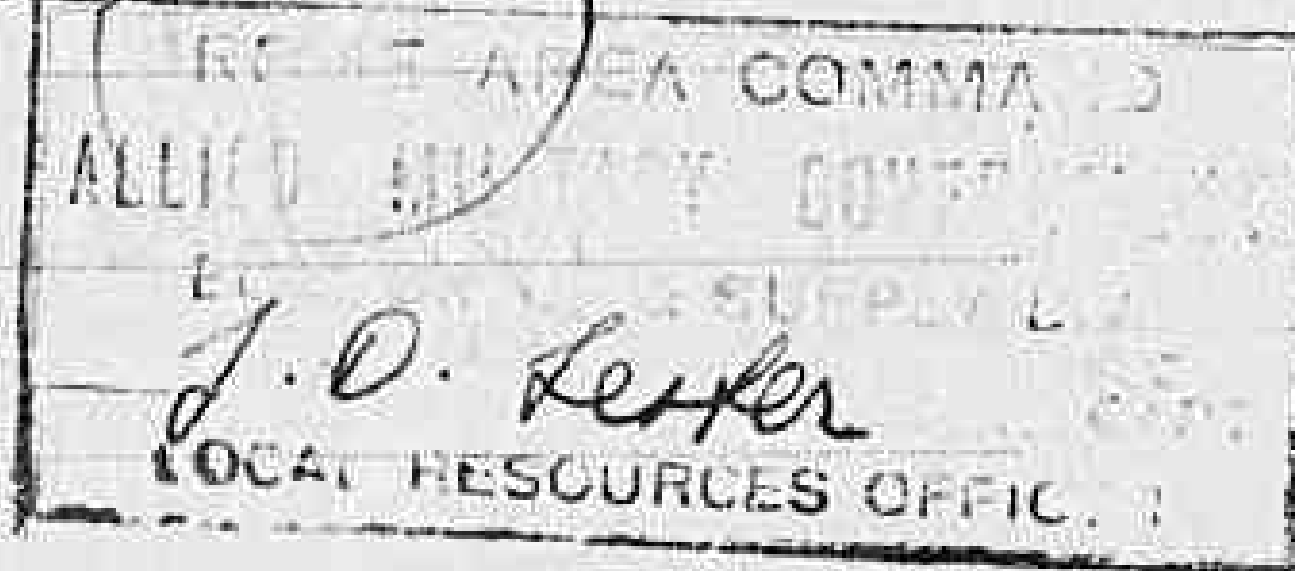

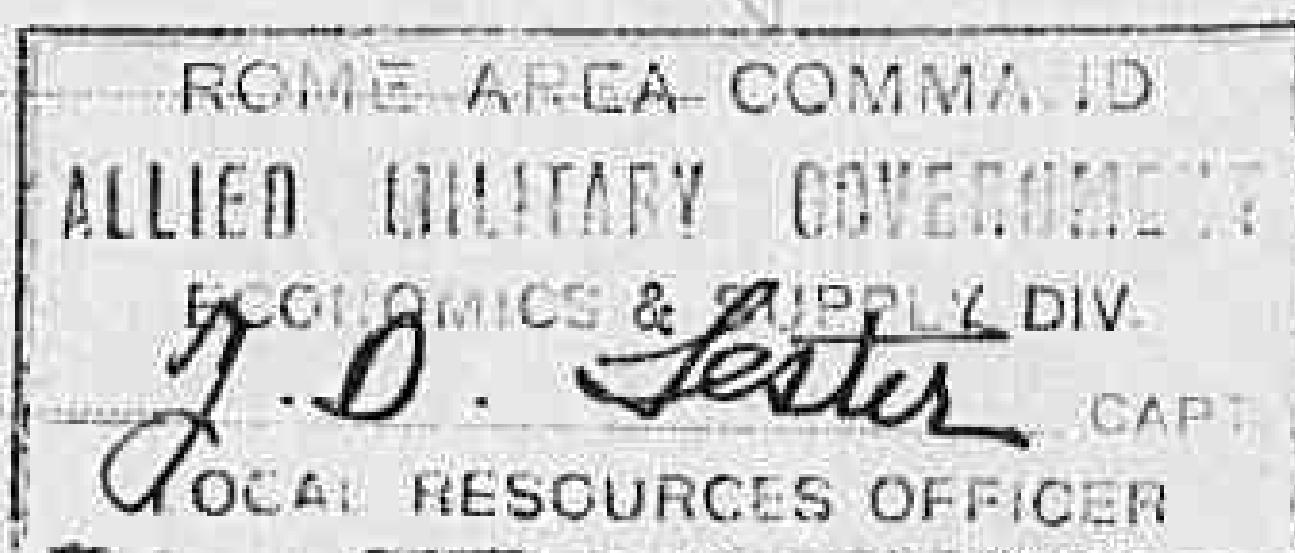

