Having his oil mill in full activity, he received orders from the Italian Government to leave immediately as a civilian war internee for Italy. Thus on January 18th 1942 he left Tripoli abandoning all his property i.e. a mechanic oil-mill at Cussabat Gabila Bueccia, a Citroen car No.895 Libia, and his furnished house in Via Luigi Mancinelli 10. Arriving in Italy he has been interned at Bagni di Lucca (Toscana) with his parents and brothers who are still in the concentration camps of Frosinone. After three months, owing to the health conditions of his wife Giovanna Pellegrino and children Salvatore and Francesco, he has been transferred to Marsala.

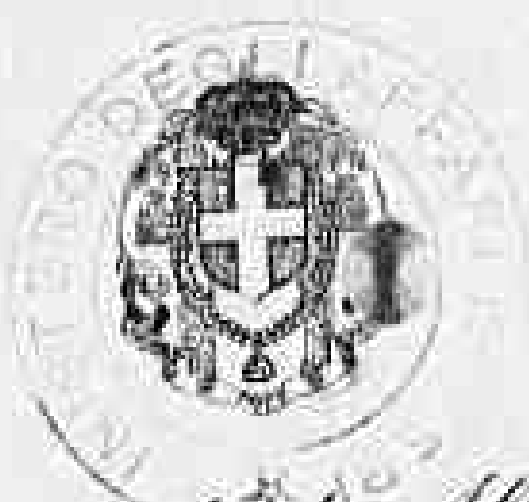

The undersigned Monsignor BRIZI DOMENICO Rector of the Pontifical College of Propaganda Fide, in the name of Cardinal PIETRO PUMASONI-RICCHI, Prefect of the Sacred Congregation of the Propagation of the Faith, on whom the above mentioned College depends, beg to ask of the Supreme Allied Military Command the following favour.

Owing to the long duration of the war the students of Propaganda College, although many have long since completed their ordinary course, with the exception of a few isolate cases, have been unable to return to work in their respective countries. This number has continually increased with the result that well nigh two thirds of the students actually find themselves in this condition. 10

There is urgent need of their services in the countries under the jurisdiction of the Sacred Congregation of the Propagation of the Faith, to replace missionaries who were obliged to return to Europe, and those serving as Chaplains in the Forces.

The Sacred Congregation and the Superiors of the College are naturally very anxious to meet this urgent need, but hitherto it has been impossible.

I/

I therefore humbly appeal to the Allied Military Command to consider our case and if and when possible to facilitate the departure of these priests. Among them there are a number whose health is already poisoned, for whom the necessity of passing another winter in Rome constitutes a grave danger. In the last two years six students have died, who would probably have recuperated their strength if it had been possible for them to return to their native climate.

I am fully aware that the favour I ask for is by no means a small one. However the priests would willingly serve as auxiliary Chaplains on hospital or troop ships returning to their respective countries should this be admissible.

I am annexing the names, nationalities and numbers of Passport of the students desirous of returning.

I have received an appeal from the Rector of the Propaganda Fide College (endorsed by the Cardinal Prefect of Propaganda) in which he urges that 41 students of the College who have already finished their course of training for the priesthood may be repatriated at an early date to their own countries.

2. The Rector points out that no less than two-thirds of the students in the College have finished their course and are now eligible for return; of these I gather that a fair number are Japanese or Chinese for whom it is no doubt assumed that nothing can be done at present. Of the 41 eligible for return whose names are given by the Rector and who include 27 from India and Ceylon, all but 5 are British subjects. It is stated that the health of several of these has been adversely affected by their prolonged sojourn in Rome and in the last two years, no less than 6 have died whose lives the Rector thinks might have been saved had they been able to return home. He adds that, if these priests can be repatriated, they will be glad to serve as auxiliary chaplains on hospital or troopships.

3. Copies of the Rector's letter and of the list of priests proposed for repatriation, with numbers of passports given where possible, follow by Bag.

4. I shall be grateful if this appeal may be given urgent and favourable consideration, on humanitarian grounds (most of these young men having been at least 7 years away from home); for reasons of health; and, most of all, because their services are urgently needed in their home dioceses.

