SUBJECT: San Marco Regiment  
TO : Liaison Officer, AC Bari

Reference your LB/21 dated 13 October 1945.

1. The situation described in your letter concerning the political activities of San Marco Regiment has now changed.
2. As from 18 October the Regiment was transferred from command Three District to command of the Ministry of War for further transfer on or after 20 October to the Ministry of Marine.
3. I understand that the intention is to demobilize two battalions and to transfer the third.
4. You will have in the area for the maintenance of law and order four Guard battalions, two under command of Three District and two under command the War Ministry.
5. You should make it clear to the Area and District Commander that the further transfer of this Regiment was initiated by the Italian Government and has not been the result of any representations on your part.

1. Recommend allotment of GD BNS as follows. 3 coys 501 at TARANTO to move to FABANO 10354 to under comd BARI TERN HQ. 507 at ANCONA to under comd BOLOGNA TERN HQ no move involved. 510 at BARI to under comd BARI TERN HQ no move involved. 515 at ANCONA to move to new locn under comd TERN TERN HQ. 520 at IESI to move to new locn under comd MILAN TERN HQ. 525 at NAPLES to come under comd NAPLES TERN HQ no move involved. HQ 518 at FORLI to remain under Allied comd to adm its coys on train guard duties until coys relieved when entire BN would be allotted GENOVA TERN HQ.

2. If above recommendations are agreed each TERN HQ would have three BNS under comd except NAPLES BOLOGNA and UDINE. 504 and 514 will presently be available to complete allotment to NAPLES and BOLOGNA respectively. UDINE will have 1 BN only under comd because (a) 517 is under comd AND 13 COMPS (b) 513 is on loan to FLORENCE TERN comd for guarding Fascist prisoners.

3. 501 GD BN may be released to Min of War wof 16 October.

4. Destinations for movement of 515 520 GD BNS will be advised earliest 5/10/45

Confirmed that accommodation is available for 3 coys 501 GREN in FABANO.

SUBJECT: Note of interview - AC HQ

DATE : 1 October 1945 - 1000 hours

PRESENT: Lt. Col. W. E. McBratney, ex-PO Bolzano  
Major Ralph R. Temple, Director, Local Government S/C  
Major C. G. R. Williams, Executive Officer, Local Government S/C

1. Italian Troops

Lt. Col. McBratney said that there was still a good deal of trouble with the FOLGORE Division--numerous instances of bullying and terrorizing the population. He cited one case of a religious festival in a town, which finished up with a party in a beer garden, at which several Italian soldiers had made a disturbance. They were asked to leave by an American officer and did so, but they came back with many more and made another disturbance. A whistle blow and about 50 Italian soldiers armed with automatic weapons entered. After firing a few shots, they beat up the population with gun butts. In the meantime, 2 heavy machine guns had been placed at the ends of the street outside. An Inquiry was held by the local Italian Command, the result of which was to white-wash everybody.

2. We mentioned that the last we had heard of this problem was that the Italian Government had been asked to remove the SAN MARCO Division. Lt. Col. McBratney said yes they had been replaced by the GARIBOLDI Unit, who were no better than SAN MARCO.

3. He had had many deputations on the subject recently, but factual complaints had ceased. The reason was, the deputations told him, that the population was terrified of reprisals. He had promised the last deputation that any complaints would be kept in his safe, and in forwarding them he would omit the names. The result of this assurance was that some 50 specific complaints reached him almost immediately.

4. De-Nazification

Lt. Col. McBratney said that practically no Nazis were now left in public office. There were, however, some 40/50 Reich Germans resident who were being registered under the Provincial Registration of Aliens Order. They were reluctant to register and give particulars of themselves for obvious reasons. Some of them are shortly to be tried for failing to register and his HQ was initiating a drive about it.

5. Transfer of Aliens

Lt. Col. McBratney thought that registration would be complete shortly and then the problem arose of transferring these Reich Germans back to Germany. Col. Pindley knew all about the problem. He understood permission is being awaited from AFHQ which has not yet been given. There were also a few Vichy French as to whom the position was the same.

6. As to the Reich Germans, he would arranged for obtaining all the particulars which USFAT would require and had asked Col. Pindley to keep the refugee camp in the province open to deal with them.

7. Local Government and Electoral Lists

All Sindaci and Giunta have now been confirmed, except in the case of one Comune. The provincial administration was functioning a little better than before.

8. The Sindaci were registering in the electoral lists all clear cases. None of those who had taken any action under the Hitler-Mussolini Agreements were being registered. We pointed out that this meant that no progress had been made beyond Stage "A". The Sindaci could send their extracts to the Judicial Record Offices, but those extracts would be incomplete. When the time came to deal with the optants, they would have to send further extracts to the Judicial Record Offices. Until all extracts had been sent to and returned by the Judicial Record Offices, no lists could be sent for approval to the Electoral Commissions. The position therefore was that in the near future the preparation of the lists in Bolzano would come to a full stop.

9. Nationality Problem

On this we told Lt. Col. McBratney that our position was as stated in the Chief Commissioner's letter to the Prime Minister of 20 August, agreeing to the Special Commission as a fact-finding body only. A reminder had been sent to the Prime Minister, but no answer had been received.

