1. With reference to your PS/17.5.1 dated 17 February, 1945, and enclosed report submitted by Capt. John Whyte with regard to the issue of a movement of Civilian pass for a journey to the Army Zone without having obtained the prior approval of S.C.A.O., AMG Fifth Army.

2. The steps taken by Capt. Whyte to ensure that the holder of the pass did not engage in any irregular transactions are appreciated at this Headquarters. The fact remains however, that the issue of the pass was contrary to the instructions contained in Executive Memorandum N°77.

3. With regard to the suggestion that of 106 applications for permission to travel into the Army Area submitted for approval between August, 1944, and December, 1944, 8 were refused and no reply was received in respect of 96, information is requested as to whether these applications were submitted to AMG Fifth or Eighth Army, in order that the matter may be taken up with the S.C.A.O., concerned.

4. Meanwhile, Capt. Whyte will be instructed that in future Movement of Civilian Passes must not be issued except in accordance with the provision of Executive Memorandum N°77.

1. Reference letter from HQ A.C. Public Safety Sub-Commission AC/14018/PS, 26 January 1945.

2. On 10th January 1945, the Zone Commissioner, requested me, if possible, to issue travel permit to a Naples business man, who stated he had large quantities of goods, chiefly woollen goods in the form of child's wear in a magazine at Prato, which he was willing to bring to Naples and sell to the people at a price fixed by the Prefect. The merchant stated the goods were his own property which had been stored there prior to the Allied occupation.

3. The Prefect was contacted and stated that SCHIOPPO was a well known business man. The Prefect also stated that, having regard to the very cold weather, prevailing at the time, it was very desirable that these goods should be brought to Naples for distribution to the children of the poorer classes.

4. Having only been in the department of P.S. for two weeks, I made enquiry from the permit office, and found that of 106 applications for permission to travel into Army Area, between August 1944 and Dec. 1944, no reply had been received from 96 such applications, whilst 8 had been refused.

5. SCHIOPPO was in possession of an authorisation to draw 76 gallons petrol from ENAC, for the journey, if the permit was granted.

6. I discussed the matter with the Zone Commissioner and it was decided to issue the permit, subject to certain conditions:

- (a) On return to Naples, Schioppo was to produce to the Prefect, a detailed list showing all material transported from Prato to Naples.

- 2 -

- (b) To prevent any black market transaction, on arrival in Florence, Schioppo to report to Public Safety Officer, 5th Army.

7. It is admitted that this permit was not issued in accordance with Executive Memorandum 77, dated 31st August 1944, but having regard to the information available from the Permit Office, that out of 106 applications, no reply had been received from 96, and the remainder, refused it was felt desirable to issue the permit from this end, providing steps were taken to notify AMG, 5th Army that this had been done.

8. This Office was not aware that the articles requested for transport were frozen by the Resources Board.

9. That the persons named in the permit were without money may be accounted for by the fact that the goods to be transported were their own property, therefore, the question of purchase may be excluded.

TO : Headquarters IV Corps, AMF Section.

1. With reference to attached letters and pass.
2. Pass #96321 was issued to BONFIGLI, FERRUCCIO, while I was at the Rest Center ROME, on leave; at that time I visited some friends by the name of VITALINI, who employed BONFIGLI, FERRUCCIO, as a chauffeur.
3. I was Civil Affairs Officer of AITOPASCIO, LUCCA right after its capture last summer, and at that time Captain VITALINI was of great assistance to me in helping to get the town organized. Later I met his family and was invited to visit them in ROME, when on leave.
4. I was assigned to the 1st Armored Division as a Civil Affairs Officer just about the time Executive Memorandum #77 was issued, and had never seen it until today. I acted in good faith in issuing the pass, as I was under the impression that a Civil Affairs Officer could issue a pass in another Commune by dint of the authority vested in him as a Civil Affairs Officer.
5. As to the identity card number, I can not recall now just why it was omitted; it may have been an oversight. Items 'c', 'd', and 'e' were left blank as 'a' and 'b' covered the points 'to' and 'from'. As there was no reason why he should be out after curfew, I pointed that out and marked it 'no'.
6. I regret the unintentional deviation from existing policies and now have a copy of Executive Memorandum #77, dated 31 August 1944, for future reference.