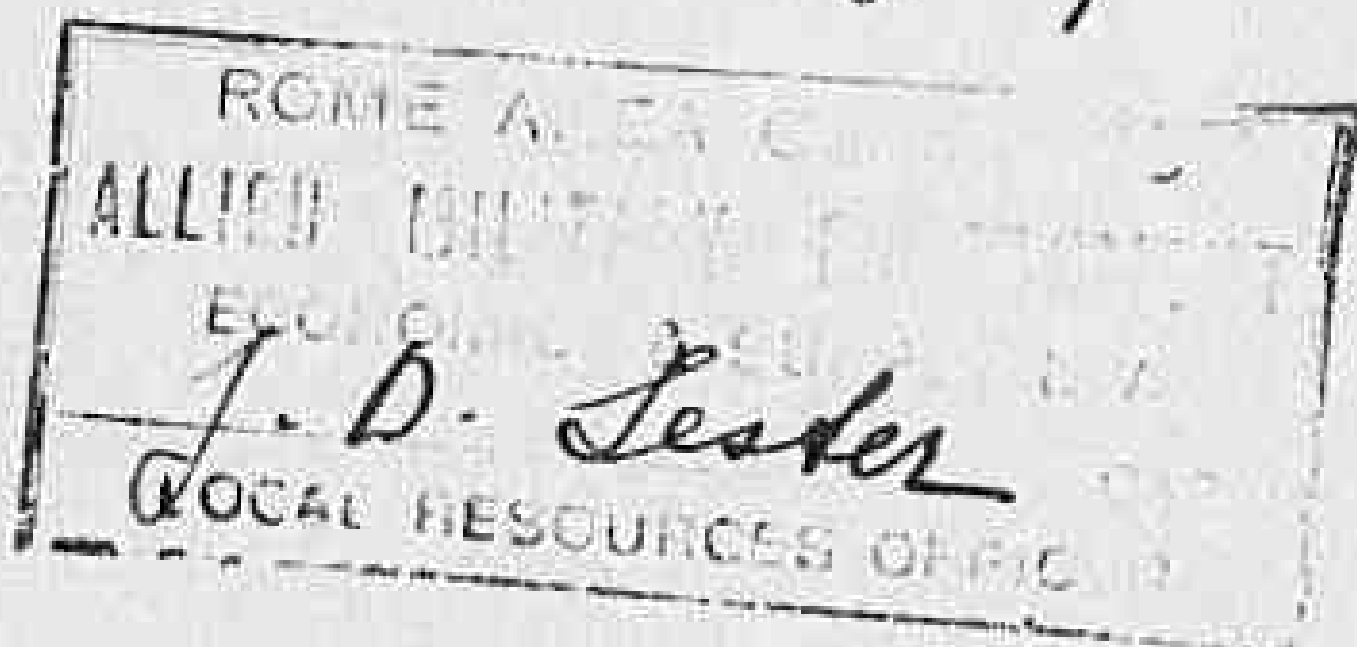

I have read through the papers received from C.A.O. Montepulciano.