With reference to my telegram No. 607 of to-day's date, I enclose herewith copies of the letter which I have received from the Sector of the Pontifical College di Propaganda Fide (it is endorsed by the Cardinal Prefect of Propaganda) and of the attached list of students whose early repatriation (i.e. before the coming winter) is earnestly requested.

2. You will note that of the forty-one students in the list, five come from Ceylon, twenty-three from India, three from Central Africa, three from Ethiopia, one from Egypt, two from Australia, one from New Zealand, two from (? British) Honduras and one (a Maltese) from Turkey. Of all these students, the numbers of whose passports are given where possible, it would seem that only five are not British subjects, viz. the three Ethiopians, one Indian with a Portuguese passport and one French citizen from Togoland.

3. As stated in my telegram under reference, I sincerely hope that means may be found of meeting the desire of Cardinal Fumasoni Biondi in this matter. It is no doubt true that the health of many of the students has suffered from so prolonged a sojourn in a climate which is trying both on account of the summer heat (the students have been deprived for two years of their usual "villeggiatura" in the Alban Hills) and on account of the lack of proper heating in the winter; I understand, moreover, that the food they are given is both scanty and unappetising/

unappetising. Besides this, it must be demoralising for them to have to stay on here after their course has been completed, and the death of six of their number during the past two years has, as the Rector informs me, had a depressing effect on the College as a whole. My principal reason for urging that the forty-one young priests be repatriated is however that there is a serious shortage of priests in most of the countries in which they will have to minister, and that their services at home are therefore urgently needed.

4. I am sending a copy of this despatch and of my telegram to the Headquarters of the Allied Control Commission.

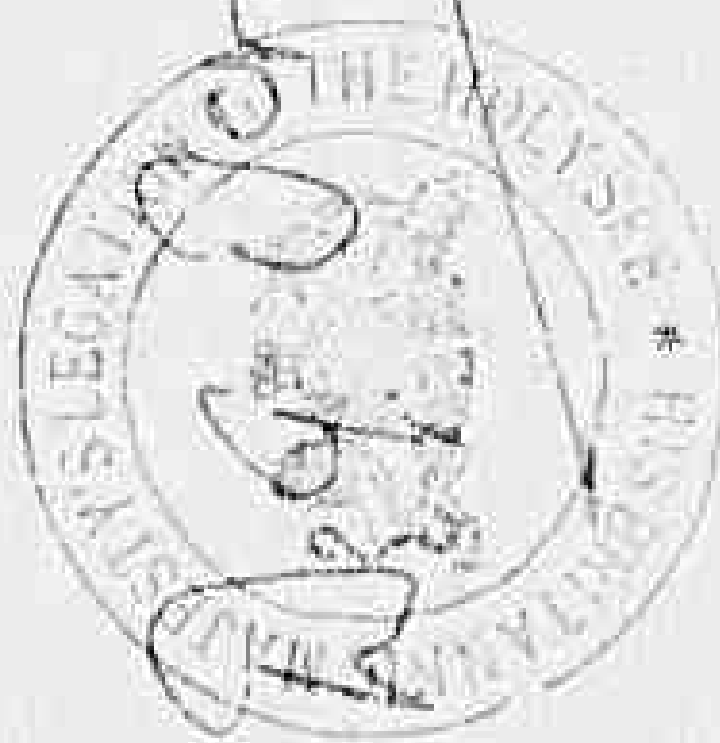

I undersigned- British subject by birth
Pass. No. I7366- issued in Malta 10th. Sept. 1936 regularly
registered and renewed at Turin, Florence, and at the Swiss
Legation in Rome: make the following application to that Hon.
A.F.H.Q.

