On the 2th instant, at 22hrs., in Mangione (Perugia), about ten allied soldiers, half drunk, rushed into the communal theatre during a dramatic performance, annoying the actors and provoking resentment among the public. In that circumstance spectators and soldiers started to fight each other; the show has been interrupted.

Soon afterwards, four soldiers having left the theatre, entered into the barber shop of Leggerini Colindo, from Mangione, carrying away 12 razors, two scissors, two shaving brushes, and four clippers.

Those soldiers, belong to a company of Genio Guastatori, which has stopped near the railway of Mangione, leaving for Arezzo the following day 3th April.

On the 6th instant, at 13 hrs; in via Flaminia, near the factory "Sintetic Gum", an allied truck n: 5614247, of the 48th Vehicle Coy Rome, for Sapienza, driven by a militarized civilian Caliceia Guido, belonging to the auto-column n: 10 at the service of Lt. Hon. bound for the North, ran over the Carabinieri Casali Imerio, class 1918, of the Parni station an in temporary service to the Parni station, who was going with bicycle in the opposite direction.

The military, seriously wounded, has been immediately taken into the hospital, with reserved diagnosis.

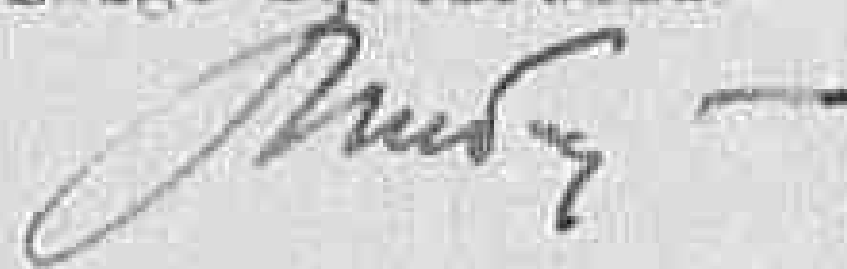

If not, perhaps the location of the unit possessing the vehicle could be traced. The case of Pte Jackson R.C.A.S.C. may be genuine, but the practice of stepping R.C.T.O. vehicles should cease.

It has been reported by the driver of A.C. 1½ ton Chevrolet truck Number V Region 332 of this truck pool that whilst unloading grain at Villa S. Maria at 15,35 hr, on 12th December an army truck contains two British Soldiers, stopped. The two Soldiers alighted and adopting a threatening attitude approached the Italian driver and demanded petrol, they then siphoned with a piece of tubing a can full of petrol from his tank. The statement signed by the driver is held in this office with a witnesses signature appended.

Herewith particulars of W.D. VEHICLES

4737076 Dodge

May it be pointed out that this truck pool operates on a civilian basis and petrol is not only paid for from C.I.P. but is rationed.

Also yesterday the driver of truck No. 372 of this pool returned and handed in a note on the back of this trip ticket which reads as follows:

"Dear Sir,
I am on my way to Fano and I have run out of petrol. So I have asked this Italian driver to help me out and I have a four gallon can from his."

As you are no doubt aware it is no uncommon occurrence for Italian drivers, to sell petrol, and unless this practice of Allied troops stealing petrol is stopped it is exceedingly difficult to check.

During the afternoon of 22nd inst., an American Officer, Capt. HUGHES, telephoned me from AVEZZANO to say he had intercepted two American soldiers (negroes) in possession of a military vehicle, when they were attempting to steal petrol. The negroes were armed and got away. Capt. HUGHES requested the services of Military Police. I sent for the District C.M.P. from PESCARA and they arrived on the morning of the 23rd inst.

In the meantime the negroes were traced at TRASACCO, and Capt. HUGHES was informed. He went to the house where the negroes were staying, called upon them to surrender and they refused and discharged firearms. They were thereupon shot by Capt. HUGHES and an Allied soldier he had taken with him. Both negroes later died. When the British C.M.P. arrived, Capt. HUGHES declined their assistance as he considers the matter entirely for American M.P.s. I therefore sent a telephone message to Allied Area Command in ROME and they sent personnel to deal with the case. The incident although involving an Allied Commission Officer is not a Civil Affairs matter and the foregoing is for your information only.