In my opinion, the men concerned are covered as regards the pass issued by the Director of the Mercato, and countersigned by an AMG Officer. Even though they may not have been authorized to do so, I think that the accused were entitled to rely on this pass as having been properly issued. It is true that the distance has not been correctly shown on the ^{first} second pass, which was actually 340 km., as shown on the second pass, but I think it would be difficult to prove that this was due to a misrepresentation on the part of the accused, and in any case, it was the duty of the AMG Officer who signed the pass to check this.

At the same time there is a prima facie case against all the accused for having travelled north of the Control Line without having in their possession a pass to travel more than 10 km., Art. 1, sec. 2, Gen. Order 28, makes it clear that the possession of a pass does not absolve a person from the necessity of obtaining such a permit, and in my opinion the accused cannot take refuge behind any irregularity committed by an AMG Officer in issuing the pass.

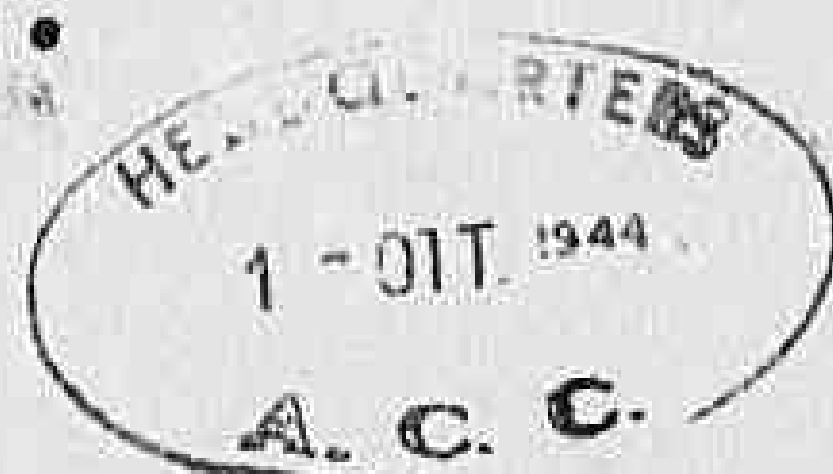

I herewith have to report that No. 5568 Cann. Arm. PAOLETTI Nello, Italian Marine, was given a special leave pass from Taranto for the purpose of going to Rome. It was clearly typed on the top left hand corner of this pass that it was prohibited to enter the zone of operations of either the 8th or 5th Armies, and this pass I found to be quite in order. On arriving at Rome however this marine succeeded in wangling a pass from the Ministero della Marina Direzione Generale Pers. Serv. Mil. Divisione, C.R.E.M. Rome. to the effect that he was going to Florence on duty. This Foglio Di Viaggio was counter signed and stamped by one A.E. Baker, Police and Public Safety Division, Allied Military Government.

PAOLETTI Nello was stopped by CMP S. Casciano and brought to me for interrogation. He admitted during the interrogation that he wanted to get to Florence to see his family, and that the only service he had to do in Florence was the delivering of seventeen private letters to families in the town.

1. Your letter 1/101, dated 25 September 1944, refers.

2. The situation should be eased as a result of our agreement to dispense with yellow "Movement of Civilians" passes in the case of those members of the Italian Army who are in possession of Italian Military passes to places south of the Control Line providing such passes are endorsed by I.C.'s of M.M.I.A.

3. Whenever the Military and Civilian Passes are required, irregularities will inevitably arise unless both passes are issued together.

4. The present difficulty might be met by the issue of an instruction to Regional Commissioners, by RC & MI Section, and to the Ministry of Interior, by this Sub-Commission, to the effect that "Civilian passes must not be issued to Italian Military personnel to proceed on leave etc., unless application for the passes is made by Italian Service Commanders. This procedure must be followed in order to ensure that Military and Civilian Passes are issued together (see Executive Memorandum No. 77 dated 31 August, 1944, para. 11 (a))."

