B.para 5. General (Jul 44 - Source 275)

(a) TRIESTE

The Carabinieri Legion is still functioning, but is NOT under the control of the Republican Government. It is now under German control, but the men still wear their old uniforms.

(b) BOLZANO

The Carabinieri ceased to exist some time ago. Many of the men of the local Legion have been sent to GERMANY for internment and their duties have been taken over by the German police.

C.para 5. Concentration Camps (Apr 44 - Source 290)

In the neighbourhood of CARPI (L 5381) there is a concentration camp for Jews, interned foreign civilians, political suspects and Allied PW. The total number of inmates is about 500. The Jews and foreign civilians receive very bad treatment and are not allowed to receive parcels of food or clothing. The women, especially the Jewesses, are exposed to outrage by the guards, who are partly Germans and partly Republicans.

Political Prison at PARMA

According to a refugee from German-occupied ITALY, the prison is located NORTH of PARMA railway station. The grounds cover an area of 300 x 150 m. and are surrounded by a concrete wall 15 m. high. It consists of three separate buildings:

a. The Penal Prison (Casa Penale), a 3-storey building measuring 100 x 50 m, and containing sixty rooms, for prisoners serving sentences of more than five years. In Dec 43 there were about a thousand prisoners in this section, of whom 600 were Italian, 350 Yugoslavs and 50 Greeks,

b. The Detention Prison (Carceri Giudiziari) for men, a 3 storey building measuring 100 x 50 m. and containing ninety rooms, for male prisoners serving terms of less than five years. In Dec 43 there were 600 prisoners in this section, of whom 400 Italians and 200 Yugoslavs.

c. The Detention Prison for women, a 3-storey building measuring 100 x 50 m. for female political prisoners. In Dec. 43 about eighty women were confined here, but Source does not know their nationality.

The prison was guarded by a total of about seventy guards. Only prisoners in the Penal Section were obliged to work, being employed in the manufacture of wine-presses. The prisoners received very little food, but these who had money could always bribe the guards to bring them more food.

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C.S.D.I.C. (Sub Centre East) AAI. Report SIM/78 - 20th April 1944

Enemy Meth :

The Russians stationed in the GAETA area have taken the GERMAN cause completely to heart, and are continually committing acts of violence against the inhabitants. On 19th February 1944, two RUSSIANS tried to rape signora Emilia VELLUCCI, about 26 years old, while she was feeding her baby. Her husband and a GERMAN Sergeant arrived on the scene and drove the RUSSIANS away, but shortly afterwards they were fired at and VELLUCCI died of serious wounds in the stomach. Luigi SALENUME and Cosima SALVIA Were eye-witness of this happening.

Documents:

- a. P.W. has NOT heard of any special permit being required for travelling on the railways, though a suggestion has been published in the newspapers to this effect in order to prevent the trains from becoming too crowded and to stop the black Market traffic.
- b. People out after the beginning of the curfew (2230hours) at LA SPEZIA are stopped by GERMAN and REPUBLICAN patrols and asked to show their documents. The REPUBLICAN police can be bribed as some of them have been enlisted by force.
- c. The REPUBLICAN Fascist Party membership card is sufficient to prove one's identity with the police. If the person, however, is young and dressed in civilian clothes, he must be able to clarify his position as regards military service.
- d. Ration cards are NOT required to prove one's identity. They are issued by the provinces when details of residence and family have been handed in. They are valid for three months. (Mar: Apr. May.)

Forced Labour :

- a. Everybody must be able to prove that he is working; failing which he has his ration cards withdrawn or incurs other penalties of the kind. The best way to prove this is to have a Libretto del Lavoro (Work Ticket) issued by the firm by which one is employed. A medical certificate signed by the Commissario Prefettizio (Prefect), or a Certificate of unfitness for work issued by a labour exchange, is considered sufficient for exemption from work.
- b. The TODT organisation recruits volunteers amongst all categories of workers, advertising for them.
- c. Workers who want to be sent to GERMANY are enrolled at the labour exchange, and have to give particulars as to the work they have been doing previously. Before leaving they are classified according to their qualifications:

Skilled workmen: Category I - Metal workers.  
 " " " II - Masons.  
 +Labourers.

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SECRET

This classification is probably checked when they arrive in GERMANY. The workers leave for GERMANY on special trains and are issued with work tickets.

Census of Workers in ROME. (End Dec. 1943).

A census of workers was carried out by the GERMANS at that time. Every worker had to present himself at the labour office in Via URBANA, and prove that he was already employed, in which case he was issued with a special ration card (red in colour) authorising him to draw 250 gr. of bread daily.

A list was made of those remaining unemployed, so that they could be assigned to the GERMAN authorities for any type of work. It was only when they actually started to work that this category was issued with the above-mentioned ration card.

All those who did not present themselves were unable to renew their ordinary bread ration cards.

Police Control and Documents. (March 1944).

The Italian police force carries out its normal duties under direction of their GERMAN counterparts who intervene in cases concerning them directly.

Of the Italian police forces, the METROPOLITANS are rather easy-going, while the P.A.I. (African Police) shows itself inflexible.

Spot check-ups are carried out at odd times by the Italian police. Documents required to pass one of these check-ups are:

- (i) identity card,
- (ii) document proving employment.

If the person stopped belongs to an age-group which has been called up for military service, he must also have a:

- (iii) discharge paper, or
- (iv) document proving exemption from military service.

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
