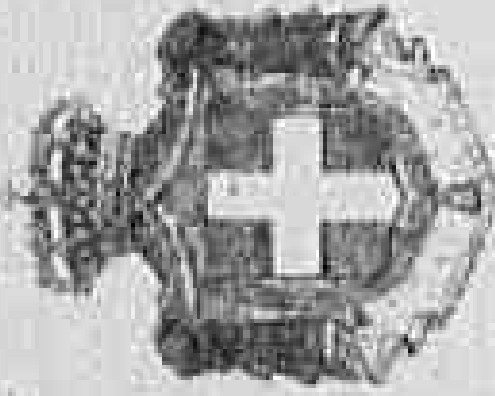

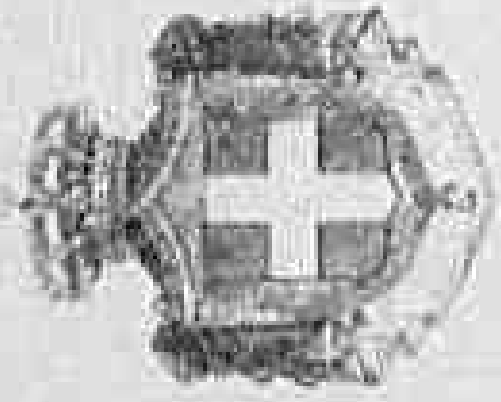

SUBJECT: Repaired Army Clothing

TO: Ministry of Industry, Commerce, and Labor

1. For several months the Commerce Sub-Commission has been repairing and dyeing salvaged army clothing and distributing it under terms of a priority schedule laid down by the A.C. Priorities Board. For the past three months the schedule has been as follows:

A. 60% of all clothing which became available was allocated to eight (8) Allied agencies employing civilian labor. This clothing is divided among the agencies in exactly the same proportions as the number of workers of each individual agency bears to the total number of workers employed by all the agencies. For example, the Directorate of Labor (B) supervises the employment of 44% of all civilian employees of the 8 important Allied agencies mentioned above, therefore it receives 44% of all the clothing which becomes available to this category. These 8 Allied agencies are:

Directorate of Labor (B)
Military Railway Service
Peninsular Base Section
Navy Sub-Commission, for Royal & U.S. Navies
American Army Air Force
5th Army
Atlantic Depot
Royal Air Force

B. 28% of all clothing which became available was consigned to the Civil Affairs Section A.C. and was divided among Displaced Persons Sub-Commission, Public Safety Sub-Commission and the Patriots Branch, according to their needs.

C. 12% of all clothing which became available was consigned to the Economic Section and was divided among the following three Sub-Commissions: Communications, Public Works & Utilities, and Transportation (for dock, port and warehouse workers).

2. In the three months of operation it was found that several other groups of workers deserved clothing allocations, particularly the miners and certain agricultural workers. Further, it was realized that in certain areas it was becoming very difficult for Allied officers to undertake the work of distribution, especially in areas now under the authority of the Italian Government.

3. Therefore, at the meeting of the AD Priorities Board of 20 March it was agreed that the new schedule of allocations should be as follows:

A. 60% to the heavy outdoor workers of Allied agencies must remain unchanged as these employees are making a most valuable contribution to the war effort.

B. 19% would be allocated to the Civil Affairs Section to be divided between Displaced Persons Sub-Commission and the Patriots Branch.

C. 25% would be allocated to the Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labor which will make further distribution.

4. This 25% of all available clothing will be immediately collected by the Ufficio Provinciale dell'Industria e del Commercio in Naples and warehoused by it until allocations are made by the Ministry.

5. 25% of the repaired army shoes reprocessed under the supervision of the U.S.I.C. will also be made available to the Ministry for allocation.

6. Financial arrangements regarding payment by workers or agencies receiving clothing and boots through the Ministry of Industry, Commerce, and Labor, will be made by that Ministry. 6614

7. This office will make clothing and shoes available only to units of the Allied Armed Forces employing civilian labor, Displaced Persons Sub-Commission and Patriots Branch. All demands for repaired clothing and boots originating from other than these units and received by this office, in the future will be forwarded to the Ministry.

8. Thus in the future ministries of the government will bid for repaired clothing and shoes for workers or groups under their supervision and not the corresponding AD Sub-Commissions as in the past.

9. The distribution of this clothing and these shoes (the 25%) will be made at the discretion of the Ministry, but it is suggested that the Ministry set up a priorities schedule which will at least make provision for certain essential groups which the experience of this office has shown as deserving of regular allocation. Such groups would be as follows:

- A.- Public Safety Agents - Guardia di Finanza, Vigili Fuoco, etc.
- B.- Communications Workers
- C.- Public Works and Utilities employees
- D.- Transportation Workers - employees in ports, warehouses, docks, etc.
- E.- Miners - particularly those of the Sardinian coal mines and the Sicilian sulphur mines.

10. This Sub-Commission would very much appreciate having the Ministry forward to it a monthly report of allocations made in order that a continuous record may be kept of all repaired army clothing and shoes distributed to civilians and agencies employing civilians in Italy.