With reference to your letter AC/14650/5/PS, dated 7th November 1944.

The incidents referred to are some of a large number carried out by Greeks and to a lesser extent Negro American troops.

The matter recently became extremely serious and necessitated military patrols in Campobasso; from exits in the area, to prevent the Greeks carrying out armed robberies etc which has openly stated were reprisals against the Italians for atrocities committed during the occupation of Greece.

The situation has now improved to a very great extent; as all the Greek troops have left the area.

The military commanders have been kept fully informed as to the position both by this Office and Town Major Farnoli.

There is an American military police detachment in Farnoli; who, now that the Greeks have gone will be able to fully cope with the situation as regards their disarmed troops.

Corso Umberto 1° - Pescara.

On the 9 inst., at or about 1730 hrs, at Corso Umberto 1° Pescara, near Caffè D'Alessandro, an Allied vehicle, stopping, hit the bicycle of one FORLANI Aldo, which was standing there, and damaged it.

At the remonstrance of the owner who intended to be reimbursed for the damages, the driver, Cdn. F.S.S. C.S.M. Sullivan, on rest at this town, apparently drunk, replied: "Mussolini pays". This reply caused the indignation of the by-standers. The C.S.M. preoccupied of what could consequently happen, even because a young man, not yet individuated, gave him a punch, jumped again into his car and because he couldn't drive frontwards he drove backwards and ran over one BROE Guido di Ugo, age 31, born at Città S. Angelo, living at Corso V. Emanuele 26, who was found with a wide wound at the left knee and with the head of the thigh-bone displaced, a rent contused wound at the forehead and abrasions all over the body, received at the hospital with reserved prognosis; then said C.S.M. went frontwards with the vehicle and towards Corso Umberto 1°, there, while taking Via Nicola Fabrizzi with excessive speed, went with the right wheels on the sidewalk and ran over one BECA Neo Bruno fu Enrico, born on the 21/1/1903 at Pescara, and living at the same place in Via del Porto 24, who was found with a rent contused wound at the skull and various contusions all over the body, considered healable within 20 days, except complications.

Subject : Campomarino and Termoli (Campobasso) -
Violations by Allied soldiers.

To : A.C. Public Safety Sub-Commission - Rome.

On last October 11th, at about 14 hrs., four Greek soldiers fired several pistol shots against a flock of sheep, killing one and wounding others.

The killed sheep was taken away by them.

The shepherd, certain Paolo Vocale, who had protested was also fired against, but with no consequence.

On the 12th of last October, at about 20,30 hrs., two negro soldiers attempted to rape some women, who were in the waiting-room of the railway station.

Some white Allied soldiers intervened with arms in hand, so as to keep away the negroes; but one of them unwillingly fired a rifle shot, perhaps a grape shot, lightly hurting 4 persons, among whom Lt. Saverio Sanges, commander of the 249^a Nucleo anti-parachutes, stationed at S. Severo (Foggia).

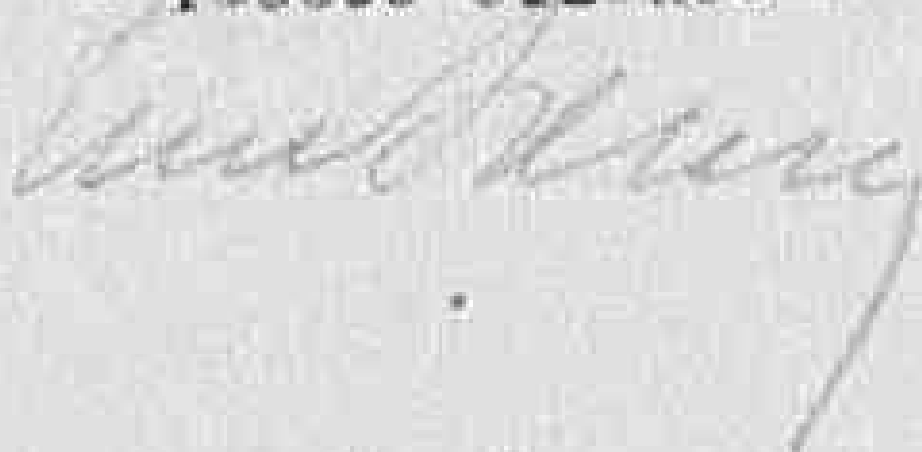

In Tolentino (Macerata) il 21 ottobre scorso, verso le ore 18,30, una trentina di militari inglesi, della divisione "Gatto", ubriachi, altercarono violentemente nel caffè "Alessandrini". Alcuni civili, intervenuti per calmare gli animi, e lo stesso proprietario del locale riportarono delle contusioni. L'Arma, poco dopo, riuscì a ristabilire l'ordine.