I am a priest civil enternee. From Palermo, where I was,
when war broke out I was interned in Florence. After a year
I was expelled from Florence by the Italian Police, and sent to
Aquila where I have been interned till Allied troops entered the
town. The Germans wanted to deport me to Brescia and eventually
to Germany. I helped, out of pure charity and humanity as many
P.O.W. as I came in contact with. Often I ran the risk of being
caught by the Germans and Fascist spies. Food; clothes, medicines,
and money I gave to them as my liabilities allowed me to do.
At Florence in 1940 I was offered by the local Questura, free
circulation all over Italy on the condition that I should change
my Passport and accept Italian Citizenship. I categorically
refused as this was against my honour. Since then I was always
pointed out. Other Maltese had fallen in the trap. I have never
had any contact with the treacherous Maltese Committee of Libera-
tion headed by Judge Mallia and other Maltese traitors. These were
much favoured by the Fascists during the war.
I left Aquila hoping to get a permit from the Allied Authorities

to go to Malta where our Order the Society of Jesus runs a boarding College and a day school: St. Aloysius Colleg Birkirkara. Our Rector A Maltese who recently came to Rome asked and obtained from our Superior General, now a Frenchman, that we Maltese Jesuits should go to Malta to help our Rector who has only 6 Fathers at his disposal. Now we depend no longer from the Sicilian Authorities. An agreement has been reached between the Br. And Ecc. al Authorities in Malta, that lays down that only maltese priests should run colleges, churches and so forth. At Valletta we run a church property of the British Government, strictly reserved for the Armed Forces. The only two english Fathers Robinson and Sullivan died last year. I wish to go back and work with my brethren, possibly going my poor nontribution to the war effort in that measure that my priestly vocation allows me to do. During the war when the heroic Malta was easily the ~~best~~ the most beaten target of the German Stukas I asked my Superiors to be transferred to Malta; but I was answered NO. Now I appeal to you Sir and kindly ask you to help me.

I can assure you that all I've written is true and I confirm it with my word of honour. I can also assure you that whatever information you may take about my political conduct you will find it more than satisfactory, and that priest of my sentiments are or should be highly desirable in Malta. Where as ^{it} is well known not all Maltese priests residing in Malta are Persons Grate to the British Government. I should be greatly honoured and deeply obliged Sir if you could allow me a few minutes ap ointment.

I enclose herein copy of a letter which Mr. Montgomery has received from the Superior General of the Missionary Franciscan Sisters' Institute in Rome, Mother Mary Holland, in which she appeals for facilities to send out five or six Sisters to Egypt, where their help in the schools is urgently needed. This appeal has been made to H.M. Legation with the approval and encouragement of Cardinal Caccia Dominioni, Protector of the Institute, and I trust that it may be given favourable consideration. The Sisters of the Institute are largely Irish and it would no doubt be possible to stipulate that those sent out should all be of Irish or British nationality.

2. You will note from the Superior General's letter that the Institute conducts no less than five schools in Egypt, where their work appears to be highly appreciated by the British Government. It would therefore probably be in the British interest, as well as in that of the Institute; that this request should be granted. As the number of pupils at some of these schools has doubled during the past years and the Mother House have not been able to send/

send out any extra Sisters since November 1939, it is easy to understand that a fresh supply of teaching Sisters is badly needed and,,even though the difficulties of arranging for their transport may be considerable, I hope that an effort may be made to meet the Mother General's wishes. If it is impossible to meet them completely I at least trust as suggested in the penultimate paragraph, it may be possible to arrange for one Sister to go to Egypt to carry out a visitation of all the convents and/or colleges there which are under the control of the Missionary Franciscan Sisters.

Sir:

In deference to the wish you expressed on Saturday last when I called upon you that I should put the matter of my business in writing, I shall try to do so as briefly as possible.

My object was to find out if it were possible to send some Sisters of our Institute to Egypt to help out in the schools carried on by our Sisters. The Institute conducts 5 schools in Egypt, namely: English School of the Immaculate Conception, 53 Haptish St., Cairo; Alvernia English Convent School 28 Mohammed Mazhar Pasha, Zamalek, Cairo; St. Clare's College, El Sharia Sultan Hussein, Helioopolis; Sacred Heart British Girls' School, 159 Rue Tanis, Thrahinieh, Alexandria; and St. Michael's Convent School, Fayoum.

The Sisters' work in the first four of the Convents is well and favourably recognised by the British Government, and the Consular Authorities have more than once publicly thanked them for the support given by them to the different activities carried on from time to time for the benefit of the wounded and invalid soldiers.