Public Safety S/C ✓

1. Under existing arrangements salvaged Allied Army shoes are procured by Allied Commission, and released to Ufficio Provinciale del Commercio e dell'Industria by the AC Commerce Officer of Southern Region.

2. Ufficio Provinciale del Commercio e dell'Industria or their representative when taking delivery of shoes from MIA or any salvage depot (whether British or American) will give the AC Commerce Officer a receiving report showing the number of pairs of salvage shoes received.

3. The Commerce Officer will compare the quantity shown in the receiving report with the corresponding amount shown by MIA or on the shipping ticket or issue voucher of the US or British salvage depot, to insure that full accountability is rendered for all such issues.

4. Ufficio Provinciale will not be required to make payment in lire to the AC Commerce Officer. Salvaged shoes are received by the Ufficio Provinciale on behalf of the Italian Government who will be charged in the final settlement in dollars or sterling at a predetermined scale for the salvage value.

5. Salvaged shoes when repaired will be sold by Ufficio Provinciale at prices established by the Allied Commission, notice of which will be sent to the AC Commerce Officer by the Commerce Sub-Commission.

6. On sales of repaired shoes made by Ufficio Provinciale, payment will be effected into the Banca d'Italia Account No 808 for immediate transfer to Via Nazionale Branch of Banca d'Italia Rome, for credit to Istituto Nazionale per il Commercio Estero (ICE), as accountable agent for the Italian Government.

7. Allied Army units, other than Allied Commission units hereinafter covered in par 8, may receive repaired

1. Under existing arrangements salvaged Allied Army shoes are procured by Allied Commission, and released to Ufficio Provinciale del Commercio e dell'Industria by the AC Commerce Officer of Southern Region.
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7. Allied Army units, other than Allied Commission units hereinafter covered in par 8, may receive repaired shoes from Ufficio Provinciale and distribute such shoes under allocations made for workmen on their activities. In all such cases the officers of the Allied Army units concerned will effect the necessary arrangements with Ufficio Provinciale for delivery of shoes, collection from the recipients, and payment of the proceeds as arranged with Ufficio Provinciale.
8. Certain officers of the Allied Commission, upon proper authorization from AC may make free issues. This applies only to issues to refugees, displaced persons, internees, patriots, and similar beneficiaries (which the Allied Commission records as distributed free on account of the Italian Government). In all such cases the responsible officer will give Ufficio Provinciale a receiving report acknowledging the quantity received, but will not be required to make any payment thereon, since such shoes will be issued free to the beneficiaries.

9. Ufficio Provinciale in the settlement of accounts with ICE will take credit for such issues to the end that the accounting will be only for the net number of pairs of shoes on which actual sales are made.

10. AC Commerce Officer will render a monthly report to the Regional Supply Accountant of Southern Region (or elsewhere as directed by the Chief Accountant) showing as under existing procedure:
(a) Number of shoes received by classes from: (1) US Army and (2) British Army, or (3) MIA; and (b) number of shoes turned over to Ufficio Provinciale.

1. Under existing arrangements salvaged army garments are being repaired and dyed in the Naples area under the supervision of the Allied Commission.
2. The purpose of this memorandum is to establish uniform procedure for the receipt, distribution, and accounting for garments allocated to Allied Army units.

3. Allied Army units receiving allocations from the AC Priorities Board will arrange with the AC Commerce Officer of Southern Region at Naples as to the time, place, and manner the garments will be turned over to them.

4. The receiving Army unit will give the Commerce Officer of Southern Region a receiving report which shall show the name of the Army unit, the specific type of garment, the number, the price, and the value.

5. The receiving report will be prepared and signed in quadruplicate by the Officer or his designee taking the goods. AC Commerce Officer will distribute the copies as follows:

- a) Retain original,
- b) Deliver first copy to the officer or his designee taking the goods,
- c) Forward second copy to the Regional Supply Accountant of Southern Region (or as otherwise directed by the Chief Accountant), and
- d) Forward third copy to the Commerce Sub-Commission,

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2. The purpose of this memorandum is to establish uniform procedure for the receipt, distribution, and accounting for garments allocated to Allied Army units.

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- b) Deliver first copy to the officer or his designee taking the goods,
- c) Forward second copy to the Regional Supply Accountant of Southern Region (or as otherwise directed by the Chief Accountant), and 5599
- d) Forward third copy to the Commerce Sub-Commission,

AC.

6. AC Commerce Officer will not require payment in advance for the garments, but will maintain accounts receivable for all amounts due to be paid by each Allied Army unit showing the respective Allied Officer signing for such garments.

7. The account for each Army unit and officer shall be charged with the value in lire of the garments as shown on the receiving report, and shall be credited with payments made to the AC Commerce Officer, Southern Region.

8. Prices to be charged in the field for the garments will be in accordance with the scale of prices which will be notified to the AC Commerce Officer by the Commerce Sub-Commission, and which will be the same prices as shown on the receiving reports.