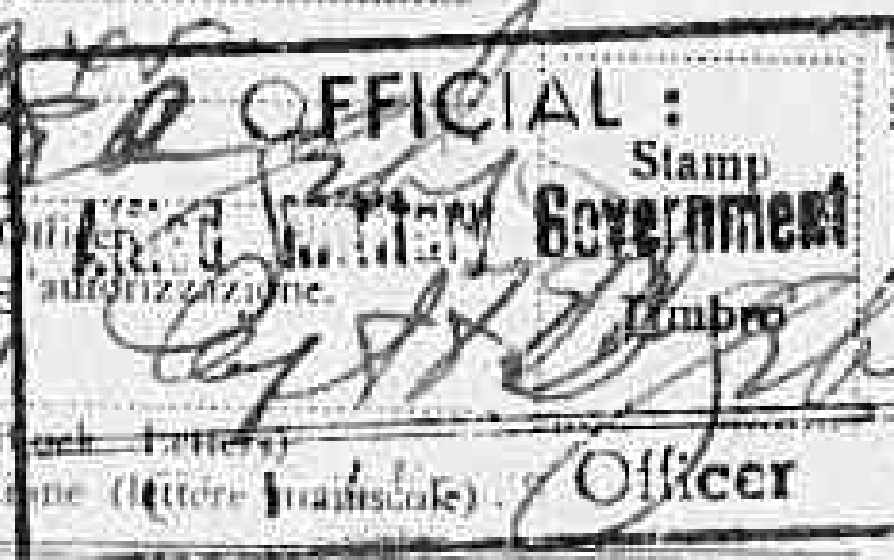

SUBJECT : Issue of Improper Movement Passes.

TO : DCAO, Headquarters 15th Army Group.

1. Transmitted herewith is a permit, marked "Secret", which purports to authorize Dr. Arnaldo LUVINI to travel north of the rear army boundaries.

2. The permit is not of the standard type of movement pass issued by AM/AC which all civilians must carry when traveling in the Army and Restricted Zones.

3. In addition, the permit does not bear Dr. Luvini's address nor his identity card number, and no date of expiry is shown. The issue of such permits, as pointed out on previous occasions by H.Q. A.A.I., is a grave danger to security.

4. It is requested that this matter be brought to the attention of 15th Army Group with a view to steps being taken to prevent the issue of such permits in the future.

5. Dr. Luvini, the holder of the permit, has now made application to Liaison Branch, this Headquarters, for the issue of a standard pass covering travel north of the Rear Army Control Line.

1. With reference to your letter R5/514/11, dated 20 January, 1945, transmitting an explanation submitted by Major G.W. Manifold with regard to the issue of Movement of Civilian Passes in a manner not in accordance with the instructions laid down in Executive Memorandum No 77.

2. The explanation submitted by Major Manifold cannot be accepted, and he will be instructed that passes will not be issued by him except in accordance with current instructions, which are sufficiently flexible to meet even the most urgent cases.

3. The restrictions relating to the control of movement are imposed by higher authority, and unilateral action by local officers will not be permitted.

4. Any difficulties which exist with regard to civilian movement into the Army Zone could possibly be smoothed out in consultation with S.C.A.P.O., AMG, Eight Army. Any suggestions for improving the control should be submitted for consideration to this Headquarters.

5. A further case of the improper issue of a pass by Major G.W. Manifold to CAMBERINI Livio and CAMBERINI Guido has come to notice. The pass in question, No 453191, is attached. It will be observed that :-

(a) the pass is issued in respect of two persons instead of a separate pass to each person;

(b) full address not shown;

(c) only one identity card number shown

(d) the pass purports to authorise travel into the

Army Zone, for which approval was not obtained from S.C.A.O., AND, Eight Army.

(e) the mark deleting "and return" has been erased. This erasure was apparently arranged with the issuing clerk through a sig. LOVCO.

(f) Authority to cross the Army Control Line deleted although authority given for travel to Forli'

(g) signature of holders not shown.

6. Pass No 452824 was issued to Livio Gamberini for travel from Ancone to Reno on 22 December, 1944. The pass was current until 31 December, 1944.

7. Major Bamford will be requested to submit his comments with regard to the issue of the two passes referred to in paragraphs 5 and 6. The date on which Major Bamford is instructed as in paragraph 2 will be reported to this Headquarters.

1. Reference is made to the issue of movement of Civilians Pass No. 277615 on the 11 January, 1945, at Naples by Capt. J. Whyte, Z. P.S.O., Naples Zone.

