It relates not only to current orders etc but also to orders previously and whenever issued.
- 2 50 copies of all Proclamations and General Orders, Regulations and Rules, for the drafting of which this Headquarters was responsible, will be sent forthwith to the Information Division by the Sub-Commission which sponsored the same together with schedules showing areas and dates of enforcement.
- 3 20 copies of all Proclamations, Orders, regulations and judicial or administrative rules (other than those mentioned above) which have been issued in a Region or any Province thereof, showing where and when they have been brought into force, will be forwarded at once by the Region concerned to the Information Division of the Public Relations Branch of this Headquarters.
- 4 All documents sent to the Information Division in accordance with this instruction will be accompanied by descriptive lists showing the quantity of each item forwarded.
- 5 Regions and Sub-Commissions respectively will in future supply the Information Division with the said number of copies of all the above described Documents which may be issued hereafter as the same are issued.
- 6 Archives will as far as they can, supply from the records of closed Regions such copies of orders etc issued in such Regions as may be spare up to the above mentioned maxima.

1. In order to avoid the appearance of introducing into Venezia Giulia current legislation passed by the Italian Government, the policy of implementing Italian Governmental and Ministerial Decrees will not be adopted in this region.

Effective legislation will therefore consist of the Proclamations of the Supreme Allied Commander and Military Governor, supplemented by such Regional or Provincial Orders as may be required.

The General Orders issued by AMG, either before or after the date of this directive will not be put into operation in Venezia Giulia as General Orders, but where applicable should be reissued as Regional Orders.

2. The absence of the Italian legislation leaves certain gaps in the legislation required for the administration of the territory and will necessitate the issue of additional Regional Orders. The following paragraphs of this directive indicate the special subjects upon which such orders are required. Nothing in this directive is intended to prohibit the normal issue of Regional Orders on particular regional problems as and when the need for such orders arises.

3. Agriculture. A Regional Order is required for the amassing of wool to incorporate the provisions of DM dated 21 April 1945 (G.U. No. 49 of 24 April 1945).

It is desirable that the rates of services in operation or to be reintroduced in Venezia Giulia should be in conformity with the rest of Italy, but it would be difficult to reproduce these lengthy decrees in a Regional Order and in any case, a number of the services mentioned therein are not likely to be introduced. A Regional Order should therefore be issued to the effect that Postal and Telecommunications rates, limitations, conditions and indemnities in Venezia Giulia will be in accordance with Bollettini to be issued by the Post Office Provincial Director for Trieste under the authority of AMG. These Bollettini can be printed locally and include relevant extracts from the decrees in respect of services which may from time to time be authorized."

5. Finance. The undermentioned 11 decrees require reissue as Regional Orders. The first eight can conveniently form the subject matter of one Order. It may be necessary at a later stage to reissue a large number of revenue decrees. If so details will be supplied:

6. Food. At a later date it may be necessary to issue regulations for the control of olive oil. It may be desirable at the present time, as and when needed, to have orders to control the manufacture and sale of sweets, the slaughter of animals and the operation of eating houses on the basis of the following decrees:

D.L. No. 99 of 1 Mar 1945 (G.U. No. 41 of 5 April 1945);

Decree of High Commr. for Alimentation of 20 Mar 1945 (G.U. No. 36 of 24 March 1945 p. 367).

7. Lebor. D.L. No. 505 of 6 Dec 1944 (G.U. No. 36 of 24 March 1945) extended Italian Social Insurance to Allied Force Employees. The Italian Government accepted this liability by reason of their armistice obligations to make labour available. A similar arrangement should be made locally and the appropriate Regional Order issued.

8. Legal. The policy of regional autonomy involves the suspension of the right of appeal from the local courts to the Court of Cassation. A Regional Order is required.

9. In drafting Regional Orders in accordance with the above policy, care must be taken to ensure that all references to and duties of Italian Central Governmental bodies are excluded.

MINUTES OF CHIEF OF STAFF'S MEETING - 13 FEBRUARY

1. Minutes of Last Meeting.

Possession of such items without declaration may lawfully be had until further notice of the Allied Military Government.

- b) any vessel of war or any vessel engaged in the transportation of supplies or personnel.

