Subject: Reconstruction of the Experimental Laboratory.

1. From enquiries made by Maricost, La Spezia, it appears that almost all the equipment of the former Experimental Laboratory has been carried away by the Germans, who have also removed platinum objects to a total weight of over 3000 grammes.
2. According to information obtained by the above Maricost it seems that the apparatus and machines belonging to the Laboratory were sent from Carrara and La Spezia to the Scientific Institute for Research in Steel (Kaiser Wilhelm Institute fur Eisenforschung), at Dusseldorf.
3. These facts are submitted for your attention with the request that we may be informed whether there are any objections on the part of the Allied Authorities to our sending an I.R.N. Mission to Germany to seek the abovementioned materials and equipment at the Institute named.

The Office of the Executive Commissioner at the Allied Commission, with memorandum n° 61/45 dated 6th June 1945 has established that all persons leaving Italy (including Sicily and Sardinia) for destination abroad, must be in possession of a Military Travel Authorization released by the Allied Commission - Sub-Commission for the Public Safety.

This obligation exempts any person who is not transiting other territories on the way to United States of America - United Kingdom enclosed Malta, Gibraltar and other territories to which British visa regulations apply and Egypt, provided these persons are in possession of Visas issued by United States or British Consulates.

In the memorandum are specified other persons exempted from this Military Authorization, who do not interest this office because they are travelling with documents not released by the Italian Authority (Allied Diplomats) or persons belonging to the Offices Allied Military War Organization.

All persons who wish to return to the State to which they belong and for whom this authorization is necessary, must make application for such authorization to the Consulate of their State or nearest office or camp maintained by Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission; instead, diplomats, consular officers, members of Special Economic and political missions (Not Allied) or Vatican Officials must forward application directly to the Allied Commission; for all other civilians whose normal documents for immigration is a pas-

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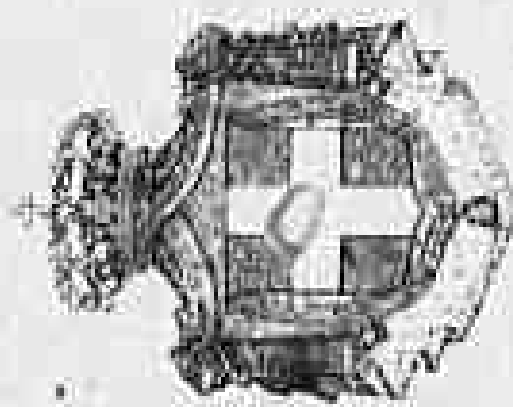
All persons who wish to return to the State to which they belong and for whom this authorization is necessary, must make application for such authorization to the Consulate of their State or nearest office or camp maintained by Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission; instead, diplomats, consular officers, members of Special Economic and political missions (Not Allied) or Vatican Officials must forward application directly to the Allied Commission; for all other civilians whose normal documents for immigrating is a passport, application will be made to the nearest Allied Commission - Allied Military Government Officer or to the Questore of the Province in which applicant finds himself.

However, the Questore taking into consideration that nothing has changed for the granting of the passports, are, from now on, empowered for further file relating to Allied Military Authorization.

For this reason the Allied Commission has established an application form that in a small quantity, will be sent to the Provinces together with this order.

This application form for Military Travel Authorization will be completed in duplicate. They will be typewritten or written with ink in block capitals where no typewriter is available, and will ensure that the application forms are fully and properly completed, adding any information available locally concerning applicant.

Two fullface and two profile photographs of passport size must be attached to the forms as indicated thereon.

Consequently from now on with the documents to be presented by the interested party have to be added four photographs needed for the application forms.

The Questure, once satisfied itself as to the identity of the applicant and to the reason for the proposed journey, will note in the "REMARKS" section on the back of the forms, any information available locally concerning applicant and add any comments of its own. Otherwise the forms will be endorsed "Nothing known against" (Nulla Osta). The receiving office will then countersigned the forms and append its office stamp.

If necessary a report will be attached.

The application forms in duplicate will be directly sent from the Questura of the Provinces returned to the Administration of the Italian Government with the regular request of "Nulla Osta" to this Ministry who will take care in sending them to the Allied Commission and later inform the decision.

And this, independently of the files of immigration that the Foreign Office does - D.I.E. or for whom the Inspectorate of Boundary Line concern.

It is made clear that this judgment is in relation to the release of passport and not to the Military Travel Authorization, as this matter concerns only the Allied Commission.