In/

In the past few years the number of pupils attending some of these schools, particularly those of Alexandria and Damask, has doubled and so necessitates the employment of many secular teachers; as the Mother House here in Rome has been unable to send on any extra Sisters since November 1933. Two Sisters who formed part of the Community in St. Clare's College were transferred to Ireland last year and were not replaced owing to the difficulties of transportation; another Sister of the Sardinian Community has been ill and unable to be in class for almost a year. The most serious handicap however, is that caused by the death of Mother Hilarton Madden, Superior of St. Clare's College, Heliopolis, who died suddenly on August 11th last. The loss of this dear Sister is a terrible blow to our Community and creates a void which will not be easily filled. 70

In view of all these difficulties I respectfully beg you to present to His Majesty's Ambassador our humble petition that if it is at all possible some way would be opened up for us to send 3 or 5 Sisters from one to Egypt. We realize that we are asking a great favour, but the serious difficulties which confront our poor Sisters in Egypt in their lack of help to carry on their good work embolden us to ask for aid. If the demand is unreasonable or incapable of being granted, may I plead that a way may be found which will allow transportation to Egypt for at least one Sister. By doing this it would enable the writer personally, or by means of a Delegate, to make the Visitation of the Convents there, which would be deeply appreciated by the Sisters, and give them an opportunity of personally representing their difficulties and discussing/

cussing what remedies could be applied for their betterment.

Thanking you in anticipation for any consideration which you may be able to give us, and assuring you of our deep appreciation and gratitude, I beg to remain,

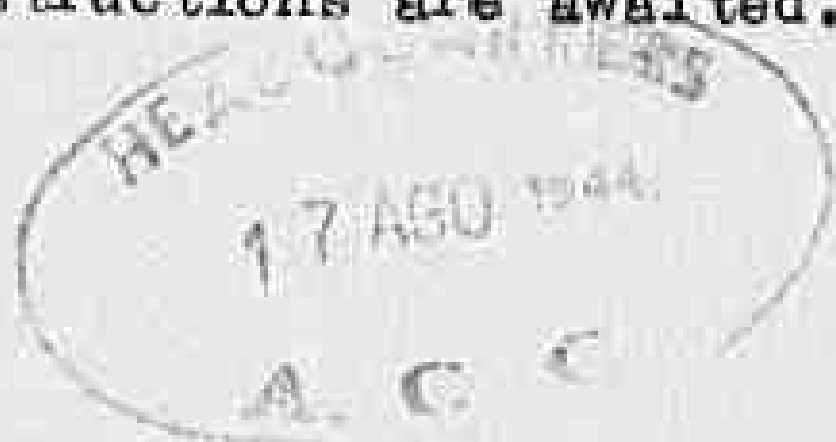

I am enclosing a copy of some letters sent some time ago to the Office for Assistance of the Ministry of Italian Africa, ^{bringing to light} ~~lightening~~ the iniquitous treatment which Italian citizens residing in Africa-Tripoli since 1911, have undergone since the fall of Fascism, and I am begging for Your Excellency's help that I may be repatriated and be paid the allowance I am entitled to. My wife is an English subject, born in Tripoli.

In reply to the attached letter on Jan. 16. 1942 N. 54 the Ministry of Italian Africa let me know that they had suspended my allowance as I was fit to work, and earn money. I thanked said Ministry for the good omen, but I was unfortunately obliged to inform them that my health was in disastrous conditions owing to a paralysis caused by the cold, which was keeping me in bed since October 1911 (as certified by a medical statement sent by me at that time to the Office for Assistance) and that moreover my financial conditions were nearly exhausted.

As Tripoli was occupied, all my financial possibilities vanished. I had there a nicely furnished house for which I paid a monthly rent of L. 354,50 and had there all my belongings and my personal clothes, which I hope some day to get back. Now after 30 years of work in the Colonies I find myself in the utmost distress.