2. This pass was issued to Lucio Schioppa, Luigi Calise and Fiorillo Mario, and authorised their travel from Naples to Florence and Prato, and return, to enable them "to collect clothing necessary for the Neapolitan population".

3. This pass was issued without the prior approval of the S.O.A.O., A.M.G. Fifth Army; moreover, only one identity card number is shown on the pass and no addresses are given apart from "Naples".

4. Transmitted herewith are copies of three letters signed by Capt. Whyte as follows :-

(a) NZ/PS/86 dated 11 January, 1945, authorising Lucio Schioppa to transport woollens and silks.

(b) NZ/PS/86 dated 11 January, 1945, instructing Schioppa to report to the Public Safety Officer on arrival in Florence.

(c) - dated 16 January, 1945, certifying that Schioppa was granted 76 gallons of petrol by A.G. Naples.

5. Capt. Whyte will be instructed to submit a full report of the circumstances leading up to the issue of the pass referred to in paragraph 1 and the letters referred to in paragraph 4.

6. In particular, he will explain why the necessary permission from A.M.C. Fifth Army was not obtained especially in view of the apparent lack of urgency about the matter.

7. The articles listed in the letter at para. 4 (a) such as silks do not appear to be articles that are "solely needed", and as these goods are frozen by the Resources Board, Capt Whyte will explain why clearance was not obtained before the journey was made.

8. It is reported that when the persons to whom the pass ~~were~~ issued were asked to show the money they had to make the purchases, they admitted they had none.

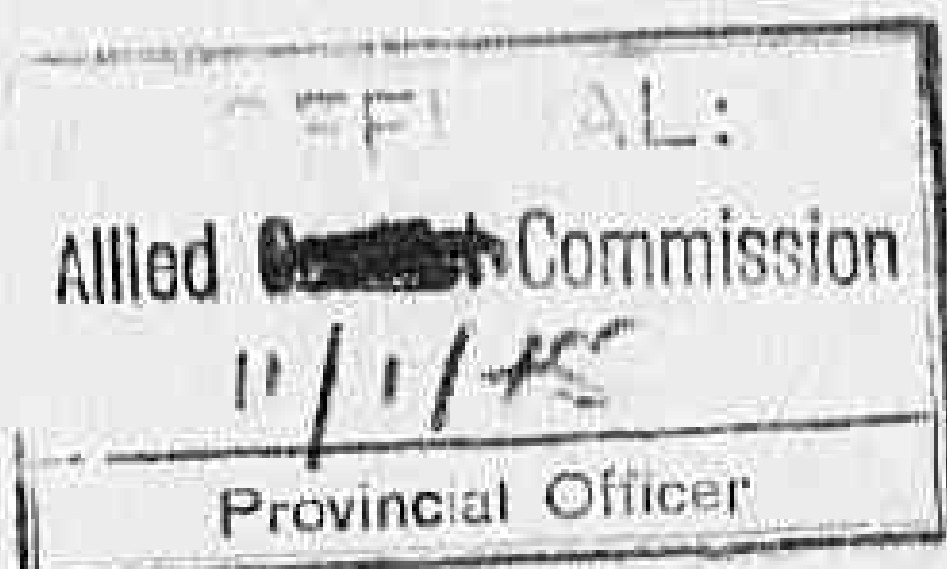

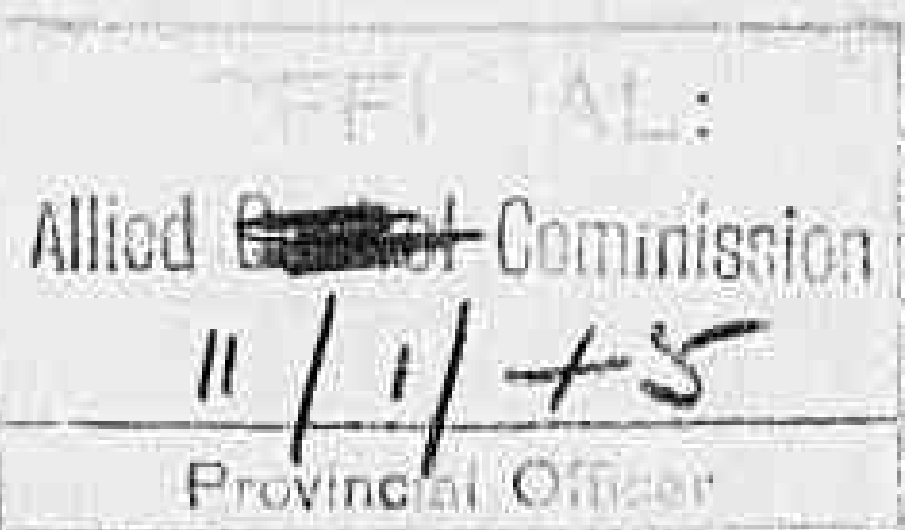

On 11th November, 1944, I was called to Rome from Florence to see G.I (British) at AC Headquarters, in connection with duty.