Verso le 20,30 del medesimo giorno, altri quaranta militari, probabilmente della stessa divisione, anch'essi ubriachi, armati di baionette, si diedero a commettere atti vandalici in una gioielleria e in un tiro a segno, situati nella piazza del Mercato, e a percuotere il personale. Rimase ferito due persone. La popolazione fu presa dal panico.

I carabinieri, giunti sul posto quando già i disturbatori si erano allontanati, s'imbattono in un nuovo gruppo di militari britannici, ebbene pure questi ultimi, i quali minacciarono ulteriori disordini.

Il brigadiere, che comandava i carabinieri, tentò di placarli; ma presto si vide circondato con tutti i suoi dipendenti. Anzi un sottufficiale britannico lo afferrò per il collo, spalleggiato da alcuni soldati, allo scopo di disarmarlo.

Fu costretto quindi a sparare quattro colpi di pistola, di cui non ancora si conoscono le conseguenze, perché i militari britannici, a questa reazione, si allontanarono subito e ripartirono da Tolentino a bordo di automezzi.

To day, at about 11 o'clock, while some people who had taken part in a communist meeting led by H.E. Guido Monicelli Under-Secretary of the Industry were coming out from the theater going to Piazza Vittorio Emanuele, passing before the Polish Command, some Polish soldiers who were in the neighbourhoods, rushed at a member of the party trying to snatch from him the communist flag which the a/m person was carrying under his arm. As this fellow and another companion called Maurizi Alberto resisted the Polish soldier, the same fired with his pistol against the Maurizi, wounding him at the chest. The wounded man has been immediately transferred to the hospital for a serious examination. Order has been re-established by the Authorities but the people in town is still excited. Proper measures have been taken in order to avoid the repeating of accidents of that kind.

In Fermo (Ascoli Piceno) the 17th instant towards 11 o'clock while those participating a reunion of the communist party held by the under secretary of Industry and Commerce S.E. Guido Molinelli gone out of the local theater were going towards the Piazza Vittorio Emanuele, passing in front of the premises occupied by the Polish Command some Polish soldiers who paused in those vicinities, intervened to take away from the hands of an associate the communist flag. To win the vivid resistance opposed by the communist and of a certain Maurizio Alberto, a Polish soldier exploded a pistol shot against the latter hitting him mid chest left. The wounded was taken sheltered in the local hospital with reserved prognosis.

By intervention of the authorities order was immediately reestablished. The population however is still excited

In Fermo (Ascoli Piceno), il 17 corrente, verso le ore 11, mentre i partecipanti ad una riunione del partito comunista tenuta dal sottosegretario all'Industria e Commercio, S.E. Guido MOLINELLI, usciti dal teatro locale si avviavano verso la Piazza Vittorio Emanuele, passando davanti i locali occupati dal Comando Polacco, alcuni militari polacchi, che sostavano in quei pressi, intervenivano per togliere dalle mani di un associato la bandiera comunista. Discipline - Town of JESI

1. AMG offr, JESI complains that he has no CMP in town to enforce discipline among tps.

2. It is forbidden for Italian MP to make use of arms against Allied tps (ref below). Therefore CIL leaves discipline entirely to the civil authority in towns where Allied tps are present.

3. That local Carabinieri are unable to cope with the situation is shown by a recent instance. AMG had a Polish CMP soldier put in prison until he could be picked up by POLISH CMP. The consequence was that other Polish tps, all armed, broke into the prison and released the man. The Carabinieri of course made no resistance against the threat of arms.