The Office of Assistance has cut off all ~~a~~ subsidy since 66 August 1943 and has deprived me of all means of maintenance. This, Your Excellency, is the reward we African veterans and pioneers, residing there since 1911 are getting. My wife and I are not accustomed to this climate and we cannot stand the cold, the more so as we have no woollen clothes. We made repeated requests for woollen clothes at the Prefecture of Frosinone, but they were always

answered negatively. Of course if my Society had paid me at least part of my salary, I could have managed; but now they have cut off my 389,30 monthly allowance.

Excellency, here the black market is unfortunately in full development as the leaders are the same persons of past days and enjoying ^{freedom} ~~insecurity~~ and protection from the authorities ~~themselves~~. Since August 1943 in this Comune we are without spaghetti, rice, soap, sugar, fats, salt and tobacco; to buy a liter of oil one has to pay 600 lire, a kilo^{of} salt from 400 to 500 lire, a kilo^{of} sugar 300 lire, a liter^{of} milk 16 lire, a package of national cigarettes 30 lire and a kilo^{of} potatoes 30 lire and so on. Tell me, Excellency, how can I and my wife, with our poor health, live on a 389,30 monthly allowance? Besides the local chemist does not deliver medicine unless exchanging them with other goods, or at exorbitant prices which we cannot possibly afford. For a quintal of corn they have paid up to 13.000 lire. We ask your Excellency to let us repatriate and to order our Society to recall us to service and to pay us all our ^{back} ~~arrears~~ monthly salaries from 1943, as it is not our fault if we did not resume service, but we were kept back by orders from the Ministry.

Excellency, I was forgetting to tell you that the barbarous Germans, after the welcome they received in this country, paid us back by robbing all our clothes, food and goods; moreover they mined part of the village and caused it to blow up, showing themselves the same barbarians they were at the times of the Huns and their King Attilas. They have mowed the corn ~~and~~ cut the trees and destroyed all culture condemning us to starvation and to a misery worse than before. We wish to take our vengeance on their land and to do to them what they did to us. In this hope, I send Your Excellency my best thanks.

It is not the first time that I make known to this Office
of Assistance, by I was assisted for a year, the situation in which
I find myself.

On July 1941 I and my wife Vella Giovanna came over to Italy to spend here a period of vacation not longer than three months, to escape the continuous naval and air bombardments; but we intended to go back at the end of October 1941, as certified by documents in my hands. Whereas at the beginning of Nov. 1941 we received from the Ministry of Italian Africa the prohibition to go back; subsequently we received the same prohibition on Aug. 8th 1942, of which orders I sent a copy to your Office by registered letter. This veto to our return to Tripoli, where we are residing since 1911 and where my wife has been born, causes us the loss a monthly salary of L. 2037 and of a daily indemnity of war of L. 24, which I was earning as ~~an~~ Department Chief of the Consumers' Service at the Italian Electric Colonial Society where I have been employed these 30 years. You cause us to stay in Italy on a daily allowance of L. 6,40, sufficient only for a package of cigarettes, and to lose all our belongings, while I can prove with valid documents at hand that for the sole rent of my house in Tripoli, completely furnished, I am paying 354,50 monthly.

In effect I have been paying from July 1911 up to the end
of January 1943, i.e. for 19 months at L. 354,50

while I have received 13 monthly subsidy of 390

You can see that there was only a difference of 689 lire left for me; then you must figure the expenses I have had for rent and food in Italy. They prevent us from going back home and they deny us the necessary winter clothes that we have not with us. How can we spend the winter here, how can we stay away from home, losing salary and indemnity and living on 6,50 each? Since August 1943 we ^{have} ~~are~~ not ^{been} getting either subsidy or help from any Benefit Institution. Is this the way these institutions are acting? We beg for ^{understanding} ~~comprehension~~ and assistance in settling this old question which is causing my wife and me such terrible inconvenience. We are nearly naked; why ^{are we} ~~do~~ not allowed us to go back home? ~~instead~~ of making us suffer as Libyan refugees? Some people, who are paid good wages, are receiving assistance, whereas we have not received anything from anybody all these 12 months; the benefit institutions are thinking only of themselves. How much better it ^{would be} ~~were~~ if they would abolish these benefit institutions which exist only ^{as} ~~as~~ a name.

