SUBJECT: Civil Government employees (AMG), Caltanissetta, Sicily,  
record check of.

TO : CIC Section, I.B.S., APO 550, U.S. Army

1. There is enclosed a list of civil government employees at Caltanissetta, Sicily. This list was submitted to this office by the C.A.P.O., Caltanissetta Province, for a check against the Fascist files in our possession.

2. As the attached check shows, out of 38 names, 3 had no record, and 35 were members of the Fascist Party. Of the 35, all but three had been members of the party since its early inception. Of the 35, fourteen are listed as Squadristas, two are carried as Fascist Lieutenants, and one is listed as a blackshirt. The remaining 18 ranged from chief clerk of the Fascist Party, to Fascist Party inspectors.

3. The C.A.P.O. declared the discharge of these men would be demanded at the next meeting of the Civil Council. Since then however, it appears that some of the men will not be employed, as the council argues they were "too young to know what they were doing when they first joined the party". A check will show that only 14 of the men were under 18, and that of the 14, nine were between 16 and 18. Four were 15, and one was 13 at the time they joined the party. It is to be noted, however, that their continued party activity, which must have been considerable to have achieved the party positions they occupied, evidently is not to be considered in whether they should be employed further in Civil Government jobs.

CRITIQUE OF NATIVE EMPLOYEES OF A&G  
AND MARINE ADMINISTRATIVE PERSONNEL

SECURITY

In the interest of effective security it is imperative that all native personnel employed directly by the Allied Military Government in any capacity, and all technicians and civilians holding civil administrative posts be vetted thoroughly. The following is a guide on the persons to be examined and the procedure to be adopted. Chart 6A is the future:

CONTINUOUS CRITIQUE

- a. Native security - this is of paramount importance and takes precedence over all other classes; a person falling into this category is, broadly speaking, one whose reason of his past or present activities is a threat to the security of friendly operations.
- b. Political activists - where any person who, by reason of his past or present activities and otherwise political views and/or activities is a menace to friendly and/or enemy forces.
- c. General activists - where any person who, by reason of his criminal habits and tendencies, who is suspected of having committed or being about to commit such activities, is deemed a threat to the security and/or freedom of operation of the friendly forces.
- d. NON-UNIFORMED PERSONNEL - the seniority chart in paragraph 4.
- e. Investigations - receipt of this directive will be carried out by C.I.T.C. 1, if available, under the direction of the S.C.C.P.C., who will be responsible to the C.U.A. Such investigations have been officially conducted.
- f. Investigation - the Head of the division concerned shall report to the Director of the division the necessary investigation. 2362

5. **Incident Report:** All sources of information, e.g. to your superior officer, the commandant, a general or chief, regardless of administrative status, will be kept by the Sectoral Police Services, Public Safety Director, who will instruct him to furnish the information concerned.

6. **Case Document:** A copy of all sources of information, e.g. to your superior officer, the commandant, a general or chief, regardless of administrative status, will be kept by the Sectoral Police Services, Public Safety Director, who will instruct him to furnish the information concerned.

1. I think the Administrative Information is altogether too elaborate as is demanded by the requirements in staff to carry it out w/ 3 Officers, 3 E/A's - 2 clerks for one region.
2. In my opinion it should be possible to prepare a form covering all the requirements.
3. Military security can be covered by reference to the present CIC or CID detachment.
4. Political activity can be covered by the completion of the "Scheda Personale" and its ultimate examination by the Security Intelligence Div.
5. This should be done in the case of all AMG personnel and in respect of Italian Officials above a certain grade. To extend it to all State, Provincial and communal employees is a policy of perfection which is, in my opinion, not justified.
6. In the same way criminal records can be checked by Special Police Section #236 and AMG in respect of AMG employees and Italian Officials above a certain grade. Below this grade local inquiries should suffice.

PRESENTATION OF EVIDENCE.

The Officer having authority to appoint or designate personnel will, with a view to securing uniformity and security, adopt the following procedure. In every instance where possible a C.A.P.O. will conduct or supervise the investigation.

(a) Military Security:

- (i) In all cases where it appears that military security is endangered and immediate action is necessary, the officer concerned will take such action as the case demands, after making contact with the military security authorities with the least possible delay.
- (ii) A resume of the case will be forwarded to Public Safety Division for information of H.S.C.O.

(b) Political activity:

- (i) The officer authorized to appoint or dismisses will nominate the officer to undertake the investigation.
- (ii) Military security authorities will not be entitled to make investigations under this heading unless military security is involved.

- (iii) A form "Sched. I Person(s)" will be used in every case under investigation and the following points and proposed procedure are to be borne in mind in respect of this document, a sample of which, together with translation, is attached hereto.

(c) Political activity.

- (iii) A form 'Chosen Personnel' will be used in every case under investigation and the following points and approved procedure are to be borne in mind in respect of this document, a sample of which, together with translation, is attached hereto.

- (b) Supplies of these forms can be obtained on application to Special Police Section, Public Safety Division, Headquarters.

- (d) It is possible that such a document will be required as a court exhibit and if the signature of subject cannot be proven strictly, the value of the document as evidence is nullified therefore the interviewing officer will be present when subject signs and countersign same as witness.

(e) The form, which is agreed to at the end of this circulate, must be ignored. An officer who has been administered by the Interrogation Officer unless he is an attorney or a properly constituted court. If an oath is administered by an unconstituted person this document may become use in law.

(c) Criminal Activity.

(1) The officer authorized to appoint or nominate will nominate the officer to conduct or supervise the investigation -

- (a) If the matter directly concerns one of other of the divisions of S.A.C. Division 1, it will be brought to the notice of Chief, Public Safety Division, who will instruct his office, his division to investigate personally or supervise the investigation of the case.