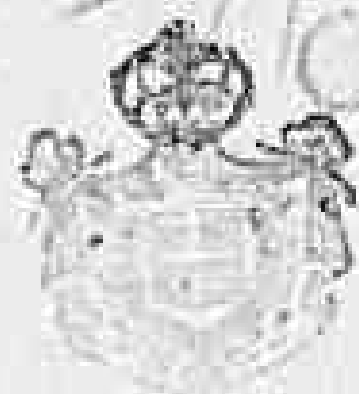
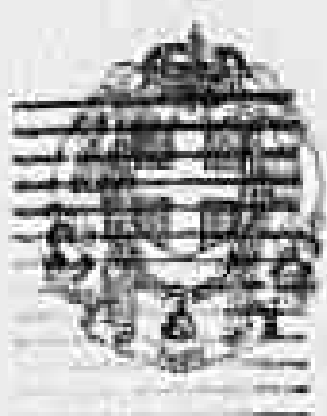

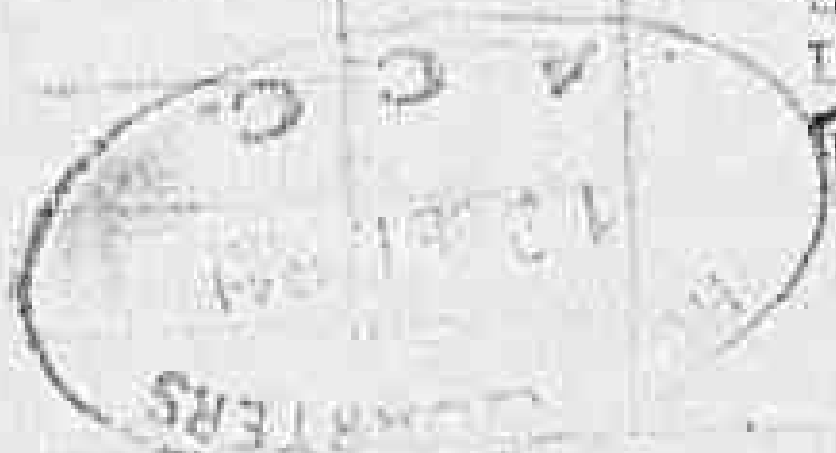

International Institute of Agriculture attached to the
Argentine Republic Delegation, ROME.

On 6 Sep 44, 1900 hrs, at the Piazza MATTEOTTI, CHIETI, my attention was called by Capt SEGUIN, Cdr Army, to a stationary 10-cwt motor truck AP3850 which was carrying 24 tins of M & V and 7 packets of dehydrated pea soup powder.

Capt SEGUIN, who is on the staff of AMG CHIETI, was, at the time, in conversation with a man, now known to me as the above named. The conversation was in Spanish. I broke in on the conversation and asked the Capt the reason for calling me. He said, "This man has this stuff on board. He claims to be a member of the Argentine Embassy at ROME and entitled to be diplomatically privileged. How that meets up with the Laws of the Allied Military Government I don't know. You are the policeman so it's up to you." Asked whether he had verified Signor DI FULVIO's statement by document or otherwise, Capt SEGUIN replied, "Here is his name and address."

Signor DI FULVIO, who understood English language fairly well, then produced a document which satisfied me that he was attached to the Argentine Delegation in ROME.

As the matter has become somewhat delicate and to an extent difficult for immediate action, owing to the place, the time, and the interest taken by the Italian public, I asked Signor DI FULVIO whether he would agree to further discussion on the matter at 10 a.m. the following day at the Public Safety Office of AMG. He readily agreed. The Truck and Foodstuffs meanwhile were placed in the custody of CC.RR.