2) Until further notice of the Allied Military Government, no person shall be required to declare the ownership or possession of any camera, telescope binoculars or photographic supplies.

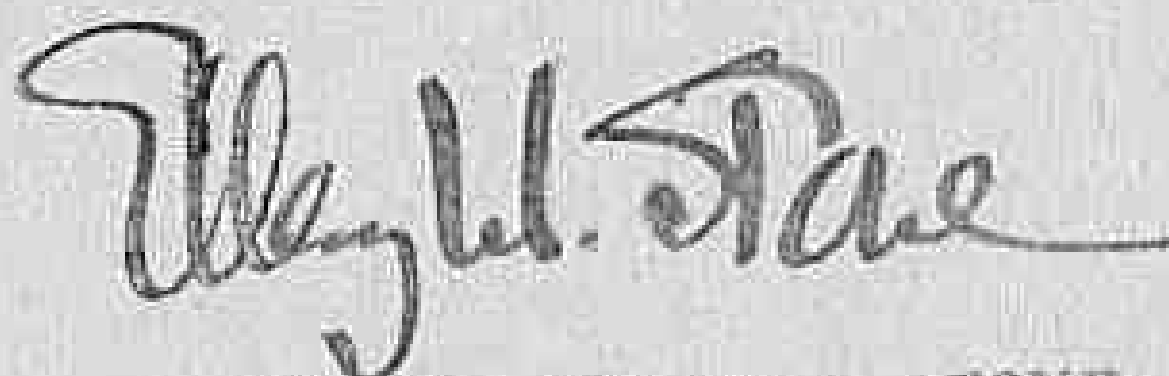

In the course of their war against the Axis powers the Allied Forces under command of the Commander in Chief Allied Armies in Italy are freeing the territory of Italy from German domination.

Much of this territory has already been restored to the jurisdiction of the Italian Government and it is the intention that all territory freed from German domination shall be restored as soon as possible to the jurisdiction of the Italian Government.

This restoration and the complete expulsion of the German Forces from the whole of Italy will be achieved more quickly if you display the same courage, determination and discipline in co-operation with the Allied Forces that you displayed in resistance to the German Forces when they were in occupation.

In order to hasten the date of this restoration and of final victory, steps must be taken to ensure the reconstitution and continuance of the administration of the country which the German Forces have attempted to disrupt and to provide for the safety and welfare of yourselves and of the Allied Forces and to preserve the law and order which are essential to military operations.

For these purposes a Military Government must be established in this territory until it can be restored to the Italian Government. This Military Government will have full control over the administration of this territory and will have power, if necessary, to try in its own Courts any persons who commit offences against any of the special provisions which at this time are essential to the safety of yourselves and of the Allied Forces and for the successful prosecution of the war.

Subject: ANA Proclamations and Orders under A.C.C. regime.

Memo to C. H. S.

It is assumed that the various divisions will comment on the portions of the proclamation and orders with which they are directly concerned. The portion which follows refers directly or indirectly to public safety.

Proclamation No. 2.

Art. I: It is presumed that these Orders will be covered by existing Italian laws or ordinances.

- Art. II: (a) should not be necessary.

The remaining Orders should be submitted under comment by existing Italian laws or ordinances.

Art. III: do covered by the Italian Penal Code.

Art. IV, V, VI, VII: It is presumed that Allied Military Courts, as such, will not operate in territory of the former Italian Empire.

Art. VIII: It is presumed that these portions will not be contained under A.C.C.

Proclamation No. 7.

On the Italian Proclamation with the Anti-Bolshevik by constitution, the renewal of this proclamation should not be necessary. But the Orders specified in Art. I should be submitted in some form or other if not already covered.



Proclamation No. 2.

Art. I. It is proclaimed that these Provisions will be covered by existing Italian laws or ordinances.

Art. II. (24) should not be necessary.

The remaining Provisions should be retained unless covered by existing Italian laws or ordinances.

Art. III. Is covered by the Italian Penal Code.

Art. II, III & IV. It is proclaimed that asked military Courts, no such will not operate in territory of the same that under A.M.A.