(a) Military Travel Authorizations are not required in the case of Allied Military personnel on assigned Missions. However, Partisan or Royalist Yugoslav Military do require M.T.A's.

(b) All civilians require M.T.A's except the following categories :

- (I) Accredited diplomats and Consular Officials.
- (II) British and U.S. Government Officials (incl. Technicians assigned for duty with Service formations).
- (III) Persons already in possession of Inter-Allied Laissez-Passers or Allied Force Permits for Italy or Sicily not marked "SINGLE JOURNEY ONLY".

3. It is understood that ADLER is about to make a further application for M.T.A. As he comes within the category described in 2 (b) (II) no M.T.A. is necessary.

Before his appointment to the accountantship of the General Commissariato of Supply and Economic Coordination of War in Libia (Acorgeerra) with residence in Tripoli, Melfi Luigi had been appointed in the accountantship of the General Government of Libia and was there chief of the Section : fixed expences.

He had to come back to Rome, as it is well known at the General accountship of the State, after two retreats, the first occurred in Tripoli the 20th of January 1943 and the second in Sicily in the month of June 1943.

Thanks to the war he was not able to take with him anything and left his furniture, household, goods and personal belongings as well in Tripoli as in Caltanissetta. Now he begs this Ministry to appoint him again to the accountantship of the Government of Libia, or to the High Commissariat of Sicily, and this also for the reason that having passed so many years in warm lands (he was appointed to the Colonial accountship since 1928), neither he nor his family would easily endure the climate of Rome during winter.

With the hope of being assigned to either Sicily or Tripoli so that he will once again re-acquire the position he once held.

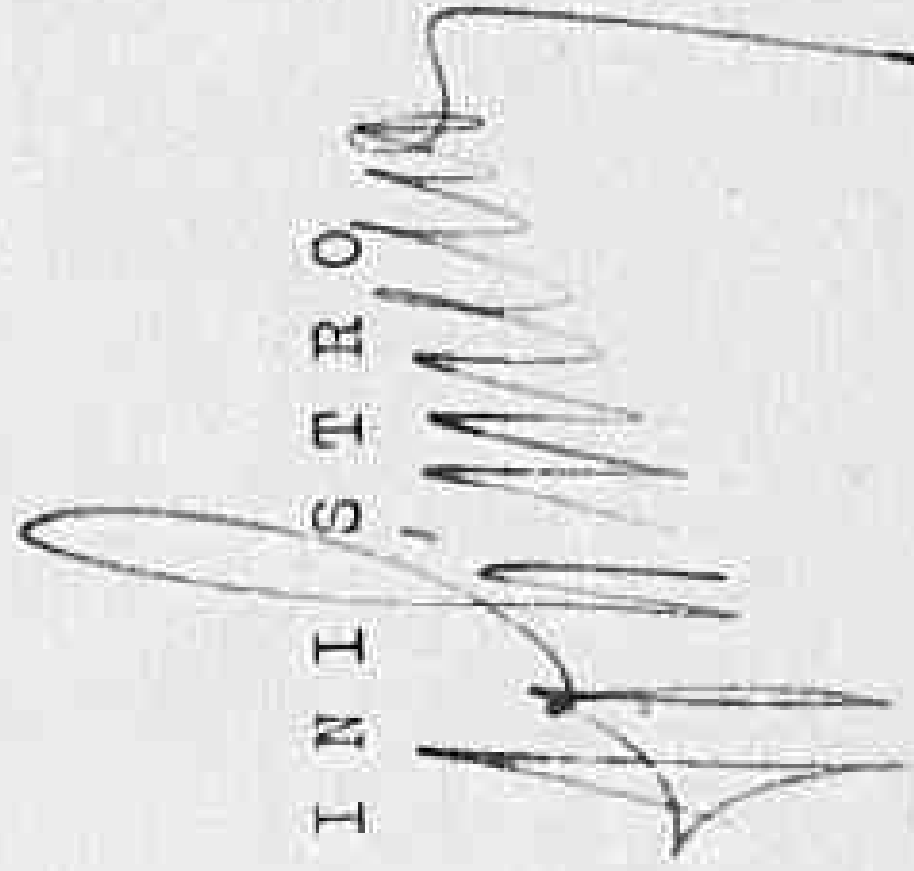

6. Normally, these applications, after completion in Region, are forwarded by this Sub-Commission to Forward Counter Intelligence, AFHQ for approval.
7. AFHQ is now in Rome Region. To avoid delay will you please forward the completed applications to AFHQ direct, indicating that this is being done at the request of this Sub-Commission and that the applications are recommended.