On 7 Sep. 10 a.m. Signor DI FULVIO attended this office. He produced documents (1) Certifying diplomatic Immunity, signed by the Allied Military Government, Rome and quoting International Law No. 1075, 20 June 1930. (2) Certifying Signor DI FULVIO to be an Argentinian, attached to the Argentine Delegation, Rome and a member of the International Institute of Agriculture. Signed Stanley Andrews, Major, USA. (3) A document granting permission to travel to Chieti, signed by Di Giacomo, Capt, USA.

Apart from the fact that the travel pass was not of the recognised yellow pass type, there was every reason to give credence to the identity of Signor DI FULVIO.

With regard to the possession of the foodstuffs, the Signor explained that he had bought them openly in shops in Chieti. 5-32

With regard to the possession of the foodstuffs, the Signor explained that he had bought them openly in shops, in Chieti. They were not for personal needs, but for his two sons whom he had traced to Para Filorium Pietro, Chieti Province. The boys were not so well off for food and he had made the purchases in order to augment their meagre rations before he himself returned to Rome.

Enquiry through the Provincial Supply Offices revealed that the foodstuffs referred to were on sale as surplus to the ration scale laid down. This was due, according to the rationing scheme, to the supply being greater than the demand, as many individuals, particularly peasants, did not take advantage of the MAV and dehydrated food to which they were entitled under the scale of rationed foodstuffs.

Signor DI FULVIO was told that all enquiries were completed with satisfactory results and that so far as AMG Chieti was concerned, the matter was at an end. I extended an apology for any inconvenience that may have been caused him. The signor replied by saying that he appreciated the difficulties of the times and my work in connection therewith.

No resentment was shown or declared to the action taken by me. Prior to leaving this office, Signor DI FULVIO was equipped with the authorised travel pass for his return journey to Rome.

1. A report has been received from the 8TH Army that PAOLETTI, Nello, (No. 5568 Cann. Arm) an Italian Marine was apprehended enroute to Florence for personal reasons to visit his family and deliver private mail.

2. An investigation revealed that PAOLETTI was given a special leave pass from Taranto for the purpose of going to Rome. It was clearly typed on the top left hand corner of this pass that it was prohibited to enter either the 5th or 8th Army zones. On arrival, Rome, PAOLETTI obtained a pass from the Ministry of della Marina Direz. Gen. Pers. Serv. Mil. Divisione C.R.E.M., Rome, indicating that he was proceeding to Florence on duty. This Foglio di Vaiggio was apparently countersigned and stamped by A.F. BAKER, Police and Public Safety Division A.M.G.

3. When apprehended by 8th Army authorities, PAOLETTI admitted that he wanted to visit Florence to see his family and that the only official duty he had to perform in Florence was to deliver 17 private letters.

4. In accordance with the provisions of Navy Sub-Commission letter NSC/785 of 3 September 1944, and previous instructions, no Italian Naval personnel are authorized to perform travel north of the Rear Army Control Line for personal reasons. In addition, the delivery of uncensored mail is prohibited.

5. It is requested that an investigation be made and appropriate action taken, both in this instance and to insure that unauthorized passes are not issued in the future for personal reasons. Please advise the Navy Sub-Commission, ACC, as to the results of the investigation made and the action taken.

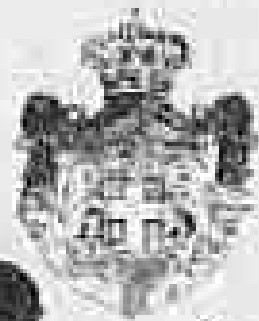

1. It has been reported that Signor Giacomo Stefanelli travelled to Scheggia, Perugia, which is north of the Rear Army Control Line, without being in possession of a standard yellow "Movement of Civilians" pass approved by the S.C.A.O. Fifth Army.

2. Stefanelli produced the attached documents, viz (a) a P.W.B. pass No. 235, (b) a letter issued by B.I.A.S., dated 24 July 1944, and (c) a letter issued by P.W.B., dated 25 July 1944 at Scheggia when he applied for a pass to return to Rome. His application was refused.