4. A Military Brothel (str 3) has been opened here (closed this a.m.) and, though it is supposed to be out of bounds to all but Italian tps, I am informed that Poles are bidding to establish a priority. The town should be put out of bounds to Polish tps except on duty, especially as they arrest Italians not on duty or on pass in their area. But there is no authority to enforce such a measure.

5. The presence of two British CMP would suffice to put the situation right.

1. Herewith is a translation of a report received from the Commanding General of the Carabinieri Regali regarding alleged serious criminal offences committed by French Moroccan troops against inhabitants of certain communes in the province of Frosinone.

2. Particular attention is invited to the number of rape cases committed during a period of three days.

3. It is requested that the strongest representations be made to HQ AAI to take decisive and salutary measures to prevent such wholesale violations of decency and the rules of war being visited upon the helpless people of the country.

The territory of Tressinone province, on the right side of the river Sacco, was occupied from June 2nd to June 5th by French Moroccan troops who, on the 13th inst, moved northward following the enemy's retreat.

During the short time the Moroccan units were encamped in said territory they infuriated the local population by terrorizing them. Numerous women and minor girls of the Communes of Giuliano di Roma, Patricia, Ceccone, Cupino, Marola and Sargola were criminally violated by soldiers who often compelled the girl's parents or the women's husbands to assist in committing their crimes.

Handless civilians were robbed by the same Moroccans of watches and jewels or of their sheep, lambs, goats, poultry etc. Their houses were ransacked and some of them set on fire.

From 2nd June to June 5th said French troops have committed in said territory the following crimes.

- 1) Carnal violence No.....396
- 2) Homicides No.....13
- 3) Robberies No.....250
- 4) Larcenies No.....303

Three carnal violences were committed against men, while the others against women aged 12 to 60 years.

The populations are in miserable financial conditions as they were robbed of most of their belongings and also because to avoid the soldiers' violent acts, they fled from the country and took shelter in towns to the prejudice of the corn crop which was already damaged by the war. The alarmed population are awaiting the Allied intervention.

It would be advisable, therefore, that the Anglo-American authorities should make thorough investigations and swiftly provide to alleviate the serious miserable condition of said people who confidently rely on the Allied good will and comprehension.

Il territorio della provincia di Frosinone, situato alla destra del fiume Sacco, dal giorno 2 al 5 giugno c.a. venne occupato da truppe francesi marocchine, che, il 13 corrente, si trasferirono più a Nord, per proseguire l'inseguimento del nemico in ritirata.

Durante il breve periodo in cui reparti marocchini rimasero accampati nel territorio suddetto, infierirono contro quelle popolazioni, terrorizzandole. Innumerevoli donne e ragazze minorenni dei comuni di Giuliano di Roma, Patrica, Gaccano, Supino, Morolo e Sgurgola vennero violentate da più marocchini, che, costrinsero spesso volte i genitori delle fanciulle ed i mariti delle spose ad assistere a tanto scempio. Sempre ad opera di soldati marocchini, vennero rapinati innumerevoli cittadini dei loro averi, di orologi e gioielli, e derubati di gran parte del loro bestiame - agnelli, pecore, capre e polli - e, saccheggiate le loro abitazioni, alcune delle quali anche incendiate.

Dal 2 al 5 giugno c.a. tali truppe francesi hanno precisamente consumato in detto territorio, i seguenti delitti:

1°)-violenze carnali.....	n°396
2°)-omicidi.....	" 13
3°)-rapine.....	" 250
4°)-furti.....	" 303.

Tre delle violenze carnali sono state commesse in persona di uomini, mentre le altre nei confronti di donne di età oscillante tra i 12 ed i 66 anni.

Le popolazioni, che allarmate attendono l'intervento delle autorità alleate, versano in stato di vera indigenza per essere state depredate di gran parte dei loro averi, e principalmente perchè, donne ed uomini, per sfuggire a violenze e sevizie, sono stati costretti a rifugiarsi nei centri abitati, abbandonando la campagna, con grave pregiudizio per il prossimo raccolto granario, già fortemente compromesso per eventi bellici.

Sarebbe bene pertanto che le autorità anglo-americane approfondissero le indagini ed ove lo ritenessero opportuno, provvedessero ad alleviare il grave stato di miseria e di apprensione delle ripetute popolazioni, che tanto confidano sulla loro bontà e comprensione.