2. Wright states that he left N. Ireland in April 1939 and went to France where in Paris he joined the French Foreign Legion.

3. Enlisted, he was immediately drafted to North Africa and served  $4\frac{1}{2}$  years of his term of 5 years until September 1943 when, in the neighbourhood of Tunis, he deserted and made his way to the British 8th Army.

4. He was then engaged as interpreter and motor driver by the 101 Provost Company, CMP. The CO of this Unit issued him with a form of identification by means of an adapted AB 64 with a covering note. Wright is also in possession of a certified copy of his birth certificate.

5. When 101 Provost Company came to this theatre, Wright accompanied them and served while they were attached to 8th Army. This Company has now for certain reasons discharged all its civilian employees.

6. Wright states that his chief intention in returning to the U.K. is to enlist in the British Army as that is impossible here.

7. He is now being fed and housed by APM 57 Area.

8. His case has been put before the British Consul, Naples, who states that he is favourably disposed to granting him a passage to U.K. subject to issue of a Military Travel Authorization.

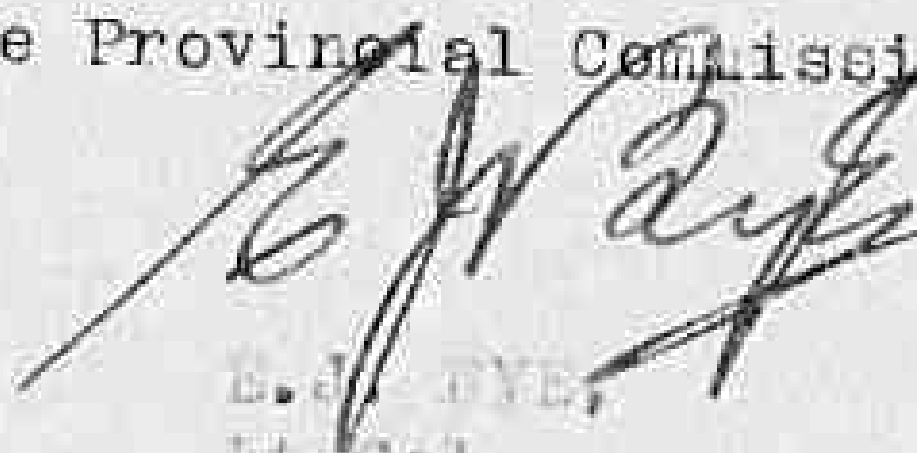

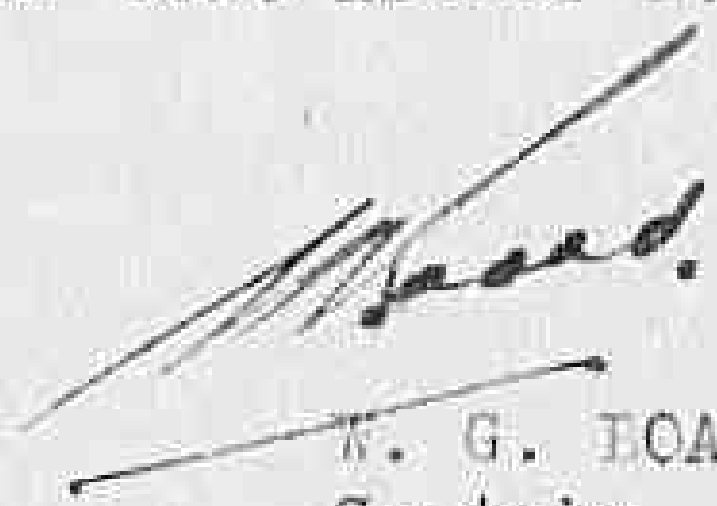