Dear Colonel Kirk,

With reference to our telephone conversation this morning I enclose a memorandum which we have received from Dr. Geremia Luconi, an official of the Public Security Department, attached to the Presidency of the Council of Ministers; he is also a contributor to the Vatican newspaper the "Osservatore Romano" and came to me with a strongly worded recommendation from Count Dalla Torre, editor of that paper and a good friend of mine.

Dr. Luconi is in a great state of anxiety and distress about his wife and small son who, as you will see, were amongst the six arrested at Perugia (I understand that the wife's object in making the journey was to visit her sick mother) and the Minister hopes that it may be possible, if they have not already been released, to arrange for their immediate liberation. It seems that they genuinely supposed that the collective travel permit which they had received (? from the Questura) was sufficient, in other words, that they erred through ignorance only, and in these circumstances we hope that they may now be released and that the wife and child of Dr. Luconi, whom Count Dalla Torre recommends so highly, may be allowed to return to Rome without delay.

● Translation.

On the 20th instant the local Command of the F.S.S. of Sigillo (Perugia) proceeded to arrest six persons accompanied by a soldier of the Royal Carabinieri who, coming from Rome, regularly furnished with documents of identity, had reached the place in question in one motor-car on the 18th August. The Lieutenant of the aforesaid Command seems to have decided that the collective authorisation of which the arrested persons were in possession was not sufficient. These persons had gone to Sigillo solely for the purpose of ascertaining the conditions in which their relations had been left after the German occupation.

All the arrested persons (two men and four women, who had with them three children of from three to five years of age) are unexceptionable in character, both morally and politically, as is guaranteed by the undersigned in his capacity as an Official of Public Security, as also by the civil and religious authorities of Sigillo and by the Bishop of Nocera Umbra.

Among the arrested persons are the wife of the Undersigned Antonietta born Bartoletti, with her son Mario aged 5. The others are Anita Damiani born Rosetti, with two children, Iole Braccini, Signorina Viola, the chauffeur Quirino and Domenico Bartelli.

I beg you to be so good as to intervene with the utmost urgency with a view to the release of the arrested persons who, detained in the Prison at Gualdo Tadino, are in the greatest moral and physical distress.

Passes. SCAO 8 Army was most concerned about the indiscriminate issue of passes to enter Army areas. Only in exceptional circumstances should they be issued at the point of destination to enter Army areas without first obtaining permission from the Army. There appears to be either abuse or misunderstanding and Civil Affairs Branch would arrange to clarify existing instructions on the subject. It was agreed that when Armies asked for Italian civilian officials to be sent forward or Sub-Commissions wished to send Italian officials into Army areas, that Armies would send back a pass ready made out to facilitate their movement, at the same time as they conveyed their approval.

1. The attached correspondence addressed to the Executive Commissioner's Branch has been forwarded to this Sub-Commission by Security Branch.
2. The SCAO AMG Eighth Army, complains of irregular circulation passes being issued by officers attached to HQ. ACO., and cites two instances.
3. As regards the letter found in the possession of PICHEZZI, Lt.Col. Carter of the Mining Division, HQ. ACO., has explained to me that the letter was not intended as a circulation pass but merely a letter which the bearer could produce if he required assistance. Lt.Col. Carter agrees that in order to avoid confusion, any future letters should state specifically that they are NOT circulation passes.
4. As regards the letter issued to Capt. Luigi TORRI, Major Magnus of the Patriots Branch is now aware of the correct procedure and no further difficulty should occur.
5. It is recommended that a notice on the following lines should be inserted in the Daily Bulletin.

