Swiss passenger stock goes through to NOVARA and ISR train will be waiting there for immediate transshipment and onward despatch to MODENA via ALESSANDRIA and PIACENZA after feeding. 1. As you are aware serious congestion and inconvenience is being caused on the railways owing to the unauthorised movement of large bodies of refugees who are travelling from the Calabria and Sicily area in an effort to return northwards. *see 10/*
2. This matter was discussed at the ~~last~~ meeting of the Transportation Committee and minute 92 refers.
3. The Director of the Italian Refugee Branch of A.C.C. has taken the matter up with the Italian High Commissioner for Refugees in order to prevent such movement in future.
4. Apart from any action which the High Commissioner may take with the Prefects in the Areas concerned, it is considered that so far as the Italian State Railways are concerned, notices must be prepared and affixed to all station notice boards prohibiting unauthorised travel, with the penalty that any such person found will be removed from the train and disciplinary action taken against the offenders.
5. Please take the necessary action with the Italian Railways to see that this procedure is carried out.

"CIVILIAN TRAVEL BY RAIL BY AND AS SECTION'S LETTER 75 DATED AUGUST 1ST 1944, ALSO REFERS. POSITION AT FOGGIA AND BARIETTA STATIONS EXTREMELY UNSATISFACTORY. YESTERDAY BARIETTA HAD IN THE STATION APPROXIMATELY 300 MEN WOMEN AND CHILDREN AND INFANTS IN ARMS WHO HAD BEEN ON HAND FOR 4 DAYS LYING AND SLEEPING IN AND AROUND STATION COURTYARD. STILL ON HAND 1500 HRS. TODAY AND NUMBER INCREASED BY ABOUT 70 PERSONS. SOME OBVIOUSLY ILL AND OVERCOME. ALL IN POSSESSION OF AML PERMITS ISSUED IN VARIOUS PARTS OF THE COUNTRY; SOME TO TRAVEL BY ANY MEANS. UNDERSTAND 'Q' (M) N/ HAVE NOT ARRANGED ANY DEFINITE SERVICE FOR THEIR CONVEYANCE. IN MANY CASES NOISES NON-EXISTENT AND DESTINATIONS IN AREAS WHERE PRESENCE OF REFUGEES WOULD INTERFERE WITH MILITARY REQUIREMENTS. SUGGEST INSTRUCTIONS BE ISSUED IMMEDIATELY TO ALL AML OFFICERS AND QUESTIONS NOT TO ISSUE PERMITS AUTHORIZING TRAVEL UNLESS AND UNTIL LAID DOWN SERVICES IN OPERATION

FOR SUCH TRAFFIC HUMANITARIAN AND HYGIENE REASONS WOULD APPEAR TO
DICTATE NECESSITY FOR DRASTIC AND URGENT ACTION ON POSITIVE LINES.
PLEASE INSTRUCT IN REGARD TO BARLETTA CROWD AS AIRMAN GROWS DAILY IN
HEAT OF THE HOT DAY SUN."

5. The position is most unfortunate, and it does seem that
the movement, whilst authorized is entirely uncontrolled and without
cognisance of the situation at the destination end.

TO : Regional Commissioner, Region II.

In compliance with your instructions, Capt. Ransom Carver and I proceeded to Barletta, arriving about 10.00 p.m.;, 31 July, 1944. Upon arrival, we found about a hundred people lying about on the outside of the railroad station. Of those interrogated, some had civilian travel permits and some did not. Some were enroute to Foggia, others were awaiting the 5.00 a.m. train to Bari.

I contacted Lt. Grimshaw, HQ., Mob., by phone, and he came to the station, accompanied by Capt. Geary; R.T.O. and Lt. Littler. From these officers we learned that a civilian passenger train arrives at Barletta from Bari about 1546 hrs on Mondays, Wednesdays and Friday, carrying about 1400 passengers. Of these, 500 or 600 are estimated to be residents of Barletta returning from Bari. It is also estimated that 100 or 200 transfer at Barletta to the Spinazola civilian passenger train which leaves Barletta at 1700 hrs. It is estimated that approximately one half of the passengers on the Bari-Barletta train are enroute to destinations farther north. This latter group, along with others who have previously arrived at Barletta, jam the station platform and attempt to board the north-bound military train. Soldiers can not vacate the military train to be served tea, for fear that their places will be occupied by Italian civilians.

On the afternoon of Monday, 31 July, 1944, an estimated crowd of 1500 Italian civilians jammed the station platform. He also will arrange with the local British military for a detail of British soldiers. Arrangements have been made to supplement this force, temporarily, with six Carabinieri from the Bari Group.

CONCLUSIONS:

The congestion at Barletta is caused by north-bound Italian civilians, most of whom are travelling with bonafide passes but for whom there is no rail transportation north of Barletta. If this northward movement is not checked at its source, conditions will become increasingly bad at Barletta, and with the back-wash from Barletta will cause trouble in Bari.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the lack of rail transportation north of Barletta for civilians be immediately brought to the attention of HQ. A.C.C. and the Minister of Interior.

That all Provincial Commissioners and Questura Officials authorized to issue civilians travel permits, be instructed to issue passes to points north of Barletta only in exceptional circumstances.

That passes issued to points north of Barletta indicate thereon that train travel is not authorized north of Barletta.

That Prefects of Bari, Taranto, Brindizi and Lecce be requested (or instructed) to erect signs at the principal railroad stations, informing the public that train travel for civilians does not extend beyond Barletta.

That the Italian State Railway be requested to instruct station - masters to announce before train departures that civilians are not permitted to travel by train north of Barletta.

That Mov and TN. 2 District, be requested to change the hour of departure of the Spinazzola civilian train from 1700 hours to 1800 hrs, so that civilians will have no excuse for being on the station platform at the time of departure of the north bound military train.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

A That the lack of rail transportation north of Barletta for civilians be immediately brought to the attention of HQ. A.C.C. and the Minister of Interior.

B That all Provincial Commissioners and Questura Officials authorized to issue civilians travel permits, be instructed to issue passes to points north of Barletta only in exceptional circumstances.

C That passes issued to points north of Barletta indicate thereon that train travel is not authorized north of Barletta.

D That Prefects of Bari, Taranto, Brindisi and Lecce be requested (or instructed) to erect signs at the principal railroad stations, informing the public that train travel for civilians does not extend beyond Barletta.