9. Payment will be made to the AC Commerce Officer Southern Region and will not be paid into accounts in the name of the Allied Financial Agency with local banks. Where convenient payment will be made in cash (which will generally apply to Naples and vicinity). Where not convenient funds should be remitted through ordinary army financial channels but if this is impracticable or inconvenient they may be remitted by an ordinary vaglia bancario, or cambiale; or by assegno circolare drawn in favour of AC Commerce Officer Southern Region; all these may be obtained at any bank.

10. All garments should be distributed within 30 days after release by AC Commerce Officer. It is not required that the Allied Officer distributing the garments shall make payment to the AC Commerce Officer as each collection is effected in the field. If small he may accumulate such collections and make semi-monthly remittances on the 15th and on the last day of the month.

11. Attention is invited to the requirement that Allied Officers in the field are not authorized to release garments on credit to consignees. Collections must be made by them at the time the garments are sold. Each Allied Officer receiving garments for resale will be held responsible to make payments to the AC Commerce Officer.

12. Certain officers of the Allied Commission, however upon proper authorization by AC may make free issues of garments. This applies only to clothing issued to refugees, displaced persons, internees and similar beneficiaries (which the Allied Commission records as distributed free on account of Italian Government.) In such cases the receiving report given the AC Commerce Officer will be marked "FREE ISSUE", and show the purpose, and name of the AC organization making the distribution.

13. The AC Commerce Officer shall render a monthly report to the Regional Supply Accountant of Southern Region, (or as otherwise directed by the Chief Accountant) showing (as under existing procedure).

Security Police, Fire Brigades, and Finance Guards are not included, as they are not military organizations in the above sense of the term. Their functions are essentially civilian in character and the control is maintained through the Allied Control Commission."

2. This paragraph states clearly that the Finance Guards are not included under the term "bona fide members of the Italian armed forces".

3. Under these circumstances the two directives HQ A.C. M.H. I.A.C. Section letter 360/11/CA dated 10 Aug 1944 and AFHQ letter AG/S of 4 Oct. 1944 do not apply to the Finance Guards.

The section is known as the Captured Enemy Material Section - is an integrated section consisting of American and British officers.

The Captured Enemy Material Section receives all demands for allocations of captured enemy material and processes such demands to (C-3) (Org) for allocation instructions.

"Cases have occurred (particularly in Rome and other newly occupied localities) where property, transport and materials belonging to the Italian Forces have been removed from them without proper authority and when the operational need for such action no longer existed."

"In future no buildings, real estate, transportation or other materials belonging to the Italian Armed Forces, or in the possession of effective units of the Italian Navy, Army or Air Force, will be occupied, requisitioned, seized or made use without prior reference to this H.Q."

"The Italian Commanders concerned have been authorized to place notices on their property indicating its ownership. These notices will be respected." 5 A.

3. Every assistance should be given to the Italian Armed Forces in their efforts to maintain themselves by the salvaging and collecting into Depots of war material scattered throughout the country. 6574

4. When ownership of any material is in dispute the matter will immediately be referred to this HQ for investigation and final decision.

Provincial Commissioner, Foggia Province.
S.C.A.Os 5 & 8 Armies.

1. Permission has, in certain cases, been granted by Regions, to civilians to collect material such as motor vehicles, etc., which have been abandoned at the roadside, or which have been partly destroyed in action or otherwise.

2. Your attention is drawn to AFHQ circular No. 13, dated 1 May 1944, relevant extracts of which are attached, which clearly states that all enemy material will only be disposed of on instructions of Captured Enemy Material Section, AFHQ.

3. All Italian material belonging to all arms and services of the Italian Ground Forces is reserved for use of the Italian Army.

4. The War Material Disposal Sub-Commission directs the disposal of war material and will be responsible for the granting of permits to move or recover such material not collected by the Armed Forces for operational purposes.

5. Particulars of all cases where permits have been granted by Regions or SCAOs Armies to individuals, giving permission to collect or move any material will be reported to this H.Q. so that a decision may be given as to the validity of any permit which may have been issued.

Extracts from AFHQ Circular Number 13 dated 1 May, 1944.

The following prescribe the general procedure to be followed in the allocation and assignment of serviceable and repairable captured enemy material.

"All equipment, stores, supplies, previously belonging to all arms and services of the Ground Forces of the enemy.

The responsibility for the assignment of serviceable and repairable captured enemy material and the maintenance of necessary records pertaining to such material and supplies is placed upon a special staff - Sub-Section of the Quartermaster Section of AFHQ. The Section is known as the Captured Enemy Material Section - is an integrated section consisting of American and British Officers.

The Captured Enemy Material Section receives all demands for allocations of captured enemy material and processes such demands to G-3 (Org) for allocation instructions."

 Explosives
 Fire Control Instruments and accessories
 Mine Flares removed from captured equipment
 Optical Instruments and accessories
 Firearms
 Articles whose combined length and girth is more than five feet,
 or of a weight in excess of twenty pounds.