"Civilian Travel Passes.- Instances are still being reported of civilians being found in possession of slips of paper signed by officers of this HQs purporting to authorise travel in Army areas and AMG territory. 1. On 21st July, 1944, at 10-15 a.m. outside the Prefettura Perugia, I saw a Fiat 1500 saloon motor car, Index No. 9406 P.G. bearing a pass (No. A.68703) issued in Rome to Sig. PICHETTI Filippo on 6-7-44, expired on 10-7-44. I questioned Sig. PICHETTI and he produced a typewritten letter from the Mining Divn. A.C.C. H.Q. dated 7th July, signed by Lt. Col. Carter, requesting that assistance be given to the bearer and three others named. Only Sig. PICHETTI was travelling in the car and he stated that the others had not accompanied him.

2. In view of the fact that the car permit had expired and in any case, was only for the Rome area, I have caused the car to be placed in the care of Lieut. SHOUSE, C.A.F.O. Perugia. The above named was without an official pass allowing him to enter Army Area but in view of the letter from Lt. Col. Carter, I did not arrest him.

3. I wish to draw attention to the increasing number of people entering this area from Rome without official passes. The Military Police have been repeatedly assured that A.M.G. or A.C.C. Officials will only issue official passes and have been instructed to arrest anyone without such a pass. It must be seen that the issue of letters and unofficial documents unless backed up by the official pass, cause great confusion, and will lead to the arrest of the persons concerned.

1. At 3-10 p.m. on 20 July, 1944, I saw a stationary open tourer, No. 66389 Rome, on a diversion of the Umbertine-Perugia Road. My attention was drawn to this car owing to the large quantity of luggage which it held. On examination I found that affixed to the windscreen was a typed rectangle piece of paper bearing the following inscription, "This car is used by the "Office of Strategic Services" Allied Armies in Italy" A.S.O. 777 United States Army. It was stated to expire on 30-7-44. and the signature thereon was not decipherable.

2. The car contained two persons both in civilian clothing. One of them, Capt. Luigi TORRINI produced another typewritten slip of paper, signed by P.M. Magnus, Major for C.D. McCarthy, Colonel, which stated that Capt. TORRINI was travelling from Rome to SIENA and back on an urgent patriot mission. The other person was a Dott. Eriberto SCORATO, who produced as his authority to travel the attached typewritten slip, signed by one, Bernabo Tiro, Ten. Col.

3. The latter said he was ordered by the Italian Colonel to go with TORRINI to act as his driver, and without any interrogation on my part, volunteered the information that he was not going to see his family as they were in Venice. In view of the fact that this document is dated 19th July, and the one signed by Major Magnus is dated 20th July, I cannot understand why this was not mentioned when the latter pass was applied for, or perhaps it was?, and permission denied. Capt. TORRINI did not give me any details of his urgent mission and did not give any explanation for the large amount of luggage carried, which, to say the least, was a very unusual load to carry on such a mission. He informed me that he would be returning within three days.

4. I allowed them to proceed after taking possession of the Italian pass but I consider it necessary that if and when it is necessary for such people to travel in Army Area they should at least be provided with official passes. The C.M.G. have been assured that this would be done.

2. The three green and white "Lasciapassare" were offered at a check post on the Rear Army Control Line as authority to cross into the Army Area. It is recommended that in cases such as these yellow passes should be issued since police and security personnel manning check posts have been instructed that the yellow pass is the only valid AMG/ACC pass authorising civilian movement. It will be noted that none of the three passes attached bears the signature or stamp of the issuing authority.
3. The pass in respect of DOGA Renato needs no comment. (ORBESALIA is some eighty miles north of ROME).

1. If the security control of civilians is to be effectively exercised, it is essential that civilian passes should be issued on a uniform basis.

2. There are three standard pass forms in use in this Theatre, viz,

(a) The ACC/ANG Pass - See para 3 below).

(b) The Brown Military Permit.

This is for strictly limited issue by intelligence staffs of higher Headquarters to persons employed on special intelligence duties.

(a) Any such pass must:-

- (i) Be properly identified with the person to whom it is issued; i.e., the latter's name, identity card number and signature must be shown on the pass.