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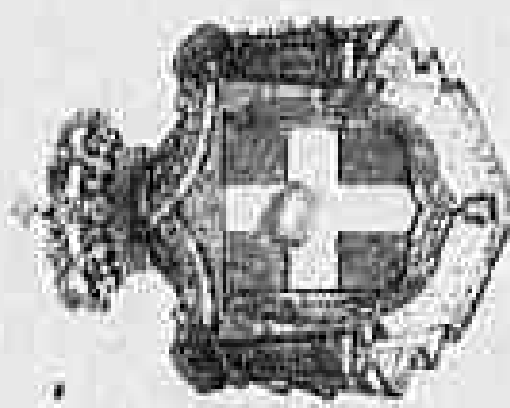

- d) Approved refugees and repatriates.

The Military Travel Authorization does not substitute the Consulate Visa which must be released before a Military Travel Authorization is granted.

It is recommended to spare the application forms assigned the most possible for the reasons that they will be delivered strictly only to the quantity of the expatriated subjects **up** to the date in each province.

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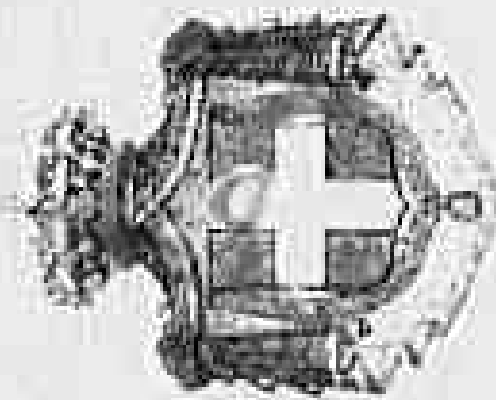

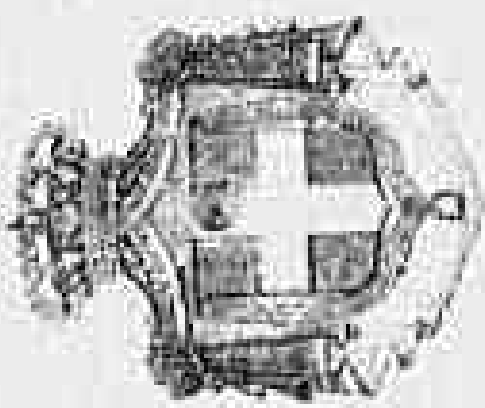

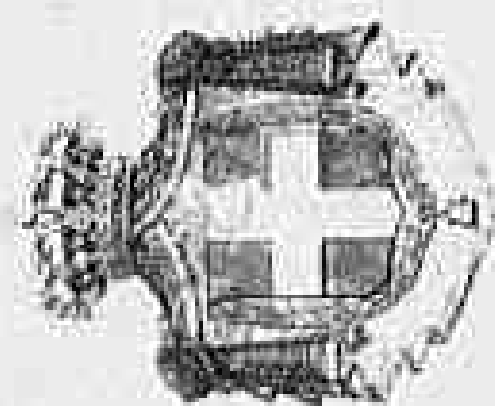

1. Transmitted herewith is the latest instruction governing the issue of military travel authorisations.
2. It will be noted that :
 - (a) A military travel authorisation is only an authorisation to leave Italian territory, and does absolve a person from regulations which require possession of passports, documents of identity, visas, exit permits, etc.
 - (b) Questori are authorised to accept applications in the case of applicants not dealt with by Displaced Persons Sub-Commission or Liaison Division.
3. A supply of 3,000 MTA application forms for issue to questori in Italian Government territory has been handed to Dott. Rateni Luigi of your General Direction.
4. This Headquarters would be glad if you would issue a suitable instruction concerning these matters as early possible to your dependent commands with copies for information to this Headquarters and Questori in Allied Military Government territory.
5. Publication of the fact that questori now deal with applications for military travel authorisation is not considered necessary.

Two copies of the application form will be completed. They will be typewritten, or written in block capitals where no typewriter is available. The applicant must furnish, where photographic facilities exist, two full face and two profile photographs of passport size, which will be affixed to the two copies of the application form as indicated in the spaces provided. Where the applicants cannot provide photographs, right thumb prints will be made on the application form, in the presence of the agency accepting the application.

6. In the case of applications for diplomatic and consular officers and members of special economic or political missions, however, applications will be handled by Headquarters, Allied Commission. Photographs will not be required.

7. The agency receiving an application will satisfy itself as to the identity of the applicant and as to the reasons for his proposed journey, and will note in the first few lines of the "Remarks" section of the application form any information available locally concerning the applicant, and any comments. Otherwise, the receiving agency will indorse the Military Travel Authorization application forms "Nothing known against" ("Nulla Osta"). The agency will then fill in the items "Counter signature of Civil Affairs Officer and Office Stamp" and "Region and Province", but will leave the remaining spaces blank. The terms of this paragraph will not apply to applications under paragraph 6 above.

8. Both copies of the application form will then be forwarded by the receiving agency through Headquarters Allied Commission to G-2 (CI) AFHQ.