Just before leaving, I saw the O.C., British Detachment of AC, whom I know well; and this Officer, cognisant of the fact that I was the SCAPO of Florence, asked me about the restriction of civilian movement in that area, as he wished to send someone to Lucca.

I explained the position, and he then called into the office a gentleman who spoke good English and who gave the name of FILO DELLA TORRE, Vittoria. I was told that this man was to visit Lucca as soon as a permit was available for the purpose, and I was asked to expedite this document. I understood at the time that the applicant was an employee of that Office, and that his journey to Lucca was part of his duties.

I told the officer in question that I would ascertain the position as soon as I returned to Siena (to which Province I had just previously been transferred), and if there was no objection to the journey, I would send back the Pass from Siena, so as to save the normal wait of seven or eight days required by ordinary application.

Subsequently at Siena, I telephoned my late office at Florence and ascertained from my ex-secretary that there was no change in the procedure and I informed that office I was about to issue a Pass for Lucca, under the same conditions. Having previously issued some 10,000 Passes whilst SCAPO of Florence, I had been the authority for that area.

On the same day, a Pass was prepared and

1. Reference is made to the attached pass, No. 85197.
2. On the arrival of the Rome Courier on 4th instant, one of the passengers was FILO DELLA TORRE Vittorio, Via Lisbona No. 9, Rome, Identity Card No. 8384.
3. He asked that he be given travel facilities to Lucca whereupon his pass was examined. This showed that while the pass was from Rome to Lucca and return, it had been issued at Siena on 29th November, 1944, and was available until 20th December, 1944.
4. On being questioned he stated that he wished to go to Lucca to see his wife who was ill, and not on A.C. business as stated on the pass.
5. There is no record of any permission having been asked or granted for this journey by A.M.G. Fifth Army.
6. FILO stated that he was employed as an interpreter at A.C. H.Q.
7. The pass was impounded and enclosed herewith for such enquiry as is necessary. FILO was issued with a new pass for the single journey to Rome and returned by courier today.
8. The courier's trip ticket was examined and FILO's name appeared thereon.

 - (b) No. 306893. Pass made out for FABULANO in ANCONA Province and return from 4 OCT to 5 NOV 44, for "motivi servizio", no holders signature, no endorsement to carry goods.
 - (c) No. 305852. See (b).
 - (d) No. 305775. Pass made out for FABULANO in ANCONA Province and return from 5 OCT to 30 NOV 44. Purpose illegible, no holders signature, no endorsement to carry goods.
 - (e) No. 307329. Pass made out for MONTANO di VICA, PARUGLIA and return from 7 OCT to 15 NOV 44. Purpose "health", no signature of holder, no endorsement to carry goods. Arrested at FABULANO.
3. All the above were allowed to proceed in the vehicle (after removal of goods which they were not allowed to carry) in view of the letter produced by MR3. FABULANO which asked why she was carrying 20 quintals of grain, some chickens, eggs and potatoes.
4. The letter in a Telegram violation on the part of an AG officer of 141/403 instructions in that it authorizes the purchase for officers issued of blocked products "oil, eggs, flour etc." Incidentally the letter was in the hands of MR3 FABULANO and neither of the persons mentioned in it was in

4. The letter is a flagrant violation on the part of an ACO officer of AAT/ACC instructions in that it authorizes the purchase for officers' needs of blocked products "oil, eggs, flour etc." Incidentally the letter was in the hands of MRS. FRAELIA and neither of the persons mentioned in it was in the party.

5. It would seem probable that this "carte blanche" to purchase rationed food stuffs practically anywhere in occupied Italy passes from hand to hand. Anyone getting a pass for any reason (the reasons given on the passes have nothing to do with buying food) can borrow or hire the letter for a day or so and carry on a lucrative black market business in safety.

6. Any time in the future be informed of the measures taken to prevent a recurrence of this incident. The original certificate signed by Major SOGGIANO has been retained here to prevent any further unauthorized persons getting hold of it.