- (ii) State precisely what the holder may do or where he may go.

- (iii) Bear the legible signature of the issuing officer.

- (iv) Show the period of limited validity.

- (e) ACC/AMG passes issued to public utility workers etc. may be endorsed either by the issuing officer or by the unit employing them, to cover any particular aspect of their work, as may be considered requisite.

He said he was MARIANO RAFFANELLE, an official of the R. Intendenza di Finanza and that he came from NAPLES. Identity card No. 31019. He was accompanied by another civilian.

He stated that he had been to S. PIETRO and ROCCA D'EVANDRO on official business. He carried A.M.G. pass No. 36064. issued by Capt. JEFFERSON at CAPUA, as he said it was necessary to obtain one there to cross the VOLTURNO. The pass was made out to ARPINO and was valid until 11 June 1944.

His reason for going to ARPINO was to visit his family.

He was interrogated by P.G.S. and no letters were found on him, though as he had been in the town some hours he had time to deliver any he may have had.

He was ordered to return immediately, but later stated he had trouble with the engine and was then told to leave at dawn on 5 Jun 1944.

It is requested that C.A.O.s in the back areas be reminded once again of the restrictions on passes in the forward areas, and of the probable fate of civilian cars found in the Corps Area, and especially of those that develop engine trouble.

On the afternoon of the 25th April 44 the following three men were found in Isernia with a three-wheeled Guzzi motor cycle 15451 Roma which was laden with furniture and bedding.

They were asked to produce their passes for the use of the vehicle and the purpose of their visit to Isernia.

Each of them produced a permit issued Nos 0491, 0490 and 0316 issued at the Provincial Commissioner's Office in Bari stamped by Lt. Col. Vining and the three permits authorized a journey to Campobasso Province and return on Official Service, dated 19/4/44 and 20/4/44 and all for the period of three months.

When interrogated all three men said they were employed by the Engineer at Bari, Edgardo Marzono, Piazza Garibaldi 75, to proceed to Isernia to collect his furniture and bedding. There was no other material on the vehicle.

The bedding and furniture was taken from the vehicle and the men sent back to Bari.

It is requested that the matter be taken up with the ACC authorities in Bari to ascertain what reason Marzono gave for the issue of the permits.

It is pointed out that the circulation of civilian vehicles in the forward areas which is congested with military traffic should not be authorized except for urgent domestic business and the visit is not within that category.

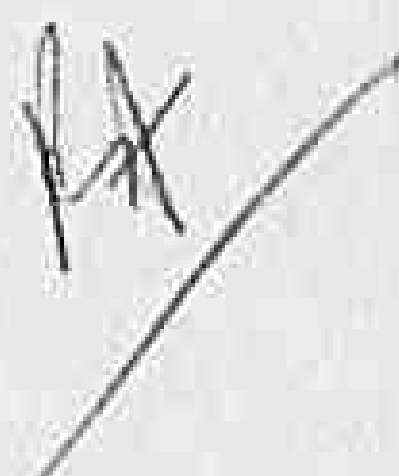

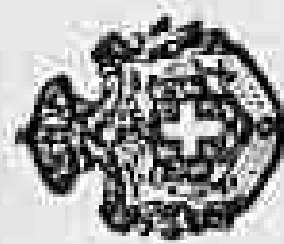

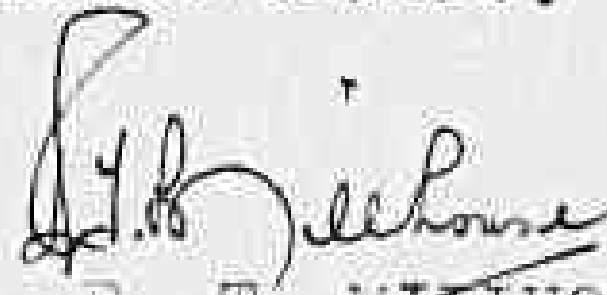