Art. III. It is proclaimed that these provisions will not be continued under A.C.R.

Proclamation No. 7.

As the Italian Government with the Anti-Trust by competition, the removal of this proclamation should not be necessary. But the Provisions specified in Art. I should be retained in some form or other if not already covered.

Proclamation No. 8.

The limitation of prices is closely connected with the problems of inflation and the black market. The Italian Government will, I doubt, be really interested in these questions but other interests depend on the relative article or articles of the Administrative Tables, which are not available.

Proclamation No. 11.

Articles I, III and IV should be continued in some similar form, if not already provided for under Italian Law.

Article II is not necessary in its present form but there should be some provision for the control



of photography in <sup>no news</sup> news, military establishments, etc.

Proclamation No 13.

What is it desirable in the interests of the national that Article II should be retained, I do not think it is essential from an A.C.C. standpoint.

General Order 405 should only be retained in so far as the armistice conditions require control of inflation and black markets.

General Order No. 9. The general spirit of this Order should be retained in view of the necessity for maintaining the consumption of goods at a reasonable level.

SUBJECT: Proclamations of AMG under AGO conditions.

TO : Colonel Upjohn, Chief Legal Officer, AMG.

1. In the light of our telephone conversation yesterday, in which you stated that a comparative study of the provisions of the Italian criminal code and the offenses set forth in AMG proclamations could not presently be made, I wish to modify my earlier recommendations on this subject.

I. Proclamation No. 2.

1. I now recommend that as to Proclamation No. 2, all of the offenses in Article I be carried over by the Italian Government. In clauses 3 & 5 thereof the term "Allied Military Government" should be replaced by "the Questura" or some other appropriate agency of the Italian Government. Clause 21 should be reconsidered and revised by the Finance Sub-Commission. Of course, the tribunal to try these offenses would have to be an Italian Court unless extra-territorial courts were established for such offenses which would seem to be unlikely.

2. Article II should be continued in effect, with appropriate modifications of clauses 31, 32, 38, and 43. The comment made above as to the tribunal to try the offenses is applicable here.

3. Article III should continue to be operative, and the phrase "or order issued under the authority of the Allied Military Government" should be stricken out.

4. Articles IV & V, and section 1 of Article VII should be eliminated as being incompatible with the resumption of sovereignty by the Italian Government. The first paragraph of Section 2 of Article VII should be retained after striking out the phrase "or the Allied Military Government". Paragraph 2 of Section II of Article VII should be amended by substituting the words "of the Allied Control Commission" in lieu of "of the Allied Military Government". Section 3 should be retained in its present form.

5. The defenses provided in Article VI should be applicable to trials before Italian Courts.

II. Proclamation No. 11.

1. Proclamation number 11 has certain provisions which should be retained in the absence of positive knowledge that similar provisions are contained in the Italian Penal Code.
2. The Italian government should continue to require declaration of the means of communication set forth in Article I.
3. Article II. The taking of photographs in restricted military areas, or of military equipment installations or armament should be forbidden.
4. Article III. The continuance of the Identity Card system as it prevailed under Italian law prior to the occupation would, in my judgment be sufficient.
5. Article IV. Restriction to be continued by the Italian Government.
6. Article V. This I consider of real importance. The power to grant permits for or to disperse assemblies should be exercised by the Italian Police authorities.
7. Article VI. Strike out "of any flag or colors of Italy or" and "other" in the first line. Otherwise retain.

SUBJECT: Proclamation & General Orders

TO : Col. Upjohn, Chief Legal Officer, AMGOT.

1. It is the opinion of this sub-commission that the retention by decree of the Italian sovereign of the proclamations and general orders which have been published by AMGOT, will insofar as they relate to Public Safety, upon the resumption of Italian sovereignty not be necessary. This conclusion is of course predicated in part upon the assumption that the relinquishment of Allied Military Government will be made only for such regions or areas as have given evidence of their capacity to be governed through native officials without impairing Allied military operations.

2. Attention is invited, perhaps needlessly, to Proclamations 2 & 11. As to these, it is recommended that AMGOT be consulted to determine which provisions, if not all, should be retained from the point of view of the security of military personnel and installation.