10. Lt. Col. McBratney said the Prefect had been in communication with the Prime Minister and the Prefect understood that the appointment of the Special Commission would be accompanied by a declaration of the Italian Government as to minority rights in Bolzano. He had seen a telegram from the Prime Minister to the Prefect stating that this declaration as to minority rights had been transmitted to AC on 13 September.

11. We said we doubted if it was necessary to hold up the appointment of the Special Commission for this declaration to be settled. Lt. Col. McBratney said that might be so, but the declaration was very important. He said it was most important that the Special Commission should get to work at once to relieve the increasing tension in the Province.

12. Conclusion.

Lt. Col. McBratney said that tension and unrest among the population were increasing and that 2 main things were required to allay it:--

- (a) Removal of the FOLGORE Division;
- (b) A formal and binding declaration from the Italian Government about minority rights.

He added that when the Prefect had seen the Prime Minister over 2 months ago, the Prime Minister had promised to deal with all of these points at once. The Prefect had returned to Bolzano and had told a meeting of the Sindaci that he had the Prime Minister's verbal promise to that effect, and the population are now awaiting for it to be implemented.

My dear Mr. Prime Minister,

I have received your letter of the 6 July 45 and am glad to be able to tell you that authority was granted on 1 July 45 to raise the maximum number of Carabinieri to 65,000 and this has been duly communicated to the Minister of War.

With regard to the remainder of your letter I am reluctant to remove from the North any of the Combat Groups but part of the Garibaldi Regiment has already been moved to the Bari Area. I appreciate your desire that there should be additional battalions of troops in the South of Italy and I am able to inform you that the whole question of the numbers and distribution of Italian Internal Security Troops all over Italy is now under consideration at AFHQ. I hope to be able to give you the Field Marshal's decision shortly.

Dear Admiral,

a propos of the preoccupations caused by the weakening of the police forces because of the transfer of important contingents of carabinieri to North Italy, you pointed out in your letter of April 27th, n. 14601/53/P.S., that the maximum number of carabinieri fixed in Italy is of 59,000 units and that this force must be equally distributed all over Italy, adding that the superior authorities had been requested to raise this number to 67,000 units.

On this subject, it must nevertheless be remembered that in past times, in an emergency, public order was assured by using, exceptionally, the regular forces of the Army stationed all over Italy, and particularly in the main towns of the provinces, especially in the most important ones.

As it is well known the only units which are at present at the exclusive disposal of the Italian military Authorities are the 'Saubauda' and 'Aosta' Divisions, stationed in Sicily, and the 'Calabria' Division stationed in Sardinia, with two battalions detached to Calabria. These units represent the indispensable minimum to maintain order in these regions, and cannot be weakened by sending men to other places.

As in the present state of things there is no possibility of using the Army forces, in the other regions, the advisability of arranging for the co-operation of the Italian troops depending from the Allied commands for the maintenance of public order, ought to be taken in consideration, and consequently, their equal distribution in the various regions of the peninsula. In particular, I think it would be advisable to transfer South of the Apennines one of the combat teams, for instance the 'Cremona' group which is now stationed in Adria. The most efficient of the pioneers battalions and guards battalions might also do very well.

I shall later on indicate the most appropriate destinations.

I shall be most grateful if you will take this proposal in consideration and intervene with the competent Authorities.

Caro Ammiraglio,

a seguito delle preoccupazioni sorte circa l'indebolimento delle forze di polizia per il trasferimento nell'Italia settentrionale di notevoli contingenti di carabinieri, lei giustamente faceva osservare, nella lettera 27 aprile us. numero 14601/53/P.S., che il numero massimo dei carabinieri fissato in Italia è di 55.000 unità e che tale forza deve essere egualmente distribuita in tutta Italia, aggiungendo che erano state fatte pressioni alle autorità superiori perché tale limite venisse portato a 65.000 unità.

Al riguardo bisogna, però, tener presente che in passato, in caso di gravi emergenze, l'ordine pubblico veniva assicurato con l'impiego straordinario delle forze regolari dell'Esercito che erano distribuite in tutta Italia ed in particolare di stanza nei capoluoghi di provincia, specie in quelli più importanti.

Ora, com'è noto, le sole unità attualmente ad esclusiva disposizione delle Autorità militari italiane sono le Divisioni "Sabauda" ed "Aosta" dislocate in Sicilia, e la Divisione "Calabria" dislocata in Sardegna con due battaglioni distaccati in Calabria. Tali unità rappresentano il minimo indispensabile per assicurare l'ordine in quelle regioni e non possono essere indebolite con l'invio di reparti in altre sedi.

Perché in le altre regioni manca, allo stato attuale, la possibilità di utilizzare le forze dell'Esercito, dovrebbe essere presa in considerazione l'opportunità di prevedere il concorso, nei servizi di ordine pubblico, delle truppe italiane dipendenti dai Comandi Alleati, e in conseguenza un'equa dislocazione di esse nelle varie regioni della Penisola. Mi sembrerebbe opportuno, in particolare, trasferire a sud dell'Appennino uno dei gruppi di combattimento, per esempio il gruppo "Cremona" ora di stanza ad Adria. Altre truppe che pure si presterebbero possono essere anche i più efficienti dei battaglioni pionieri e dei battaglioni guardie.
